# 1892



The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.





# **Hyde United FC**





Hyde FC will always be remembered for the record 26-0 FA Cup defeat suffered at the hands of Preston North End in 1887. But the club, founded two years earlier, was anything but a collection of cotton-town bumpkins. It was a highly ambitious outfit which wanted to compete with the best sides in the North.

The 1887-88 season actually proved to be very successful and at the end of it Hyde met Newton Heath (now Manchester United) in a match the local press termed the unofficialchampionship of Manchester. Hyde enjoyed a very productive period at the turn of the 20th century when the club won four league titles. It moved to Ewen Fields in 1906 after merging with Hyde St George's and taking over the Saints' place in the Lancashire Combination.

In 1917, Hyde folded because of what was termed war reaction but in 1919 there were demands for the club to be re-established. United was added to the name because of a match between two groups which used to meet in the market place: the Forty Gang and the Discharged Soldiers and Sailors.

The inter-war years were a purple patch. In the 1920s, Hyde won five Manchester League championships. This record allowed them to win election to the Cheshire County League in 1930, and four years later Hyde beat Stockport County Reserves to lift the league cup.

In 1945-46 Hyde won the Cheshire Senior Cup for the first time and in 1954 reached round one of the FA Cup, losing to a Workington side managed by Bill Shankly. In the following two seasons the club clinched back-to-back Cheshire League titles.

Hyde's nickname, the Tigers, was adopted at the end of the 1960s when they were founder members of the Northern Premier League. They were expected to struggle but fought like Tigers for two seasons and finished seventh and eleventh. However, the club could not compete financially and returned to the Cheshire League in 1970.

It took ten years for Hyde to re-emerge as a force. In 1981-82 they swept the Cheshire League board and won election back to the NPL. Hyde returned to the first round of the FA Cup in 1983, losing at Burnley, and in 1989 made it to the semi-finals of the FA Trophy.

In 1986, Hyde took the radical step of selling Ewen Fields to Tameside Council so that a synthetic Baspograss pitch could be laid. They picked up several trophies, returned to the first round of the FA Cup (1994) and reached two more FA Trophy semi-finals.

Grass was reinstated in 1995 but as the 21st century dawned Hyde began to struggle. They finished second to Leigh in 1999-2000 but were relegated to the NPL first division three years later. They won the championship at the first attempt and immediately followed up with the NPL title in 2004-05.

Fortunes were mixed in National League North. Hyde were badly affected by the banking crisis of 2008 and the following year were actually wound up for a week.

In 2010, Hyde agreed a deal for Manchester City's elite development squad to use Ewen Fields. The money secured the club's immediate future but a decision to revert to the old name of Hyde FC, and to stop wearing red shirts, divided the fans. A poor season followed, but under the management of Gary Lowe, the Tigers amazed everyone in 2011-12.

Beginning the campaign with ten consecutive wins, Hyde won the championship and promotion to the national division where they continued to surprise the pundits by finishing 18th and by beating clubs such as

Wrexham, Hereford United, Luton Town and Grimsby Town. Unfortunately Hyde were unable to continue competing at such a high level and suffered

back-to-back relegations which have taken them back to the NPL.

In the spring of 2015 Hyde, back under the management of Gary Lowe, returned to the name of Hyde United and announced plans to turn the club into a supporters' trust. Hyde United parted company with six games left of the 2015/16 season due to a poor run of results and appointed Darren Kelly as manager for the remaining games. However Darren wasn't able to prevent the team from their third successive relegation, this time to the Evo-Stik First Division North.

Darren Kelly was appointed first team manager during the close-season after applications were invited for the vacant post, which attracted a large number of applicants and some from some notable names in football management.

Hyde United FC secured £400,000 in funding from Tameside Council in March of 2106. The investment was to help fund a programme to transform the ground and its connections with the local community by laying a FIFA 2\* 3G pitch, which was completed in July 2016. It enabled the Hyde United Academy to move to Ewen Fields from its 5 year home at Knutsford. Which will enable the academy players train and gain experience from the first team.

So Hyde United go into the 2016/17 season with a strong squad assembled by Darren Kelly complemented by some exciting academy players. A first class FIFA 2\* 3G pitch which it hopes will secure its future for years to come, and now a supporters owned football club. It has been an eventful year so far off the pitch and Hyde hope it continues on the pitch this coming season.

The controversial goal galvanised Farnborough and put York under a period of sustained pressure before the sides went in level at the break.

The half-time interval certainly benefited York College as Farnborough were piling on the pressure at the end of the first forty five.

And York came out of the blocks ravenous and determined in the second half as they dominated possession and continued to spray the ball around in the opposition half.

York did then deservedly retake the lead on hour mark. Captain Kieron Holmes lead by example storming out from the back into the Farnborough half before getting back from substitute Donald Chimalilo.



Holmes then threaded it through to Tom Hullock who turned provider and a composed finish put York/i2i back in front.

But back came Farnborough again levelling just six minutes later. Jake Wilson was the stand out for the side in purple all afternoon and his superb free-kick from 20 yards out pegged York back once more.

York continued to play their own game with the full-backs operating high up the pitch however; the decisive fifth goal was scored by Farnborough eighteen minutes from time.

Sam Henneberg's long ball in behind Kieron Holmes and Joe Dunnett allowed Jake Wilson to spring the offside trap, run clean through on goal and squeeze a shot beyond Nick Lock for his second of the game.

York pushed hard for an equaliser in the final ten minutes and felt they should have had a penalty kick in the 85th minute as captain Liam Whyte looked to upend Joe Dunnett but again, referee Andrews was unconvinced.

## **Grounds For Celebration**



Some people love cars or bikes. Others get excited about pubs and restaurants. Me? I love football grounds! Now, I hate the term "ground hopper" because it's so geeky and, well, downright American – but, I guess I must admit, the anorak fits - a ground hopper is what I must be!

No two venues are the same and it's fascinating to me how there can be such an infinite number of variations in the configuration of what basically boils down to a piece of grass surrounded by something to watch from, somewhere to buy refreshments and a place to park your car outside. There are around a thousand grounds in the top ten levels of the pro' and semi-pro' game and every single one is unique.

One of the great consequences of gaining promotion is that it means you get to travel to a large number of new grounds! And this season we have visited a lot of interesting places. I think all grounds should be celebrated as the great theatres of entertainment and passion they are. So in true communitarian style, where everyone wins and no one leaves empty-handed in case it gives them a "complex", here are my awards for those I have visited with the Brewers this

HYDE – Most developed stadium and best-surfaced car park and best carpeted pitch! 3 awards in one for today's visitors. All four sides of Ewen Fields are properly developed and covered and there are numerous excellent vantage points. A spacious fully tarmac'd car park and approach road is a rarity at this level of football. The excellence of the other facilities helped me overlook the shortcomings of the artificial playing surface.

**MOSSLEY – Highest ground above sea level!** Well, OK, only the 4<sup>th</sup> highest altitude in the country overall, but the highest in this division. Nice Pennine aspect too!

OSSETT TOWN – Closest to a town centre or most mobile phone masts! Many clubs now rely on income from mobile phone companies to make ends meet but Ingfield boasts more than the rest. Just over the road from the bus station for PT users.

BAMBER BRIDGE – Best modern permanent stand or closest to a major road!
Beside a slip road off the A6, Irongate has a brilliant, modern, raised side stand, offering unrestricted views of the action.

GOOLE – Best name and most time spent retrieving the ball or closest to a water tower! The Victoria Pleasure Grounds sound delightful but the 4-lane running track means that a lot of game time is lost. Perhaps, with more in-play time, Goole could have saved themselves from the drop?

RAMSBOTTOM – Darkest car park or latest switching on of floodlights! Having negotiated the way from the pitch-black car park into the ground, we were greeted with yet more blackness, with the floodlights being rationed before kick-off and then turned off before we'd even left the ground at the final whistle.

BURSCOUGH – Most in need of some TLC! The poor Linnets are going through the wringer on and off the pitch at the moment, sadly. Victoria Park exudes a sense of a glorious past but nowadays it more than a little tired.

**OSSETT ALBION – Best redevelopment project!** The Unicorns have very ambitious plans to create a new clubhouse, changing rooms and full-length stand along the South side. Works are already underway and I look forward to seeing big changes next season.

PRESCOT CABLES – Biggest stand or muddiest pitch! Cables' main stand is huge by NPL standards. It may have seen better days but it provides a great view of the pitch. The only problem is that the pitch is the most worn and muddy in this division – largely due to the ground-sharing arrangement with St Helens Town. And the great news is that next season we get to go twice – Skelmersdale United are moving in soon too!

CLITHEROE – Smallest car park and most vociferous fans! A car park the size of the average suburban driveway doesn't detract from a very boisterous home crowd. Perhaps the long walk to the ground warms them up!

RADCLIFFE BOROUGH – Most resilient club! Boro' were already raising funds to repair their stand, burned down by arsonists in the days prior to our December visit. A real "phoenix club"!

FARSLEY CELTIC – Most frustrating ground! Frustrating, not just because we somehow lost 5-1, but also because despite having developed both sides and one end of the ground, so much of it is unworkable – bad sight lines, seats out of action. And yet somehow, I really like the feel of it!

DROYLSDEN – Loudest tannoy or best covered end terrace! If you like loud "Madchester" music, The Butcher's Arms is the place for you! Great covered Kop too!

COLWYN BAY – Most income generated from Tad fans! Charging £10-a-head to our largest away following of the season, combined with refreshments necessary after such a long journey meant the Welsh club made a healthy profit on our cross-border visit!

TRAFFORD – Greenest surroundings and biggest car park! Situated in a leafy Cheshire suburb, with a golf club next door and surrounded by grass and trees, Shawe View is an ideal place to relax – unfortunately, our defence agreed! Huge car park too!

LANCASTER CITY – Closest to a railway station and best uncovered terrace! With the station next door and the Castle behind that, a full day out can be had in a radius of just a few hundred yards. Great permanent terrace behind one goal too!

BRIGHOUSE TOWN – Longest imaginary players' tunnel! Players must navigate a full 50 yards from dressing room to pitch. Pre-match warm ups are unnecessary!

GLOSSOP NORTH END – Best food or best sand pit! A severe drainage problem caused by nearby building work left a section of the pitch resembling Morecambe Bay, but a tasty pie and peas soon take your mind of it!

**KENDAL TOWN – Best scoreboard!** We could easily have "troubled" it 4 times in the first half alone, but had to make do with a share of the points in the end!

**COLNE – Best views or most sloping pitch!** Even by NPL standards, Colne play on the side of a mountain! The pitch may be almost vertical but the stunning views more than make up for that!

SCARBOROUGH (renting at Bridlington Town) – Best draining pitch or closest to a gas tower! Despite gale-force winds and torrential rain battering it for entire 90 minutes during the cup-tie, the Queensgate pitch played superbly – unlike the referee, unfortunately!

For all that I love visiting new towns and grounds, there really is no place like home! The i2i with its pristine grass pitch (sorry Hyde!), on a sunny day, beside the River, watching Taddy in full flow, is my idea of paradise! Home results since Christmas have been much improved. We need to make this place a fortress once again and taking three points from our Red Rose rivals today will put another big stone block in the perimeter wall – Come on you Brewers!

## **Shoot-out Disappointment For TAD in Cup Final**

# On Tuesday night Farsley Celtic were crowned West Riding County Cup Champions winning 4-2 on penalties.

Coincidentally the goal that Farsley scored in regulation time was also from the penalty spot. Richard Marshall was thought to of been clipped by Carl Stewart and Marshall stepped up himself to put Celtic one goal to the good.

Nevertheless Stewart more than made up for his alleged offence by drawing Taddy level seven minutes later.

Conor Sellars' driven cross-field pass was chested on the run and exquisitely sent into the back of the net by Stewart.

Both sides gave it their all to score a winner in the second half but failed to do so which saw the Final decided by a penalty shoot-out.

Tom Corner was the first man to miss his spot-kick blasting off the crossbar before Farsley's Richard Marshall, who scored the penalty in normal time, went one worse than Corner blasting way over the mark.

With the scores at 2-3 to Celtic, Josh Grant saw his weak penalty comfortably saved by Goalkeeper of the Year Graeme McKibbin which allowed Paul Walker to be the match winner for Farsley.

The match was a fantastic advert for Non-League Football in front of a terrific 853 attendance at the i2i stadium.

Taddy boss Billy Miller welcomed Jono Greening, Carl Stewart and Josh Grant back into the starting eleven with Michael Ingham back in the squad for the first time since suffering a serious foot injury back in October.

It was somewhat strange having a Cup Final at the i2i stadium, it just felt like a home game, and home advantage almost told inside five minutes when Taddy had the ball in the back of the net.

Carl Stewart's bobbling volley was parried and fumbled by Celtic stopper McKibbin allowing Rob Youhill to follow up with a tap-in, only for the linesman to raise his flag for offside.

The noisy 'home fans' were enjoying what they were seeing in the opening ten minutes as Rob Youhill threatened with his pace in behind again.

Josh Grant made a fine tackle to thwart Lewis Nightingale inside the penalty area before Grant drove a superb through ball for Youhill to latch onto.

The speedy winger, who was actually playing down the middle in the first half, went for an audacious outside of the foot effort which nestled into the side-netting.

It was a fast and frenetic opening to the final as John Deacey's Celtic side enjoyed long spells of possession with Pete Davidson and Ross Daly spraying it from side-to-side.

Farsley still have it all to play for this season as the league title looks like being a two-horse race between themselves and Lancaster City.

They soon got into their rhythm in this encounter though with Ross Daly kneeing up and arrowing an impressive volley off the crossbar. And this was all before ten minutes was on the clock.

The chances were free-flowing at both ends as Richard Marshall's in-direct free-kick was fired off the line by Tom Corner before a spiralling goal kick from Chandler Hallwood set Carl Stewart away at the other end but the lively forward lobbed narrowly wide

Premier League referee Bobby Madley was the man in the middle and he soon became very unpopular with the Tadcaster fans as he controversially pointed to the penalty spot on 23 minutes.

Carl Stewart was adjudged to have gone through the back of Marshall but without any real appeal from Celtic. Madley was adamant it was a penalty kick.

Richard Marshall picked the ball up and struck powerfully past Chandler Hallwood in the Taddy goal to but Farsley in front.

Gregg Anderson and Josh Barrett were doing a good job of marshalling the many threats that Farsley have however, experienced striker Lamin Colley was looking dangerous and was denied twice in quick succession by Hallwood.

The first save out of the two was a strong left-hand down low to his left, and this proved to be very important when Tadcaster equalised just after the half hour mark.

Following some nice one touch interplay, Conor Sellars fizzed a delightful diagonal ball to Carl Stewart who magnificently controlled with his chest on the run and sent an exquisite half-volley into the roof of the net leaving McKibbin with no chance whatsoever.

Taddy's number 10 was having a superb game constantly being a threat with his eye for goal as well as continuing to track back down the right-hand side time and time again.

#### Half-Time: Tadcaster Albion 1-1 Farsley Celtic.

As the chilly spring wind picked up, Taddy started the second forty five just like the first, very lively and looking to force the issue early on.

Tom Corner came incredibly close to nudging the Brewers ahead when he prodded Jordan Armstrong's cross inches wide of the left-hand upright.

With less than five minutes gone in the half Albion created another good chance at goal.

Conor Sellars' work-rate is unbelievable each and every game and this was no different as his fierce pressing saw him win the ball back and play Stewart through on goal but his strike bounced off target also

Stewart's willingness to run in behind continued to be a problem for Farsley as the forward superbly controlled the ball down an inside left position before firing agonisingly wide once again.

I'm certain that Farsley would have expected a fiery start from Miller's men and they did well to exit the spell without conceding at least one more goal.

As the contest entered the final quarter, Taddy opted to drop deeper surrendering the vast majority of possession to Farsley making it incredibly tight and tough for them.

It was certainly a plan that worked as Farsley got very little change out of the Brewers who were solid at the back.

The tactic almost paid off perfectly for Taddy after going close on the counter attack.

Josh Grant, who was having a good game at leftback, won the ball back, drove into midfield and played it forward for the sprinting substitute Carlos Dialo.

The Portuguese attacker carried the ball into Farsley's half before caressing a superb ball with the outside of his boot in behind to Tom Corner.

Corner's first touch was good, the crowd screamed in anticipation but just as the top scorer pulled the trigger one v one with McKibbin, Nathan Turner recovered with an outstanding goal-saving tackle.

The last chance of the match fell to Celtic in the final minute as substitute Jordan Deacey jinked, ducked, dived, dodged his way beyond two yellow shirts and into the penalty area before seeing his strike well stopped by Hallwood.

So after 90 minutes the two sides could not be separated and the West Riding County Cup was to be decided by a penalty shoot-out.

Good friends they may be, but they were opponents on Tuesday night, Lewis Nightingale and Conor Sellars stepped up first and both dispatched their spot-kicks confidently.

Jordan Deacey, who must have still been kicking himself about missing that late chance, kept his cool and stroked into the back of the net.

Tom Corner was the first player to miss as he saw his power blaster smash off the crossbar.

Corner would have felt better a few seconds later though as Richard Marshall hammered way over the target.

The experienced Jono Greening made it 2-2 with a cool as you like penalty followed closely by Farsley captain Aaron Hardy who made no mistake.

Josh Grant opened the door for Celtic as the defender saw his tame penalty denied by McKibbin.

Substitute Paul Walker had the chance to be the hero and this he was as he tucked away the winning penalty which saw Farsley Celtic win 4-2 on penalties and lift the West Riding County Cup Trophy.



Harrogate were hesitant at the back and that allowed Hansen to pounce upon a loose ball and drive beyond Toby Lees but with Sean Hunter in space the winger got caught in two minds and couldn't pick out the advancing striker.


