# 1892



The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.





## Goole AFC





The Port and Town of Goole have had a semi professional football team since the 1900's. Goole Town competed in various leagues throughout their history including the Midlands League in the 1950's when they were probably at their most successful.

Time went by with varying degrees of success and failure and finally at the end of the 1995/96 season, because of everincreasing debts and falling attendance's Goole Town committee had no option but to close down the club. For the last few die hard supporters it was a very sad time in Goole's history.

In the autumn of 1996 a Leeds Businessman, Mike Norman who was at work in the Goole area happened to stumble across the Victoria Pleasure Ground and hearing that the Town had no football team visited the local council regarding the possibility of starting a brand new club. It had been his dream to run a semi professional club and set to work immediately recruiting local people to help him with his endeavor.

In the summer of 1997 Goole AFC advertised for a club manager, a few applications were received, but one stood out from all the others, that of John Reed. The manager who had taken Bridlington Town to Wembley and who had enjoyed five league Championships with many clubs was appointed.

The first game of the new season was a sign of things to come when local man Paul Gibbon hit Blackwell Miners Welfare with 5 goals. The final score saw Goole hit their highest score to date winning by eight goals

to nil. The first year was more successful than anyone dare imagine. That season ended with Goole crowned as Champions of the Central Midlands Premier Division with statistics of Won 27, Drawn 4, and the only loss coming against Askern Miners Welfare. Goole also managed to top the 100 goals in a season finishing with 102 league goals in all

Goole's second season also provided more success. Promotion to the Northern Counties East League, following a third place spot was topped by two cup victories. The Wakefield Floodlit Cup and the Cox League Cup both travelled to East Yorkshire. On top of that success, a superb run in the Carlsberg F.A Vase saw Goole get to round four, a crowd of 526 (the biggest at that time) and have Premier League referee Neil Barry officiating the game.

Year 2000 and the third season for Goole was their most traumatic. The whole season seemed almost meaningless when in January it was announced to a sombre crowd that founder and Chairman Mike Norman had passed away. Mike who had had the ambition and motivation to start a club so soon after the last folded immediately had received the backing of the council and more importantly the general public. John Reed went public and stated that he would win the Championship for Mike and this he did in style. Eleven points clear and another trophy in the cabinet in the shape of the Wilkinson Sword Trophy meant that Goole had ended the season in style for Mike and his family.

At the end of the season Richard Norman.

who had taken over the club since his father's death and had provided the stability it had needed following the loss of its founder, decided to relinquish his role as Chairman and hand the club over to the local people of Goole. A change in personnel saw Geoff Bruines take over as Chairman, and more local people getting involved in the running of the club. Richard was offered the role of president by the new Chairman and readily agreed to take over this figurehead position.

The new season started with a defeat against Alfreton Town and then a run, which took us to the 2nd qualifying round of the F.A. Cup and to the second round of the F.A. Vase. However November came and a run of four defeats in a row and a new regime at Harrogate Town meant that manager John Reed was in demand and the lure of a club with fantastic finances and Conference ambitions was just too good to turn down. The manager who had adhered himself to the supporters over three years was gone.

November 2000 saw Peter Daniel installed as club manager. After an impressive playing career, which saw him at Football League Clubs including Hull City, Sunderland, Wolverhampton Wanderers and Lincoln, Peter had moved into management around the Yorkshire and Lincolnshire area and was seen as an ambitious manager who could continue the work started by John Reed and John Kirk.

The season finished with Goole in 4th position of the North Counties Premier Division and only a handful of points away from a promotion opportunity. Overall it was

considered a very successful season after the turmoil midway through. The ground began major redevelopment to allow Unibond Football to be played at the Victoria Pleasure Grounds once again.

The 2001/02 season was another year of change as 10 months after Peter Daniel had taken the reigns a string of poor results which was primarily caused by the lack of available players saw the manager leave and another ex Hull City legend take charge. Steve Richards task was simple, to put the club into the Unibond League and to build a squad that could keep them their. Off the field other changers were afoot with Eric Lawton taking the Chairman position from Geoff Bruines, whilst Geoff still remained heavily involved in the running of the club.

Finally in 2004/2005 Goole achieved the dream of Unibond Football under the direction of Des O'Hearne. Des had taken over from Eric Lawton who had kept the club afloat during difficult times and Des had promised to the fans that Unibond Football would be his number one priority, this he duly delivered. With the club now in Unibond Football the next aim was to put the club in a sound financial position.

The season finished with a new manager Nigel Danby who had been at the club as player agreed to take the role of player/manager and this had seemed to work well very quickly.

The next major occasion for the club came in season 2006/07 when a terrific cup run in the West Riding Cup meant that Goole AFC lifted the trophy for the first time, as Goole Town had done a few times before, but many years ago.

The 2007/08 season saw Goole make a real push for promotion with the club sitting in third place for many weeks of the season, however it was a very close race, in fact with only a couple of weeks of the season left clubs as far down as 10th place could still have made the play-offs. With only a

month left, the club suffered some bad injuries and points began to slip and with only two games left Goole fell out of the play-off positions and eventually fell to 9th place.

After the hope of the previous season, supporters could not have been blamed if their dreams for a Unibond Premier League push could be finally realised in 2009 but all that was dashed before the season started. With the credit crunch biting the financial world, money in football was also causing concern and rather than taking the easy option of burying heads and hoping this would be OK, the Chairman took the painful decision to apply for administration and make sure that the club would put their financial house in order and take the long term view for the club.

This meant that the 2008-09 season was almost over before it had begun with only the question being, could Goole escape relegation but with the league trying to increase the number of teams then a relegation place being exercised was even doubt. As it turned out Goole didn't finish bottom with Brigg Town taking that honour and as expected no relegation was enforced.

At the start the 2009-10 season and with other clubs finding the present time difficult the fans can be proud of the forethought the Chairman had and they can look forward to the 2009-10 season with hope once again. Following a disastrous start to the 2009-10 campaign, the management team of Nigel Danby and Mick Norbury resigned, Chairman Des O'Hearne installed Karl Rose as caretaker manager and following some positive results and improved displays, Karl was given the job on a permanent basis.

In May 2012, Karl Rose resigned to take over at Frickley Athletic and to the delight of all Goole AFC supporters, it was announced that former manager John Reed had agreed to return to the club and would be assisted by former Goole AFC payer Clive Freeman.

Following a poor start to the 2012-13 season and with just one win from eight league games, Des O'Hearne took the decision to part company with John Reed and Clive Freeman. Less than a week later it was announced that Wayne Benn had been appointed manager of Goole AFC.

In November 2012, Des O'Hearne stood down as Chairman due to ill health, the club was at this time put up for sale, with Craig Whincup taking temporary charge until a new owner could be found.

Almost 12 months later, on October 14th 2013, the club announced that a takeover had been agreed and signed that would see London property investor Mr Baron Bloom take over as the clubs new owner and Chairman with immediate effect.

It was simultaneously announced that David Holdsworth and Curtis Woodhouse had been appointed as the new management team. After a poor run of results during December and January, Curtis Woodhouse replaced David Holdswoth as manager, with Chris Adam being appointed assistant manager.

In December 2014 Baron Bloom resigned as chairman and sold his majority shareholding to club officials for the nominal sum of £1. Just a few weeks later, Steve Shorthouse was appointed as chairman and a plan was put in place with co-director Craig Whincup to put the clubs financial affairs in order and to pay off the clubs historical debt.

In April 2016, it was announced that Steve Shorthouse had stood down as chairman of the club, leaving it debt free.

## INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS (Part One - The Problems)



Well, a couple of weeks ago we awoke to the reassuring news that those boffins at FIFA had put their heads together, had a good old brainstorming session, deployed some "blue-sky-thinking" and "pushed the envelope" in order to redesign the format for future World Cups, to be effective from 2026.

The World Cup "has to become more inclusive!" cried FIFA President Gianni Infantino. A laudable premise perhaps, but what do these changes entail and how successful are they likely to be in creating an even more successful tournament? More of that in the next column but for now let's examine the extent of the problems that need to be addressed.

The Finals format, in existence since France 98, is to have 32 qualifying nations split into 8 mini-groups of 4 teams. They play each other once and the top 2 teams from each group qualify for the 16-team knockout stage. From then on, the logic of pure knockout football finally kicks in and continues until the final. All told, 64 matches (including the 3rd place play-off).

At this point I would like to give a personal opinion. Mini-group football is RUBBISH! It's rubbish in World Cup Finals! Rubbish in World Cup Qualifiers. Rubbish in the Finals and Qualifiers of the Euros. Rubbish in the Champions League. Rubbish in the Europa League. Rubbish wherever it exists.

The only thing worse than mini-group football is mini-group football where more than one team qualifies from the group and, in the case of the recent Euros Finals where, in many of the mini-groups, 3 of the 4

participants went through to the next stage, the word "pointless" doesn't begin to do justice to the futility of the exercise.

It was possible to progress without winning a single group game! 99% of the time everyone knows as soon as the draw is made which will be the teams to progress from the group stages and most of the games are played at the intensity of preseason friendlies, as the bigger teams do just enough to ensure they progress and the little teams are just on a damagelimitation exercise, but nevertheless just happy to be taking part. If we are really lucky, and the group has more than one decent side perhaps there will be one of the 6 games in each group that has something remotely competitive about it. As things stand, perhaps only 20 or so of the 64 Finals matches actually have something decisive riding on them.

All this, of course follows on the back of a protracted and largely tedious 2-year pre-tournament qualification process whereby teams are once again placed in groups (usually of 6 or 7 teams in Europe) from which 2 generally qualify. Given that most of these groups only contain 2 or 3 teams who have any hope of qualification, it once again means that only 2 or 3 of the 30 or more group games have anything more than a pre-season feel about them.

Even worse, it means that domestic calendars are wrecked as every 3 or 4 weeks there is an enforced hiatus in every top division (and even down to The Championship in England) as thousands of players have to jump on planes and criss-cross the globe in order to take part in yet another non-event of a qualifying tie.

It causes disruption at club level, as individual players and teams have an enormous challenge to try and build any kind of consistency with the constant interruptions. Players return tired, jet-lagged, injured or all three and clubs are left to pick up the pieces. From a fan's perspective, the top-start nature of top-flight football is a real

turn off.

Imagine if that were the case in the real lives of all of us... For 3 weeks or so you do your normal job and then for the last week of the month you have to go and work in a different town for a different company with a different boss, different colleagues, different equipment, different working processes etc. Even though the basic profession is the same it would be a great challenge to be able to adjust to all the changes and still be at your best. Only to then have to return to base a week later and start the entire cycle again!

And yet the system as it stands doesn't benefit national teams either. They too have to deal with quickly assembling and organising a team out of a group of disparate individuals who have arrived from all corners of the earth and often really don't want to be there. Coaches must attempt to create a side capable of cohesive and winning football at 3 days' notice. It's an insane system!

Indeed it would seem that the only people to benefit from the status quo are the "big-wigs" at FIFA, UEFA and the various national FAs who get to enjoy a jet-set lifestyle travelling the world arranging and attending these pointless matches. I mean, an all-expenses paid week-long stay in, say, Malta or Cyprus in November is pretty appealing, regardless of the fact that the actual game will be tedious. Not to mention the necessary inspection trips beforehand in order to select hotels and training facilities etc.

Next time I will look at what FIFA is proposing to do by way of improvement and I'll be offering my own solution too. But for now attention turns to one game which has a HUGE amount riding on it! At Goole we came away with only a point after absolutely battering them in the second half. Let's ensure we get a deserved 3 points this afternoon – Come on you Brewers!

## **Player TALK**



#### **JOSH BARRETT**

Barrett insists there's more to come from this squad and is excited by potential brother challenge

This week we spoke to one of the Brewers' most consistent and arguably most improved players, defender Josh Barrett.

When asked who would come out on top if the two Barrett Brothers did come up against each other, Josh remained confident.

"Silly question really, it's always going to be the older brother. Either way I'm looking forward to it."

"Me and Dan are very close, but it will just be business as normal for me."

Greening gained control and helped it on to Adam Baker who jinked inside on his favoured right-foot and drove narrowly off target.

These were encouraging signs for Miller and Heath though as the Taddy faithful were encouraged by what they were seeing.

However, two minutes later and Shaw Lane were awarded a penalty kick as Dan Thirkell was adjudged to have impeded the onrushing forward.

Alex Byrne stepped up and struck powerfully to the left corner but Chandler Hallwood flew to his right and pulled off a brilliant save to keep the tie scoreless.

From the resulting corner, the visitors spurned another golden opportunity to take the lead as Jonathon Wafula found himself unmarked at the back post but he couldn't direct on target with the goal gaping.



Three minutes later and Shaw Lane did in fact break the deadlock as Jack Touhey's low shot was turned into his own net by Tom Allan.

It was a fast and frenetic first half and showed no signs of letting up as just a few minutes later and Taddy were awarded a penalty of their own as Josh Greening got clipped by full-back Neil Austin.

Greening opted to take the spot-kick himself and fired low to the bottom right-hand corner but Shaw Lane stopper Mateusz Zanieuwski made it one penalty save a piece with a strong left handed stop.

Taddy continued to play some fine fast flowing football and almost equalised with a superb counter attacking move.

Albion continued to knock on Shaw Lane's door and came close once more when the towering presence of Tom Allan stormed agonisingly wide of the mark.

The visitors still posed a serious threat going forward though and if it wasn't for Taddy goalkeeper Chandler Hallwood it could have been a much different result with the former Walsall man making several top quality saves to deny Wafula and Byrne.

But it was Taddy who looked the more likely to score the next goal as they ramped the intensity up another level. There were massive appeals for another penalty fifteen minutes from time as the guilty party from the first penalty Austin upended Tom Allan but referee Andy Smith waved away.

However, Taddy's constant pressure paid off with ten minutes to go as they finally levelled the cup tie.

Most of the credit has to go to Rob Youhill who drove down the right touchline, cut inside and powered beyond Joel Purkiss, jinked down the outside once again past Ben Algar and delivered into the danger area where Sellars helped it on to Josh Greening who turned in from three yards.

All of Tad's hard work was almost undone four minutes later when Gary Burnett sprung the offside trap and raced clean through on goal with the whole half to himself. Burnett had an age to decide what to do but Chandler Hallwood rushed off his line and pulled off a phenomenal stop from point blank range.

Hallwood's outstanding save proved to be even more important than first thought as Taddy completed the comeback a minute

Substitute Fraser Hansen weighed up his options before passing in-field to Adam Baker who dashed to the right from a central position and unleashed a fierce strike from 22 yards into the left-hand corner.






