



Formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title. In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**. In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new chairman. In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games. in March led to them finally finishing in third. An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town. At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

> In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare. They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers started their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy Miller was back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division was needed.

The Brewers started the season well and were in the play-off spots, then injury problems hit the team and the season seemed to run away from them.

They finished 19th in the league. The Brewers had a great chance for silverware in the West Riding County Cup Final, the game finished 1-1 but they lost out to Farsley Celtic 4-2 on penalties.

At the end of the 16/17 campaign the Directors made the tough decision to change the management team from Billy Miller and Matt Heath to Michael Morton and Simon Collins bringing it more in-house. In the 2017/18 season the new-look management team took a couple months to adapt to the league and mould the squad that they wanted. However it didn't take them long to find their feet as the fortunes took a turn for the better after the new year with Michael & Simon steering the club to its highest ever finish reaching the Evo-Stik League play-offs after a dramatic final day. This once again brought massive excitement amongst the club and town but unfortunately it ended in semi-final defeat 2-1 at Bamber Bridge despite taking the lead and putting in a valiant performance.

There's no doubting that the club is going in the right direction as the 2018/19 season sees the Brewers move into the Evo-Stik East Division after the league switched from a North/South divide to an East/West split. Can the club improve again this year...

Keep up your support again this year, here's to a successful season.




Aaron Hardy Defender

THE BREWERS · 2018-2019 Season



The Club was founded in 1904 under the name of Sneinton FC and for much of the 20th century played its football in the local leagues of Nottinghamshire.

The Club led somewhat of a nomadic existence, playing at various grounds, and only settled at its current location of Stoke Lane, Gedling, in the early 1990s. This move coincided with the ambition from within the Club to progress beyond the confines of local parks football and the Club took the bold step of joining the Central Midlands Football League for the 1995-96 season, a move previously undertaken by only two other Nottingham parks sides. It is perhaps from this point that the modern-day Carlton Town FC really started to take shape.

The first season in the CML was reasonable, but at the start of the 1996-97 campaign the Club was left with just three players and no manager. In a desperate quandary, chairman Bill Stokeld turned to former players Tommy Brookbanks and Neil Cooper who agreed to take over the managerial reigns at Sneinton, and there began a period of outstanding success.

Brookbanks led the club outstandingly for 14 years from 1996 – 2010 with the club gaining four promotions under his stewardship. He took just two years to gain promotion from the Premier Division to the Supreme Division of the CML, and three years later only ground grading issues prevented elevation into the Northern Counties (East) League.

Chairman Mick Garton of local company MSR Newsgroup took over the hot seat at Stoke Lane in 2002 and with his financial input (well over £200,000 has been spent during his tenure) the ground was brought up to Step 4 standard to ensure ground grading would never again deprive the team of the fruits of its labours.

Also in 2002 the club changed its name to Carlton Town and in its first season under its new monicker it duly won the CML title and gained promotion to the First Division of the NCEL.

The Millers spent three years in this division before winning the league in 2005-06 and gaining promotion to the NCEL Premier Division. However, by this stage the club was without club President and legend Bill Stokeld, who passed away watching the Millers on 23 October 2004. Bill had been involved with the Club for over 50 years and a player, secretary, chairman and president and without his financial assistance and sheer effort, the Club simply wouldn't exist today. It is fitting that his name lives on through the name of the stadium itself.

Having taken three years to rise one level within the NCEL it took only 12 months to gain yet another promotion and join the Northern Premier League at step 4 of the pyramid. The club had begun the 2006-07 season with no ground, as a new link road was being built through the middle of the old ground and the new site, adjacent to the old one, wasn't ready in time. Nonetheless, despite starting the season with a run of away games, the team enjoyed an excellent campaign and travelled to Garforth on the last day of the season in a winner-takes-all game for the final promotion spot.

Carlton Town

Dean Gent was Carlton's hero, scoring a 94th minute winner to secure a 2-1 win in front of 560 to secure Brookbanks's fourth promotion in 11 years into the NPL First Division South, where the Millers have remained ever since, until this year's reorganisation.

Carlton's first season at this level saw them finish a creditable 10th, and in 2008-09 they finished fourth and made the play-offs, where a certain Jamie Vardy was amongst the scorers as Stocksbridge Park Steels won 5-2 in South Yorkshire.

Another top half finish followed in 2009-10 before Brookbanks decided to move on to Premier Division Hucknall Town. He took with him most of the players and the Academy set-up so when new manager Les McJannet arrived, he had to recruit an entire squad of players. None of the starting eleven in the first match of the 2010-11 season had been at the club the previous season.

With most Carlton fans expecting a relegation battle McJannet's side made a fantastic start to the campaign, losing just one of the opening

15 games and finishing in eighth place. The club also made it to the final of the Notts Senior Cup for the first time before being well beaten by Conference North Eastwood Town.

If Carlton fans thought that was impressive, the next three seasons brought even more success. 2011-12 saw the Millers finish second in the table, their highest ever placing to date, score 101 league goals and only go out of the play-offs after a penalty shoot-out against Leek Town.

The league form dipped in 2012-13 but Mc-Jannet brought silverware to the Club in the form of a first ever Notts Senior Cup success, beating his former club Sutton Town 5-2 in the final, even though centre-half Grant Brindley had to play in goal due to an injury crisis. The club also made it through the third round qualifying of the FA Cup for the first time before going out to Bradford (Park Avenue).

The Millers made a great start to 2013-14, winning their opening five matches without conceding a goal. However, McJannet struggled to put out a settled side and results suffered, with Carlton eventually finishing tenth in the table. Once again, the team save its best

performances for the cup competitions, with another third qualifying round appearance in the FA Cup and a best-ever semi-final showing in the League Cup in a run which saw Carlton beat three Premier Division sides including a memorable guarter-final win at home to FC United of Manchester. The Millers also retained the Notts Senior Cup in some style, beating Rainworth MW 6-2 in the final.

2014-15 was a huge disappointment. The Millers opened with three defeats and never really recovered, spending far too much of the season flirting uncomfortably with relegation, eventually finishing in 18th position and failing to win any of their last 13 matches. Early exits were made in all cup competitions and at the end of the campaign McJannet decided to call it a day.

He was replaced by his assistant Wayne Scott who had led the under 21s to an impressive second place in their division in McJannet's final year. Scott's first two seasons in charge were almost identical, with Carlton starting poorly and hovering around the relegation zone for the first six months of the season before hitting their stride in February or March,

putting together excellent winning runs, and pulling well clear of the drop in points terms at least.

Team · HISTOR'

Those seasons saw 18th and 19th placed finishes in the league but Scott's second season at the helm ended in spectacular style with the manager leading the club to its third win in the Notts Senior Cup, beating local rivals Basford Utd 4-1 at Notts County's Meadow Lane.

2017-18 saw an excellent start, with 10 points from the first five games and 20 points reached by mid-November. However, a horrendous run of postponements allied to a habit of conceding late goals saw the Millers slip down the table, albeit with games in hand. The postponements plainly had an effect with Carlton having to play their final 12 matches in the last 24 days of the season, and without a win in the last 10 they once again finished 19th.

With the side venturing into new territory in the Evo-Stik East division, the challenge for Scott's team is to maintain the early season form of the last campaign over an entire season, as well as try and put together a run in one of the FA competitions, not enjoyed by Millers fans for some seasons now.

Another arrival at the start season 2015/2016, as part of the Wayne Scott revolution having arrived from Harrowby. Niall has made a great impact in his time at the Club playing for Carlton Town Under 21s and as a result he has been given an opportunity with the first team. Awarded for his efforts with a contract and the Club have high expectations for the player in the forthcoming season.

KYLE STOVELL - STRIKER

Kyle now in his fourth season with Carlton Town having made good performances with the Under 21 side scoring a number of key goals. Serious injury has limited his opportunities at the Club. Has returned fit at the start of last season and become a regular member of the first team squad. Now needs to take his chance at a higher level and prove he can score regularly.

A Billy Whitehouse header ensured that Tadcaster Albion rounded off pre-season with an impressive victory over higher league North Ferriby United.

The only goal of the game came half way through the first half when Casey Stewart's inch perfect cross allowed Billy Whitehouse to power home a header.

The win will no doubt instil greater confidence amongst the Brewers who now cast their attention to the opening game of the season at home against Carlton Town next Saturday.

It was the hosts who in fact started the brighter in the final friendly as former Scarborough Athletic defender Joe Lamplough headed off target after escaping his man on a corner kick.

Ferriby went even closer on five minutes as captain James Piercy saw his looping header canon off the top of the crossbar.

Taddy came out of the early Ferriby pressure unscathed and had a good chance to break the deadlock in their first venture forward on eight minutes. Casey Stewart has been like a new signing after arriving back from his trial with Harrogate Town as he gracefully glided past a trio of green shirts before playing a neat one-two with Aiden Savory but goalkeeper Lewis Exall stood tall.

The couple of early headers signalled promise for the Villagers but that's as good as it got for the home side as the Brewers dominated possession with the utmost of confidence and coolness.

It was an increasingly impressive display from Tadcaster and they scored the only goal of the game on 22 minutes. Casey Stewart dangerously drove at the Ferriby back-line before deftly chipping a brilliant cross on to the head of Billy Whitehouse who powered into the bottom corner leaving Exall with no chance whatsoever.

Following on from the goal Albion just persisted on maintaining complete control on the contest as the back three of Jack Vann, Jason Mycoe and Ellis Barkworth quickly swept the ball back and forth with Mitch Langton and Pete Davidson offering a helping hand in midfield.

Eddie Rogerson had a rare attempt on goal for North Ferriby but his strike from 30 yards was never troubling the former Northern Ireland International in Michael Ingham.

Ingham's opposite number Lewis Exall almost gave Taddy a helping hand to a second goal as his poor goal kick was put back in behind the defence by Pete Davidson allowing Billy Whitehouse to drive into the penalty area but the Ferriby stopper made amends.

Taddy continued where they left off at the start of the second half with Jack Vann going close with a backpost header. Seven minutes in and the Brewers were awarded a penalty kick as Joe Lamplough was the guilty party barging Billy Whitehouse to the ground after Hardy's cross caused problems.

Billy Whitehouse stepped up after scoring two spot kicks already in

pre-season but he couldn't make it three out of three as his low sidefooted effort was pushed clear by Lewis Exall.

North Ferriby finally started to turn the screw somewhat after making a whole host of substitutions injecting some much needed urgency into their play. Luke Lofts and Josh Walker in particularly looked lively for the home side when coming on and the latter was found by a brilliant Alex Knox ball but as the forward pulled the trigger Jack Vann stormed across to superbly block the shot.

This was their only opportunity to draw level though as the final twenty minutes dwindled down without a noteworthy moment. Taddy look good ahead of next week's season opener with goalkeeper Michael Ingham unbeaten in pre-season.




