The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.





Silsden AFC





The first ever Silsden AFC was formed at a meeting at Silsden Liberal Club in September 1904. They adopted the blue & white playing kit that had been used by the recently defunct village rugby club, and a field adjacent to the original rugby field on Keighley Road was hired. It is amazing that the same field is used to this day with our brilliant new facilities and football ground.

One of the prime movers behind the original Silsden club was Irish GP Dr John Purcell. In their first season they won the prestigious Keighley Charity Cup at their first attempt and then went on to play in the Keighley & District League, which they first won in 1909, before joining the Bradford & District League for a short while.

1921-22 was to prove a highly successful season for Silsden sides. Silsden FC started the season by absorbing Silsden White Star (they absorbed lots of other local sides around this period) won the Charity Cup again after a 3-0 victory over Skipton Christ Church. They then won it again the next year.

Silsden were at this time among a number of local clubs wanting a higher grade of football in which to play and so became founder members of the West Riding County Amateur League. In 1922-23 they also entered the FA Amateur Cup for the first time, before moving on to the South Craven and then Airedale & Craven League. In all, they won the Charity Cup nine times, in 1904-5, 1913-4, 1921-2, 1923-4, 1931-2, 1933-4, 1934-5, 1935-6, 1939-40. Their league record was great, with championship wins in the Keighley & District League (1908-09, 1914-15, 1939-40) and Airedale & Craven League in 1931-32.

In the 1933-34 season, Silsden beat Sutton

to regain the Charity Cup. They also won the league cup (defeating Barnoldswick 5-2 in the final) and, for the first time, the Keighley & District FA Cup – Cullingworth YMCA were thrashed 6-1 in the final at Lawkholme Lane.

At the end of the 1933-34 season, Silsden resigned from the Airedale& Craven League to join the senior division of the Bradford Amateur League, the reason being a desired increase in support and revenue. They were pipped for the title but at least the Charity Cup was won again, Sutton United defeated 3-2 Silsden returned to the Keighley League for the 1937-38 season. The gloomy economic climate at the time had seen many clubs go to the wall, and there is no doubt that Silsden were also feeling the pinch. Despite this the District Cup was won for only the second time, holders Guardhouse defeated 3-2.

In the 1913-14 season they won the Charity Cup for the second time with a 3-2 success over Cullingworth. War disrupted the 1914-15 season, but Silsden lifted the Keighley League title again.

The 1951-52 campaign also saw the Keighley Cup return to Silsden, Sutton United defeated by a solitary Arthur Tillotson header in a tight final.

The 1954-55 season at last proved successful, with the league title accompanying the Keighley Cup to Keighley Road – and for the time being Silsden AFC were undoubtedly the top team in town.

Silsden's 1955-56 campaign proved to be highly successful. Guiseley were the only side to lower their colours in the league, but Silsden had the last laugh in the league cup final 7 days later – winning 6-1. Steeton were the next to follow – defeated 5-3 in the Keighley Cup final.

Silsden achieved promotion to the premier division at the end of the 1985-86 campaign, but they struggled at the foot of the table during the 1987-88 season, eventually finishing second from bottom.

When Silsden AFC re-joined the Craven& District League at the start of the 1996-97 season there were high hopes that past glories could be equalled.

In season 2002/2003 Silsden set another record in going through the season unbeaten in all competitions. In addition we won the West Riding County Challenge Cup for the following 3 years.

In season 2004/2005 Silsden gained promotion to Division 1 in The North West Counties Football League in their inaugural season.

Silsden AFC have also a progressive junior set up with age groups running from U7's right through to U17's, some age groups run two teams making this one of the largest football clubs in the area. All teams play at Keighley Rd, Silsden.

In May 2009 the building of a new clubhouse & changing facilities was completed & in August 2010 saw the completion of the ground improvements which meant a return of Silsden AFC to its rightful place back in Silsden at The Keighley Road Stadium.

Former Silsden player & local lad James Gill was appointed First team Manager in Feb 2016 & is ably assisted by Danny Forrest. Despite avoiding relegation James primary target is to get Silsden back into the NWCFL Premier Davison come May in 2017.

Christmas Trees & Wingless Wonders



So, do you prefer a "Bolt" or a "Sweeper"? Or are you more of a "Christmas Tree" kind of a guy? No, I'm not referring to your last trip to the DIY store! I'm talking formations...

It's quite mind-boggling how tactical geniuses over the years have managed to devise so many different ways to set up ten outfield players for the simple game of football.

Until the mid-20th Century (in Britain, at least) it would seem that pretty much all teams were advocates of the "W-M" formation; 5 attackers, 5 defenders. Not surprisingly this splitting of the team into separate attacking and defensive units tended to create a plenty of goalmouth drama and little midfield action. Lots of long balls and plenty of crosses aimed at big target men were the order of the day. This was the only way to play! Or so we thought until one day in 1953 when English football was shaken to its very foundations.

The "Marvellous Magyars" of Hungary came to Wembley and thrashed the hosts 6-3! This was the first time England had ever lost at home to Continental opponents and it caused a radical rethink among English coaches. Manchester City were the first to emulate the Hungarian tactic of the deep-lying centre-forward dropping back into midfield to look for the ball and thus draw the centre-half out of position which created space for others to

exploit. It was known as "The Revie Plan" as the great Don Revie played the key role in the formation.

For the first time, coaches realised that there was more than one way to play The Beautiful Game and a period of experimentation and innovation ensued.

The ultimate fruits of this exercise in self-analysis were borne in the form of the "Wing-less Wonders" of Alf Ramsey who of course won the World Cup in 1966 playing a 4-3-3 formation, without wingers.

Elsewhere during the '60s, those wily, defensively-minded Italians, led by Inter's coach, Helenio Herrera, were busy perfecting "Catenaccio". Translated as "the (door) bolt" this formation saw a defensive back-four given extra solidity by means of a fifth man (known as the Sweeper) tidying up any danger that had managed to breach the line of four.

In '70s Holland, Ajax were creating a football revolution all of their own with "Total Football", whereby all ten outfield players rotate around the field ensuring that everyone was equally involved in defence and attack. Every player possessed great technique and finishing ability. It was a breath-taking, counterattacking style that won Ajax lots of trophies and the national team many neutral admirers.

4-3-3 continued in England in the '70s but with a twist. The front 3 began to be made up of a tricky winger, a big target man to get on the end of crosses and a nippy little strike partner to provide the finish.

Liverpool, with Heighway, Toshack and Keegan, and then Forest, with Robertson, Withe and Woodcock, enjoyed huge success with this tactic. Enter the '80s and long-ball football made a return with two-man midfield watching on as the game took place above their heads. Wimbledon and Watford with their 4-2-4s and Sheffield Wednesday with a 5-2-3 were masters of this style. It wasn't always pretty but it was very effective.

Liverpool dominated the decade, however, with a dynamic 4-4-2 whereby balls were played predominantly through behind defences or into the channels for Rush and Dalglish (and later Aldridge) to run onto.

Highlights of the '90s were the advent of wing-backs; marauding full-backs-cumwingers who were given licence to attack down the flanks wherever possible. They provided the width in a 3-5-2 formation. Although perhaps the best-remembered formation of that era was Terry Venables' so-called "Christmas Tree" 4-3-2-1 set up.

Man' United ruled the '90s and Noughties with Fergie's classic 4-4-2. The individual personnel changed over time but the system remained essentially the same. And these days, of course, most of the successful teams (including our own mighty Brewers!) tend to line up with a 4-2-3-1.

It's true to say though, that while ingenious formations can ensure that the combined strengths of the individual players are given the best opportunity to be most effective, nothing beats having a team filled with 11 top players. Let's hope that our top players have too much for Colne to cope with today, whatever formation they face us with – Come on you Brewers!

The young Brewers broke the deadlock after just four minutes when Dan Davison sprung the offside trap, kept his cool, rounded the goalkeeper and tapped into the empty net.




