The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCFL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.





Kendal Town FC



The club's origins come as a factory team from K Shoes (Kendal Shoes), local shoe manufacturers. K Shoes were taken over in the 1980's by Clark Shoes (now C&J Clark International). Employees at the firm's nearby riverside Netherfield factory were encouraged to form a football team. This was formed as Netherfield AFC at the end of the First World War (1919-20). The new members led club were provided with land near to the K Shoes Netherfield factory on Parkside Road where the club resides to this day. The club then began to compete in local leagues as Netherfield AFC.

In 1945 the club joined the semi-professional football ranks by joining the Lancashire Combination League. For the first time in its history Netherfield played against Football League opposition when nearly 10,000 people watched the two FA Cup ties against Barrow. Netherfield was soon established as a major club by taking the Lancashire Combination Championship in 1949 and again qualifying to meet a football league side Gateshead in the FA Cup.

K Shoes continued to encourage and support the club, placing their logo on the team shirts. This was amongst the first 'shirt sponsorship' in the country.

Cup success was quickly becoming a tradition and in 1950 over 15,000 people watched Netherfield take on Watford in the second round of the FA Cup. In 1955 Wrexham were visitors to Parkside Road in the FA Cup and had to settle for a 3-3 draw. By the time Grimsby Town visited in 1956 it had been the 5th time in 8 years that Netherfield had reached the first round stage of the FA Cup. Over 5,000 local people turned up to watch the Third Division leaders beat Netherfield 5-1, a then home record crowd, more than 500 more than the previous year's tie against Wrexham. In 1956 Netherfield won the Combination Cup, a trophy they won again five years later in 1961.

In 1956 the new stands and clubhouse were completed supported by local businesses who donated time and materials. The clubhouse was run by a volunteer committee as a sports and social centre for the factory and raising funds for the football club. These original updated buildings are still in place today.

Parkside Road saw FA Cup action as Football League side Chesterfield were held to a draw in 1963. Tom Brownlee managed to score an incredible 76 goals in the 1963/4 season as Netherfield finished runners up to Chorley. The 1964/65 season was probably Netherfield's most successful as they won the Lancashire Combination First Division Championship Division, with the reserve team winning the Second Division of the Combination as well. There was also an appearance in the First

Round of the FA Cup at home to Barnsley.

In 1968 the Club accepted the challenge of becoming a founder member of the Northern Premier League. The 1970s were not kind to Netherfield as they languished around the bottom of the Northern Premier League for most of the decade.

In 1980 Netherfield and Bridlington Trinity set a record for cup tie replays when they played each other seven times in the first round of the FA Trophy. After a total of thirteen and a half hours of play Netherfield won 2-0 to go through to the second round. However the cost to both clubs was dear, totalling £1,800. It depleted the finances of Netherfield causing the club to move down into the North West Counties League Division 1 in 1982.

As modern legislation arrived, in 1986 members withdrew from running the sports and social club. The clubhouse was converted by a local businessman, run separately and it became a nightclub called The Park. The building was further converted in the 1990's so it could also act as a function suite.

In 1987 the Northern Premier League expanded into a new division, League Division 1 which provided a route back for the Club to play at a higher level.

In 1998 the club to gain more national recognition changed its name to become Netherfield Kendal. In 2000 the club again changed to its current name of Kendal Town FC. In the same year the nearby Netherfield factory was closed and reopened as a shopping outlet called the K Shoes Village. This site at the bottom of Parkside Road has now been cleared and replaced by a modern shopping and housing complex.

New state of the art floodlights began a process of gradual ground redevelopment. In 2004 2,500 fans turned up to watch the lights switched on for a visiting Manchester United XI squad. Manager Tony Hesketh returned to the club for a second spell as Manager in 2004/5 steering the club to fifth place in the league. In the ensuing play-off final the club travelled to AFC Telford as underdogs. Although Kendal could not overhaul the favourites they won much respect from the 4,250 Telford fans watching as they narrowly lost 2–1.

2005/6 saw the Kendal's most successful season for 40 years as they achieved promotion for the first time in their history to the Unibond Premier League. The run-in to the end of the season was nail-biting. Kendal missed out on automatic promotion on the last day of the season by a single goal difference. In the play-off final at Parkside Road (former Manager) Peter Smith popped up to score the

winner in the last minute against Gresley Rovers to seal a famous promotion.

After a fine start to the 2006/7 season in the Unibond Premier League, reality kicked in for Kendal Town. After a series of poor results, both in the league and in cup competitions, manager Tony Hesketh resigned and was replaced by club captain Lee Ashcroft. The club hovered around the relegation zone for some time but managed to avoid relegation. The highpoint of the season was when Preston and England legend Sir Tom Finney OBE was persuaded to be club President: Sir Tom recounted he had as a teenager had been turned down by Netherfield as a player by the club.

The 2007/8 season saw the club finish in mid table. The following two seasons were Town's best in the Unibond Premier League where they secured two play-off places in a row losing in the semi-finals each time.

Longstanding Chairman David Willan was replaced by Haydon Munslow in 2010.

Manager Lee Ashcroft left to join Northwich Victoria half way through the 2012/13 season taking many of the playing team with him. Steve Edmondson took over as Manager but despite winning many of the remaining games with a new hastily formed squad was unable to prevent the club being relegated.

In 2013 the club house which still runs in private ownership was taken back by the club and renamed by supporters as Finney's (after Sir Tom). In the same year Kendal Town Ladies was formed and a local Youth Development Centre established.

The 2013/14 season was one of consolidation in the Evo Stick First Division North. Former club striker David Foster replaced Steve Edmondson as Manager. The season opened with hopes of a play-off place, but after a series of indifferent results David Foster departed and his assistant Michael Stringfellow stepped up as replacement. He was able to produce a number of exciting home wins against highly rated clubs but couldn't find a consistent run of results.

The 2014/15 started well for Michael Stringfellow with good results. A troubled period then followed with an outside Lancashire based business consortium trying hard to take over the club. Internal friction amongst the club's members was mirrored by increasingly poor results on the pitch. Chairman Haydon Munslow resigned and was replaced by George Gudgeon. Michael Stringfellow resigned and was replaced by a new coaching team led by Gary Fawcett and returning David Foster. The consortium withdrew. Results started to again improve, leading to a mid-table finish.

A local Kendal lad Danny has re-joined the Mintcakes for his second spell with the club. He's a right back with bags of energy and delivers some quality crosses higher up the pitch.

It was tit for tat in the opening stages at the i2i stadium as Taddy looked to break their two-game duck. Gregg Anderson came close to doing just that after quarter of an hour but the defender saw his shot blocked on the line by Sean Clancy.

Anderson was involved again from another corner moments later as his powerful header towards goal was flicked over the bar by Tom Corner.



Here we look back at previous games played by the Brewers on this day in;

On This Day By Ian Tyssen

1983 - Tadcaster Albion slumped to a 0-3 defeat against neighbours Selby Town in the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) Division Two North and had picked up just two points from their opening six league games. The Brewers were bottom of the league but would finish one place higher - above Brook Sports on goal difference - by the end of the season. The Robins finished the campaign in fourth place.

1988 - The Brewers went into their NCEL Division Two home game against Ossett Town on the back of a five game unbeaten run and were in fifth place in the league. Unfortunately, the West Yorkshire club went home with a 2-0 win and jumped above their hosts. The clubs continued to move in opposite directions, with Town ending the season as champions and Albion finishing tenth in the 14 team Division Two.

1994 - Albion travelled to Brodsworth Welfare for an NCEL Division One fixture and registered a 1-1 draw - their third away game without victory. Brodsworth weren't bottom of the league - their final position - at that

stage of the season but they had played several games more than other teams. The Brewers would finish 12th out of the 16 clubs.

2005 - In a clash between the teams who would finish first and third in the NCEL Division One, Tadcaster Albion lost 0-3 against Carlton Town. An above average crowd of 73 saw the eventual champions claim three points thanks to a brace of first half goals from Phil Bignall and one in the second half from Steve Chaplin.

2011 - After losing their opening two NCEL Premier Division games, the Brewers extended their unbeaten run in the league to nine games with a 1-0 win over Lincoln Moorlands Railway. Watched by 70 fans at Tadcaster, the home side's goal was scored by Danny Gray on 39 minutes. The result lifted Paul Marshall's team to fourth in the league but they would slip down to eighth by the end of the season. The visitors from Lincoln ended the campaign in 19th place.


