The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975** & **1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979** & **1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.



MANAGER

Neil Parsley

After a 12 year playing spell, Neil first went into management with Guiseley, taking them to the First Round of the FA Cup, consistently and winning the West Riding County Cup. The club decided to dispense of his services in November 2006 despite the club holding top spot in the league. He then moved onto North Ferriby United where he guided the East Yorkshire side away from the threat of relegation and also winning the East Riding Senior Cup at the KC Stadium. After a difficult start to the 2007/08 campaign, the club parted company with Neil and he then moved to Farsley, as assistant manager to John Deacey. Farsley and Deacey parted company in October 2008 following relegation and following a successful spell as caretaker manager, was given the role full-time. Following the demise of the old club in March 2010, Parsley agreed to manage the new side for the 2010/11 season and guided Farsley to NCEL Premier Division and League Cup double in the club's inaugural season.



GOALKEEPERS

Tom Taylor

Tom returned to the club in November 2013 after a spell at Ossett Town. He originally played for the club in our inaugural season when he was just 17 back in 2010/11. He moved on during the 2011/12 season and gained invaluable first team experience at Brighouse Town and then Ossett Town before returning to the club mid-way through the 2013/14 season. Taylor has had a really impressive season between the sticks last season, winning the Evo-Stik Division One North Young Player of the Year award as well as the Manager's Player of the Season and Supporter's Player of the Season trophies at the Farsley awards.



Jake Lofthouse

The teenage keeper joined the club last summer as Tom Taylor's understudy. He has previous experience in the youth sections of both Guiseley AFC and Harrogate Town. Jake made his league debut for the club in April 2015 against Kendal Town.



DEFENDERS

Josh Grant (Left-back)

Josh Grant also made his return to the club in the summer of 2013 after playing here during the 2010-11 inaugural season in the NCEL Premier. Josh, who is also comfortable playing in midfield, played for Wakefield after initially leaving the club in 2011. His highlight for Farsley was scoring a hat-trick during a 4-1 win over Padiham in the 2013/14 season.



Aaron Hardy (Right Back)

Aaron returned to Farsley in October 2013 following a spell with Skrill North side Guiseley. The right-back had originally joined Farsley at the start of the 2012/13 season from Bradford Park Avenue but when Conference North football came calling at Nethermoor, he made the decision to jump ship. Aaron began his career at Huddersfield Town, where he made 15 Football League appearances for The Terriers and has also had spells at Harrogate Town and FC Halifax Town. Unfortunately, he was ruled out of most of last season with a hip injury.



Kyle Harrison (Centre Back)

Kyle initially joined the club in October following a spell at Conference North side Guiseley. But after being often called back by the Lions, the former Bradford City youth player's loan was ended as Farsley found a permanent right-back in the shape of Mikey Aspin. However after he was released by Guiseley in the summer, the defender made his return to Throstle Nest where he is expected to fill the gap at centre half this season.



James Riley (Centre Back)

Riley joined from Bradford Park Avenue in September 2012, making his debut in the 4-0 win against Ossett Town. The 27-year-old began his career at Thackley, playing for the Northern Counties East League side between 2005 and 2007. He then moved onto Harrogate Railway before moving to FC Halifax Town in their inaugural 2008/09 season. He played at The Shay until 2011 before joinging Bradford Park Avenue. James missed the majority of last season after undergoing shoulder reconstruction surgery but is back in shape ahead of the 2014-15 season.

Ryan Serrant (Left Back)

Long-serving left-back Ryan Serrant first arrived at Throstle Nest on-loan from Leeds United towards the end of the 2006-07 season after helping the club achieve promotion to the Conference Premier. He was released from Leeds that summer and decided to join Celtic but numerous injuries disrupted his chances to get into the first team. However in 2008-09, he became Farsley's first choice left-back under Neil Parsley and won the won the manager's player of the year award for that season. Briefly joined Bradford Park Avenue after the old club's demise in March 2010 but returned to the reformed club that summer and has played in almost every game over the past five seasons.



MIDFIELDERS

Ross Daly (Centre Midfield)

Midfielder Ross Daly had a very brief loan spell at Farsley during the 2012-13 season but moved permanently in October 2013 after being let go by John Deacey at Bradford Park Avenue. The 25-year-old has also previously had stints at Thackley. Daly had his best season in a Farsley shirt in the last campaign, winning the Player's Player of the Season.



Kyle Hancock (Centre Midfield)

A product of the Farsley AFC Academy side, teenager Kyle Hancock was promoted to the first team over the summer after impressing the management over the past couple of seasons. Made his league debut for the senior side in the final game of the 2013/14 season against Mossley and has gone on to be a regular pick in Neil Parsley's side this campaign. His highlight last campaign was scoring the winner in a 3-2 win over Darlington in February 2015.



Lewis Nightingale (Winger)

Lewis was our first signing of last season, returning to Throstle Nest at the beginning of June. The winger was part of the 2010-11 NCEL Premier Division winning side, joining during the latter months that season but was let go that summer and subsequently joined NPL Premier Division side Droylsden. Injury scuppered his chances at the Manchester side and since went onto play for Division One North sides Curzon Ashton, Harrogate Railway and Ossett Town. The former Huddersfield Town trainee linked up with Mossley at the start of the 2012-13 season.



Robbie O'Brien (Centre Midfielder) - Captain

Robbie joined the club in Fabruary 2013 and made his debut in the 3-2 defeat at Curzon Ashton on 16th February. He began his playing days in the youth sections at Leeds United and Doncaster Rovers but was released in the summer of 2004 and subsequently joined Harrogate Town. He then moved onto Wakefield and Gainsborough Trinity before joining Ossett Town in 2005 and went onto enjoy a four-season spell at Ingfield before switching to Bradford Park Avenue in 2009. Was handed the first team captaincy at the start of the 2013/14 season and showed his strong leadership skills as Farsley went onto finish in the top third.



Neil Stevens (Centre Midfield)

Local lad Neil Stevens returned to the club back in June as he was Neil Parsley's first signing of the summer. Stevens progressed through the youth ranks at the club and was part of Farsley Celtic Reserves 2007/08 Lancashire Reserves League winning squad. He broke into the first team squad during the following season but later moved onto Evo-Stik Premier side Buxton, where he has remained ever since.



STRIKERS

Nick Guest

Guest was the second signing of the summer after joining from Hemsworth Miners Welfare. The 21-year-old finish second top of the NCEL Division One scoring charts last season, with an impressive 38 goals in total.



Aiden Savory

Aiden Savory signed for Farsley at the start of last season. He had originally made his name on the West Yorkshire non-league circuit with Ossett Town and Bradford Park Avenue before moving over to Australia for a spell last year. He returned to the UK in early 2013 and originally joined Goole before linking up at Avenue again. However he became available last summer and was snapped up by Parsley, finishing as top scorer with 19 goals.



Visitors' Club History



Farsley AFC were formed in June 2010 from the embers of Farsley Celtic F.C which entered Administration in June 2009 whilst in the Blue Square North and which failed to fulfil its fixtures eventually being expelled from that league early in 2010.

The old Farsley club (the name Celtic being added later) initially competed in the Leeds Amateur leagues and played its first game at the current site in 1948. Throughout the 1950's and 60's Celtic established themselves in the Yorkshire Leagues, being crowned champions in 1959-60 and 1968-69, although failing to be promoted as a result of ground regulations. A First Round FA Cup tie against Tranmere Rovers at Leeds United's Elland Road ground in 1974 proved to be the highlight of the decade, and the 11,000 crowd that saw the Celts lose 2-0 to a Steve Coppell inspired Rovers is still the largest crowd in the club's history.

As the Yorkshire and Midland leagues merged in 1982, Farsley began in Division One North. By the mid 80's the club was invited into the Northern Premier League.

After a few largely uninspiring seasons, the new decade brought unparalleled success. In 2004-05 under the inspired management of Lee Sinnott, the team won the Unibond League Premier Division only to have points deducted as the result of Spennymoor Town going out of business and its results being expunged. The reduction in points resulted in the Celts securing only a play-off place, losing controversially

on penalties against Workington in the final.

Promotion was secured the following season after a playoff final victory against North Ferriby and in the following season, the club's first in the Conference North, they reached the first round of the FA Cup losing in a replay to MK Dons as well as securing promotion to the Conference National following a memorable evening at the Pirelli Stadium in Burton Upon Trent, when Simeon Bambrook's last minute penalty saw the Celts beat Hinkley United 4-3.

A single season of Conference National football resulted in relegation to the Conference North. On-going financial difficulties saw the Administrators appointed in June 2009 with the club's results expunged in March 2010 when the Administrator prohibited the club from fulfilling its fixtures.

The re-formed club were placed in the NCEL Premier Division for their first season which turned out to be highly successful with a league and cup double recorded. Many of the former players remained loyal to the club and top spot was held for much of the season, with the title confirmed on the penultimate weekend of the season. The club also reached two cup finals, the NCEL Presidents Cup, in which Tadcaster won but the season ended on a positive note with the League Cup being lifted despite Farsley having to play the majority of the final with 10 men. The 2011/12 season was almost as

successful, with a top five spot being se-

cured ensuring qualification for the playoffs. Unfortunately, the semi-final opponents were Witton Albion who won 3-0 and deservedly booked a place in the final, going onto win promotion after defeating Curzon Ashton in the final.

The following league season didn't quite go to plan with a disastrous run in the closing months, saw Neil Parsley's side go without a win in the final eight games. Inconsistent form before this point had all but put an end to the club's playoff chase and a 14th place finish was all that could be mustered. On a positive note, Farsley reached the quarter-finals of the Doodson Sports Cup. After beating Ossett Albion and Clitheroe, Farsley beat Premier Division opposition Whitby Town and Worksop Town before bowing out to Matlock Town in the final eight.

A strong fight for the play-offs also gave way late on in the campaign but the club did enjoy another quarter-final berth in the Doodson Sport Cup, eventually suffering defeat to Premier Division side Skelmersdale United.



1892 TAD'S History

by Ian Tyssen

The NCEL Years 1993 - 1994 Season

Since it was established in 1982, the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) had been constantly shrinking. The 76 clubs in the 1982/83 season had reduced to just 34 in ten years but it did increase by one team for the 1993/94 campaign.

The Premier Division continued with 20 clubs and Division One contained 15 teams. Tadcaster Albion were joined in Division One by relegated Harrogate Railway and new NCEL members Arnold Town and Louth United. The previous season's new clubs, Lincoln United and Hucknall Town, had been promoted to the Premier Division.

The opening three games of the league season were defeats, before the Brewers then picked up three consecutive wins in September - RES Parkgate (2-1), Selby Town (4-2) and Immingham Town (2-0).

After one more defeat, a pair of 2-0 victories came in October - at Hall Road Rangers and at home against bottom club Brodsworth Welfare.

The next four league games brought just one point for the Brewers and included a 0-5 loss at Hatfield Main. The sole point came from a 1-1 draw at home against Hallam, who would go on to finish in second place.

In the winter months, Albion managed three wins and one draw from the nine league games. All four games were at Ings Lane - Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare (2-1), Immingham Town (7-1), Yorkshire Amateur (3-2) and Garforth Town (0-0). During that period of the season, the Brewers suffered 0-3 and 0-1 losses against the champions Arnold Town.

The final six league games resulted in six heavy defeats,

with 29 goals being conceded. On consecutive Saturdays, 1-4 and 0-5 losses came against third placed Louth United. The poor run of results culminated in a 0-7 thrashing in the final game at Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare.

The club finished the 1993/94 season in 12th place, with 26 points from 28 games.

The Brewers lost 1-3 against Louth United in the preliminary round of the FA Vase. Another leading NCEL Division One club, Hallam, beat Albion 1-0 in the League Cup.

In the West Riding County Cup, NCEL Premier Division strugglers Pontefract Collieries were beaten 2-1 in the second round. The Brewers lost 1-3 at Guiseley in the third round

As in the previous season, the second XI finished bottom of the 17 club Reserve Division. Only 16 points were picked up in the 32 games and the season ended with a -84 goal difference after 125 goals were conceded.

The only victories for the reserves were against Farsley Celtic (2-1), Glasshoughton Welfare (4-0) and Liversedge (3-2).

The reserve team's worst results were against Ossett Albion (1-10), Armthorpe Welfare (0-8), champions Guiseley (0-13), Liversedge (2-8) and Pontefract Collieries (1-9).

In the Reserve Team Cup, Emley narrowly beat the Brewers 2-3 in the first round.




