Formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title. In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**. In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new chairman. In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games. in March led to them finally finishing in third. An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town. At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare. They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers started their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy Miller was back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division was needed.

The Brewers started the season well and were in the play-off spots, then injury problems hit the team and the season seemed to run away from them.

They finished 19th in the league. The Brewers had a great chance for silverware in the West Riding County Cup Final, the game finished 1-1 but they lost out to Farsley Celtic 4-2 on penalties.

At the end of the 16/17 campaign the Directors made the tough decision to change the management team from Billy Miller and Matt Heath to Michael Morton and Simon Collins bringing it more in-house. In the 2017/18 season the new-look management team took a couple months to adapt to the league and mould the squad that they wanted. However it didn't take them long to find their feet as the fortunes took a turn for the better after the new year with Michael & Simon steering the club to its highest ever finish reaching the Evo-Stik League play-offs after a dramatic final day. This once again brought massive excitement amongst the club and town but unfortunately it ended in semi-final defeat 2-1 at Bamber Bridge despite taking the lead and putting in a valiant performance.

There's no doubting that the club is going in the right direction as the 2018/19 season sees the Brewers move into the Evo-Stik East Division after the league switched from a North/South divide to an East/West split. Can the club improve again this year...

Team · HISTORY





Pontefract is known to have had a football club as far back as the 1890's when a side, presumably composed mainly of soldiers, completed in the West Yorkshire League as Pontefract Garrison. Much of the history requires further research but it is known that a Pontefract Borough Club reached the dizzy heights of the Yorkshire League in the late 1920's. By 1935 a club called Tanshelf Gems managed to acquire a ground on Ackworth Road, moved there and became Pontefract United.

The current club was formed in 1958 enjoying considerable success on and off the field, much work being done during the miners' strike cementing relationships with the mining industry and the local community. The floodlight opening in 1987 saw the Colls take on Hull City in a friendly watched by a record crowd of 1000.

Recent History

2012/13 – The season ended with only one defeat in the last ten games including victories over Askern Villa of 9-0 and 10-2. The club finished 5th for the 3rd season in a row.

2013/14 – This was a season of consolidation which ended in a disappointing 9th place but with a clear plan in place for the 20/14/15 season.

2014/15 – The plan was delivered as the Colls finished as runnersup in North Counties East League Division One and were promoted back to the NCEL Premier Division after a 15 year absence. Along the way they recorded the highest away win, best aggregate score, most goals scored (joint with Louth Town), 2nd best defence and the most clean sheets.

2015/16 – The latter part of the season saw the Colls with a new management team of Craig Parry, Manager and former Colls Keeper, assisted by Craig Rouse and Nigel Danby. The Colls fought to the bitter end but ended up 3rd from bottom and back in Division One!

2016/17 – A great start to the season led by Manager Craig Parry, Assistant Manager Craig Rouse & Head Player/Coach Luke Jeffs saw the Colls win 9 from 9 (including pre-season friendlies) The League performance saw some brilliant runs of form including one of 21 games with only 1 defeat. With the Colls fate in their own hands they only needed to win away at Worsborough Bridge in the final game. This they duly did and returned to the NCEL Premier Division at the first time of asking!

2017/18 – Last season was fantastic for the Colls, stamping their authority on the NCEL Premier Division with only 6 league games lost all season. The lads produced some cracking stats – best attack, best defence, most clean sheets, biggest away win (8-0 over Thackley). They finished in top spot with 102 points, a goal difference of +96 and scoring 138 league goals in the process. This fabulous performance saw the Colls gain a 2nd successive promotion in 2 years!

2018/19 – After 2 consecutive promotions the Colls begin their first ever season at Step Four of non-league in the Northern Premier League Division One East Evo-Stik. A good pre-season has seen the Colls gain 2 pieces of silverware already – The Bill Cook Memorial Trophy against Glasshoughton Welfare and most recently the Inaugural Colliery Cup from a keenly contested game against Northern Premier Division One West Evo-Stik side Atherton Collieries. (We are looking to retain the cup when we travel to Atherton in the return fixture next year!)

We do not know what this season will have to offer but the Management Team of Craig Parry, Craig Rouse, Luke Jeffs and goal keeping Coach Jordan Wildey have assembled a great squad and they are all relishing the new challenge of the Evo-Stik! Up the Colls!





Ryan Musselwhite (GK)

Formerly of Cleethorpes Town and Brigg Town to name a few, joined Ponte Colls at the start of the 17/18 season and has been no.1 since.

Jack Greenhough

Young Right back was part of the Bolton Academy system but returned to Ponte Colls part of our U19s set up before joining the first team squad in 16/17 and has been a mainstay since.

Jimmy Williams

Previously of local rivals Glasshoughton Welfare. Now Club Captain and Centre half has been a key part of our side helping to gain two promotions in two years.

Spencer Clarke

Another of our key men who helped to achieve back to back promotions as part of a solid Centre back pairing. Spencer is in his second spell at the club.

REPORT Savory Double Helps Taddy Win Again Tadcaster Albion recorded their fifth straight victory in the Evo-Stik East League after second half strikes from Aiden Savory and Joe Lumsden saw off strugglers Spalding United.

Aiden Savory eventually broke the deadlock for the dominant Brewers on 59 minutes before quickly firing home a second to add daylight between the two sides. Top scorer Joe Lumsden made sure he was on the scoresheet once again tapping home with a minute to play.

After the most recent victory over Wisbech, Simon Collins was forced to make a change as the injured Corey Roper was replaced by Jason Mycoe who was coming in for his first league start since October. Collins had to make another change after the warm-ups as Luke Porritt pulled up which handed a second Taddy debut to new signing Will Annan.

Conditions were abysmal and downright miserable with strong winds and swirling heavy rain making for a difficult contest for both sides. The first ten minutes was definitely a bedding in period with countless balls being over-hit and slung out of play. Taddy took to the challenge quicker though and the first sighting at goal fell to Joe Lumsden when Aiden Savory flicked in behind setting his strike partner away but his audacious attempt wasn't executed.

Albion were swiftly getting into their groove as Casey Stewart arrowed in a brilliant ball after quarter of an hour but Lumsden couldn't quite adjust his body enough to divert on target. Wave after wave of Tadcaster attacks were being forced upon the Tulips who were desperate for the points at the opposite end of the division. Colossal centre-back Harry Coates stormed out from the back before Will Annan threaded a lovely ball through to Casey Stewart who's cross was gathered by Michael Duggan with yellow shirts queuing up.

The first clear-cut opening of the contest fell to the aforementioned Coates but he could only shoulder over the bar after Stewart superbly crossed in. The Brewers continued to dominate proceedings in the woeful weather and it seemed like only a matter of time until they took the lead. First Joe Lumsden was denied by Duggan, then Pete Davidson saw two shots blocked by the same man before it ran out for Aiden Savory who sidefooted just the wrong side of the post.

Moments later and Spalding had their backs against the walls once more as a sumptuous first-time flick from Lumsden found its way to Will Annan who's low fizzing effort was well kept out by Duggan. Aiden Savory had another opportunity from the resulting corner as his close range blast was blocked in the goal mouth. The match really was as one-sided as it sounded as Spalding's first shot saw Isaac Cooper fire wildly over the Loxley Homes Stand from distance.

Tulips stopper Michael Duggan was keeping his side in it for the time being as he made an outstanding save on 38 minutes. Jason Mycoe's deep cross was headed back across goal by Annan before Joe Lumsden's volley took a wicked deflection seeing the ball spiral towards the top corner only for Duggan to superbly claw out. As half-time approached, a miscued clearance from Neal Spafford allowed Aiden Savory to race in on goal but he dragged his left-footed shot wide of the mark. The visitors from Lincolnshire will have been very happy to have been still all square at the break but Taddy just continued where they left off and if anything kicked into a higher gear. Casey Stewart was looking dangerous on the ball as always as he cleverly jinked inside James Hugo and let fly only for the strike to deflect wide. Just as frustration began to grow around Ings Lane, the breakthrough finally arrived. A one-two between Will Annan and Joe Lumsden broke down but the danger was by no means averted as Aiden Savory powered past two blue shirts before firing into the back of the net from 12 yards.

If the result was in any doubt, it wasn't anymore as the goal only added greater confident for Albion as Will Annan went close again to reopening his account for the club. Annan retrieved a Lumsden pull-back before beating his man and striking firmly with his left-foot but Duggan got his angles spot on again to push clear.

However Duggan was beaten for a second time just four minutes after the deadlock was broken. Harry Coates did brilliantly to acrobatically keep a free-kick alive before Aiden Savory expertly rolled his marker and volleyed in his 10th goal of the season. Taddy were playing some scintillating football and it was a case of 'how many' at this stage as poked agonisingly wide after a gorgeous piece of interplay with Joe Lumsden.

As the contest reached its conclusion, substitute Jake Buckle came incredibly close to his first Tadcaster goal before the result was rounded off with a third goal. Casey Stewart, Pete Davidson and Aiden Savory worked a short corner effectively teeing up Harry Coates on the edge of the box, his effort was parried straight into the path of Joe Lumsden who smashed home his 22nd goal of the season. Five straight wins, three straight clean sheets, Taddy are coming into form at the most important time of the season.






