

# Formed in **1892**

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's** & **60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the lngs ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title. In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**. In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new chairman.



In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games. in March led to them finally finishing in third. An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history

by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA
Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd
of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town. At the end of the season, the
club opted not to renew their contract

with manager Paul Marshall, two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers started their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy Miller was back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division was needed.

The Brewers started the season well and were in the play-off spots, then injury problems hit the team and the season seemed to run away from them.

They finished 19th in the league. The
Brewers had a great chance for silverware in the West
Riding County Cup Final, the game finished 1-1 but they lost out to Farsley Celtic 4-2 on penalties.

At the end of the 16/17 campaign the Directors made the tough decision to change the management team from Billy Miller and Matt Heath to Michael Morton and Simon Collins bringing it more in-house. In the 2017/18 season the new-look management team took a couple months to adapt to the league and mould the squad that they wanted. However it didn't take them long to find their feet as the fortunes took a turn for the better after the new year with Michael & Simon steering the club to its highest ever finish reaching the Evo-Stik League play-offs after a dramatic final day. This once again brought massive excitement amongst the club and town but unfortunately it ended in semi-final defeat 2-1 at Bamber Bridge despite taking the lead and putting in a valiant performance

There's no doubting that the club is going in the right direction as the 2018/19 season sees the Brewers move into the Evo-Stik East Division after the league switched from a North/South divide to an East/West split. Can the club improve again this year...



Pickering Town Football Club were first established in 1888, for many years the club competed in the local football leagues. One of the local leagues they competed in was the York Football League which they joined Division Two, in 1953–54. They were promoted to the league's top division after only one season.

In the early 1950s, the York League was heavily contended between York Railway Institute, Market Weighton and Pickering Town. Indeed, these were the teams in the top three when Pickering Town first won the York League in 1955-56.

The club dropped in form for the rest of the decade in comparison (although they did always finish in the top eight). During the 1959–60 season, they finished as league runners-up to Dringhouses.

# Yorkshire and Northern Counties Leagues

Pickering eventually joining the Yorkshire Football League Division Three in 1972. They started well in the league, and during their second season were promoted to Division Two as champions. Pickering Town finished as runners-up to Bridlington Town in the 1974-75 season and thus were promoted to the top division of the Yorkshire League.

They dropped in form a couple of seasons later, getting relegated in two successive seasons. For the rest of the decade Pickering lingered around the mid parts of the Yorkshire League Division Three. In 1982 they became founding members of the Northern Counties East Football League and were in the NCE Premier Division from 1992. It was around this time that the club first entered the FA Challenge Cup, they knocked out Penrith before losing to North Yorkshire rivals, Northallerton Town in the next round.

A few seasons later in 1996–97, they knocked out Pontefract Collieries 2-1 in the competition, but lost to Bishop Auckland in the next round. In terms of the draw, the club has had very bad luck in the competition, as every time they reached the 1st Qualifying Round, they were forced to play away from home. In 1999 Pickering were relegated to the NCE First Division. This was to last only two seasons and promotion back to the Premier Division came in 2001.

## **Jimmy Reid transformation**

The club underwent a great transformation with manager Jimmy Reid and his assistant Steve Brown in charge. Reid was a former player with St Johnstone and York City and Brown a former "Pikes" player and coach at the Leeds United Academy. At the end of 2001-02 season Jimmy Reid left the club and Steve Brown took control.

At the start of the 2002-03 season

5 first team regulars were lost for a variety of reasons which left the club struggling for much of the season. The hard work and dedication of Brown, his management team and the players was rewarded towards the end of the season as it all started to come together and with only 4 defeats in the last 15 league games the club finished the season in 13th position.

2003–04 season was an exciting one for the club as they were in the top half of the league table all season and for much of it, with games in hand, looked possible championship contenders. However, with a glut of fixtures, and possibly with the knowledge that promotion to the restructured Northern Premier League was not an option due to ground grading, at the season's end the club were not able to capitalise and finished in a creditable 5th position.

Early into the season 2004–05 owing to ever increasing business commitments Steve Brown stepped down as Manager to be replaced by ex-Ipswich Town and Newcastle Unitedstriker Alex Mathie, veteran of over 200 league games and 20 years as a professional.

After much ground improvement work in recent years, including the erection of floodlights, a new 120 seater stand, covered standing accommodation and more recently an additional 100-seater stand behind the "scoreboard end" goal, the club now possess one of the best grounds in the league.

#### **Recent events**

In the 2005–06 season the club reached the quarter finals of the FA Vase the furthest in the club's history. The team eventually lost out to Nantwich Town.

After an encouraging start in the 2006–07 season, results took a turn for the worse over the winter period, and a run of one win in eleven games led to the resignation of Mathie as manager on 6 January 2007. Within a week, the board announced they had appointed ex-Pickering player and Mathie's assistant Mark Wood as the new manager.

The 2007-08 season saw the club finish in third in the NCEL Premier Division, their highest league position in over a decade. Off the pitch the club saw significant change and Pickering applied for promotion to the Northern Premier League. The club erected a removable fence for the cricket pitch side and improved the existing exterior toilet facilities. Ground development has continued with the club resurfacing and floodlighting the car parking facilities, adding new goals, corner flags and dugouts and improving the drainage of the pitch.

Mark Wood stepped down as manager early in the 2010–11 season and he was replaced by Scarborough FC legend Mitch Cook. Cook oversaw a change in philosophy mainly focussed on youth and passing football. This approach had mixed success but the club eventually finished in a very respectable 7th.

Cook resigned just before the end of the season to take up the vacant managerial role at rivals Bridlington Town taking with him much of the playing squad.

Following Cook's resignation the club invited applications and eventually offered the job to former York City player and coach Peter Vasey.

They reached the Second Round Qualifying of the FA Cup 3 times (1999–00, 2001–02 and 2003–04).

On 30 April 2013, the club won the North Riding Senior Cup for the first time in their history following a 3–0 win over Marske United. The goals were scored by Liam Shepherd, Liam Salt and Joe Danby in the second half. The game was played at the headquarters of the North Riding County FA in Stokesley in front of 439 spectators.

#### Paul Marshall era

In the summer of 2015, Paul Marshall left the manager's job at Tadcaster Albion and was swiftly appointed as manager of Pickering Town. Denny Ingram joined him as a player and assistant manager. Pickering finished sixth in the first season under Marshall and second in 2017, behind only champions Cleethorpes Town. They reached the final of the North Riding Senior Cup in 2017, losing 3–1 to Whitby Town in the final at Middlesbrough's Riverside Stadium.

# THROUGH THE LENS..... With club photographer Matthew Appleby

## 1. What was your first game covering TAFC and what were your first impressions of the club and ground?

It was a pre-season friendly against a Premier League XI a couple of seasons ago. It definitely gets easier with experience, but it's a constant test of your reactions and your eye for a good shot. The ultimate challenge for any football photographer is any celebration shots and that's all down to positioning, preparedness and a whole lot of luck. Another challenge I set myself is to get at least one photograph of every player each match, if that means sacrificing the odd celebration picture then so be it.

## 7. And finally, which Taddy player do you enjoy snapping most?

Pete Davidson and Corey Roper are always good value for some let's say interesting facial expressions, general reactions.

I'm sure you'll all agree that Matthew's pictures are nothing short of excellent.

# **TALKING TADDY**With Campbell White......


