# 1892



The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCFL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.





# Clitheroe FC



The club was formed as Clitheroe Central in 1877 at the Swan Hotel in Castle Street by local businessmen. After playing in local leagues, the club joined the Lancashire Combination in 1903 and dropped Central from their name. Aside from breaks during the First and Second World Wars, the club continued to play in the Combination until the end of the 1981-82 season, when it combined with the Cheshire League to become the North West Counties League.

Success had been sparing prior to that date, with a Lancashire Junior Cup win in 1893, the Lancashire Combination Cup in 1934-5 and the League Championship in 1979-80 all that the club had to show for its efforts.

That was soon to change. Although Clitheroe were put into the Third Division of the NWCFL at its inception due to the state of the ground, there followed the most successful period in the club's long history under the stewardship of Eric Whalley, subsequently manager and Chairman of Accrington Stanley FC. He assembled one of the best non league sides in the North of England and won back to back Championships in the Third, Second and First divisions, as well as securing the Lancashire Cup for the first time in 50 years, thanks to a solitary strike from local lad Eric Geldard.

This was all the more impressive when one considers that the Division 1 was effectively Level 3 in the non-league pyramid.

Captained by Mick Ashcroft and containing extravagant talents such as John Taylor and Steve Mullen, possibly the best player ever to play for the Blues, Clitheroe regularly attracted bumper gates, with the championship winning season seeing three crowds over 1,000. Cracks started to appear when Whalley took over the manager's seat at Accrington and took almost the whole first team with him.

To compound matters, the new Unibond Division 1 was formed, but a lack of floodlights meant the Blues could not take their rightful place and they found teams effectively leapfrogging them.

It was not until the mid nineties that the Club recovered from this setback and started to fulfil its potential and not only to become a force in the NWCFL Division 1 again, but also to make itself known on the national FA Vase stage.

Possibly the highlight of the club's history came when the Blues reached the Vase Final under the joint managership of Dennis Underwood and Gary Butcher after an epic two legged semi Final win against Mangotsfield of Bristol. 2,000 people were on Shawbridge for the second leg when a deflected goal saw the Blues home with seven minutes of extra time remaining.

The Final pitted the Blues against a powerful Brigg side and a 3-0 reverse in front of 7,500 fans was a fair reflection of the play. At the same time, some £130,000 was being spent on the ground, with the sale of Jon Penman to Southport and Carlo Nash to Crystal Palace (within one month of the Vase final) helping considerably.

The Wembley experience turned the Blues into a Vase side and a Quarter Final defeat against Tiverton in 1998/99 and a two leg reverse against Taunton in the 2000/01 semi final gave the Blues national prominence. The Taunton season was memorable for a number of reasons.

Beating the pre tournament favourites Chippenham in the quarter final on their own patch in front of 1,500 fans was notable enough. However the two legged semi against Taunton Town would never be forgotten. With the first leg away and the game only just surviving an absolute deluge, the Blues went in at half time 5-0 down and reduced to 10 men. There was not much good humour amongst the 150 travelling Blues over that cup of Bovril. No further goals followed, but with manager Dave Burgess throwing caution to the wind in the home second leg, the fans dared to dream with 3 goals for the home side in the first 15 minutes (including hitting the post) and the Taunton keeper being stretchered off, but in the end Clitheroe went down 8-4 on aggregate.

The 2000-01 season was also notable for the Blues finishing as league runners up to Bradford PA in controversial circumstances, before Dave Burgess stood down and central defender Lee Sculpher took over as player manager. In 2002/3, Clitheroe again finished as league runners up and lost to Mossley at Gigg Lane in the League Cup Final. Early cup exits the following season enabled the Blues to concentrate on the league and superb away form saw the Blues capture the 2003/04 league title on the final day of the season at Nantwich where Blues legend Neil Reynolds sparked bedlam when he thumped a 25 yarder into the top corner with six minutes of the season remaining.

High hopes accompanied Clitheroe's first foray into the Unibond League in 2004/05, but the club never fully recovered from manager Lee Sculpher resigning after a handful of games into the new season. He was succeeded by Paul Byrom who then quit in the close season. Tommy Lawson was appointed manager for the 2005/06 season but he was relieved of his duties in early 2006, to be replaced on a temporary basis by Mark Smitheringale. He too left before the 2006/07 season started and his assistant Chris Stammers stepped up to the plate before resigning after a 10-1 thumping away to Conference North Kettering in the FA Trophy in November 2006.

The then chairman Carl Garner offered the job to Neil Reynolds and Pete Smith at the turn of 2007, before the latter took on the role in his own right at the end of the 2008/09 season.

2009/10 and 2010/11 saw Clitheroe finishing in eight and sixth respectively, the highest league placings in the club's history. The end of the 10/11 season also had a unique twist with Carl Garner stepping down as chairman after four years to replace Pete Smith as manager, in the process going unbeaten throughout April and taking the manager of the month prize.

Garner was replaced in the role of chair by his long standing deputy Anne Barker. Despite the great end to the previous campaign, the 2011/12 season under Garner's leadership was ultimately disappointing, although it had started so brightly with an early manager of the month award. Form quickly tailed off and huge player turnover ensued, before Garner resigned and the managerial Vase duo of Burgess and Sculpher ensured survival on a temporary basis, having taken over with less than 10 games to go.

Paul Moore, the ex Leek Town and Warrington Town manager, took over the reins in 2012/13 and led Clitheroe to their record points total in Division 1 in finishing eighth, with the play-off push only ending over the final games of the season.

However, the loss of key players in the close season led to a woeful start in 2013/14 and to an early exit from the FA Cup and Trophy, and the committee replaced Moore with ex Blue Simon Garner, who was taking his first step on the managerial ladder. Garner and his assistant, another ex Blue Ryan Parr, finished in 17th position that season, but set their stall out in 2014-15 to create a more east Lancashire focussed team with key assets secured on contract.

A 13th place finish and an appearance at the Reebok in the Lancashire Trophy against Chorley represented good progress, whilst the 7th place in 2015-16 continued the good

work, and the push for the play-offs only faltered in the final weeks. Following Garner's resignation, the club moved quickly to appoint ex Wales international Simon Haworth to the manager's role, who brings Gareth Williams, another Welsh international, as his player/assistant.

Off the pitch, chair Anne Barker has overseen the incorporation of the club as a limited company, the renewal of the ground lease and the replacement of the clubhouse, changing rooms, toilet block and electricity/ medical room at a cost of over £150K.

The club also reintroduced a Youth team in 2014-15, which play in the Lancashire Sunday League. They won their league cup and finished runners up in their first season under Tom Bartlett's guidance, and have not only provided players for the first team, but have also reinforced the club's links to the town and the Clitheroe Wolves set up.

Almost 31 years ago, on 23rd November 1985, Tadcaster Albion and Clitheroe met at Ings Lane in the second round of the FA Vase - the only competitive meeting between the clubs.

Following a reorganisation of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL), the Brewers were competing in the newly formed Division Three.

Clitheroe, who were the champions of the North West Counties League (NWCL) Division Three and Division Two in the previous two seasons, were now members of the NWCL Division One.

The Brewers had already negotiated two previous rounds of that season's FA Vase - winning 1-0 at Wearside League club South Shields in the preliminary round and 4-1 at home against Norton and Stockton Ancients from the Northern League.

Meanwhile, the Blues had disposed of NCEL Premier Division side Thackley in the first round - a 1-0 home win following a 2-2 draw in Bradford.

Although Tadcaster were on an good run of form prior to the FA Vase tie - five wins from six games - they were beaten 3-0

by their Lancastrian visitors.

The Blues were eventually knocked out by a Liverpool County Combination side, St Dominics, who won 4-2 in a third round replay after a 0-0 draw at Clitheroe.

Tadcaster Albion finished the season in ninth place in the 14 club NCEL Division Three and Clitheroe claimed a third successive title, when they finished top of the NWCL Division One table.

Liam Shepherd's lofted free-kick was headed up and across goal by Tom Corner and Conor Sellars showed great anticipation to read the play and coolness to nod past Saynor in the Colls goal.

The goal gave The Brewers a real confidence boost as Billy Miller's men looked to kick-on and extend their lead with Liam Shepherd's low skidding drive well stopped.

Taddy were in the ascendency for the second part of the first half and smelt blood. This time it was Adam Baker who came close to doubling the lead, Ben Saynor doing just enough to keep out the rasping shot

It was coming, The Brewers did double their lead in the 31st minute as Sellars grabbed his second of the afternoon.

Liam Shepherd quickly set the former Middlesbrough midfielder away one v one down the left-hand side and the livewire that is Conor Sellars dipped inside and arrowed a rocket into the bottom left-hand corner.

It wasn't all going swimmingly (no pun intented) for Miller's men as Ponte pulled a goal back four minutes from the break. Gregg Anderson's attempted clearance was blocked by Jordan Turner and the same man reacted quickest to steer past Ingham setting up an intriguing second half. Pontefract have won their first five fixtures in the 2016/17 campaign and you can see why as they pushed hard for an equaliser at the start of the second half.

A corner was controlled by Tom Corner with his back to goal and he teed up Charlie Binns who sublimely curled in his first goal for the club and celebrated with some fancy samba dance moves. Not appreciated by Gregg Anderson.

The two Greening brothers were not what Pontefract wanted to see after going 3-1 down and the younger of the two almost made it four but Ben Saynor just kept out the bending shot.

Credit has to go to Ponte though as they hit back once again reducing the deficit to one. Lewis Morgan misplaced pass inside the penalty area was pounced upon by substitute Kieran Hirst who powered past Ingham setting up a grandstand finale.

The home side threw everything at Taddy in the final stages as they looked to force a replay. They always say you'll get 'one more chance' and that they did as substitute Jack Mawson found himself unmarked but he could only head straight at Ingham. In the end Tadcaster Albion held on to advance into the Second Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup.

Here we look back at previous games played by the Brewers on 10th September.

### On This Day By Ian Tyssen

### 1983

In the second year of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL), Tadcaster Albion visited Fryston Colliery Welfare for a Division Two North fixture. The Brewers, who would finish the season 13th in the 14 team league, drew 1-1 against their mid-table opponents.

### 1988

Albion's local rivals, Selby Town, came to Tadcaster for an NCEL Division Two match. The Robins, who ended the campaign in third place, won 2-1 against their lowly positioned hosts.

### 1994

In a contest between the two teams who would finish 11th and 12th in NCEL Division One, Rossington Main secured a 3-2 home victory against the Brewers. The result extended Tadcaster's winless start to the season to four games.

### 2003

A 0-2 defeat at Lincoln Moorlands left Albion bottom of NCEL Division One with just one point from four games. The Brewers would finish the season at the foot of the 18 team NCEL Division One table, ten places behind their Lincoln opponents.

### 2005

The Brewers travelled to Rotherham to face Parkgate in an NCEL Division One fixture. A crowd of just 25 saw the home side take the lead after half an hour but goals from Andy Green (37 minutes) and Simon Brooker (43) put Albion 2-1 up at half-time. With no more goals in the second half, the visitors claimed their third win of the season and topped the table with a 100% record. The Brewers slipped down to third by the end of the season - just one point behind Retford United, who were promoted to the NCEL Premier Division.

### 2011

After an inconsistent start to the NCFL Premier Division season - one win, one draw and two defeats - the Brewers found themselves in 16th place ahead of their home game with Liversedge. The Cleckheaton based club arrived in Tadcaster with three wins from their four league fixtures and it looked like a tough challenge faced the hosts. The majority of the 72 strong crowd were relieved to see Albion take a 16th minute lead through the former York City youngster, Jamie Hopcutt. Just before half-time, the home side's lead was doubled when Danny Gray found the net. Late in the second half, Steve Jeff

completed a 3-0 victory for Tadcaster Albion. The Brewers would eventually finish eighth in their second season in the top tier of the NCEL.




