Formed in **1892**

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's** & **60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the lngs ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title. In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**. In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new chairman.



In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games. in March led to them finally finishing in third. An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history

by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA
Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd
of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town. At the end of the season, the
club opted not to renew their contract

with manager Paul Marshall, two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers started their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy Miller was back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division was needed.

The Brewers started the season well and were in the play-off spots, then injury problems hit the team and the season seemed to run away from them.

They finished 19th in the league. The
Brewers had a great chance for silverware in the West
Riding County Cup Final, the game finished 1-1 but they lost out to Farsley Celtic 4-2 on penalties.

At the end of the 16/17 campaign the Directors made the tough decision to change the management team from Billy Miller and Matt Heath to Michael Morton and Simon Collins bringing it more in-house. In the 2017/18 season the new-look management team took a couple months to adapt to the league and mould the squad that they wanted. However it didn't take them long to find their feet as the fortunes took a turn for the better after the new year with Michael & Simon steering the club to its highest ever finish reaching the Evo-Stik League play-offs after a dramatic final day. This once again brought massive excitement amongst the club and town but unfortunately it ended in semi-final defeat 2-1 at Bamber Bridge despite taking the lead and putting in a valiant performance

There's no doubting that the club is going in the right direction as the 2018/19 season sees the Brewers move into the Evo-Stik East Division after the league switched from a North/South divide to an East/West split. Can the club improve again this year...

For decades it has been documented that Spalding United FC was formed in 1921, but recent research into club history has revealed that in fact, its existence goes back much earlier!

A chance sighting of an early team photograph on social media prompted some Investigation and evidence gained shows that the club was formed back in 1905 following the amalgamation of the Fulney Institute and Victorias clubs was confirmed at a meeting in a local hostelry when it was decided that the name should be Spalding United.

A committee was formed and the home ground as to be the Low Grounds, but references were also made of games being played on Pinchbeck Road (Black Swan Field) which is now known as The Sir Halley Stewart Playing Field.

In the early days the club, fielding A and B teams, played in the Boston League and progressed to the Spalding and District League and to the Peterborough League winning a number of trophies and were runner-up to Boston in the Lincolnshire FA competition before a crowd of 4,000 fans. Their first honours, however, came in 1933 when they won the Lincolnshire Junior Cup. The feat was repeated in 1938 and they progressed to senior level and won the Lincolnshire Senior B Cup in 1951.

In 1952 the Tulips recorded their ground record attendance when playing Peterborough United, then a Midland League side, in a qualifying round of the FA Cup. A crowd of 6,973 packed into the ground and saw Spalding leading 2-0 with ten minutes to play but Posh fought back to equalise and went on to win the replay 3-0. Further progress followed with success in the Lincolnshire Senior A Cup in 1953.

The club has reached the first round proper of the FA Cup on two occasions. In 1957/58 they lost 3-1 to Durham City and in 1964/65 they played Football League opposition for the first time, being beaten 5-3 in a thrilling encounter at Newport County. Spalding became United Counties League champions for the first time in 1955, having been runners-up in 1951, 1952 and 1953. They

joined the Eastern Counties League but were without success and

joined the Central Alliance League. They stayed just one season before transferring to the re-formed Midland League in 1961. In 1968 they rejoined the United Counties League and won the title for a second time in 1975.

Spalding changed competitions once more in 1982, joining the Northern Counties East League. They were champions in 1984 but again returned to the United Counties League in 1986. A third title was won in 1988, a season which also saw them lift the Lincolnshire Senior A Cup. This time their success earned promotion to the Southern League and their first two seasons in the Midland Division saw them finish eighth and sixth in the table. In 1989/90 Spalding enjoyed an excellent run in the FA Vase, progressing to a home quarter-final tie with Guiseley, who included former Leicester City and England striker Frank Worthington in their side. A crowd of 2,020 saw Guiseley win 3-1 in extra time, having equalised in stoppage time.

Things took a down turn with relegation back to the United Counties League the following season. The club went into decline, but recovery came in 1995 when Spalding won the League Knockout Cup and in 1997 they were runners-up in the league, as well as reaching the last-16 of the FA Vase when they were defeated by Taunton Town.

In 1998 they finished third in the league and again reached the quarter-final stage of the FA Vase, losing 2-1 at home to eventual winners Tiverton Town in front of 2,038 spectators.

In 1998/99 the club won the United Counties League championship, the Lincolnshire A Cup and the Hinchingbrooke Cup. As UCL champions Spalding regained membership of the Southern League and competed in the Eastern Division for season 1999/2000. They finished in a creditable 15th position.

The next three seasons proved less successful and despite narrowly avoiding relegation they eventually returned to the UCL. Season 2003/4 saw a revival in fortunes, winning the the UCL championship and the East Anglian Cup for the first time, beating Aveley 3-1.

2004/5 was the club's debut in the Northern Premier League, and despite only finishing 18th they managed to retain the East Anglian cup, beating Lowestoft 4-2 in the final.

The debut season in the UniBond League was was one of highs and lows but too many defeats by a single goal resulted in the team finishing in 18th position, however they ended the season on a high by beating Lowestoft Town 4-2 to retain the East Anglian Cup.

The following season proved less successful and it wasn't until the 2006/07 season that saw the Tulips return to the Southern League for a third time. But in the final phase of FA restructuring the club was relocated back to the UniBond League for the 2007/08 season, competing in Division One (South). The club then experienced a number of difficult seasons trying to maintain their status at step 4.

Year (2011/12) started on a high with a partnership deal with top local junior club Spalding Athletic JFC, putting us in contact with age group football from under-7 to under-18. Sadly the season ended in relegation but despite this set back they aimed at a return to step 4. In 2012/13 they narrowly missed winning promotion by one point but won the UCL Knockout Cup, beating promoted St Ives Town 4-0 in the final.

The UCL championship trophy, however, was brought back to town in convincing style in 2013/14 season with the title secured with four matches of the season remaining. Looking to build on the success of winning promotion to Level 4, the "Boardroom" was strengthened by the appointment of a Chief Executive Officer in local businessman and former player, Malcolm Gray. With the formation of a reserve side and a commitment to strengthen the club as part of the local community, the club look forward to the challenge of establishing itself at step 4.

A return to the Evo-Stik NPL for the 2014/15 season was highly successful with the team always placed in the leading group and eventually finished in a very respectful seventh position in Division One South. The season also saw the introduction of an under-18 team.

The end of season brought changes off the field with chairman and director Chris Toynton stepping down and a consortium of local investors taking up the reins with the aim and challenge of taking the club forward. Andrew Gay was appointed as the new chairman.

November 2015 saw the resignation of manager Pat Rayment after almost four years in charge and replaced by his assistant Marcus Ebdon, who resigned at the end of the season. David Frecklington, who played for the Tulips at the end of the 1990s, and who had been at the helm of Lincoln United for the past three seasons, returned to the Sir Halley Stewart Field as Ebdon's successor.

However, Frecklington moved on in mid February, joining Gainsborough Trinity. His assistant with the Tulips, Chris Rawlinson, was appointed his successor.

The 2016/17 campaign evolved as their best ever, finishing in their highest ever placing in the modern Football Pyramid. The Tulips finished in third position in NPL First Division South, just missing out on promotion from Level Four when losing by the odd goal in three away to second placed Witton Albion. The Tulips had, infact, never been outside the top three all season. In addition the club had three players – Nathan Stainfield (for the third time), Michael Duggan and Bradley Wells named in the South division team of the year.

An Under-21 Development squad was introduced into the ranks. for the 2017/18 season they ended up as runners-up in the south section of the Lincs FA League. The successful senior team however, began to break up with a number of players moving to higher grade clubs. A reduced budget mid-season also curtailed manager Chris Rawlinson's rebuilding plans to a degree but under-21 squad members were given their opportunity to play level-4 football and they did not let the club down. A 13th position at the end of season was considered highly satisfactory. Following an indifferent start to the 2018/19 season manager Chris Rawlinson and chairman Andy Gay mutually agreed to part company. Assistant manager Matt Easton was put in temporary charge of the team but formally took over the reins towards the end of September..

Michael Duggan (dob 29/07/86) (Goalkeeper):

A February 2013 signing from St Neots Town – a member of their Evostik Central Division 1 championship winning side. Michael is a physical education teacher at Spalding Academy secondary school. He played for University of Bedfordshire first team and represented East Midlands Universities. Has also played for Stamford and Blackstones. At the beginning of the current season he had made 253 appearances for the Tulips.

Neal Spafford (dob 07/10/86) (Defender):

An experienced defender playing his fourth season with the Tulips.. After two successful seasons at Boston Town as a teenager, Neal played two years on contract at Gainsborough Trinity under manager Brian Little before moving to the successful Wisbech Town team as vice-captain. He has a total 110 appearances for the Tulips.

Leon Mettam (dob 09/12/1986) (Striker)

Scoring goals is Leon's passion, and he has scored more than a few since beginning his career in the youth ranks of Lincoln City. He had a 13-match loan spell from King's Lynn Town with the Tulips in the latter stages of the 2016/17 season and netted nine goals, including a cracker in the league play-off final 2-1 defeat at Witton Albion. He made five appearances for Lincoln City's first team and his travels in the higher levels of non-league have taken him to Corby Town (36 goals), Worksop Town (66), Tamworth and latterly to King's Lynn.

Jack Fixter (dob 08/04/99) (Right back)

A product of the famed Lincoln City Youth Academy, but his contract was ended at the end of June 2017. Greatly impressed Tulips boss Chris Rawlinson on the occasions he watched him in Imps' under-18 action. A versatile defender equally happy in either central defence or at right back. Highlights of career so far include playing against Liverpool in a 2016 pre-season friendly and being on the 'bench' against Oldham Athletic the FACup. Has also been involved at Leicester City.

Scott Floyd (dob 24/04/98) (Midfield)

Yet another key part of the Tulips U21 Development squad operated by Lewis Thorogood. Scott debuted for the Tulips first team in the FA Trophy first qualifying round defeat at Chasetown on 28/10/17. He made nine first team appearances last season. Another young player who appears to have a bright future ahead of him.

James Hugo (dob 11/10/99) (Left side wing back)

Highly rated teenager arrived in Spalding last season on loan from Lincoln City. Made his Tulips debut in the Boxing Day home game against Peterborough Sports and became an ever-present member of the squad, making 21 consecutive appearances. Nominated man-of-the-match playing against Romulus.

Liam Marshall (dob 17/09/96)) (Left side defender)

Signed from Evo-Stik South club Peterborough Sports this November and made his debut against Lincoln United. His day job is working as head coach for Peterborough United under-21 squad. He has also debuted for the Posh in League One. Among his former clubs are Ilkeston, Corby Town and Stamford.

Rudy Misambo (dob26/05/94) (Centre half)

Big emposing central defender signed from Hednesford Town and crowned his debut against Pontefract Colleries with a man-of-the-match performance. Previous clubs include Stourport Swifts and Coalville Town.

Isaac Cooper (dob 07/07/95) (Left side midfield)

One of three players signed from Premier Division Hednesford Town and gave a solid display on his debut against Pontefract Town. Previous clubs include Barwell, Rugby Town and Darlaston Town.

Romario Martin (dob 30/08/99) (Striker)

Lightening quick centre forward, scoring two debut goals on his debut. Also joins the Tulips from Hednesford Town. He is St Kits and Nevis international, capped at under-20 level and also made one senior national team appearance. Previous English clubs include Solihull Moors, Barwell, Highgate United and Romulus.

Taron Hare (dob 04/10/96) (Right back)

Former Scunthorpe United youth team graduate, joins the Tulips from Matlock Town. Prior to playing at Matlock also had experience with Stamford, Boston United, York City, Gainsborough Trinity and North Ferriby

Archie Moyses (dob 21/07/99) (Midfielder)

Returns to the Tulips after a spell at Sleaford Town. A box to box player who also offers defensive capabilities. He is a product of Lincoln City Academy and while with the Imps spent time with Doncaster Rovers and Bolton Wanderers. He is the son of former Tulip Chris who went on to manage Lincoln City.

Luke White (dob 28/12/1999) (Striker)

Another talented highly rated young player who joined the Tulips on his release by Lincoln City. He is known to Tulips fans having made 14 appearances (including seven starts) while on loan from the Imps in the second half of last season. Luke has also played for Goole Town.

George Zuerner (dob 20/04/88) (Midfield)

George has made the short move from neighbouring UCL side Holbeach United to play at the higher level with the Tulips. An energetic player George, in addition to lining up at Holbeach last season, George, who is employed in Practice Placement Development, has also spent time with Grantham Town, Lincoln United, Brigg Town and Sleaford Town.

Jack Brownell (dob30/09/99) (Central Midfield)

Signed from Matlock Town in late September (2018) and made his debut against Stamford. Jack can also count Chesterfield as a previous club and debuted in League One.

Arrived at the Tulips at the end of September (2018) from Evo-Stik Premier Division side Grantham Town and made his first appearance for the Tulips against Morpeth Town. Began his career at Lincoln City and made 21 appearances in National League. Has also played for Alfreton and Buxton

Jenk Acar (dob 06/09/97) (Attacking midfield)

Returned to the Tulips' fold in mid-October after a 14 match experience in the Premier Division with Grantham Town. Before his departure from the Tulips in the close season, Jenk had accumulated 79 appearances for the club following his move from the Academy ranks of Lincoln City. He made 36 appearances in his debut season (2016/17) for the Tulips and scored 14 goals.

Bradley Wells (Striker)

Returned to the Tulips camp in mid-December. He last donned a blue shirt in the 2016 season, making 47 appearances and scoring 28 goals in league and cup competition. His travels since have taken him to Stamford and AFC Mansfield. Among his other clubs are Long Eaton, Belper and Gainsborough Trinity.

Alex Smith (dob 23/02/96) (Golkeeper)

Introduced to the Tulips via the under-21 squad for 2017/18 season and has been a very able deputy to regular number-one Michael Duggan. Made his NPL debut in a league cup match against Gresley FC, performing superbly in a penalty shoot out. Made his debut in Step 4 against Carlton Town and again did not disappoint. Was one of the stars in the January '18 7-3 victory agaiunst Pontefract Colleries.

James Cullingworth (Right back/midfield)

Joins the Tulips for a second time, from Newark Floserve. Former Nottingham Forest, Boston United player who last played for the Tulips during the reign of manager Pat Rayment.

Charlie Hart

The latest addition to the Tulips' squad. Charlie arrives from League Two club Lincoln City as a work experience player until the end of the season

Management Team

Matthew Easton (Manager)

After a short spell away from football he joined the Tulips in May 2017. A highly regarded qualified coach with most recent experience gained with the FA's under-16 England squad. A Uefa 'A' licenced coach who has worked with clubs in England and Ireland. Matt started his playing career at Ruston Sports before playing at Leicester United, Alfreton Town, Holbeach and Louth United. He was previously assistant at Spalding before taking over the manager's hotseat in September 2018.

Richard Storey (Physio):

Richard joined the Tulips in October 2016 following the departure of long-term medical custodian Sam Seal. A veritable giant of a chap, Richard's expertise should ensure injured players are back where we need them most as soon as is practically possible.

Bob Don Duncan (Director of Football)

A UEFA A Licence coach, Bob is a former player and manager with the Tulips and has been around the non league at our level and above for many a decade. He was manager at Grantham for a while but since 1993 until the end of the '09/10 season he had been at the helm of United Counties League club Boston Town.

Lewis Thorogood (Development manager)

Having gone through the ranks of both assistant and head coach roles at Boston United Centre of Excellence for many years and working with the club's youth team along with first team match analysis for a period of time, in 2015 he took over the newly formed Boston United Under-21 side successfully winning the title in the first season and developing a pathway for young players and existing to work into the first team structure. In May 2017, Lewis left the role at the Pilgrims to take set up the under-21 side at Spalding Unite

Paddy Discusses That Free-Kick, Retirement & PPG





After his worldie free-kick last Saturday, we could only speak to one man this week, Paddy Miller.

1. Another game ticked off last Saturday, what did you make of the performance as a whole against Wisbech?

"Overall I thought Saturday was a professional performance from the lads, we created numerous chances, kept a clean sheet and maintained our recent good run in form."

"We've been very creative and on the front foot over the past four games, when it gets to this stage of the season it's not necessarily the performance that matters it's all about the result. There's been times this season where we have played very well and got nothing from the game, it's always nice if you can get both but nothing matters more than the three points."

2. We could have easily been three or four up at the break, does it concern you that we aren't making it more comfortable when it probably should be?

"Not at all, I would be concerned if we were struggling to create chances but that's not the case, it's rare you see teams win four or five nil every week, except from Manchester City."

"In the past four games we have scored 9 and conceded 2, with figures like that I am not concerned at all. We have a lot of quality in our attacking options and I believe since Luke (Porritt) came on loan he's given us a different dimension going forward. Joe and Sav's have been brilliant playing together up top recently and both scored goals, with Casey playing some of the best football I've seen him play at the club and getting himself a lot of assists."

3. We have to talk about your stunning goal, I mean, the one at Belper was good but this was next level, you can't have scored one better than that in your career surely?

"Yeah free kicks is something I've worked on a lot this season to be honest, the one against Belper was a decent one but the one last Saturday is the best goal I've scored in non-league, as soon as I struck it I knew it was in. I'd come close the week before against Stocksbridge hitting the crossbar also. Some of the lads joked after that I should retire now after scoring that one, hopefully it's not my last one before I hang up my boots."

4. Touching on your decision to retire at the end of the season, for people that don't already know, what made you come to that conclusion at this time?

"Retirement was something I actually thought about last season at Hyde, but after speaking to Si and Mikey I wanted to finish my career at Tadcaster by hopefully helping the club gain promotion. Everyone knows how much the

club means to me and I've always felt like I had unfinished business here. The demands of non-league football is hard to juggle with work now for me, I've been lucky enough to play since I was 16 years old so it's been a massive part of my life. Anyone who has played or worked with me knows I always give 100% to every training, match and how busy I am with the gym etc away from football. Next season I would not be able to commit 100% due to work commitments and I don't think you can give anything less to be successful."

5. Eight games to go, how important is Saturday's game against Spalding given that we have a week off the following week?

"I know it is a cliché but every game is a cup final, we just have to take each game one by one. Hopefully we can continue our recent good form and maintain our high standards which we set ourselves, and if we do that I don't think we will be far away from our targets and ambitions we set at the start of the season. We are expecting a really difficult game today against a strong Spalding side, so we will have to start the game bright and perform well to get a positive result."

6. Finally, with only 5 out of 7 teams at Step 4 eligible for promotion out of the play-offs and with ours currently one of the lower ones, how do you as players feel about that going into the final few games?

"Regarding the points per game we've hardly even spoke about it, at the end of the day the outcome of the season is completely in our own hands. We just need to keep our heads down, work hard and take each game as it comes. If you look through our side we have a very good mix of experience and youth, there are around 10 players who have all won promotions from various divisions in non-league. From a mentality aspect I think that could play a big part in how we perform, its massive that us experienced players keep everyone relaxed, calm and just play our own game and don't change our style of play due to pressure. It's key that the lads enjoy playing and keep doing what we have done for the majority of this season."

"I hope everyone enjoys today's game, make yourselves vocal and cheer the boys on because the supporters will play a huge part in how successful our season will be. We are all in this together. The lads thank you for the support today and in recent weeks."



REPORT | Two's Company For Taddy Who Move Up To Fourth

Another goal for top scorer Joe Lumsden and a stunning free-kick from Paddy Miller saw Tadcaster Albion defeat Wisbech Town at the i2i Stadium by Jay Taylor

The victory was Albion's fourth in a row as well as a second straight shutout as eight games remain in the race for play-offs.

Simon Collins named the same starting eleven for the third match running as his side looked to solidify a place in the Evo-Stik East play-offs.

There was a return for James Hodges and Jake Buckle on the bench whilst Jack Walters and Jake Rose were ruled out through injury.

On a piercingly bright but breeze afternoon in Yorkshire, Taddy started on the front foot with on-loan winger Luke Porritt causing problems from the off. His powerful pace is a danger to any full-back and he was sent galloping in behind on 6 minutes after a lovely flick around the corner from Joe Lumsden. As Porritt was forced wide, he crossed to Casey Stewart at the back post but he lost his footing at the crucial moment.

It was a frenetic opening to the contest with both sides bellowing at one another trying to gain an early advantage. There was a spot of controversy on 8 minutes too as Toby Hilliard went to ground in the box wanting a penalty which angered the Albion men as they felt it was clear simulation. Rightly so it appeared too as Miller pulled out of the challenge and referee James Unwin agreed it wasn't a spot kick but clearly didn't feel it was a booking worthy dive as play was allowed to go on.

Anger quickly turned to delight for the Brewers though who broke the deadlock on 10 minutes. Neat interplay between Ellis Barkworth and Casey Stewart down the right-hand side before Jonathan Fairweather failed to clear the cross allowing lethal marksman Joe Lumsden to slide home from close range. Sweeping low underneath keeper Dan Swan, goal number 21 for the season for Lumsden.

Wisbech's first sighting at goal arrived six minutes later as many red shirts swarmed forward on the break, a dinked cross found Michael Frew who went for the spectacular, but volleyed wide of the mark. This was a rare moment of danger for Taddy as they quickly regained their dominance as Pete Davidson went close to adding a second. The Yorkshire Pirlo headed Stewart's corner goalwards only for Dan Swan to impressively push wide of his left-hand upright.

Simon Collins' side were in full-flow in the brisk wind as a second goal seemed only a matter of time. A cute clip in behind from Corey Roper released Lumsden in behind but he was denied by the onrushing Dan Swan, the loose ball dropped to Aiden Savory who just couldn't adjust his feet accordingly to scramble over the line.

Tempers soon flared once again when Jack Keeble went flying into Casey Stewart in an incredibly dangerous challenge which saw the Town man leave the ground. However referee James Unwin allowed play to continue. This clearly disgruntled the Brewers as both sides clashed in the next phase of play. Corey Roper stormed into two full-blooded 50-50's before an altercation broke out on the floor seeing many pile into a pushing match ending with the Albion midfielder being cautioned.

With calm finally restoring Lumsden was threatening again as Luke Porritt curled in behind setting the striker racing into the penalty area, but his attempted nutmegs was just cut out by the recovering Sam Gaughran.

Wisbech Town Manager Gary Setchell clearly wanted a response from his side in the second half as he made two substitutions at the break sending in Thembelani Nkala and Sam Murphy. Sticking with substitutions, Taddy were forced into making their first change three minutes into the half as Corey Roper picked up a knock, this allowed Jason Mycoe to come on for his first appearance since November.

The visitors' hopes of a comeback were dealt a huge blow a minute later when Paddy Miller scored a contender for goal of the season. Standing over a free-kick in a central area 30 yards from goal, the experienced defender struck a thunderbolt which screamed into the top corner leaving Dan Swan with absolutely no chance in the Town goal. This was one of the superbly struck left-footed efforts that Julian Dicks, Thomas Hitzlsperger and Teemu Taino would have been proud of.

Following on from the worldie of a free-kick, Taddy were looking to put the game to bed completely eliminating any chance of a Wisbech comeback. Casey Stewart showed great pace to blow past Oliver Gale latching onto Ellis Barkworth's ball but Joe Lumsden saw his scuffed shot blocked.

Taddy let the game slip out of their grasp ever so slightly allowing their opponents to push further up the field. The second half was far less controlled by the home side as Wisbech huffed and puffed without really troubling Michael Ingham. Nevertheless Harry Coates and Joe Lumsden did both fire headers on target but couldn't beat Swan in the Town goal.

It took Wisbech 87 minutes to carve out a clear cut chance on goal and they really should have found the net as Toby Hilliard did brilliantly to burst past two yellow shirts and break through the Taddy back-line before screwing comfortably wide of Ingham's goal. Unfortunately the match ended on a sour note as both sides clashed again on the touchline after another altercation which culminated with Town boss Gary Setchell being dismissed.




