# "the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.



# **Visitors'** History





The club was formed in 1979 as Athersley North Juniors, playing mostly in local Barnsley leagues. They were renamed Athersley Recreation in the summer of 1986.

The club joined the Sheffield & Hallamshire County Senior League (S&HCSL) in 1997, and reached the top flight of the S&HCSL in 1999 after winning back-to-back promotions. They then won the Premier Division title at the first attempt.

They would go on to become the most successful club in the history of the County Senior League, finishing inside the top two positions for nine consecutive seasons from 2003-04. After their fifth title win in 2012 the club was in a position to take promotion to the Northern Counties East League (NCEL), entering Division One. After finishing as runners-up in their first NCEL season, they were promoted again, to the Premier Division. In 2013 they entered the FA Vase for the first time, and a year later they made their FA Cup debut.

In May 2014 they won the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup for the first time, beating Frickley Athletic in the final at Hillsborough.

After falling just short in the past two seasons, Tadcaster Albion made it third time around and achieved promotion to the Evo-Stik after beating Armthorpe Welfare 2-1 on a memorable night at the i2i stadium.

A header from Josh Greening in the first half and a precise finish from Adam Baker in the second was enough to see Taddy over the line and achieve greatness.

With two home games to go in two days The Brewers simply had to win just one of these matches to be crowned NCEL Premier Division Champions and achieve promotion into the Evo-Stik Division One North.

# TAD'S History

### The NCEL Years 2014-2015 Season P2

As well as finishing third in the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) Premier Division, the Brewers also enjoyed several cup runs in the 2014/15 season.

In the FA Cup, North West Counties League (NWCL) Premier Division strugglers Barnoldswick Town visited the i2i Stadium for an extra preliminary round tie and were comfortably beaten 5-0 - Carl Stewart scoring a 19 minute hat-trick. Spennymoor Town, who would reach the Northern Premier League (NPL) Division One North play-offs, won 2-0 at Tadcaster in the preliminary round.

North Yorkshire neighbours Knaresborough Town visited Tadcaster in the second round of the League Cup but went home disappointed with a 0-2 defeat. A pair of big away wins followed for the Brewers in the next two rounds - 6-1 at Retford United and 4-1 at Lincoln Moorlands Railway - but the visitors trailed 0-1 in both ties. This set up a home tie against Cleethorpes Town in the semi final.

The semi final attracted a crowd of 305 to the i2i Stadium but the majority were shell-shocked by half time, with the visitors leading 4-0. Albion did pull one goal back in the second half but never looked like really getting back into the game.

The Brewers made club history in the FA Vase, with an exciting run taking them to a sixth round (quarter final) replay.

NWCL club Winsford United were narrowly beaten 3-2 in the first round, despite the hosts taking an early lead. The Brewers survived another scare in the second round, when a tough Northern League team, Morpeth Town, were controversially defeated 2-1 by a last minute Liam Ormsby penalty.

The third round brought another trip to a NWCL club but the Brewers raced into a 4-0 lead against 1987 FA Vase winners St Helens Town. The visitors did concede a couple of late goals but still booked a place in the fourth round with a 4-2 win.

Midland League club Brocton, from Stafford, came to Tadcaster in the fourth round. Calum Ward scored the decisive goal in a 3-2 victory, in front of a crowd of 637.

Another 600+ crowd watched the fifth round tie against NCEL Division One high flyers AFC Mansfield. The large and vocal support from North Yorkshire returned home happy after a 3-0 win - goals from Josh Greening, Josh Barrett and George Bissett

In the sixth round, the Brewers were drawn away against Wiltshire club Highworth Town from the Hellenic Football League. At first glance, it appeared to be a favourable draw for Albion - avoiding some of the clubs, who were expected to win the FA Vase - but that proved to be incorrect.

On a windy day, the tie ended in a 1-1 draw - after extra time - with both teams scoring a penalty. Calum Ward's 67 minute spot-kick brought the teams level, after the home team scored on 60 minutes. A crowd of 771 watched the game at The Elms.

One week later, a crowd of 1,307 gathered at the i2i Stadium for the sixth round replay. In a tight game, the Brewers failed to take their best chance, when Calum Ward's penalty was saved by Gary Stevens, who would become a Tadcaster player later in the year. Highworth snatched victory with a goal in the 74th minute and the majority of the record crowd went home disappointed, after missing out on a place in the semi finals.

Albion did reach the semi finals of the West Riding County Cup but the cup run came to an end in a controversial manner.

In the first round of the county cup, Liversedge visited the i2i Stadium and took a 1-0 lead after five minutes, before eventually losing 3-1 to their hosts.

Selby Town were the opposition in a quarter final tie at Tadcaster, which had to be decided by a penalty shootout. A goal from Paddy Miller and a brace from Josh Barrett saw the Brewers take a 3-2 after 23 minutes - one of the Robins' goals being scored by Danny Gray. The visitors levelled the score in the last minute of the second half to take the game into extra time but there were no more goals in the additional 30 minutes. Albion won 4-2 on penalties and were drawn away to Bradford Park Avenue in the semi final.

With Park Avenue struggling to get matches played on their own pitch, the tie was switched to the i2i Stadium. After the first attempt to play the game was postponed due to fog, the mid table Conference North club took a three goal lead in the rescheduled game. Lewis Clarkson scored two late goals to add some respectability to the score for the Brewers, in front of 422 fans.

After the winners were deemed to have fielded an ineligible player, the county FA decided that the tie should be replayed at Tadcaster, rather than expelling Park Avenue from the competition.

Sadly, the Brewers were swept aside 4-0 in the replayed fixture, which was watched by 313 fans. Former Albion player, Ryan Qualter, was among Park Avenue's scorers.

Having narrowly missed out on winning the NCEL title and reached the latter stages of three cup competitions, it was a hugely successful season but one which was also full of frustration, with no silverware to show for all the effort.






