The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975** & **1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979** & **1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

Club Information

Pine Villa was formed in 1895 but on July 4, 1899 ceased to exist.

However, there were no tears because the name was changed and the birth of Oldham Athletic came about. Latics enjoyed success in the early years finishing runners-up in the First Division (the equivalent of today's Premier League) in 1914/15 having earlier reached the FA Cup semi final in 1913. They lost their topflight status in 1923 and would not regain it for 68 years. In the intervening years, most was spend in Division Three North. Divisions Three and Four. The club's three championship winning campaigns also came in this period in 1952/53 under the legendary George Hardwick, 1973/74 and 1990/91. There had been dark days when Latics had to go cap in hand to the Football League to seek re-election after finishing in the bottom four in the basement division.

Latics have had a roller-coaster ride over the last twenty years, seeing action in the Premiership and the equivalent of the Championship before suffering relegation down to the current Coca-Cola League One.

They were founder members of the Premier League back in the 1992-93 season,

and stayed in the top flight for three seasons - one campaign in the old First Division, two in the Premier League.

They also enjoyed glory in both cup competitions (FA and League Cup). Indeed, they appeared in the 1990 Littlewoods Cup Final at Wembley, only to lose 1-0 to the late Brian Clough's Nottingham Forest, a game that even 'Cloughy' himself said was an unfair result.

The FA Cup also brought disappointment for Oldham when they lost two semi-finals to Manchester United. Their 1990 appearance in the last four was their first foray to that stage since 1913, but they bowed out to Manchester United 2-1 in a replay after a thrilling 3-3 draw in the initial clash.

Latics appeared in the semi-finals again in 1994, losing out 4-1 in a Maine Road replay following a 1-1 draw at Wembley.

More recently, Latics fell on hard times and were forced to go into administration in the summer of 2003, but some much-needed financial stability was provided when three American-based businessmen - Simon Blitz, Simon Corney and Danny Gazal - purchased the club the following November.

Academy Information

Oldham Athletic youth team, sponsored by the Safeguard Group, play in the Football League Youth Alliance, North East Conference.

They also take part in the FA Youth Cup, Youth Alliance Cup and Lancashire FA Professional Youth Cup.

Last season, the young Latics lifted the Youth Alliance Cup, defeating MK Dons 4-0 in the final at SportsDirect.com Park in front of just under 1,000 supporters.

Youth team boss Tony Philliskirk is in his 18th season in charge of the young-sters and he is accompanied by head of coaching Simon Cooper, lead phase coach Pete Wild and foundation phase coach Phil McGrath.

The academy achieved category three status in EPPP audit which took place in 2014, claiming top marks and an exceptional report.

Home games are at the club's training ground at Chapel Road.



1892 TAD'S History

TAFC - The NCEL Years - 1992/93 Season

The Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) contained one less club in the 1992/93 season, with a total of 34 members. The Premier Division increased in size.

Tadcaster Albion were joined in Division One by Lincoln United, who had been in the NCEL between 1982 and 1986, and the completely new club Hucknall Town.

The Brewers kicked off the season with a disappointing 0-3 defeat at near neighbours Garforth Town. However, ten goals in the next two games brought a pair of home wins - Selby Town (4-2) and RES Parkgate (6-2).

Another 4-2 victory soon followed at Brodsworth Welfare before a winless run of six games in October and November, including a couple of losses against third placed Hallam.

December and January saw an upturn in the club's fortunes with three wins and a draw in league fixtures. The victories came against Yorkshire Amateur (3-1), Hatfield Main (3-1) and Immingham Town (2-0).

January came to an end with a 1-4 defeat at the champions Lincoln United but it wasn't long before the Brewers were back to winning ways.

Four consecutive wins, with 15 goals being scored, were picked up in the month of February. Lowly Brodsworth Welfare were crushed 6-0 before Hall Road Rangers (3-1), Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare (3-2) and Garforth Town (3-1) were also brushed aside.

After a few games without a win, the season's best result came with a 2-1 triumph at home against Lincoln United. It was one of only four losses for the champions.

Another victory, 1-0 at home against Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare, was achieved before the Brewers embarked on their final two games of the season - home and away against second placed Hucknall Town. Unfortunately, the newcomers to the NCEL took four points from these two games.

Tadcaster Albion finished the season in sixth place with 41 points from 26 games.

NCEL Premier Division strugglers Pontefract Collieries ended Albion's hopes of glory in the FA Vase, with a 6-2 win at Ings Lane. However, there was a little success in the League Cup and West Riding County Cup.

In the League Cup, RES Parkgate were beaten 4-3 in a second round replay, after a 1-1 draw at Tadcaster. In the third round, Division One champions Lincoln United beat the Brewers 4-1.

The West Riding County Cup brought a 2-0 win at Yorkshire Amateur in the second round. This was followed by a narrow 1-0 loss at the lowly NCEL Premier Division club, Glasshoughton Welfare.

After an excellent 1991/92 season for the reserves, this season saw them come crashing down to earth, when they finished bottom of the 17 club Reserve Division with 24 points from 32 games.

The opening 15 games of the season brought five wins and four draws over six months. The remaining 17 games, which were crammed into the final two months of the season, saw the Brewers reserves pick up just five points, including a win in the final game.

Heavy losses were suffered against Farsley Celtic (2-8), Thackley (1-8), Harrogate Town (0-6) and Ossett Albion (2-7).

Hall Road Rangers knocked the Brewers out of the Reserve Team Cup with a 4-1 victory.
