Formed in **1892**

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's** & **60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the lngs ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title. In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**. In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new chairman.



In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games. in March led to them finally finishing in third. An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history

by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA
Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd
of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town, At the end of the season, the

club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers started their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy Miller was back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division was needed.

The Brewers started the season well and were in the play-off spots, then injury problems hit the team and the season seemed to run away from them.

They finished 19th in the league. The
Brewers had a great chance for silverware in the West
Riding County Cup Final, the game finished 1-1 but they lost out to Farsley Celtic 4-2 on penalties.

At the end of the 16/17 campaign the Directors made the tough decision to change the management team from Billy Miller and Matt Heath to Michael Morton and Simon Collins bringing it more in-house. In the 2017/18 season the new-look management team took a couple months to adapt to the league and mould the squad that they wanted. However it didn't take them long to find their feet as the fortunes took a turn for the better after the new year with Michael & Simon steering the club to its highest ever finish reaching the Evo-Stik League play-offs after a dramatic final day. This once again brought massive excitement amongst the club and town but unfortunately it ended in semi-final defeat 2-1 at Bamber Bridge despite taking the lead and putting in a valiant performance

There's no doubting that the club is going in the right direction as the 2018/19 season sees the Brewers move into the Evo-Stik East Division after the league switched from a North/South divide to an East/West split. Can the club improve again this year...



Manager's NOTES




Good afternoon and welcome along to TAFC for today's league match against Stamford.



Team · HISTORY



Stamford AFC



There is evidence to support the existence of a football club in Stamford as far back as 1870 & various clubs came & went in the next twenty vears until 1894 when the town's two most prominent clubs Stamford Town & Rutland Ironworks agreed to amalgamate. Initially the club adopted the name of the Rutland Ironworks who were viewed as the stronger of the two, but the current club's existence is generally accepted to date back to 1896 when the Stamford Town name was adopted to give the club a higher profile. It was to be some years before the club became known as "The Daniels" after Daniel Lambert, the heaviest British man ever, who died in 1809 in Stamford weighing 52 stone or thereabouts and is buried in St Martin's churchyard in the town. The club's first ever match was played on Hanson's Field, at the location of Wothorpe Road and the club has enjoyed continuous use of the ground ever since. Evidence has come to light that the site staged football in the early 1870s making it a candidate for the world's oldest football ground. Stamford Town enjoyed success from the off and won the Younger Cup in their first season. Several other trophies followed in the next decade and a half as Stamford established themselves as one of the area's most successful clubs. Most notable were back to back successes in the prestigious Hinchingbrooke Cup in 1907 and 1908, the trophy being won in front of four figure crowds in the finals at Huntingdon.

Encouraged by these successes Stamford turned professional in 1909. Stamford was quick to progress and in only their third season of Northants League football they won the championship. In 1913-1914 Stamford enjoyed their best ever FA Cup run reaching the 5th Qualifying Round before losing 2-0 at Chatham.

Financial troubles plagued the club towards the end of the thirties and in 1939 they decided to take a season's break to put the finances right. Within a few weeks war was declared, and it was 1945 before league football resumed.

After a season regrouping in the Peterborough League Stamford returned to the United Counties League, successor to the Northants League, in 1946. They soon earned a reputation as cup specialists winning the Lincolnshire Junior Cup in 1949, UCL Knockout Cup in 1952 & Lincolnshire Senior Cup 'B' in 1952 and 1954. Football in the early post war years captured the public's imagination with a record crowd of 4,200 watching a 3-3 FA Cup draw with Kettering in 1953. In 1955 Stamford joined the Central Alliance before stepping up in class to join the Midland League in 1961. The sixties were years of struggle although 1961 saw Arsenal come to Wothorpe Road to beat the Daniels 9-0 in a match arranged to mark the town's quincentenary

1972 saw the Daniels return to the United Counties League where they became a power under the guidance of former Peterborough manager Norman Rigby. Another FA Cup run to the 4th Qualifying Round in 1973-1974 was followed by an excellent FA Vase campaign a year later, Stamford reaching the semi-finals of the new tournament. After several near misses Stamford won the UCL league & cup double in 1976, also going one better in the Vase, losing 1-0 to Billericay in extra time at Wembley. Malcolm Hird - later voted Stamford's Player of the Century by supporters and goal ace Dick Smith, the club's highest postwar marksman, were stars of this side. Stamford continued to dominate the UCL under Rigby winning a further title in 1978, their first Lincs Senior Cup 'A' success the following season was the highlight of a disappointing campaign under Ray Medwell, but the appointment of ex-skipper Hird as boss in the summer of 1979 proved a masterstroke. Three seasons under the management of the Casterton schoolmaster saw the Daniels complete a hat-trick of UCL championships, Knockout Cup successes in 1980 & 1982 & best of all a Wembley return in 1980, goals from Keith Alexander & Andy McGowan giving Stamford a 2-0 win over Guisborough. Under Chris Corby's management Stamford enjoyed Lincs Senior Cup 'A' success in 1982-1983 and a third Wembley visit in 1984, losing 3-2 to Stansted in the Vase final, while Paul Brackwell steered the Daniels to Knockout Cup success in 1986. By now the club's









golden age was at an end although the club continued to produce good players with Keith Alexander & Andy Tillson (both Grimsby), Darren Edey (Peterborough) & Brett McNamara (Northampton) all graduating to the pro ranks.

The appointment of Steve Evans as manager in 1994 started Stamford's revival. His policy of signing high profile players brought ex-Posh favourites Trevor Quow, Steve Collins, Milton Graham and Micky Gynn to the club, along with Scottish international David Speedie and ex-Olympic decathlon champion Daley Thompson. The club's centenary season saw Stamford win the UCL for a seventh time after a spectacular late burst through the pack, while 1997-1998 was even better as Stamford retained the title, also carrying off the Lincs Senior Cup'A' & Hinchingbrooke Cup. Promotion to the Southern League was the outcome and the club's debut campaign in the Midland Division proved hugely eventful. After steering Stamford to Benevolent Cup success and a place in the Lincolnshire Senior Cup final manager Evans moved to Boston United with Billy Jeffrey arriving from Rushden & Diamonds to take the reins. The new manager rebuilt with younger players and a final placing of 18th in the Midland Division. League reshuffling saw Stamford placed in the Eastern Division for 1999-2000 and an 11-match unbeaten start - the club's best ever - proved invaluable as Stamford accumulated a record 18 draws over the season, eventually finishing 17th in the table. Seventh place in the 2003-2004 season was enough to earn the Daniels a Premier Division place for the first time in their history. Unfortunately, too many draws proved costly as Stamford were relegated. In July 2005, new manager Graham Drury arrived from Harrowby and his new look side regained the club's Premier Division place at the first attempt. After finishing fourth in Division One East the Daniels defeated Wivenhoe to progress through the play offs. Stamford fared much better on their return to the Premier Division & briefly topped the table in January. In 2006-2007 the season ended with silverware on display as the Daniels claimed their fifth different county cup, beating Brigg to win the Senior Shield at Lincoln City's Sincil Bank Stadium.

In the summer of 2007 the club was transferred to the Northern League Premier Division after nine years playing in the Southern League but suffered instant relegation to Division One South after losing manager Graham Drury.

Graham Drury returned to take over as manager within a couple of weeks of the 2011-2012 season ending. Graham departed for Boston United in December 2012. He was replaced by Wayne Hatswell in January 2013, which culminated in the club gaining promotion via the play-offs defeating Chasetown in the final. We then had another managerial change with Hatswell leaving for a coaching role at league 2 Newport County. His deputy David Staff was promoted for his first managerial position for the 2013-2014 campaign. The season culminated in winning the Lincolnshire Senior Trophy in the final against Brigg Town. The 2014-15 season was started at our Wothorpe Road ground, and we played out last game there on the 22nd November before moving to our new home at the Zeeco stadium.

On 13 December 2014 we started a new chapter of the club's life with our first game at the Zeeco Stadium. Unfortunately, it took us longer than expected to get that first home league win - it came down to the last game of the season against Witton Albion when the win was the only way to say in the Premier Division.

The 2015-2016 season was the first full season at the Borderville Sports Complex.

This was a turbulent season which saw David Staff replaced by Andrew Wilson whose tenure only last 10 games and saw

him being replaced by Graham Drury for his third stint with the club. Despite an upturn in form it was not enough to stop the Daniels being relegated.

In 2016, club history was made when Stamford made the first-round proper of the FA Cup by beating Wrexham in a replay at the Racecourse ground. They were drawn against Hartlepool United in the first round, eventually losing 3-0.

The 2017/18 season saw the Daniels finish sixth in the league and saw them reach the play-off final losing 2-1 in extra time to Bedworth United. Stamford look forward to the new challenge of the Evo-Stik division East.

Third time in charge of the Daniels having previously led the club to promotion in 2005 before leaving to manage Corby, he then returned in 2012 but left to manage Boston United. In 2016 Graham took the Daniels to the first round of the FA Cup.

Danny Hussey (Assistant Manager)

Former Deeping Rangers Manager, joined the Daniels as Assistant to Drury having held the same role with Spalding United. Is well known in the local area for his playing career featuring Spalding United, Wisbech Town and Holbeach Town among many of his former teams.

Mike Hogg (Goalkeeping Coach)

Has worked alongside Drury before at Boston United as well as with first team goalkeeper Dan Haystead at both Boston United and Grantham Town.

Tom Haystead (Goalkeeping Coach)

Tom has been coaching for the last four years following his brother from club to club. This has seen him spend a year and a half at Belper Town as well as time with Sheffield FC.

Carol Holland (Physio)

oined the Daniels at the start of the 17/18 season having previously worked with Graham Drury at Holbeach Town. Alongside her work with the Daniels she is Head of Medical for the CV academy.

Jon Challinor (Player/Coach)

Capable of playing at the back and in midfield with a giant throw. He originally signed for the Daniels in 2000 having come through the Rushden and Diamonds academy. He has vast experience having won the FA Trophy in 2012 with York City as well as gaining promotion with them through the playoffs. He has also played for Cambridge City, Aldershot Town and Exeter as well as a stint in America. He was also named caretaker manager in November 2015. Joined Graham's coaching team this season

Danny Haystead (Goalkeeper)

Experienced shot-stopper who replaced Paul Bastock as Boston's number one in 2012 having previously been at Hinckley United. He has also played for Grantham Town, Sheffield FC, Belper and Ilkeston having come through the youth setup at Sheffield United.

Joe Tarris: (goalkeeper)

Signed at the start of the 2018-19. Played for Leicester City academy, Walsall academy & Coalville.

Sam Vince (Goalkeeper).

Signed in September from league rivals Wisbech Town. Has also played for Lincoln United and Boston United

Chris Salt (Centre Back)

Chris originally signed for the Daniels in September 2016 from Clipstone and then returned in summer 2018 from Gainsborough. Began his career at Sheffield United before moving onto Worksop, Gainsborough Trinity & Buxton. Last time Chris was with the club he played a major role in the FA Cup run, with the Daniels reaching the first round.

Kern Miller (Centre Back)

Rejoined Stamford in October 2018. Was part of the 2016-17 side that reached the FA cup first round. Originally signed for Stamford in July 2016 from Kings Lynn Town. Started his career with Lincoln City. Left Sincil bank to join Barnsley but failed to make a senior appearance at Oakwell. The 2011-2012 season took in brief stints with Accrington Stanley, Hereford United, Gainsborough Trinity and Worksop Town. Has also played for Boston United, Spalding United and Corby Town.

Henry Eze (Central Defender)

Returned to Daniels in November 2018. Originally joined Stamford in August 2017 having previously played for Rushall, Kings Lynn, Kettering, Romulus and Chasetown. He won Supporters player of the season in 2013 at Kettering. Works with Football Aid Africa helping those that are less privileged to have a chance to play football by distributing unwanted equipment. Was named in the league team of the year last season.

Josh Egginton (Left Back)

Signed for the Daniels at the commencement of this current campaign, having previously playing for Gresley FC since July 2016.

Harry Peasgood (Defensive Midfielder)

A graduate of the Daniels Academy. Progressed through the Young Daniels youth teams. Made his first team debut against Coalville Town in the league cup last season.

Mike Armstrong (Defensive Midfielder)

Joined for the 2017/18 from Belper having impressed the management whilst playing against us. He has also played for Long Eaton where he came through the youth system. Last season's Manager's Player of the Year.

Joe Burgess (Midfielder)

Joins the Daniels from Boston United last season. He is a versatile player that can play in midfield whilst being equally comfortable at the back either on the right or centrally. He joined Boston from Ilkeston in February 2016. He has previously played for Histon, Fleetwood and Peterborough.

Moving into his third full season at the club. Scored the winning goal against Wrexham in 2016 to put the Daniels in the first-round proper of the FA cup.

The former Gresley winger joined the Daniels in the 2018 pre-season having previously played for Grantham and Leicester Nirvana. In the 2016-17 season he took a clean sweep of awards at Gresley including Player's and Manager's player of the season as well as being their joint highest scorer.

Liam Adams (Striker)

Signed originally on a youth loan from Boston United last season before signing permanently at the start of the 2018/19 season. Liam, re-joined Boston United in August 2016 having spent five years away from the club at Nottingham Forest. He was an integral part of the Pilgrims' Centre of Excellence before switching to the City Ground but was released after completing his two-year scholarship on Trent Side.

Ollie Brown-Hill (Striker)

Ollie re-joined the Daniels in January 2018 having originally been with the club in the 2016/17 season where he scored 6 goals in 24 games. He has also played for Oadby, Corby, AFC Rushden & Diamonds and Barwell as well as representing England at under 18 and 19 level.

Bradley Fortnam-Tomlinson (Striker)

Joined the Daniels at the end of September 2017 from Stafford Rangers. Previously been capped by the Northern Ireland Under 19 side as well as playing for Leicester, Sheffield Wednesday, St Johnstone, Grays, Tonbridge, St Neots, Ilkeston, Hereford and Bishop's Stortford. Last season's top goal scorer.

Grant Ryan (Striker)

Re-joined Stamford in October 2018 from Hinckley AFC. Originally signed for the Daniels in October 2016 from Grantham Town. Began his career at Mansfield Town. Has also played for Chasetown, Belper Town, Hucknall Town & Rainworth Miners Welfare, Sheffield FC, Hinckley AFC.

John Sands (Striker)

Joined Stamford in October 2018 from Mildenhall Town. Has previously played for Bury Town, Canvey Island, Chelmsford City, Leiston & Boston United

Joe Boachie (Striker)

Signed in November 2018 from Loughborough University FC. Started his career at Dagenham & Redbridge and has also featured for Grays Athletic.

REPORT | Taddy Back In The Play-Offs As They Continue To Enjoy Life On The Road

Tadcaster Albion extended their unbeaten league run to six and jumped back into the play-offs after a convincing 3-1 victory at Belper Town. by Jay Taylor

First-half goals from Billy Whitehouse and Paddy Miller put the Brewers in the driving seat before top scorer Joe Lumsden added a third late on. Piteu Crouz pulled one back but it was merely a consolation for the Nailers who ended the contest with ten men.

The result was Taddy's fifth win on the road this season as they jump back up into the playoff places.

Simon Collins made just one change to the side that played their last league fixture as Aiden Savory replaced Casey Stewart, who had started every match prior.

As the dark clouds moved in and the heavens opened, both sides paid their respects for Remembrance Day and those affected by the Leicester City tragedy.

Taddy started much the brighter of the two teams and went close in the opening five minutes when Pete Davidson burst forward before firing wide of the mark.

Albion were looking confident and assured in all areas of the pitch, not getting embroiled into Belper's antics with the referee. A looping header from Joe Lumsden was well tipped over by Town keeper Leigh Overton before the deadlock was broken on 20 minutes.

Paddy Miller's high free-kick was nodded down by centre-back partner Harry Coates allowing for Billy Whitehouse to sweep home his seventh goal of the season from close range.

Belper rarely threatened in the final third and that was down to the tremendous teamwork from every single Tad player. All of the chances were falling the way of Collins' side as Jake Rose smashed narrowly over before neither Howarth nor Lumsden could head on target after escaping their markers on a corner.

The Brewers in blue were looking menacing in every attack as another looping header from Lumsden went close, this time landing on the roof of the net after Jack Walters crossed on the volley.

Albion number one Michael Ingham had little to do in the first 45 but when he was called upon he never looked troubled. The Northern Irishman tipped over a free-kick to be on the safe side as well as confidently claiming a couple of crosses.

With the half reaching it's latter stages, referee Gareth Thomas pointed to the penalty spot after Billy Whitehouse went to ground. With Joe Lumsden ready and waiting with the ball on the spot, the man in the middle went over to his assistant and after a brief discussion, the decision was overturned to a free-kick right on the edge of the box.

Positioned on the right-hand side of the area, Paddy Miller stepped up and superbly bent into the far corner leaving the rooted Overton with no chance whatsoever.

Taddy were well in the mood and it almost got even better when Lumsden latched onto Walters' ball over the top but Overton got a crucial touch to stifle the striker this time

With the hosts needing a spark from somewhere, Manager Grant Black certainly acted as he made a triple substitution at halftime introducing Paylor, Hancock and Sturgess.

The travelling Taddy fans, who were in fine voice all afternoon, were pleased with what they were watching as the second half continued in the same vein. Pete Davidson glided to the by-line and cut back into the danger zone only for it to evade several blue shirts.

Jake Rose was putting in an outstanding display in the centre of midfield breaking up play with sheer tenacity time and time again. Rose, along with Miller and Ingham, continued to spur each other on with constant instructions and encouragement.

Belper did start to rally together in the second half as Crouz delivered into substitute Kai Hancock who could only guide straight at Ingham.

Back up the other end and it was clear to see there was more goals there for the Brewers and Paddy Miller almost bettered his first half strike with another free-kick however Leigh Overton did well to save this time.

It wasn't to be the Nailers' day as a tantalisingly teasing cross bounced up kindly for Derry Robson but his instinctive effort was again straight at the Taddy keeper.

Further evidence that it wasn't going to be Belper's day arrived soon after when hesitation between Ingham and Ellis Barkworth allowed the loose ball to be turned goalwards by Hancock but off the post it went and Coates hacked off the line.

The encounter opened up more and more as the minutes passed by, Joe Lumsden running clean through on goal with 20 left on the clock but Overton did very well again to storm off his line and smother.

As Belper squandered another good opportunity from a corner, Taddy broke in behind once again setting up a 3v1 scenario but Lumsden couldn't beat last man Isaac Assenso.

It felt as though Tadcaster needed a third goal to make absolute sure and that's what they got eleven minutes from time. Pete Davidson again doing exceptionally well to get the by-line before pulling back to Joe Lumsden who was never going to miss from six yards.

The home side did respond immediately though, Savory conceding a penalty kick and former Brewer Piteu Crouz dispatching.

With the points well and truly wrapped up, Belper ended the afternoon with ten men as Jake Sturgess, who was one of the three to be introduced at the break, was shown his second yellow after an altercation with Ingham.

In the end the scoreline could have looked even more handsome for Taddy if Davidson and Savory could have kept their cool after surging in on goal.






