# "the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.



# **Visitors'** History





#### **A Brief Club History**

Handsworth Parramore FC were formed at the start of the 2014/2015 season after the merger of two highly successful clubs, Handsworth FC of the S&H County Senior League Premier Division and Worksop Parramore of the NCEL Premier Division. The clubs had been working together towards the merger during the previous season after first announcing their plans in the Summer of 2013.

The NCEL and the FA allowed the new club to take over the position of Worksop Parramore, who had just finished in 4th place in the Premier Division, whilst the S&H CFA allowed their reigning Champions to continue under the name of Handsworth Parramore Reserves.

The decision was made for the first team to play their home matches at Sandy Lane, Worksop whilst the Reserves and the other senior teams (Under 21's, Under 19's, Under 18's A & B sides and Over 35's) play their home games at Olivers Mount in Handsworth, Sheffield. The aim of the clubs joint Chairmen, Pete Whitehead and John Ward, is for

the first team to return to Sheffield in a brand new facility within the next two years.

The new club could not have begun life better as in their first game, they crushed Glasshoughton Welfare 6-0 and followed this up with a 5-1 victory over Oadby Town in their first ever FA Cup tie. # Head 2 Head Handsworth Parramore FC

The Brewers have met the Ambers and, prior to a merger with Handsworth in 2014, Worksop Parramore in seven Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) fixtures.

In the 2012/13 season, Albion picked up a brace of 2-1 victories over Worksop Parramore. Terry Taylor scored a last minute winner in the away game, when the Brewers came back from 0-1 down with only a few minutes to play.

The following season's away fixture also saw a 0-1 deficit being turned around in the closing minutes - Carl Stewart scoring both goals in another 2-1 win. Nick Thompson scored the only goal in the return fixture at Tadcaster, watched by 274 fans.

Handsworth Parramore were beaten 3-0 in their home game last season, when Josh Greening bagged a hat-trick with 72nd, 75th and 86th minute goals.

When the Ambers visited Tadcaster last February, they took a two goal lead after 55 minutes - Bruno Holden and Luke Fletcher scoring. George Bissett reduced the deficit on 62 minutes but Sam Smith put the visitors 3-1 up with ten minutes remaining. In

another late show by the Brewers, goals from Josh Greening (84) and Denny Ingram (90) salvaged a 3-3 draw to the relief of the majority of the crowd of 312.

When the Brewers visited Sandy Lane in November, they were six points ahead of their hosts but having played four games more. It was critical that they didn't return to Yorkshire empty handed - a draw would have been more than acceptable.

What followed was beyond the hopes and expectations of many of the Brewers fans in the crowd of 155. Josh Greening and Adam Baker put Albion 2-0 up at half time and it could have been even better, if Jason Mycoe's goal hadn't been harshly disallowed. Baker extended the lead mid-way in the second half but Parras joint top scorer Jon Froggatt pulled one back after 87 minutes. The last word came from Greening, when he scored his second goal in the dying minutes, to clinch a 4-1 victory.

So, prior to today's game at the i2i Stadium, the Brewers have won six and drawn one of the seven meetings. However, this afternoon's match is significantly more important than all of the previous encounters.

# Tadcaster Albion showed their courageous and professional side to see off Albion Sports and reduce the gap at the top to just two points.

The assist king Josh Greening set up both goals with perfect free-kick deliveries to which were headed in by defender Andy Milne and Tom Corner for his first for the club.

Tadcaster boss Billy Miller made three changes to the side that played out a goalless draw with Cleethorpes Town last week. Josh Barrett came in at right-back for the injured Jordan Armstrong, Conor Sellars came in for the ill Liam Ormsby and Adam Baker was preferred to Nick Black.

The pitch at Throstle Nest, which is actually home to Evo-Stik side Farsley Celtic, took a hammering on Saturday morning following persistent rain. The surface was extremely bobbly making it difficult to play football on and both goal mouths were incredible boggy.

The first real effort of the afternoon came in the third minute and it included the aforementioned goal mouth. Conor Sellars' cross from the left-hand side was cleared out to Jason Mycoe who took one touch and went for goal striking from 25 yards which bobbled into the muddy goal mouth but Kyle Trennary managed to palm it out for a corner.

The Brewers did in fact take the lead sixteen minutes later and the goal came from a set-piece. Josh Greening's floated free-kick from the right-hand touch-line was flicked into the far corner and out of Trennary's reach via a deflection from Temar Khan.

The home side were passing the ball about neatly with all attacks going through prolific striker Marcus Edwards and they could have actually equalised immediately after going a goal behind. Aran Basi's lofted free-kick was headed down at the back post to Matthew Mathers whose first flicked effort was thwarted and sharply grasped by Gary Stevens.

For all of Albion Sports' hard work, they were struggling to test Stevens in the Tadcaster goal as Joe Barden's tame effort from 30 yards was comfortably picked up by the Taddy stopper.

Sports did think they had levelled the match up shortly after the half hour mark though as

Marcus Edwards tapped in a parried Stevens save but was adjudged to have been offside.

With nine minutes to go until half-time, The Brewers doubled their lead and it came from another Josh Greening free-kick. The talented Greening curled in from the opposite side this time to Tom Corner who did brilliantly to slow down his run and guide his header into the top corner from twelve yards out.

Taddy were growing in confidence and were looking more and more dangerous as the half ticked by. The Brewers should have been going into the break three goals to the good. Adam Baker picked the ball up half-way in Sports' half and it suddenly opened up for the attacker who glided past at least five yellow shirts and into the penalty box but saw his goal bound strike superbly blocked by Khan. The best chance however was probably the rebound as the flying block fell kindly for Tom Corner who side-footed over from thirteen vards out.

The towering figure of Aran Basi found himself constantly battling with Beadle, Corner and co on a number of occasions as the midfielder curled narrowly wide on the stroke of half-time.

Into the second half and it was The Brewers who had the first sighting at goal as Josh Greening had a bouncing ball at his feet with his back to goal but the forward couldn't generate the power required to trouble Trennary.

With the pitch cut up, bobbly and not in the best condition to say the least, the afternoon saw a lot of niggly fouls but Morgan was perhaps lucky to stay on the field at the start of the second half. The ball cannoned into space which created a 50-50 with Jason Mycoe. Whereas both players went in full blooded, Morgan clearly had both feet off the ground and was out of control however the referee didn't batter an eyelid.

Speaking of Jason Mycoe, he was putting in another stellar performance in the heart of Taddy's midfield throwing himself into absolutely every challenge and winning them more often than not. Conor Sellars was another one who gave it his all, literally running himself into the ground for the team working backwards and forwards tirelessly.

Taddy were looking to contain and soak up the pressure of Albion Sports in the second half to protect their two goal lead.

The home side were always going to create opportunities though and this they did in the 57th minute as Alex Cusack's free-kick was cleared out to the young midfielder Joe Barden who volleyed ferociously over from inside the penalty area.

The home side were having the vast majority of the ball in the second half but still struggled to create any clear cut chances as Cusack could only find the side-netting from an acute angle.

Marcus Edwards was the one for Albion Sports who was trying to make things happen, dropping deep to pick up the ball but the 28 goal striker was becoming increasingly frustrated as Taddy were defending terrifically.

Josh Barrett has only just recovered from a back injury but he slotted in comfortably at right-back not putting a foot wrong. Clayton was composed as ever at left-back and the centre-back pairing of Gregg Anderson and Andy Milne were showing their class and experience and not for the first time.

With fifteen minutes to go, it looked as though Taddy were going to pick up a valuable three points and keep the pressure firmly on leaders Handsworth Parramore but Stevens was called into action. Cusack did well to pull back to Lewis Morgan whose slid shot was well saved by Gary Stevens.

Stevens was determined to keep the clean sheet intact as he easily tipped over Mohamed Kaba's rasping drive from the left-hand side and then held Edwards' long-range free-kick

The Brewers didn't come close to adding to their tally for the afternoon but they didn't need to as two brilliant deliveries, two superb headers and a lot of heroic defending was enough for Taddy to pick up the three points.






# TAD'S History

By Ian Tyssen

## The NCEL Years 2012-2013 Season

For the 2012/13 season, the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) expanded by four clubs to 44 - 22 in each division.

Heanor Town rejoined the NCEL from the East Midlands Counties League and took a place in the Premier Division. Glasshoughton Welfare and Worksop Parramore were promoted from Division One, with Selby Town bring relegated in the opposite direction.

Despite being the Division One champions in the previous season, Handsworth left the NCEL and rejoined the Sheffield & Hallam County Senior League. Athersley Recreation (Sheffield & Hallam County Senior League), Cleethorpes Town (Lincolnshire League), Clipstone Welfare (Central Midlands League) and Knaresborough Town (West Yorkshire League) all moved up to the NCEL Division One.

Bradford City visited Tadcaster in a pre season friendly, which attracted a crowd of 693. The Bantams, who would reach the Capital One Cup final later in the season, won 7-1.

The Brewers started the league season in fine style - winning 2-1 at Bridlington Town, who were one of the fancied teams after finishing second in the 2011/12 season. That win was followed up with a 2-0 home victory over Winterton Rangers.

A 1-5 loss at another highly rated team - Brighouse Town - followed, despite going 1-0 up in the first minute. This was one of three away defeats in four games, when 14 goals were conceded.

Albion picked up six wins and two draws in the next eight league games to get the season back on track. The unbeaten run included a 1-0 win over the previous season's champions Retford United, last minute victories at Worksop Parramore and Maltby Main, thrashings of Arnold Town (4-1) and Hall Road Rangers (6-1) and a 1-1 draw with another one of the title chasers - Scarborough Athletic.

The good run of results came to an end with a disappointing 0-1 defeat against strugglers Lincoln Moorlands Railway.

Fortunately, the Brewers put together another five games without defeat, which included a 4-1 victory at fourth placed Barton Town Old Boys and another win against Worksop Parramore. Tadcaster were now in fifth place, just three points behind Bridlington Town at the top of the league.

Three straight defeats followed, including a brace of losses against North Yorkshire rivals Pickering Town. The Brewers then went unbeaten again for seven games, which culminated with a 4-0 victory over Staveley Miners Welfare.

Tadcaster remained in fifth place after Danny Critchlow's winner for Nostell Miners Welfare but they were now 16 points behind the leaders Scarborough Athletic.

The Brewers again strung together another sequence of victories - three wins with no goals conceded, including 1-0 over third placed Bridlington Town. However, the good results came

to an end too quickly, with defeats at Retford United (1-4) and Scarborough Athletic (0-2), with Paddy Miller on the scoresheet.

A four game winning run, with home victories over Long Eaton United (5-2) and Barton Town Old Boys (5-1), lifted Albion to fourth place in the league.

The final game of the season was a 3-4 reverse against Brighouse Town, who had just lost out to Jimmy Beadle's Scarborough Athletic in the title race.

The Brewers eventually finished the season in sixth place, with 77 points from 42 games - 22 points behind the champions and below Pickering Town on goal difference.

Steve Jeff was the top scorer, with 17 goals in league and cup games. He was backed up by Calum Ward, who scored 14 goals, plus Danny Gray, Nick Thompson and Tom Owen, each with eight goals.

Average league attendances at Ings Lane fell from 107 in the 2011/12 season to 106. The biggest crowds were 337 against Scarborough Athletic and 288 for the visit of Barton Town Old Boys, which was the last game of an Easter NCEL groundhop. The lowest attendance at a league game was 59, when Long Eaton United came to Tadcaster.

The Brewers enjoyed success in the previous season's FA Cup but this season would be even better

In the extra preliminary round, Albion were taken to extra time in a 3-2 replay victory at Consett. There were 3-0 home wins against Norton & Stockton Ancients and Holker Old Boys in the preliminary round and first round qualifying, respectively.

In the second round qualifying, the Brewers were drawn at home to Skelmersdale United, who would go on to be Northern Premier League (NPL) champions with over 100 points. Thanks to a Calum Ward hat-trick, which earned him a nomination for player of the round, the home side won 4-1 in front of 182 fans.

Conference North club Boston United were the visitors to Ings Lane for the third round qualifying. The game attracted a crowd of 368 but the Brewers fans went home disappointed after a 0-2 defeat, with two second half goals.

There was no success in the FA Vase, as a 2-3 loss at Esh Winning in the first round qualifying ended hopes of bringing this silverware to Tadcaster.

Bradford clubs Thackley and Eccleshill United were both beaten 2-1 by the Brewers in the West Riding County Cup. Harrogate Railway were the opposition in the quarter final and a last minute Nathan Cartman goal for the NPL side clinched a 3-2 win.

Tadcaster Albion also reached the quarter finals of the League Cup. Having defeated Brighouse Town (2-0) and Winterton Rangers (4-1) in away ties, the Brewers lost 0-1 at home against Nostell Miners Welfare.






