The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.



Visitors' History



Garforth Town Football Club were originally formed in 1964 as the MINERS ARMS, a local pub team taking their name from the hostelry where they were based. Formative years were spent in the Elmet Sunday League and then the Leeds Sunday Combination League in 1972

Having no ground of their own and none available in Garforth, matches had to be played on a council pitch in nearby Swillington. Following several years of League & Cup success, the club decided to step up into Saturday Football and joined the West Yorkshire League, at the same time acquiring their own ground at BRIERLANDS LANE, by transforming a former council rubbish tip.

In 1977 Garforth made an application to join the Yorkshire League, however they were advised that pub teams were ineligible to compete so they changed the team's name to GARFORTH MINERS and were duly elected.

At the start of the 1981/82 season they became founder members of the Northern Counties East League, which was an amalgamation of the old Yorkshire and Midland League. In 1985 came the name change to the present one of GARFORTH TOWN.

The 1986/87 season saw Town produce their best ever Cup run when they reached the QUARTER FINAL stage of the FA VASE, eventually bowing out by 2 goals to 1 to the Essex based side Collier Row.

1991 saw the clubhouse erected at Brierlands Lane and in 1995 floodlights were installed following a campaign, which included the handing over, to local councillors of a petition in favour of lights going up which was signed by several hundred people.

The appointment of Dave Parker as manager in 1994 after the departure of the previous manager and nearly all the first team players started what is undoubtedly Town's best period in the NCEL.

The 1996/97 season brought a Division One runners-up spot as well as a Cup Final win when Town lifted The Wilkinson Sword Trophy by defeating Eccleshill United over two legs. In 1997/98 Town won the Division One Championship in style, 18 points clear of the second placed team - their first ever major League victory - and also completed the DOUBLE by winning the West Riding

County Cup, beating Premier Division side Liversedge 2-0 in the final.

For the 1998/99 season Town moved into their brand new purpose built stadium - WHEATLEY PARK

That season saw Town reach the final of the NCEL President's Cup, eventually losing over two legs to North Ferriby United and in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division - although topping the table to Christmas - finish in a very creditable mid-table position.

In the 1999/2000 season, despite a poor league finish, Town proved to be a cup winning side. They won the West Riding County Cup, beating Eccleshill United 2-0, as well as the NCE League Cup with a 3-1 victory over First Division side Glapwell in the final at Ossett Albion's ground.

Success that season was not confined to the First Team. Town's Under 18 side won the Leeds & District Championship at their first attempt and several of the side also made their debut for the First Team. A sign that Town's youth policy is starting to bear fruit.

Dave Parker retired as manager following the League Cup final after six years at the helm. He was the best and most successful manager Town has ever had. His successor was Dave Harrison who had been Parker's assistant manager for the previous 3 years.

His time in charge at Town saw him having to guide a young and inexperienced side through difficult times before being replaced towards the end of the 2001/2002 season as manager by Dave Holmes. Despite the hopes for better with the 2002/03 squad being augmented with more experienced players, The Miners finished bottom of the Premier Division and were relegated to Division 1.

Simon Clifford who ran the Brazilian Soccer Schools then took over as owner of the Club and after a shaky start to the 2004/05 season took over as manager guiding the club to promotion back to the NCEL Premier - the 1st step of his ambition to take Town all the way up the football pyramid. The season also saw The Miners take the National limelight with former Brazilian International Socrates making his Garforth Town debut, alongside former Manchester United player Lee Sharpe.

In 2006/07 Garforth formed a major three-year sponsorship deal with GENIX, which also included the Stadium name

changed to THE GENIX HEALTHCARE STADIUM. Clifford also led Garforth to his second promotion in three years. For the first time in the club's history Town reached Step Four of the National League System and entered the newly formed UniBond League Division One North.

Seasons 2008/09 & 2009/10 saw Town's league position stabilize, however they were more successful in cup competitions; victorious in the West Riding County Senior Cup in both seasons.

The Miners finished a creditable 13th in season 2010/11, the highlight being a famous victory in the last game of the season over 1st Division North Champions, Chester in front of their record highest crowd of 2428.

2011/12 saw Town under manager Steve Nichol reach their highest league finish when a final day victory over Skelmersdale Utd resulted in a 5th place finish and a trip to Curzon Ashton in the play-offs. However despite being the better side, Town bowed out on penalties.

A disappointing season followed in 2012/13 with the resignation of Nichol and disbanding of the first team squad resulting in Town being relegated back to the NCEL Premier Division. 2013 saw Simon Clifford's ownership came to an end, and a new Management Committee was formed with a major sponsorship from RIASA assisting with the rebuilding process. Graham Nicholas, a UEFA 'A' qualified coach, was appointed as 1st Team Manager and a new playing squad was formed.

For the 2013/14 campaign the Club aimed to avoid a second successive relegation and achieve stability on and off the field. With the support of RIASA and the hard work of all involved this was achieved, a league finish of 14th was recorded and the club in a much better state.

This allowed, in the club's 50th anniversary year, a consortium of Chairman Brian Close, Treasurer Jane Close and Craig Bannister to take over and they have already succeeded in bringing much-needed sponsorship and providing a firm footing to take the club forward once more.

For the start of the 2015-16 season the stadium name was changed to the J.S. White & Co. Community Stadium after Town's long term main sponsors.

Head 2 Head Garforth Town FC

Tadcaster Albion and Garforth Miners, as they were then known, managed to avoid each other in their Yorkshire League days. The Brewers were relegated from Division Two in the season when the Miners were promoted from Division Three.

The clubs met for the first time in the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) during the 1984/5 season. The Brewers lost 0-3 in Tadcaster and 0-5 at Garforth.

By 2005, there had been 20 meetings in the NCEL but Albion only managed to win one of those games - a 3-1 home win in the 1992/93 season. The Brewers didn't even score a goal in their first eight league visits to Garforth.

Undoubtedly the most famous fixture between the clubs was at Garforth in the 2004/05 season, when a crowd of almost 1,400 turned up to see former Brazilian international Sócrates. The 50 year old made a 12 minute substitute appearance in. 2-2 draw.

Since promotion to the NCEL Premier Division, the Brewers have enjoyed much better results in the clashes with their neighbours. A 4-1 home win, in front of a crowd of 308, in the 2013/14 season is Albion's best result so far.

Last season, the Miners were beaten in both games against the Brewers. At the i2i Stadium, George Bissett and Carl Stewart scored second half goals to earn a 2-0 victory, watched by 398 fans. In the game at Garforth, Danny Gray's 85th minute goal clinched a 2-1 win. Nick

Black had given Garforth the lead, before David Brown equalised on 35 minutes. The nine mile journey back to Tadcaster was a happy one for the Brewers fans in the crowd of 206.

Garforth have won 14 of the 24 NCEL meetings between the clubs, with Albion only winning four. Today's visitors have scored 45 goals in those games, compared to 24 for the Brewers.

The teams have also competed in four cup ties in the last 25 years. Again, the Miners have enjoyed more success than their West Riding rivals.

Garforth have triumphed twice in the West Riding County Cup - 2-1 in the first round of the 1991/92 season and 4-1 at Ings Lane in the 1999/2000 semi final. They also beat the Brewers 2-1 in the first round of the President's Cup in the 2005/06 campaign.

Most recently, Albion won 1-0 in an FA Cup preliminary round tie at Garforth in the 2010/11 season.

A hat-trick from Josh Greening and a brace from Tom Corner saw The Brewers see off 10 man Handsworth after the goalkeeper saw red.

Manager Billy Miller named an unchanged side to the one that beat Albion Sports like week with Jordan Armstrong the only different name on the bench after returning from injury.

Before delving into the match details, it was great to see the i2i stadium rocking again in the sunshine after all it has been through with the floods this season.

However, it was in fact The Ambers who took an early lead in the Yorkshire sunshine. They had a decent sniff at goal inside the first sixty seconds but the visitors did take the lead in the eleventh minute. Danny Buttle found himself in acres of space on the left-hand side allowing the midfielder to pick his head up and deliver to a completely unmarked Jon Froggatt who volleyed into the back of the net from close range.

As the saying goes, you are most vulnerable when you have just scored and this was the case once again as Taddy bounced straight back. Conor Sellars crossed to the back post where Adam Baker's flick down bounced into the path of Josh Greening who diverted the ball into the back of the net.

Six minutes later and Taddy had completely turned the match on its head and it was the in-sync combination of Baker and Greening yet again. Jason Mycoe won the battle in midfield as per usual and Adam Baker played a perfectly weighted through ball which carved through Parramore's defence setting Josh Greening clear on goal and he made no mistake sliding it calmly beyond Andy Sneath. Interestingly, this was Tadcaster Albion's 100th goal of the season.

The next piece of real noteworthy action came five minutes from the break. Connor Smythe, recently joined The Ambers from Rainworth and he tested Stevens with his left-boot striking straight at the goalkeeper who punched clear which incidentally set up a counter attack.

From this break came the most controversial

moment of the match. Adam Baker started the break by driving down the right wing and the attack culminated with Jimmy Beadle flicking over the Ambers' backline to Tom Corner who helped the bouncing ball over Andy Sneath but saw his effort scrambled off the line by Richard Adams. However, when Corner guided it over Sneath, the Handsworth stopper collided with the new Taddy number nine leaving the referee with no choice but to point to the spot.

Now, the referee had a massive decision to make in terms of what to do next with Sneath, as the Taddy faithful cried 'OFF OFF OFF' from the side the man in the middle agreed and showed Sneath a straight red card.

After winning the spot kick, Tom Corner wanted to take it himself but he was made to wait an age as Handsworth made a change bringing on U19 player Tyler Bates to go in between the sticks.

Corner eventually stepped up and stroked it past the stand-in keeper to give The Brewers a two goal cushion plus a man advantage going into the break.

Half-Time:

Tadcaster Albion 3-1 Handsworth Parramore

If Taddy could net an early goal in the start of the second half you would start to worry for Handsworth at 4-1 down but this is exactly what happened. A minute into the second forty five The Brewers put daylight between the two promotion chasers. Conor Sellars' corner was headed away by captain Adams but Jason Mycoe did superbly to guide back up and over the defence to which Tom Corner flicked backwards past the hapless Bates. That's Corner's third goal in just his third appearance for the club after recently arriving from Scarborough Athletic.

As dominant as Taddy were, Handsworth deserve a lot of credit for the way they played, they gave it a good go in the second half and caused the home side some problems.

The Ambers did actually pull a goal back just shy of the hour mark as Simon Harrison bent in a stunning free-kick from 22 yards out which left Gary Stevens with absolutely no chance.

With Handsworth pushing bodies forward because, well why not, this left large gaps in behind for Taddy to exploit and substitute Carl Stewart was the man to find these on a number of occasions. With 68 minutes gone Gregg Anderson played a long ball forward which bounced in the path of Stewart leaving the striker clean through on goal but at a tight angle. Stewart drove goal wards and struck on target but it was a nice height for Bates who managed to keep it out.

Carl Stewart found himself one v one with Bates again two minutes later as long balls in behind were causing The Ambers real trouble however as Stewart drove into the box he poked agonizingly wide squandering another glorious chance to put the game to bed for good.

Taddy were creating plenty of chances to kill the game off with Black and Stewart both seeing their tame efforts stopped by Tyler Bates. Kieran Wells has 32 goals this season for the Parras and he almost made it 33 so set up a slightly nervy finale but the fiery striker saw his header fly inches over the crossbar.

With two minutes to go the three points were already in the bag for Tadcaster but they did make it a five star afternoon as Josh Greening completed his hat-trick. Jason Mycoe unleashed a rocket from 30 yards which Bates actually stopped well but Greening was onhand to smash into the roof of the net with his weaker right-foot to cap off a brilliant victory.

The three points saw The Brewers replace Handsworth Parramore at the top of the NCEL Premier Division to go a point clear with a game in hand.

Taddy were sensational throughout against an extremely talented Handsworth side. To come from behind so early shows character, to score as many goals as they did shows quality and to boss the game (albeit against ten men) as they did shows true professionalism.

Tadcaster Albion advanced into the NCEL League Semi-Final after a Carl Stewart hat-trick saw off nearby Division One neighbours Knaresborough Town.

With games coming thick and fast to say the least over the next fortnight, TAFC boss Billy Miller made no fewer than eight changes to the side that beat Handsworth Parramore.

The Brewers boasted four ex-Premier League stars with Seb Carole and Richard Cresswell making their debuts along with Matt Heath and Jonathan Greening also back in from the start.

From the experienced to the inexperienced as U21 players Ryan Woodhead and 17-year old Casey Stewart, who only knew about starting ten minutes before kick-off due to Nick Black pulling up in the warm-up, were both given game time at Manse Lane.

The cup tie started off in a cagey manner with both sides finding their feet without creating any chances.

The home side were massively up for the contest as you'd expect and it was never going to be a walkover with Town looking up towards the play-offs in Division One.

20 goal striker Brad Walker got his first sight of goal after quarter of an hour played. A long goal kick was flicked into Walker's path but the talisman was yet to find his range as he pulled his half-volley way wide.

Knaresborough were dealt a blow to their chances shortly after Walker's effort as the highly rated Will Lenehan was forced off with a shoulder injury after a collision with Cresswell.

Apart from Cresswell's header in the early stages, both sides were struggling to create any noteworthy chances but were finding themselves in decent wide positions. Seb Carole was seeing plenty of the ball on the right-hand side and the 33-year-old Frenchman was showing glimpses of

what he's all about.

He was looking comfortable on the ball as you would expect and he created himself a shooting opportunity from 25 yards out after turning Calum Rodgers inside and out before firing high into the night sky.

Taddy did however strike blood first in the Quarter-Final with less than half an hour played. Seb Carole drove beyond Rodgers in a central position before guiding a perfectly weighted through ball to Carl Stewart who impressively fired low into the near corner past Jack Rushworth.

The goal certainly didn't faze Knaresborough's game plan as they bounced back positively from going behind.

The home side kept plugging away though and really should have been back in the cup tie but the usually deadly Brad Walker somehow slid wide from four yards with the goal gaping.

Walker must have been kicking himself about his missed opportunity but would have felt even worse when Taddy put the game to bed with seven minutes to go.

Hainsworth awarded The Brewers a penalty kick after Toby Lees was adjudged to have deliberately handled the ball.

There were no surprises who picked up the ball to take the spot-kick, yep it was of course Carl Stewart who emphatically stroked past the hapless Rushworth to complete his hat-trick.

The home side did however pull a consolation goal back in the dying embers. Gary Stevens produced a magnificent save to keep out the hard-working Walker but unfortunately for Taddy's back line and Stevens, Toby Lees swiftly hooked into the back of the net to get Knaresborough on the score board.

Tadcaster Albion romped into a three goal lead before holding off a late fight back from Thackley as another match is ticked off with three points.

Taddy boss Billy Miller inevitably made seven changes to the side that beat Knaresborough Town in the League Cup on Thursday with Josh Barrett, Dan Clayton, Gregg Anderson, Adam Baker, Jimmy Beadle, Tom Corner and Josh Greening all coming back into the side.

As the match got underway in the Bradford sunshine, Taddy's nerves were calmed as they took the lead inside five minutes.

Andy Milne's long ball forward in behind Thackley's high back-line was pounced upon by Josh Greening who was forced wide but still managed to stroke the ball past Dayle Coleing and into the bottom right corner from an acute angle.

Josh Greening's hung up cross was powerfully met by the head of Tom Corner which flew towards the upper echelons of the goal but credit to Dayle Coleing who soared up to his left-hand side to claw out the fierce header.

However, just seven minutes later and Taddy did score the all-important third and what a goal it was.

The rapid Conor Sellars picked the ball up ten yards inside Thackley's half and drove at the heart of defence. Sellars then played a lovely reverse ball inside to Josh Greening who performed a perfect first-time cryuff flick into his brother's path and Jonathan Greening coolly passed the ball beyond Coleing and into the bottom corner to finish off a sublime move.





The NCEL Years 2013-2014 Season

The Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) increased its membership by one to 45 clubs for the 2013/14 season. The Premier Division now had 23 teams.

The previous season's champions, Scarborough Athletic, moved up to the Northern Premier League (NPL) Division One South and Garforth Town returned to the NCEL from the NPL Division One North.

Basford United joined the NCEL Premier Division from the East Midlands Counties League, with Arnold Town moving in the opposite direction.

At the end of the 2012/13 season, Hall Road Rangers were relegated from the Premier Division, whilst Albion Sports and Athersley Recreation were promoted from Division One.

Dronfield Town (Central Midlands League) and Shaw Lane Aquaforce (Sheffield & Hallam County Senior League) joined the NCEL Division One. Having lost all of their final 22 games, Askern Villa finished bottom of Division One in 2012/13 and moved down to the Central Midlands League.

The Brewers' season started with the upheaval of Rob Northfield resigning and i2i Sports Ltd taking control of the club.

Albion's league campaign had an unspectacular start, with a last gasp 3-2 win at Winterton Rangers, who would finish 22nd in the league, and a 1-3 home loss against title favourites Brighouse Town.

What followed was a 24 game unbeaten run - 15 wins and nine draws - which lasted until mid December. There were big home victories over Armthorpe Welfare (4-1), Nostell Miners Welfare (4-1), Long Eaton United (4-1) and Basford United (5-0) as well as a 4-0 win at Pickering Town. The Brewers also completed a double over Heanor Town.

The unbeaten run almost came to an end in the 21st game, when Parkgate were leading 3-2 with only a few minutes remaining. However, Josh Barrett and Mitch Hamilton scored to seal a dramatic 4-3 victory for the home side.

Tadcaster Albion topped the league but Brighouse Town were looking threatening with several games in hand.

Albion Sports inflicted the Brewers' second league defeat of the season when Liam Ormsby scored the only goal at Tadcaster.

Another disappointing defeat followed quickly - losing 3-5 at Basford United, who were 4-0 up at half-time. Two late Mitch Hamilton goals made the score slightly more respectable.

Albion got back to winning ways with three big wins against the bottom two clubs. Lincoln Moorlands Railway were beaten 6-0 at Tadcaster and 8-1 away, with four goals from Carl Stewart. Winterton Rangers were then thrashed 6-0, thanks to a Calum Ward hat-trick.

The Brewers visited Brighouse Town for must win game in early February but, in awful weather conditions, they were crushed 8-1. They never recovered from being 6-0 down at half-time, having played against a strong wind in the opening 45 minutes.

Once more, Albion embarked on another unbeaten run - seven wins and a draw from the next eight games. Big home wins came against Garforth Town (4-1) and Pickering Town (5-0) and notable away victories were picked up at Nostell Miners Welfare (5-0) and Bridlington Town (4-0).

Mid-table Glasshoughton Welfare subjected the Brewers to a 0-1 home defeat but victories were secured in the final three league games. The final game was a 4-0 win at Liversedge, where Carl Stewart bagged a hat-trick.

Having had four points deducted, Tadcaster Albion finished third in the league with 93 points from 44 games - eight points behind champions Brighouse Town and trailing Barton Town Old Boys on goal difference. They only lost five games, which was lower than any other team in the NCEL. Also, with only 48 goals conceded, the Brewers had the best defence in the Premier Division.

With over 30 goals, Carl Stewart was the club's top scorer in league and cup competitions. Danny Critchlow (12), Nick Thompson (10) and Calum Ward (10) also contributed to the 122 goals scored by the Brewers in competitive games.

There was a 75% increase in average crowds at the Brewers' home league games - growing from 106 to 186. The attendances at all of the final nine home games were over 200, with the biggest being against Pickering Town (522) and Barton Town Old Boys (501). The lowest turnout was 64 for the visit of Basford United.

The Brewers were drawn away in all ties in the four cup competitions and there was very little success on their travels.

In the FA Cup extra preliminary round, Albion brought Bishop Auckland back to North Yorkshire for a replay after a 0-0 draw. The Northern League Division One club then won 3-0 in front of 214 fans at Tadcaster.

Another Northern League club, Birtley Town, ended the Brewers' hopes in the FA Vase - winning 4-1 in the first round qualifying.

Ossett Town of the NPL Division One North thrashed Albion 5-0 in the first round of the West Riding County Cup.

In the League Cup, Glasshoughton Welfare were beaten 4-2 in the second round but the Brewers lost 1-2 to Division One Eccleshill United in the third round. The Bradford club defeated three other Premier Division teams and the Division One champions, Cleethorpes Town, to reach the final.






