The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCFL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.





Glossop North End AFC





It's a classic quiz question — which is the smallest town in England to have been the home of a top division football club? The answer — Glossop.

Of course, it's a long time since that 1899/1900 season but the Hillmen (or Hillsmen, as they were known back then, in honour of owner Sir Samuel Hill-Wood) supporters never forget the proud history of the club. However more recently they were given some more moments that they will talk about in the town for years to come and are hopeful of providing a few more.

Founded in 1886, Glossop North End began by playing friendly amateur matches. They entered the North Cheshire League in 1890 and introduced professional players in 1894. Their Chairman and benefactor was local cotton magnate Sir Samuel Hill-Wood who later left to become Chairman of Woolwich Arsenal. In 1898, on their third application, they were admitted to the Football League. In their first season, by finishing runners-up to Manchester City, they won promotion to the Football League Division 1. Unfortunately, they spent just one year in the division, the best victory being a 3-0 result

Glossop played in League Division 2 until the end of the 1914/15 season, In 1908/09 reaching the quarter finals of the FA Cup where they lost to Bristol City in a replay. They ceased playing during the latter part of the First World War but were reformed by Oswald Partington MP, who had been club captain in the 1890's.

Between the wars the club played in the Lancashire Combination and the Manchester League, of which they were champions in 1927/28. They also won the Gildryst Cup on three occasions.

Matches again ceased during the Second World War, Glossop rejoining the Manchester League afterwards. They won the Gilgryst Cup for a fourth time in 1949.

In 1955 they moved from their original ground at North Road to the present home at Surrey Street. Since then they have played in the Lancashire Combination, the Manchester and the Cheshire Leagues before becoming founder members of the North West Counties League in 1982.

Glossop have spent most of the time in the First (now Premier) division, although much of it was spent at the lower end fighting against relegation, whilst the club itself fought for survival, victim of a criminally corrupt owner in the 1980s. It was only the hard work of board members and supporters kept the club afloat after the disgraced regime. There was a little success — the club was Manchester Premier Cup winners in 1997 and 1998, and Derbyshire Cup winners in 2000-01.

More recently though, things have improved for the Hillmen. 2008/09 saw a once-in-a-lifetime day in the history of the club after the side embarked on a terrific FA Vase run which saw North End reach the final at Wembley.

Whilst the final saw a disappointing result — losing 2-0 to Whitley Bay — the run awakened interest in the Hillmen throughout the town. There is now a thriving Supporters Club, which has funded makeovers to the ground and helped generate interest in the club home and away.

This sparked a dramatic overhaul that saw a refurbishment of changing rooms, a new clubhouse, a new covered standing area and new perimeter fencing. Ground grading for the Evo-Stik league was achieved, and now what was a required was a team to make that count.

Manager Chris Willcock is the man appointed to the task, and he had a very exciting first season in charge in 2013-14, taking the club to a 3rd place finish – it's highest in the NWCFL – and a Derbyshire Senior Cup Final. However, that was just the start.

2014-15 is a season that will live long in the memories of everyone involved in the club. It started with a decent FA Cup run, only ended narrowly at Chorley, whilst league wins were ticked off.

However, cups runs and replays meant that North End missed games, and found themselves many games in hand on the leaders Runcorn Linnets. At one point 21 points behind, they were required to play three games a week to play catch up. However, the players kept achieving.

Firstly the players clinched a return to Wembley with a 2-legged win over Cornwall's AFC St Austell having defeated strong outfits like Worksop, Dunston UTS and Shaw Lane Aquaforce. Once-in-a-lifetime...pah!

Then, having relentlessly chased down the Linnets they clinched the league with a 3-0 win over Nelson with 3 games to play. Next they completed a league/cup double with a 2-0 victory over Atherton Collieries.

Finally, Wembley beckoned. The FA Vase final build up was perfect, but again the result was disappointing, losing 2-1 to North Shields as the season finally caught up with them. However, the pride of being a Hillman had never been a higher and the feeling of watching your team take the lead at Wembley is hard to beat.

2015/2016 saw the Hillmen make an excellent start to life in Step 4 of the Non-League Football Pyramid when they finished 4th and qualified for the play-offs, only to be narrowly beaten by Northwich Victoria in the Semi Final in a very controversial fashion. The club also achieved what must have been record attendances in their non-league history with an average 383 per home game during the course of the season.





Here we look back at previous games played by the Brewers on 27th September.

On This Day

By Ian Tyssen

1986

Tadcaster Albion picked up an unlikely 2-0 victory at Glasshoughton Welfare in an Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) Division Two fixture. The home side went into the game in fourth place and the Brewers were much lower down the table with only one win in the opening seven league games. Their second victory of the campaign lifted Albion to ninth place but they would slip to 13th in the 18 club NCEL Division Two by the end of the season.

1997

After a win in their opening NCEL Division One game of the season, the Brewers slumped to a third successive league defeat - 1-3 at Rossington Main. Albion were in 13th place in the league, which is where they would finish the 1997/98 campaign.

2003

Following a 0-3 loss at highflying Sutton Town, the Brewers had only picked up one win from their first six NCEL Division One games of the season. They were just one place above bottom placed Pontefract Collieries, thanks to a better goal difference, but would eventually finish the season bottom of the 18 team league table.

2008

Barton Town Old Boys visited Tadcaster for an NCEL Division One match, watched by a crowd of 52, and went home with three points after a 3-0 victory. A first half goal for Danny Ricketts and a brace in the second period from Gareth Barlow gave the visitors their convincing win. With six losses and one victory from the opening seven league games, Albion only had Glasshoughton Welfare - who would finish 23 points adrift at the bottom - below them in the league. The North Lincolnshire club finished the season in fifth place.

2014

Watched by a crowd of 296 at the i2i Stadium, Tadcaster Albion beat Liversedge 3-0 in an NCEL Premier Division match. The Brewers' goals came from Josh Greening (29 minutes), George Bissett (42) and Calum Ward (66). It was the eighth consecutive league game in which Greening had scored - a run which had seen him score 16 goals, including hat-tricks in three games. After nine league games, Albion topped the table by one point from eventual champions Shaw Lane Aquaforce, who had beaten the Brewers in the opening game of the season.






