TADCASTER ALBION V CLEETHORPES TOWN

Formed in **1892**

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's** & **60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the lngs ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title. In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**. In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new chairman.



In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games. in March led to them finally finishing in third. An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history

by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA
Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd
of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town. At the end of the season, the
club opted not to renew their contract

with manager Paul Marshall, two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers started their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy Miller was back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division was needed.

The Brewers started the season well and were in the play-off spots, then injury problems hit the team and the season seemed to run away from them.

They finished 19th in the league. The
Brewers had a great chance for silverware in the West
Riding County Cup Final, the game finished 1-1 but they lost out to Farsley Celtic 4-2 on penalties.

At the end of the 16/17 campaign the Directors made the tough decision to change the management team from Billy Miller and Matt Heath to Michael Morton and Simon Collins bringing it more in-house. In the 2017/18 season the new-look management team took a couple months to adapt to the league and mould the squad that they wanted. However it didn't take them long to find their feet as the fortunes took a turn for the better after the new year with Michael & Simon steering the club to its highest ever finish reaching the Evo-Stik League play-offs after a dramatic final day. This once again brought massive excitement amongst the club and town but unfortunately it ended in semi-final defeat 2-1 at Bamber Bridge despite taking the lead and putting in a valiant performance

There's no doubting that the club is going in the right direction as the 2018/19 season sees the Brewers move into the Evo-Stik East Division after the league switched from a North/South divide to an East/West split. Can the club improve again this year...

When we travelled to Cleethorpes earlier in the season back in October we were aware that the club had never beaten them in their history which added some pressure but at the same time we knew that any result would be seen as greatly positive. What followed was an excellent day for ourselves and our



Team · HISTORY



Deethorpes Town



The club is in its 20th year and the 20th year sees the club make the step into a new ground which has been hard work from so many as volunteers came together to help the dream become reality.

Last season was the first season in the Evo-Stik and after a great start the side would slip down the table to tenth as the side was deducted 12 points but year was a great learning to make this coming season even better. The 2016-17 season saw the side win the NCEL Premier Division setting new records, also the Lincolnshire Senior Trophy was added in the same season. Then the side made it to the final of the FA Vase where the side lost in the final but the efforts of all to reach the final within 20 years since the sides formation was truly remarkable.

Cleethorpes Town has come a long way in its relatively short history. Initially formed in 1998 as Lincolnshire Soccer School, it was the brainchild of former Grimsby Town player Tommy Watson. The team was an immediate success with both boys and girls across every age group and the club began to grow quickly. In 2003, the club set up a flagship senior team. In the team's first season within the Lincolnshire League they secured a credible fourth place finish for which the foundations for the future were set.

Now rebranded as Cleethorpes Town, the club has

redeveloped into an important community outlet. With over 35 teams competing at every level of local and regional football, the Owls are one of the largest clubs in the area and still continues to expand in all areas. The excellent array of teams and high quality coaching saw the club awarded with Football Association Charter Standard Community Club Status thus further underlining the clubs commitment to providing high quality football coaching alongside enjoyment for youngsters.

The development and evolution of Cleethorpes Town Football Club has been spearheaded by the first team. With the arrival of a new manager during the 2010-11 season it saw the club who were languishing in the lower echelons of the Sills and Betteridge Lincolnshire League go on to finish the season in an amazing third place. In addition, the club collected the Supplementary Cup by defeating Heckington United in the final at Sincil Bank.

The 2011-12 season saw the Owls not only become champions of the Lincs League but also win the Challenge Cup. Additionally the club was accepted into the Northern Counties East League. Our first season in the NCEL saw us finish fourth in the Division 1 table with

some impressive victories along the way. It was a steep learning curve for the players, management and staff.

The 2013-14 started with a change of management and Marcus Newell was brought in. The season started off at a medium pace but a long unbeaten streak mean the Owls were top of the league at Christmas. However, we had a slow start to the new year and fell 7 points behind with only a handful of games remaining. With the pressure at its highest, others around us felt it most and we managed to secure the title with one game to go.

In 2014-15 the club started life in the NCEL Premier Division in slow fashion and with a mountain of cup games fell behind the main pack. But once the FA Cup exploits had finished, we went on a run of 11 then 9 games without defeat which saw us climb the league table and had the rest looking over their shoulders. We finished the campaign in 4th place, and also got to the NCEL League Cup Final which we narrowly lost.

Cleethorpes Town represented the Northern Counties East League in July 2015 in the Toolstation Cup in Bristol where the team played Willand Rovers. A nine-goal thriller ensued and the Owls lifted the trophy.

The Owls began season 2015-16 in sluggish fashion and sat second bottom in the league table in September. However, a great run for the rest of the season saw the team finish in third place to record the sides highest ever

league finish. In addition to this Cleethorpes Town reached the last 32 of the FA Vase for the first time and finished the season in style by beating league champions Tadcaster Albion 3-2 to lift the Northern Counties East League Cup in a thrilling cup final.

The club is determined to make further strides to improve and fulfil their immediate ambition of becoming North East Lincolnshire's most successful lower league football club. With construction underway for a new stadium back at the true home of Cleethorpes Town Football Club, the Linden Homes Club, it is a truly exciting time for the Owls as they compete in the Evo-Stik league from the start of 2017-18

"It was clear from the get go that the management team, players and fans were all very welcoming and I could tell from my first training session here that the quality of the squad is of a very high standard."

The former Hyde United stopper has an impressive record during his short spell with TAFC keeping three clean sheets out of six.

Focusing back on today's crunch clash with Cleethorpes, Hodges insists that a reaction is integral.

"Every game is huge for us as we push for promotion, but due to recent results, yes, Saturday's match against Cleethorpes is a must win. I hope to see a lot of the fans out in force as I do believe goals will return this weekend and hopefully we can kick on from there."

REPORT | Bulls Hold On To Frustrate Brewers

TAFC made a couple of changes to the side that was unlucky to leave leaders Morpeth Town empty handed on New Year's Day as Aaron Hardy and Aiden Savory both earned recalls.

Albion seem to be doing everything but put the ball in the back of the net at the minute, however that's the all important part of 'The Beautiful Game' of course. Having said that, this encounter could not possibly be described as 'The Beautiful Game,' far from it in fact. On a pitch which was never going to allow fast-flowing slick interplay, Taddy started on the front foot and were almost ahead on 12 minutes when Casey Stewart's teasing cross was sliced inches wide of his own goal by Jordan Annable.

After suffering with a goal drought of late, the Taddy fans weren't necessarily bothered as to how the net was struck, they just wanted to score again and Aiden Savory couldn't have gone much closer two minutes later. The versatile forward must have thought he'd done enough on his return to the side when Hardy curled into the box and Savory flicked a header towards the near post only for goalkeeper Jason White to superbly tip onto the inside of the upright. Fortunately for the plucky hosts, no blue shirts were on hand to turn home from a couple of yards.

With Albion dominating proceedings, Simon Collins was forced to make an early change as defender Paddy Miller tweaked his groin slightly which led to him being replaced by Josh Barrett on a precaution measure. The cycling track around the Forest Town Arena was denying any real flow as twenty minutes passed with about ten minutes of actual match time. Nevertheless the woodwork was being rattled for a second time eight minutes from the break. Casey Stewart once again got the better of Jimmy Ghiachem down the right before crossing to Chris Howarth at the back post who could only head on to the top of the crossbar. Albion really should have been in front at this point as goalkeeper Jason White had been bypassed and the number ten just had to hit the target.

Josh Barrett and Harry Coates were having very little to do in the Bulls' half as Taddy continued to press hard for the opening goal. Casey Stewart was instrumental in creating another good chance again on 41 minutes when he cleverly spun away from Ghiachem setting Howarth in down the right but Corey Roper couldn't generate enough power to head past White.

The second half followed in similar vein with the Brewers the only side looking like scoring. Having said that, the feeling of it's going to be 'one of those days' started to reverberate amongst the Tadcaster supporters as AFC to their credit were determined not to be beaten. Joe Lumsden, who was the last player to find the net on December

22nd, went close to ending the duck bending a free-kick narrowly wide from 27 yards out.

As the match surpassed the hour mark, it started to open up with greater gaps appearing all over the pitch. It was still one-way traffic though as Lumsden couldn't quite connect with a volley in the box before Howarth fired over after galloping into a plethora of green grass. It was the two aforementioned players that carved out arguably the best chance of the afternoon though as Howarth excellently slid Joe Lumsden clean through on goal only for an immense and equally crucial touch from Jason White deflected the ball agonisingly wide.

Northampton Town loanee Joe laciofano netted a hat-trick for Mansfield last week and he showed glimpses of his ability after a clever sequence almost saw the striker break Taddy's back-line, but Barrett and Coates were solid in defence. As time hurried along, frustration only grew as Tadcaster huffed and puffed in the final third. Goalkeeper White was proving to be a real thorn in Taddy's ranks as he made another impressive stop, this time with his foot to once again keep out Lumsden after Corey Roper found the front man with a divine ball.

Tadcaster earned their first point of 2019 but it strangely felt like a loss as they couldn't make their dominance count once more, against a Mansfield side who held on for a terrific goalless draw to help their survival bid.

For the first game in 2019 Taddy named the same side that were shocked by Pickering Town on Boxing Day with one change to the bench in Aiden Savory dropping out of the squad following the birth of his second child.

On a cheek-bitingly cold afternoon in Northumberland, it was Simon Collins' Tadcaster side who started the livelier of the two outfits and could have taken the lead inside seven minutes. Joe Lumsden pounced onto a Paddy Miller clearance racing in behind Morpeth's defence, he spotted goalkeeper Dan Lowson off his line but the striker couldn't execute the desired technique.

As the first half began to unfold, it was clear to see why both sides are currently occupying spots at the top end of the Evo-Stik East League; very well organised, strong defensively and tricky going forward. As a result of this there were limited chances on display with Taddy continuing to see the majority of possession.

However, the Brewers went perilously close to breaking the deadlock again just short of the half hour mark. Classy central midfielder Pete Davidson started the move off with a lovely ball out to Billy Whitehouse, he then cleverly jinked inside and curled a cross right on the money only for Lowson to get the faintest of touches taking it away from Casey Stewart arriving at the back post.

The league leaders finally woke up from this moment as their first noteworthy chance saw Wayne Phillips divert Joe Walton's power-blaster well wide of the goal. The 2016 FA Vase winners were growing in confidence in front of their home crowd with David Carson, Ben Sayer and Phillips all trying to engineer an opening goal. Nevertheless Taddy were defending well as Paddy Miller and Harry Coates continued to impressively marshal danger-man number nine Liam Henderson. Former Hull City pro Ellis Barkworth was also defending admirably as he did outstandingly well to head two dangerous free-kicks away to safety, taking an almighty whack on the second occasion.

Eight minutes into the second half and the hosts were in front though, but it wasn't without controversy. There was nothing dubious with the goal itself, just the free-kick that was awarded as Jack Walters robbed the ball cleanly off of Carson only for referee Jonny Irwin to give a foul. After the Albion protestations were quickly shut down, James Hodges made a brilliant stop to initially deny Liam Henderson but it was his namesake Jeff who popped up to head home the rebound.

Taddy were feeling aggrieved but they simply had to regroup and push the hosts for a way back into the contest. Casey Stewart went close to equalising on 64 minutes when he broke out on a counter

at electric pace driving all the way into the penalty area and getting his shot away but Lowson was equal to it pushing it clear.

Taddy's performance was impressive and professional yet again but goals were still proving hard to come by. Pete Davidson could only fire down Dan Lowson's throat after a neat one-two with Casey Stewart. A minute later and the travelling Taddy fans thought this was to be the moment as Joe Lumsden superbly wriggled beyond a Town defender but again the shot was comfortable for the goalkeeper.

As darkness descended and time started to run out, the Brewers continued to push increasingly hard for a goal that they will have certainly felt was deserved. Paddy Miller came remarkably close to scoring his second free-kick of the season as he whipped agonisingly over the bar on 74 minutes.
