1892



The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCFL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.







Farsley Celtic FC



The current football club was formed in June 2010 from the embers of Farsley Celtic F.C which entered Administration in June 2009 whilst in the Blue Square North and which failed to fulfil its fixtures eventually being expelled from that league early in 2010.

The old Farsley club (the name Celtic being added later) initially competed in the Leeds Amateur leagues and played its first game at the current site in 1948. Throughout the 1950's and 60's Celtic established themselves in the Yorkshire Leagues, being crowned champions in 1959-60 and 1968-69, although failing to be promoted as a result of ground regulations.

A First Round FA Cup tie against Tranmere Rovers at Leeds United's Elland Road ground in 1974 proved to be the highlight of the decade, and the 11,000 crowd that saw the Celts lose 2-0 to a Steve Coppell inspired Rovers is still the largest crowd in the club's history.

As the Yorkshire and Midland leagues merged in 1982, Farsley began in Division One North. By the mid 80's the club was invited into the Northern Premier League. After a few largely uninspiring seasons, the new decade brought unparalleled success.

In 2004-05 under the inspired management of Lee Sinnott, the team won the Unibond League Premier Division only to have points deducted as the result of Spennymoor Town going out of business and its results being expunged. The reduction in points resulted in the Celts securing only a play-off place, losing controversially on penalties against

Workington in the final.

Promotion was secured the following season after a playoff final victory against North Ferriby and in the following season, the club's first in the Conference North, they reached the first round of the FA Cup losing in a replay to MK Dons as well as securing promotion to the Conference National following a memorable evening at the Pirelli Stadium in Burton Upon Trent, when Simeon Bambrook's last minute penalty saw the Celts beat Hinkley United 4-3.

A single season of Conference National football resulted in relegation to the Conference North. On-going financial difficulties saw the Administrators appointed in June 2009 with the club's results expunged in March 2010 when the Administrator prohibited the club from fulfilling its fixtures.

The re-formed club were placed in the NCEL Premier Division for their first season which turned out to be highly successful with a league and cup double recorded. Many of the former players remained loyal to the club and top spot was held for much of the season, with the title confirmed on the penultimate weekend of the season. The club also reached two cup finals, the NCEL Presidents Cup, in which Tadcaster won but the season ended on a positive note with the League Cup being lifted despite Farsley having to play the majority of the final with 10 men.

The 2011/12 season was almost as successful, with a top five spot being

secured ensuring qualification for the playoffs. Unfortunately, the semi-final opponents were Witton Albion who won 3-0 and deservedly booked a place in the final, going onto win promotion after defeating Curzon Ashton in the final.

The following league season didn't quite go to plan with a disastrous run in the closing months, saw Neil Parsley's side go without a win in the final eight games. Inconsistent form before this point had all but put an end to the club's play-off chase and a 14th place finish was all that could be mustered.

On a positive note, Farsley reached the quarter-finals of the Doodson Sports Cup. After beating Ossett Albion and Clitheroe, Farsley beat Premier Division opposition Whitby Town and Worksop Town before bowing out to Matlock Town in the final eight.

Last season saw Farsley finish in mid table in twelfth position, after being as high as second place in late November. Despite a poor run of form after Christmas the side made it through to the Final of the Doodson Sport Cup against Warrington Town at Edgeley Park. Despite a goalless score line at full time Farsley eventually lost out on penalties.

The game proved to be the last for the club as Farsley AFC as they had their original name reinstated through the close season. On May 19th 2015 the club were officially known as Farsley Celtic FC once again.

Neil Parsley - Joint Manager

After a 12 year playing career, Neil Parsley first went into management with Guiseley, taking them to the First Round of the FA Cup on a number of occasions, and winning the West Riding County Cup. The club decided to dispense of his services in November 2006, despite the Lions holding top spot in the league. Parsley then moved onto North Ferriby United where he guided the East Yorkshire side away from the threat of relegation, also winning the East Riding Senior Cup at the KC Stadium. After a difficult start to the 2007/08 campaign, the club parted company with him and he then moved to Farsley, as Assistant Manager, to join now Joint Manager, John Deacey. Farsley and Deacey parted company in October 2008 following relegation and after a successful spell as Caretaker Manager, Parsley was given the role full-time. With the demise of the old club in March 2010. he agreed to manage the new side for the 2010/11 season and guided Farsley AFC to a NCEL Premier Division and League Cup 'double' in the club's inaugural season. In the following season he guided the club to the Semi-Final Play-offs in the Evo-Stik League First Division North and in 2014/15 the Integro Doodson League Cup Final.



John Deacey - Joint Manager

John was announced as Joint First-team Manager in July 2016, having been at the club for the majority of the previous season in an unofficial capacity. Deacey adds a wealth of experience to the Management team of the Celts. He has a long association with the club having been signed as a player in the 1990s and then becoming Assistant Manager to both Martin Haresign and Lee Sinnott. When Sinnott left in 2007, Deacey took the role of Manager and was assisted by Neil Parsley. Deacey also had a successful spell as Manager of Bradford Park Avenue, before his departure at the end of the 2014/15 season.



Goalkeepers **Graeme McKibbin**

Hailing from Northern Ireland, Graeme McKibbin signed for the club in the summer of 2016 after impressing in pre-season. The young keeper comes with plenty of top flight experience having played for Glentoran, Ards and Crusaders in the Northern Irish Football League.



Jake Lofthouse

The teenage keeper joined the club in 2014 as understudy to then first-choice keeper Tom Taylor. He has previous experience in the youth sections of both Guiseley and Harrogate Town. Jake made his league debut for the club in April 2015 against Kendal Town. This season he has signed dual registration with NCEL Premier Division side, Harrogate Railway.



Defenders **Adam Clayton**

Central defender Clayton arrived at the club in October 2015 and made his debut in the home match with Spennymoor Town. Adam arrived from Bradford Park Avenue having spent the early part of the season out with injury.



Aaron Hardy

Aaron returned to Farsley in October 2013 following a spell with then Conference North side Guiseley. The right-back had originally joined Farsley at the start of the 2012/13 season from Bradford Park Avenue, but when Conference North football came calling at Nethermoor, he made the decision to move club. Aaron began his career at Huddersfield Town, where he made 15 Football League appearances for the Terriers and has also had spells at Harrogate Town and FC Halifax Town. He regularly captained

the side last season in another impressive campaign, which saw him selected in the Evo-Stik League Division One North Team of the Season.

Paddy Miller

Paddy Miller initially left Farsley AFC for Bradford Park Avenue at the end of the 2013/14 season, a campaign for which he was honoured with the Player of the Season. Having completed a pre-season with the Bradford club, he was snapped up by Tadcaster Albion and played there for just over a year as a first-team regular and also had a spell at Scarborough Athletic. In October 2015 Miller made the return to Throstle Nest to play for the club he first represented at youth level. For the 2016/167 season Miller was appointed club captain.



Luke O'Brien

Left sided defender O'Brien joined Farsley for the start of the 2016/17 season from Shaw Lane AFC of the Evo-Stik League Division One South. Luke has Football League experience with Bradford City, Exeter City and Oxford United, as well as spells with Gateshead, Thackley and Bradford Park Avenue.



Ryan Serrant

Long-serving left-back Ryan Serrant first arrived at Throstle Nest on-loan from Leeds United towards the end of the 2006/07 season, after helping the club achieve promotion to the Conference Premier. He was released from Leeds that summer and decided to join the Celts, but a number of injuries disrupted his chances to get into the first-team. However in 2008/09, he became Farsley's first choice left-back under Neil Parsley and won the Manager's Player of the Year award for that season. He briefly joined Bradford Park Avenue after the old club's demise in March 2010, but returned to the reformed club that summer and has been a familiar fixture in the defence ever since.

Peter Davidson

Jordan Deacey

The attacking midfielder, son of Joint Manager John, joined the club at the beginning of January 2016, and scored on his debut. Deacey started his career with Bradford Park Avenue and has also had spells with AFC Telford and Boston United in the National League.



Chris Howarth


Strikers Richard Marshall

Tadcaster Albion's first league encounter with the original Farsley Celtic club came in Yorkshire League Division Two in the 1976/77 season. Both clubs were promoted, with the Brewers finishing in second place and the Villagers two positions lower in the final league table.

In the following season, Albion enjoyed their most successful season in the Yorkshire League - finishing ninth in Division One - but Celtic were relegated back to Division Two.

As the Brewers were relegated at the end of the 1978/79 season, the clubs met again in Yorkshire League Division Two in the following campaign. Sadly, it was another relegation season for the Tadcaster club and they wouldn't play Farsley Celtic again in that league.

Both clubs were founder members of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) in the 1982/83 season but were placed in different divisions. However, they did meet in a West Riding County Cup first round tie at Throstle Nest, which the Villagers won 1-0.

After two third place finishes for the Leeds club and a reorganisation of the league, Farsley Celtic and Tadcaster Albion found themselves together in the NCEL Division One North for the 1984/85 season.

The Villagers won 4-0, when the teams met at their home ground early in the season. However, the return fixture in late February brought the Brewers' finest result of the season - a 3-2 victory against the eventual league champions. Unfortunately, Albion failed to win any of the remaining 14 games

of the season - losing 13 - and finished bottom of the 17 club NCEL Division One North.

Although the Brewers would not play another league match against the original Farsley Celtic team, they did meet on four occasions in cup competitions.

In the 1987/88 season, when Albion finished bottom of the 15 club NCEL Division Two, the Villagers visited Ings Lane in a West Riding County Cup second round tie. Against their Northern Premier League (NPL) Division One opponents, the home side gained a creditable 0-0 draw. Farsley Celtic progressed into the third round with a 2-1 victory in the replay.

Eleven years later, the clubs were drawn together in two competitions - both at Tadcaster. In an FA Cup second round qualifying tie, Farsley Celtic won 2-1 and in the West Riding County Cup first round they registered a 3-1 victory.

In the 2010/11 season, the newly formed Farsley AFC joined the recently promoted Brewers in the NCEL Premier Division.

In November 2010, Albion travelled to Throstle Nest and a 20th minute Tom Woollard goal was the winner against the league leaders, in front of a crowd of 228.

In the last month of the season, Farsley visited Tadcaster, knowing that three points would virtually guarantee them the NCEL Premier Division championship. The Villagers raced into a 3-0 lead at halftime, with two goals from Ben Jones and one from Lee Connor. Goals from Terry Taylor (57 minutes) and Marc Thompson (73) gave the Brewers hope but Jones completed his hat-trick on 77 minutes, to give the visitors a

4-2 lead. Nick Thompson's goal for Albion, with ten minutes remaining, was not enough to prevent defeat. A crowd of 304 witnessed the seven goal thriller.

Following the 4-3 victory, Farsley were 12 points ahead of Bridlington Town, who only had four games remaining. With a far superior goal difference, the championship had almost clinched the title.

Eleven days later the teams would meet again at Tadcaster in the NCEL President's Cup final. Farsley arrived on a 19 game unbeaten run - 18 wins - and had now won the NCEL Premier Division. They had also booked a place in the NCEL League Cup final against Winterton Rangers.

The Brewers raced into a 2-0 lead, with goals from Carl Stewart (10 minutes) and Stuart Rice five minutes later. Ryan Qualter extended Albion's lead ten minutes into the second half but Ryan Serrant pulled a goal back, with a quarter of the game remaining. There was to be no comeback for the Villagers, when goals from Graeme Whitehead and Terry Taylor, in the final 10 minutes, sealed a 5-1 victory. Tadcaster Albion lifted the NCEL President's Cup in front of a crowd of 284.

A few weeks ago, the clubs met for the first time in the Evo-Stik First Division North. Farsley Celtic arrived at the i2i Stadium as the season's early leaders, having beaten Colwyn Bay (1-0), Goole AFC (3-0) and Kendal Town (1-0). After a tight encounter, the visitors maintained their 2016/17 record of not conceding a goal but lost their 100% status, with a 0-0 draw. The game was watched by a Bank Holiday crowd of 510 - the second highest in the Evo-Stik First Division North so far this season.

The visitors made sure Michael Ingham was kept on his toes after Bradley Knox's audacious volley had to be tipped over.


But it was Taddy who were looking the most likely to find the net next as Conor Sellars' overhead kick from point blank range was headed off the goal line.

Barrett has quietly gone about his business at right-back this season but he is swiftly becoming one of the first names on the team sheet.

On Saturday The Brewers once again welcome Farsley Celtic to the i2i stadium but this time, for an FA Cup tie.

"Farsley Celtic is a tough draw for us, they are a good organised team. You just need to look at the goals they are scoring with the clean sheets they are keeping.

But we are just as good if not better. Anything can happen in the FA Cup but I do expect goals.

The FA Cup does bring different incentives but for me it's just another game. Preparation will be exactly the same."

Barrett insists that getting a home tie is crucial and praises the facilities at the i2i stadium.

"It always helps being at home in a game like this. Playing in front of your home fans and on your own turf. I do enjoy playing at home. Who wouldn't? The facilities and the pitch are outstanding."

Over the years Barrett has fluctuated between right wing and right back but now seems to be settling into the back four making the position his own.

"As a kid growing up I was a defender. I do enjoy it at full-back, keeping clean sheets and also going forward and joining in with the wingers. For me I do think full-back is my position."

The Brewers have made an impressive start to their debut Evo-Stik season losing just once on the opening day.

"We have started the season well.
We have kept four clean sheets in the league now as well as scoring goals.
You can tell the difference in standard, it is definitely more of a challenge.

I do think we are capable of reaching the play-offs, if not competing to win the league.

This is my fourth season now at Tadcaster Albion and I have loved every moment of it. Seeing the club grow and grow has been great. The owners have done a brilliant job but also the fans have been fantastic.

It's a great club to play for and I look forward to the future."



Here we look back at previous games played by the Brewers on 17th September.

On This Day

By Ian Tyssen



Tadcaster Albion travelled to Armthorpe Welfare, for a Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) fixture, following draws in their opening two games. The visitors, who would finish the season 13th out of 14 clubs, slumped to a 0-3 defeat against a Welfare team who ended the campaign in second place.

1988

Albion picked up a 2-1 victory at Fryston Colliery Welfare in their fourth league fixture of the season. All four of the Brewers' opening matches had resulted in away wins - two victories and two losses for Albion. The season would be a struggle for both clubs, with the Brewers' hosts finishing bottom of the 14 team NCEL Division Two and the Tadcaster club being tenth.

1994

The Brewers recorded an impressive 3-1 success at home against Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare, who finished the season as runners up in the NCEL Division One. Albion had started the league campaign with two draws and two defeats in their previous games and found themselves in 12th place at the end of the season.

1996

A 1-1 stalemate against North Yorkshire neighbours Harrogate Railway Athletic at Ings Lane completed a mixed start to the NCEL Division One campaign for the Brewers - a win, a loss and a draw. The Rail ended the season third in the league, which was ten places higher than Tadcaster.

2005

Tadcaster Albion crashed out of the FA Vase, in front of a crowd of just 25 at Parkgate. One week earlier, the Brewers had beaten Parkgate 2-1 in a league fixture but they lost 0-2 in the FA Vase first round qualifying tie. The consolation for Albion was that they topped the NCEL Division One table with a 100% record after the first three games.

2011

The Brewers met North Yorkshire rivals Scarborough Athletic in front of the FA TV cameras for an FA Cup first round qualifying tie. In front of a crowd of 472, Danny Gray headed the Brewers into a first half lead. which he then doubled with a tap in just after 60 minutes. With only a few minutes remaining, instead of just trying to keep possession and protect the 2-0 lead, Carl Stewart made it 3-0 with a stunning free kick. The Seadogs enjoyed the better league season, finishing third in the NCEL Premier Division table, five places higher than their FA Cup hosts.

2013

Thackley, who were top of the NCEL Premier Division table with a 100% winning record from seven games, visited Tadcaster for their eighth league match. A crowd of 83 saw the home side claim a 2-0 victory - a first half goal from Vinnie Dhesi and a late penalty by Dan Barrett - and end the Dennyboys perfect start to the season. The Bradford club were still top of the league but would eventually slip down to 13th by the end of the season, with the Brewers finishing third.
