# 1892



The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCFL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.







# Colne FC





Colne FC were formed in January 1996, by a group of like-minded people under the wing of now Chairman Dave Blacklock. The enthusiasts combined their strengths and knowledge of non-league football, and arrangements were made for a new club to use the vacant Holt House Stadium, once used by the Dynamoes in the North West Counties Football League Division Two.

Colne FC's first ever competitive game was on the 17th August 1996 against Middlewich and the result ended in a 1–0 defeat.

The team was then managed by Keith Mason, but after his resignation soon after, Denzel Hart was appointed to the hot seat. His first game was a 6–0 defeat away at Ashton Town, but just two games later Colne FC recorded their first ever victory thumping Bacup Borough 5–2. The highlight of the season, coming when the reserves won the BEP Cup at Clitheroe's Shawbridge ground.

The clubs fourth season was eagerly awaited, but in September 2000 manager Hart left the club by mutual agreement. Player John Lister was placed in temporary charge and his appointment was made permanent a month later. Lister learned lessons from this campaign and in 2001/02 finished 14th.

In the summer of 2002 James Webster took control of the club, to become the youngest chairman in the league at the age of 24. James was a player at the club with plenty of experience and along with his father who was vice chairman, had a strong desire to see the current side emulate the success of its predecessors.

Season 2002/03 started well enough, but in December 2002 John Lister resigned as Manager.

Paul Lynch took over as manager and the improvements continued, but in August 2003, Paul was offered the position of manager at Unibond side Rossendale United and subsequently left.

Webster responded immediately by appointing Nigel Coates as the new manager as well as player Gary Rishton as his number 2. Nigel had played for the Dynamoes, being in the FA Vase winning team and had experience of management at local rivals Nelson.

Season 2003/04 brought back the glory days to Colne with a string of successes. In the League Colne had to play catch up after a successful cup run, but ended the season 10 points clear in Division two, scoring 102 goals in their 38 games.

We completed the double by winning the Division Two Trophy 1–0 over Great Harwood. The season was capped by an amazing run in the FA Vase for a North West Counties Football League Division Two club, they progressed all the way to the semifinals, (via an incredible 1–2 away win at AFC Wimbledon) before being defeated over two legs 4–3 on aggregate to AFC Sudbury.

As the season progressed attendances started to rise as the local population realised we were no longer the whipping boys of the league, and the famous RED ARMY was formed.

Colne took little time in adjusting to life in the First Division, another FA Vase run and a creditable 10th place was secured in 2004-/05. Consolidation has followed and Colne FC's highest league positions to date have been 5th in season 2007-08 and the same again in 2010-11.

In November 2013 Colne's manager for the past 10 years stepped down from the hot seat and former Colne player Steve Cunningham was appointed manager, with another former Colne favourite Ted Cockett as his No.2 and Coach.

Steve and Ted had ambitious plans for the club and wasted no time in bringing in a few new faces to boost the playing squad, consolidating for the rest of the season but with big hopes and plans for the following seasons.

Season 2014-15 proved to be the best ever at that time in terms of league placing, with Colne finishing a creditable fourth. No doubt the management team have ambitions to improve on that in 2015-16.

Season 2015-16 proved to be the best ever in Colne FC twenty year history. The reds battled for the NWCFL Premier title with Runcorn Linnets and Atherton Collieries with the reds winning the title with an 81 minute goal at 1874 Northwich securing 100 points and 100 + goals upon the way.

The reds also reached the final of the League Cup before falling to Atherton. In addition the reserves did the double for the second consecutive season.

With all this going on, due to the fantastic efforts of a strong and loyal band of followers and officials including the resurrected "Red Army" and the continued support from our main sponsors XLCR Vehicle Management there is a bright future on the horizon for Colne FC.

The whole team are looking forward to the challenge of playing football at Step 4 for the first time and making new friends on the way.

# Christmas Trees & Wingless Wonders



So, do you prefer a "Bolt" or a "Sweeper"? Or are you more of a "Christmas Tree" kind of a guy? No, I'm not referring to your last trip to the DIY store! I'm talking formations...

It's quite mind-boggling how tactical geniuses over the years have managed to devise so many different ways to set up ten outfield players for the simple game of football.

Until the mid-20th Century (in Britain, at least) it would seem that pretty much all teams were advocates of the "W-M" formation; 5 attackers, 5 defenders. Not surprisingly this splitting of the team into separate attacking and defensive units tended to create a plenty of goalmouth drama and little midfield action. Lots of long balls and plenty of crosses aimed at big target men were the order of the day. This was the only way to play! Or so we thought until one day in 1953 when English football was shaken to its very foundations.

The "Marvellous Magyars" of Hungary came to Wembley and thrashed the hosts 6-3! This was the first time England had ever lost at home to Continental opponents and it caused a radical rethink among English coaches. Manchester City were the first to emulate the Hungarian tactic of the deep-lying centre-forward dropping back into midfield to look for the

ball and thus draw the centre-half out of position which created space for others to exploit. It was known as "The Revie Plan" as the great Don Revie played the key role in the formation.

For the first time, coaches realised that there was more than one way to play The Beautiful Game and a period of experimentation and innovation ensued.

The ultimate fruits of this exercise in self-analysis were borne in the form of the "Wing-less Wonders" of Alf Ramsey who of course won the World Cup in 1966 playing a 4-3-3 formation, without wingers.

Elsewhere during the '60s, those wily, defensively-minded Italians, led by Inter's coach, Helenio Herrera, were busy perfecting "Catenaccio". Translated as "the (door) bolt" this formation saw a defensive back-four given extra solidity by means of a fifth man (known as the Sweeper) tidying up any danger that had managed to breach the line of four.

In '70s Holland, Ajax were creating a football revolution all of their own with "Total Football", whereby all ten outfield players rotate around the field ensuring that everyone was equally involved in defence and attack. Every player possessed great technique and finishing ability. It was a breath-taking, counterattacking style that won Ajax lots of trophies and the national team many neutral admirers.

4-3-3 continued in England in the '70s but with a twist. The front 3 began to be made up of a tricky winger, a big target man to get on the end of crosses and a nippy little strike partner to provide the finish.

Liverpool, with Heighway, Toshack and Keegan, and then Forest, with Robertson,

Withe and Woodcock, enjoyed huge success with this tactic.

Enter the '80s and long-ball football made a return with two-man midfield watching on as the game took place above their heads. Wimbledon and Watford with their 4-2-4s and Sheffield Wednesday with a 5-2-3 were masters of this style. It wasn't always pretty but it was very effective. Liverpool dominated the decade, however, with a dynamic 4-4-2 whereby balls were played predominantly through behind defences or into the channels for Rush and Dalglish (and later Aldridge) to run onto.

Highlights of the '90s were the advent of wing-backs; marauding full-backs-cumwingers who were given licence to attack down the flanks wherever possible. They provided the width in a 3-5-2 formation. Although perhaps the best-remembered formation of that era was Terry Venables' so-called "Christmas Tree" 4-3-2-1 set up.

Man' United ruled the '90s and Noughties with Fergie's classic 4-4-2. The individual personnel changed over time but the system remained essentially the same. And these days, of course, most of the successful teams (including our own mighty Brewers!) tend to line up with a 4-2-3-1.

It's true to say though, that while ingenious formations can ensure that the combined strengths of the individual players are given the best opportunity to be most effective, nothing beats having a team filled with 11 top players. Let's hope that our top players have too much for Colne to cope with today, whatever formation they face us with – Come on you Brewers!

Manager Billy Miller initially made two changes to the team that narrowly lost to Scarborough Athletic on Boxing Day however this was to change as Jono & Josh Greening were caught in horrendous traffic.

Both Greening's were named in the starting eleven but didn't arrive till the game had kicked off therefore Jordan Armstrong and Conor Sellars stepped in.

Despite the late alterations, it was nearly the perfect start to the game and the year for Tadcaster.

The rebound fell to Conor Sellars who's reaction header was blocked and eventually Graeme McKibbin pounced on the pieces.

# **Taddy Punished By Celtic.**

Farsley were coming into the contest on the back of a defeat at Ossett Town on Boxing Day and there were certainly signs of uncertainty at the back in the first fifteen minutes.

First it was McKibbin, then a clearance off the line, then the crossbar. Well next it was the referee's turn to deny Taddy a chance to take the lead.

As the half wore on, Celtic began to grow in the encounter and Ross Daly had a glorious chance to break the deadlock eight minutes later.

The midfielder stormed into the penalty area but could only poke straight at the advancing Gary Stevens.

However the home side did in fact take the lead six minutes from the break.

Richard Marshall's low shot somehow found its way through Stevens' legs and into the back of the net.

The goalkeeper may have been unsighted by Thirkell and saw the effort late but nevertheless Farsley took the lead.

And it could have been two five minutes later, this time Stevens made amends to deny Marshall his second.

Taddy did find a way to goal before the half-time whistle went however, it was adjudged to have been an illegal way.

Josh Grant's high cross squirmed past McKibbin but Tom Allan clearly jumped into and impeded the goalkeeper. Into the second half and Conor Sellars was given a golden opportunity to equalise after being played in behind but the nippy attacker couldn't beat McKibbin who stood up tall.

Farsley were building momentum as the second half ticked by and had an effort of their own cleared off the line by Dan Thirkell.

They did double their lead in the 69th minute though with James Walshaw turning in at the near post.

But back came Taddy as the deficit was pegged back to just one four minutes later.

A double change saw Tom Allan move from centre-back to centre-forward and the man on loan scored his third goal in three games.

Allan capitalised and pounced on a mix up between McKibbin & Clayton to reignite hope for the travelling Taddy fans.

Having said that though, with nine minutes remaining the contest was all but over as Richard Marshall netted his second and Celtic's third of the afternoon.

The Brewers couldn't live with Paul Walker's trickery and powerful wide play and Marshall leathered into the net after several fortuitous ricochets.

With the game effectively over, James Walshaw scored two more in the final two minutes to complete his hat-trick and add a certain gloss on the score line.

His second and Farsley's fourth was a fantastic goal. The ball was sharply played into him on the edge of the penalty area and the experienced striker turned and arrowed into the bottom corner in one swift motion.

The fifth and final goal of the afternoon came deep in injury time when Walshaw raced through Taddy's back-line and deftly dinked over Stevens.

A dubious penalty decision with ten minutes to go ignited a Scarborough comeback as Cameron Murray's late strike wins it for Boro

Former Boro marksman Carl Stewart gave Billy Miller's men the lead six minutes from the break looping over goalkeeper Jordan Porter.

Benny Igiehon tapped in at the start of the second half to equalise before Tom Allan controversially put the Brewers back in front.

The referee then took centre stage once again with ten minutes to go after awarding the visitors a questionable penalty.

This drove Scarborough on and Cameron Murray completed the comeback with five minutes to go.

Taddy boss Miller made five changes to last week's County Cup victory with Josh Grant, Tom Allan, Jason Mycoe, Tom Corner and Josh Greening all coming back into the starting eleven.

After a very cagey opening twenty minutes, it was the home side who had the first two efforts on goal.

Both Carl Stewart and Jono Greening tried their luck from outside the penalty area but could only shoot straight at Jordan Porter in the Boro goal.

However, Scarborough unlocked the door at the other end and carved out a glorious chance as new boy Jacob Hazel drove past Josh Barrett but was denied by a terrific one v one save from Gary Stevens.

But it was Taddy who drew first blood in the 39th minute. Josh Grant's long raking ball down the left-hand channel was met by Carl Stewart.

Stewart saw that Porter had come flying off his line and the former Boro striker ever so coolly flicked over the goalkeeper.

It seemed to take an age to make its way goalwards but after bouncing once it nestled into the back of the net to give the Brewers the lead as chants of 'he's one of our own' rang around the i2i stadium.



It was a bitterly cold and blustery afternoon in Tadcaster but the contest certainly heated up in the second half.

Taddy began the half on the front foot as Dan Thirkell and Tom Corner both came close to establishing a healthier two goal cushion.

Despite that however, it was the visitors who netted next and drew level nine minutes into the second half.

A ball in behind the Brewers' defence lead to a mix-up between goalkeeper Gary Stevens and Tom Allan which allowed Craig Nelthorpe to square to Benny Igiehon who helped himself to a tap in.

The 721 watching on football fans were being served up a Boxing Day treat as both sides were going hammer and tong for all three points.

Josh Greening must have thought he'd put his side back in front after latching onto Tom Allan's flick on and firing low and hard only to be miraculously kept out by goalkeeper Porter.

Taddy needn't have worried though as they did in fact retake the lead a minute later.

Tom Allan marked his second appearance for the club with a second goal after turning in Josh Greening's deep free-kick.

There was certainly an element of controversy about the goal though as at first the visitors were appealing for offside before shouting for handball.

They may well have had a point with the latter but gesticulating with referee Tristan Greaves only resulted in a flurry of cautions and the goal stood.

Following the goal, the game entered somewhat of a lull as Scarborough held the majority of possession but could only waste a succession of free-kicks.

As time rapidly ticked by, Gary Stevens was on-hand to terrifically rush off his line and thwart Jacob Hazel.

However the away side were awarded a penalty kick a mere thirty seconds later.

Midfielder Dan Thirkell was the guilty party after allegedly bringing down Jacob Hazel but it looked as though the Boro man was already on his way to ground.

Nevertheless the penalty kick was given and despite a touch from Stevens, Adam Bolder side-footed confidently into the top-right hand corner to set up a grandstand finale.

Taddy may have been the comeback kings in the FA Cup meeting earlier in the season but this time it was Boro who came from behind with five minutes remaining.

After a mixture of several pinball like ricochets and Taddy not being able to clear their lines, the ball fell for tricky attacker Cameron Murray who expertly fired low into the back of the net to send the travelling fans into ecstasy.

From this moment on Scarborough ran the clock down effectively and held on to the victory.




