The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCFL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.





Ossett Albion FC





Ossett Albion Football Club originated in 1944 when a group of schoolboys decided to form a team to play in the local football leagues in and around the Heavy Woollen area covering mainly Ossett, Dewsbury and Batley. In those early days they could hardly have envisaged that 71 years later their Club would still be going strong and competing in the higher echelons of Non League football. A football club having its origins during the Second World War is not unique to Ossett Albion but it is obviously a fairly rare occurrence.

Since its formation and humble beginnings the Club has eventually achieved its long term aim and ambition of Northern Premier League football and now finds itself in the fourth tier of Non League clubs in the whole of England. Surely few of those schoolboy founders of the Club, of whom Jack Ingham is the only surviving person, could have predicted back then what would become of their germ of an idea and where the Club would be 71 years on.

Progress throughout their history has been steady and measured and at all times sustainability, at whatever level of the game they were competing, has been very much the order of the day. There has never been a "boom and bust" mentality within the organisation and successive Committees and administrations have always followed the tried and tested methods of moving the Club forward while always operating strictly within its means.

While progressing steadily through the various leagues on their climb up to their current position within the National League System, Albion established a strong reputation locally and particularly in cup competitions with plenty of silverware to show for their efforts along the way.

Although we have yet to see the name of Ossett Albion in the draw for the 1st Round proper of the FA Challenge Cup the Club have reached the 4th Qualifying Round on several occasions only to fall at the final hurdle. This feat remains one of the Club's major aspirations. The Club also experienced a good deal of success in the FA Vase competition but fortunes since competing in the FA Trophy have been less impressive.

Three West Riding County Cup wins in the mid-sixties and four in all were instrumental in promoting Ossett Albion's reputation over a wider area of the county. Winning the Yorkshire League Cup twice in successive seasons followed by victories in the Northern Counties East League Cup on two occasions all enhanced Albion's cup pedigree and made them a real force to be reckoned with. In among they also lifted the Yorkshire League Division 1 championship trophy in 1974/1975 and the Northern Counties East League Premier Division titles in 1998/1999 and again in 2003/2004.

Albion realised their ultimate goal of promotion to the Northern Premier League at the end of season 2000/2001 though survival at this level lasted only the one campaign before suffering relegation back to the Northern Counties East League from whence they came. They regained their Northern Premier League status for the 2005/2006 season and 20015/2016 will be their 12th consecutive one in this league.

The Club are run by a group of Directors and Committee several of whom have been the backbone of the organisation for many years and they are now led by a newly appointed Chairman in Dominic Riordan. Dominic had a couple of spells as a player in Ossett Albion

colours before taking on the role of Chairman and at 29 he is one of, if not the youngest, Chairmen at this level of the game. Having turned out for the first team on numerous occasions last season and, still a registered player, he is quite possibly the only Player/Chairman at this level of the game.

After a few years of battling relegation at the wrong end of the league table it is the Chairman's aim to introduce new ideas and initiatives in order to take Albion to the next level or at the very least establish the team as a competitive outfit capable of finishing in the middle to higher positions in the table.

The group of long-serving Committee men are used to seeing players spend much of their careers with Albion most notably Peter Eaton and Nigel Yarrow who played respectively over 800 and 600 games for the Club and are still involved in one capacity or another.

As well as progress on the field of play the next immediate phase of Albion's history will see the Club looking to embark on a series of ambitious projects to further develop the ground and infrastructure. It has long been felt that the facilities are in need of up-dating but limited financial resources have always proved a stumbling block. Initiatives have now been put in place to increase revenues and a number of ground improvements, though still in the planning stages, are becoming realistic possibilities in the not too distant future.

Pat joins the club from Sheffield FC and is an experienced midfielder having played a number of clubs including, Handsworth Parramore and Staveley MW.







On This Day

2003 - In their opening game of the Northern Counties East Football League Division One season, Tadcaster Albion were beaten 2-0 by Rossington Main. The visitors from Doncaster eventually finished 12th in the league and the Brewers would finish below all of the other 17 clubs.

2008 - The Brewers faced a tough tie at the Northern League club Dunston Federation in the FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round. The game was heading towards a replay at Tadcaster until the home side scored four goals in the final 13 minutes, to the delight of the

majority of the 162 crowd. The Fed went on to face North Yorkshire opposition in the next two rounds - Harrogate Railway and Whitby Town. **2013** - Albion kicked off the season's FA Cup with a Friday night fixture at Northern League club Bishop Auckland. The vastly experienced Denny Ingram, who had recently signed for the Brewers, captained the visitors to a creditable 0-0 draw. A crowd of 359 watched the Extra Preliminary Round tie at Heritage Park.

2014 - Barnoldswick Town, from the North West Counties League Premier Division, visited Tadcaster in the FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round. Calum Ward gave the Brewers the lead after just nine minutes but they had to wait until the second half to add more goals. Between the 52nd and 71st minutes, Carl Stewart completed a hattrick, including a penalty, and Mitch Hamilton added a fifth goal in the last few minutes. The bulk of the crowd of 107 went home happy with a 5-0 victory and a place in the Preliminary Round.

HEAD TO HEAD Ossett Albion FC

THE BREWERS

DCASTER ALBION

Tonight's EVO-STIK Northern Premier League (NPL) fixture between Tadcaster Albion and Ossett Albion is the first meeting in a league game since the 1970s.

During the nine seasons in which the Brewers were members of the Yorkshire League, the 1977/78 season was the only one when the two clubs competed at the same level - Division One. It was Tadcaster's most successful campaign in the Yorkshire League - a ninth place finish - but Ossett Albion ended the season in 13th place and were relegated to Division Two.

All of the eight more recent competitive matches between the clubs have been in either the West Riding County Cup or the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) Cup. In the 1985/86 season, the Brewers visited Ossett in the West Riding County Cup first round but were on the wrong end of a 2-3 score line.

Three season's later, the clubs met in the second round of the same competition. On this occasion, the NCEL Division Two club secured a 1-1 draw at Ossett and then won the replay 3-0 at Ings Lane. It was a poor season for the West Yorkshire club, who finished bottom of the NCEL Premier Division.

Ossett Albion were again struggling in the NCEL Premier Division in the 1989/90 season, when the teams were drawn together in the first round of the West Riding County Cup. This time the Brewers were unable to beat a team from two tiers higher in the football pyramid and they lost 0-2 at Tadcaster. One month later, there was an opportunity

for revenge in the NCEL League Cup second round but Ossett Albion were the 2-1 winners at Ings Lane.

The Brewers suffered a heavy defeat when the clubs next met in the 1994/95 season. In an NCEL League Cup second round tie at Tadcaster, the visitors, who would finish the season in 10th place in the NCEL Premier Division, cruised to a 5-0 victory.

Ten years later, with Ossett Albion having just achieved promotion to the NPL Division One, the clubs met in a West Riding County Cup third round tie. The visitors recorded a 2-0 win in the last fixture between the clubs at Tadcaster.

The last time the clubs met in a match at Ossett, was in the 2008/09 season, when the Brewers visited for a first round tie in the West Riding County Cup. The home side were enjoying their most successful season in the NPL Division One North - finishing sixth out of 21 clubs.

Although Pitts scored for the Brewers in the fourth minute, the hosts had already scored twice in the first three minutes. Douglas equalised in the 12th minute but Ossett then added four more goals before Harkin scored a third for Tadcaster, making the halftime score 6-3. The home side extended their lead on the 53rd minute but it was the end of the scoring until the last minute, when the West Yorkshire club made the final score 8-3. The crowd of 57 definitely received good value for their admission money.


