The club is believed to have been formed in 1892 as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until 1923 that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In 1948 Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the 1950's & 60's.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until 1960, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In 1973 the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in 1975 & 1977 to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in 1979 & 1980.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of 2004/05, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in 2006, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov 2007, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of 2008/09, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title. In 2010, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in 2011/12 and 6th in **2012/13**. In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new chairman.



In 2014/2015 the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games. in March led to them finally finishing in third.

> An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In 2015/2016 the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare. They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In 2016/2017 the

Brewers started their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North.

With a mix of old and new players Billy Miller was back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division was needed. The Brewers started the season well and were in the play-off spots, then injury problems hit the team and the season seemed to run away from them and they finished 19th in the league. The Brewers had a great chance for silverware in the West Riding County Cup Final, the game finished 1-1 but they lost out to Farsley Celtic 4-2 on penalties.

In 2017/2018 the Brewers started the season with a new management team, the Directors made a tough decision at the end of last season and decided to change the management team and out went Billy & Matt and in came Michael and Simon. Michael and Simon are full of energy and excitement after finishing the season with the i2i Football Academy and TAFC Under 21 squads both winning silver ware and finishing first and second in their respective leagues. Now the duo have a chance to continue that form and take Taddy to greater heights.

Team · HISTORY



South Shields



It has now been over 125 years since the first recorded appearance of a named South Shields Football Club.

A team from the town began playing friendly matches in 1888, and from those early times, the town club has been subject to much fortune and misfortune.

The club, in all of its incarnations, has had many twists and turns, and now appears to have started another new era.

South Shields Athletic AFC was a member of the Northern Alliance League, and enjoyed moderate success in its short career of five years, before being disbanded in 1902 due to financial problems.

The name of Jack Inskip features prominently in the early annals of South Shields FC, and he is credited with the formation of a junior club in 1899 of local schoolboys from the Adelaide Street area of Laygate, that progressed beyond all measure to be ultimately elected into membership of the Football League in 1919.

This team was known as South Shields Adelaide Athletic, and after much success, it re-organised two years later as a limited company in 1910, and now changed its official title to that of South Shields Football Club, and was victorious in the Durham Challenge Cup the following season.

Numerous records were made and smashed, plus two consecutive North Eastern League championship titles won, in which seasons only four games were lost.

The 1913-14 and 1914-15 campaigns turned out to be most remarkable for Shields, and the statistics are indeed memorable, as they were winners of six trophies, champions of the North Eastern League in the first season by a margin of 15 points, winners of the Durham Football Association Challenge Cup, the Ingham Infirmary Cup and retained the Black Cup (Tynemouth Infirmary Cup).

Shields were champions of the league for 1915-16, and in 1919, the years of effort behind the drive for the Football League came to fruition with its elec-

tion to the Second Division, or the second league as it was then titled.

Initially all seemed promising, and manager Jack Tinn and his colleagues had good reason for quarded satisfaction.

In the 1921 season, with Shields top by five clear points at Christmas, promotion was in the air and the distinct possibility of derbies against the league neighbours Newcastle United and Sunderland was an exciting prospect.

However, the impetus was not maintained, form suffered and the club finished in sixth place, only 10 points behind champions Nottingham Forest. Indeed only a total of seven more points would have seen Shields promoted as runners up, and only the bitter pill of crushing disappointment was their reward. How very different club history would have been if promotion had been realised.

Famous players in this period included 'Warney' Cresswell – the only player ever to gain a full international cap with Shields – and Alf Maitland.

Shields reached the FA Cup fifth round in 1925-26 and again in 1926-27, and the ground attendance record for Horsley Hill was achieved, 24,348, but the visitors Swansea Town denied Shields' further progress.

The club sold its best players, though, and was relegated to the Third Division North before, facing impending bankruptcy, the only possible viable alternative from closure was to move, and this regrettable but seemingly unavoidable point was reached in 1930.

Despite a final league table position of seventh, the club left the town and moved to Gateshead.

A new club was eventually established, and won the 1938-39 North Eastern League championship, and the Durham Challenge Cup.

In 1950, Shields moved to Simonside Hall, and for a few years from the mid-1950s, it was widely acknowledged as one of the better non-league clubs in the country. The development of Simonside Hall, backed by the endeavours of a supporters club with a recorded membership of over 13,000, produced positive dividends.

Shields played in five different leagues during the 1950s and 60s, and many will recall with great pleasure the appearance of the great Stanley Matthews in a game at Simonside Hall in 1966.

A major change in the national non-league set-up came in 1968 with the formation of the Northern Premier League, part of the new soccer 'pyramid', with South Shields invited as a founder member.

The club advanced to the FA Cup third round in 1970 and was drawn away to Queens Park Rangers. The final result of 4-1 also told a story of missed chances by Shields and numerous injuries sustained, against a side that included Terry Venables and Rodney Marsh.

Also in 1974, the club reached the FA Trophy semi-final, but financial problems culminated in 1974 with the total loss of the club, the ground of Simonside Hill and all effects.

The club went to Gateshead for the second time in 44 years and re-emerged as Gateshead United, and took the place of South Shields in the Northern Premier League, and the rest is history.

A new club, the South Shields Mariners FC, was born, and started with nothing.

Initial progress was indeed quite remarkable, only the lack of a ground with adequate and sufficient facilities to satisfy the required criteria of the Northern League for promotion prevented this being maintained.

After the winning of two consecutive Northern Alliance League championship titles, and an appearance in the FA Vase quarter-final, the club joined the Wearside League. Further success followed with the winning of the Durham Challenge Cup at Roker Park in 1977.

A ground to develop became a long-running issue and over the course of the next long 18 years, so the club remained a member of the Wearside League,

seemingly unable to leave the council-owned Jack Clark Park.

In 1992, the redundant sports club and ground of Filtrona FC became available for purchase, and following protracted negotiations, was bought by the club.

Gradual upgrading and development of Filtrona Park and promotion to the First Division of the Northern League was achieved in the years that followed.

The club's recent successes were in 2009-10 as winners of the League Cup and J R Cleator Cup, but it faced a major challenge to stay at Filtrona Park

after its former owner put it up for sale, and eventually Shields were forced to leave the ground in 2013.

They also suffered relegation to Northern League Division Two in 2012-13, and kicked off the following season 20 miles away from home, in Peterlee.

The club played home matches there for two years until new chairman Geoff Thompson bought Filtrona Park – now renamed Mariners Park – in the summer of 2015 to start a new era at the club.

In his first season at the helm, Shields won the Northern League Division Two title with 107 points, and in the off-season, Mr Thompson continued to press ahead with his plans for the club.

Ground improvements – which began in his first summer at the club – continued, with three new stands erected and a new 3G facility installed on what was the bottom pitch at Mariners Park.

They followed up that superb campaign with the most successful season in the club's history, with Shields winning the Northern League, Northern League Cup and Durham Challenge Cup before adding the icing to the cake by lifting the FA Vase at Wembley - the first national trophy in the Mariners' history.

Last season, a third consecutive league title and promotion was achieved as Shields won the Evo-Stik North Division, and they now look ahead to a campaign in the Premier Division.

Blair Adams

Shields pulled off a transfer coup in July 2018 with the capture of Adams. He made over 200 appearances in a professional career which included spells at Sunderland, Coventry City, Notts County, Hartlepool United and Hamilton Academical, and joined his hometown club aged just 26. Able to play at left-back or further forward on the left flank.

Craig Baxter

Has been regarded as one of non-league's best right-backs for the best part of a decade, and was particularly successful in his time with Gateshead. Strong defensively but is always a threat going forward, too.

Gary Brown

The defender was a summer arrival from Darlington, who he captained. A strong presence at the back, he won three promotions during his time at Darlo and will be looking to use his experience to help those around him at Mariners Park.

Anthony Callaghan

Exciting attacking left-back who signed for Shields from Washington in October 2016. Played a key role for the Mariners in the first half of last season, but has been out since December 2017 with a back injury.

Chris Hunter

Signed for his hometown club from Darlington in the summer of 2018 after almost a year out with injury. The full-back or centre-back is strong physically and technically, and will be hoping to make his mark quickly.

Darren Lough

A former Newcastle United academy youngster, Lough spent five years playing professionally in Iceland before returning to England with Shields in January 2017. Comfortable at left-back or centre-back.

Dillon Morse

An arrival in the summer of 2016 from Blyth Spartans, the young and talented defender has established himself as a firm favourite at Mariners Park. He has helped the club to five trophy wins over the last two seasons.

Jon Shaw

Club captain Shaw joined from Gateshead as a striker in the summer of 2016, having been a prolific frontman during his time with the likes of Gateshead, Luton Town and Burton Albion. He has been switched to the centre of defence since signing for Shields, though, and has won consistent praise for his performances and leadership.

Robert Briggs

Technically gifted central midfielder who is in his second spell with the Mariners, having first been with the club as a teenager. He rejoined Shields in September 2015 from Spennymoor Town and has been a key performer since then. A set-piece specialist who is also the club's vice-captain.

Josh Gillies

Signed for Shields in the summer of 2018 from Darlington, having earlier been with the likes of Gateshead and Carlisle United. Adds dynamism in wide areas and centrally when deployed there.

Matty Pattison

A former Premier League player with Newcastle United and international star with South Africa, the gifted midfielder joined Shields last summer from Blyth Spartans. He will be hoping for a big campaign.

Michael Richardson

Started his career with Newcastle United before moving into non-league with Blyth Spartans. He signed for the Mariners midway through the 2016-17 campaign and has helped the club win five trophies in the last two years.

Barrie Smith

The club's longest-serving player is heading into his ninth season with the Mariners. He has made over 300 appearances for Shields and remains an important part of the squad, deployed in central midfield or at right-back. A true crowd favourite.

Phil Turnbull

Midfielder who had long been linked with his hometown club before finally putting pen to paper in the summer of 2018, completing a transfer from Darlington. He had earlier played a key role in Gateshead's rise through the leagues. Extremely comfortable on the ball.

Daniel Wright

The former Sunderland AFC youngster is another Shields lad, and joined the club this summer. The former England youth international is excellent on the ball and will be looking to chip in with goals this season, having enjoyed a short loan spell at Mariners Park last term.

Gavin Cogdon

Exciting and gifted striker who has been terrorising opposition defences for more than a decade with the likes of Spennymoor Town and Shields. A two-time FA Vase winner, he will be hoping to make another big impact this season.

Carl Finnigan

Shields' top scorer last season will be aiming to better his goal tally this time around. The former Falkirk, Newcastle United and Gateshead striker has also played in South Africa and Botswana, and adds vital experience to the team.

Lee Mason

Joined the Mariners from cross-river rivals North Shields midway through last season, and made a big impact. His goals helped land Shields the Evo-Stik North Division title.

The Managers **Lee Picton and Graham Fenton**

Picton and Fenton took over the running of South Shields in September 2016 and have enjoyed remarkable success since. With five trophies and two promotions under their belts, their reputation is growing. They have worked with each other for many years, having led the Monkseaton Football Academy together. They now hold full-time roles at South Shields as the heads of the club's academy.

Pre-Season Recap | Leeds Youngsters Too Good For Albion Tadcaster Albion 1-6 Leeds United U23's

Leeds United's U23's show their class in annual pre-season visit to Tadcaster.

First half goals from Bobby Kamwa, Jordan Stevens, Alex Wollerton and Sam Dalby put Danny Schofield's side into an unassailable lead at the break. Kun Mihaylov and Alfie McCalmont extended the visitors' lead in the second forty five before Taddy's Adam Baker struck a stunning consolation.

Brewers assistant manager Simon Collins has stated on numerous occasions how important it is to come up against as many different scenarios as possible to prepare for the new season. However when a vibrant, energetic and hungry professional academy side like Leeds come to town it's a different prospect all together.

On a sunny evening at a busy i2i Stadium it was in fact Albion who had the first effort on goal. A reducing 'old school' like challenge from former Leeds youngster Corey Roper gave trialist Lamin Colley the chance to strike powerfully on target forcing Kamil Miazek into a decent save.

This early glimmer for Taddy was sharply followed by Leeds dominating possession moving the ball quickly across the pitch and finding the perfect gaps in behind as they unlocked Albion's defence and broke the deadlock on 8 minutes. A fortuitous ricochet fell kindly for Jordan Stevens which allowed the forward to slide a disguised ball into Bobby Kamwa who kept his cool dinky deftly over the advancing Tom Young.

Casey Stewart was looking lively on his first home appearance of pre-season after cleverly twisting Pascal Struijk inside and out before seeing his shot blocked on the edge of the penalty area.

Despite not seeing a great deal of the football Taddy did in fact have some promising moments in the first forty five. Some tenacious midfield play from Mitch Langton followed by a searching ball in behind was pounced upon by Lamin Colley but his touch allowed

goalkeeper Kamil Miazek to just beat the striker to it.

Leeds deservedly doubled their lead on 25 minutes though as Jordan Stevens was allowed far too much space to drive up to the penalty box before his strike deflected into the back of the net off of Jack Vann leaving Young with no chance.

Trialist Colley was certainly looking the most threatening for Taddy as some more powerful forward play saw him shrug off a defender before his effort was also well blocked.

Leeds netted a third on 30 minutes as Pascal Struijk found Alex Wollerton in acres of space down the right-hand channel before the midfielder slid coolly under Young.

The Whites (who played in Black) were excelling in front of an excellent four-figure crowd, continuing to showcase their superb quick passing and slick sequences. Wollerton could have grabbed himself a quick-fire double after brilliantly twisting beyond Paddy Miller only to pull narrowly wide on this occasion.

Albion squandered another chance of their own soon after when Lamin Colley headed a corner kick down to Casey Stewart who couldn't generate enough power to nod past Miazek from three yards out.

Leeds had time to net a fourth in the final minute of the first half when Kamwa's cutback found Wollerton who's deflected effort was turned in via another deflection by number nine Sam Dalby.

Tadcaster started the second half brightly with that man again Lamin Colley testing Miazek in the Leeds goal. The towering forward out-muscled Struijk before his low strike was comfortably held by the Polish stopper.

All of Albion's chances were falling the way of the former Bradford Park Avenue man as Roper's clipped cross was collected by Colley only to blaze inches over from a tight angle.

Nevertheless it was LUFC who continued their dominance by scoring a fifth goal and it was another well worked move. Substitute Kun Mihaylov, or Temenuzhkov as he's better known, turned Leif Davis' drilled cross past the trialist goalkeeper after Oliver Sarkic unlocked the defence.

Three minutes later and it was six for the visitors. Stand-out midfielder Alfie McCalmont received the ball 21 yards out and curled gorgeously into the top corner, certainly United's pick of the bunch.

This wasn't the best goal of the night though, this went to Adam Baker who netted a consolation for the Brewers in magnificent fashion. After a mini game of head tennis, it dropped invitingly for the Albion substitute who rocketed an unstoppable half-volley past Miazek from 25 yards out.

Taddy could have actually pulled another goal back shortly after when a trialist was sent through on goal by Baker but Leif Davis recovered to block the shot.

All in all it was a remarkable display by Leeds United's next generation who could have added to their healthy lead in the final ten minutes. Callum Nicell played a perfect one-two with a teammate only for the Taddy goalkeeper to keep out the half-volley and 1-6 it concluded.






