The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.



Mossley were formed in 1903 as Park Villa, initially competing in local competitions but, after just one season the club's name was changed to Mossley Juniors. In 1909 they became Mossley AFC and moved to their present ground Seel Park in 1912 from their previous site at Luzley.

The early years of Mossley AFC were spent in the Ashton & District League culminating in a superb season in 1914-15 when Mossley won the League, Manchester Junior Cup and the Lady Aitken Cup, progressing to the South East Lancs League in 1915, the Manchester Amateur League in 1916 and the Lancashire Combination in 1918.

In 1919 Mossley became founder members of the Cheshire County League, finishing runners up in the first season in both League and League Cup, returning to win the League Cup the following season beating Sandbach Ramblers in the final.

Apart from many successes in the Ashton Challenge Cup and various Manchester Cup wins Mossley had many lean years in the League, rarely finishing in the top half of the table, although, in 1961 they won the Cheshire League Cup for only the second time when they beat a strong Tranmere Rovers Reserve side 6-3 at Hyde United's ground under the guidance of former Blackburn Rovers star Eddie Quigley.

Mossley's most successful season in their Cheshire League days was in 1969-70 when Don Wilson's side finished runners-up in the League, reached the 1st Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time in 20 years, losing narrowly in a replay to Stockport County and, made it to the quarter finals of the inaugural F.A. Challenge Trophy going out to then Southern League giants Barnet.

After more than fifty years in the Cheshire League, the Lilywhites were elected to the Northern Premier League in 1972.

During the late 70's, Mossley grew into a formidable force in non-league football. They won successive League titles in 1978-79 and 1979-80 and finished runners-up in each of the next three seasons.

With influential manager Bob Murphy at the helm the club also saw it's greatest moment. May 1980 saw the Lilywhites at Wembley in the Final of the F.A.Challenge Trophy.

After defeating supposedly bigger clubs like Altrincham, Blyth Spartans and Boston United on the way, Mossley unluckily lost 2-1 in the final to Dagenham, their first defeat in 31 games.

A crowd of 26,000 were at Wembley, and a memorable day for the Club and town was captured for posterity by Granada TV in their documentary "Mossley Goes To Wembley."

At this time Mossley had the most formidable strike force in non-league football with the legendary Leo Skeete, Dave Moore and Ian Smith alongside first Eamonn O'Keefe (sold to Everton for a club record £25,000 fee), and then Kevan Keelan.

The following season saw Mossley take their only Football League scalp in the FA Cup when they beat Crewe Alexandra at Seel Park. Other League clubs faced in the FA Cup during the glory years were Rotherham United, York City, Mansfield Town, Stockport County, Huddersfield Town and Darlington.

The great run of success ended abruptly in 1984 when following financial upheavals the Lilywhites finished bottom of the then one division NPL and had to seek re-election.

A gradual recovery took place through the 80's with 1988-89 being the most successful since the glory days. Under the guidance of Bryan Griffiths and the now Cardiff City manager Dave Jones, Mossley won the NPL Cup, Manchester FA Premier Cup, Reporter Floodlit Cup and at the start of the following season, the NPL Challenge Shield.

After this, fortunes faded again following further financial problems with the Club narrowly avoiding relegation in 1992. The following year, after a calamitous series of results not even the return of the legendary Bob Murphy could save the Club from the drop.

Over the next two years Mossley saw no fewer than six managerial changes and the Lilywhites run of 23 years in the Unibond/NPL came to an end in 1995 when they were relegated to the North West Counties League.

1995-96 saw Mossley make a highly promising NWCL debut, involved in the promotion race for most of the season they eventually finished 4th, reaching the final of the NWCL Floodlit Trophy into the bargain.

The following season, after a bright start, the team failed to stay the pace with the leaders and finally finished in 7th position, but did have a great run in the FA Carlsberg Vase, reaching the quarter finals.

In 1997 the Club parted company with manager Kevan Keelan and installed another former Lilywhites player, Benny Phillips as his replacement. Season 1998-99 then saw Mossley more than unfortunate not to win the title, losing out in controversial circumstances to Workington on the last day of the season. It was a bitter pill to swallow after leading the table for the last three months which included a club record 12 successive wins. The Millennium season saw Mossley again reach the quarter finals of the FA Carlshern

reach the quarter finals of the FA Carlsberg Vase, going down 3-1 at eventual winners Deal Town and slip from the title race after that blow to finish 4th. They did though reach the final of the Manchester Premier Cup, unluckily losing by a last minute goal to Droylsden at Oldham Athletic's Boundary Park.

2000-01 was a disappointing one after a great start which saw the record 12

successive wins equalled, but hampered by injuries and suspensions to key players Mossley eventually finished in mid-table.

In November 2001 Benny Phillips was replaced as manager by former Coventry City and Stoke City star Ally Pickering and Mossley finished in 8th position.

Mossley finished their Centenary Season 2002-03 in 3rd position, reaching the quarter finals of the FA Carlsberg Vase for the third time and won their first silverware in over a decade when beating Clitheroe 2-1 to win the NWCL Worthington Trophy at Gigg Lane, Bury.

The 2003-04 season saw Jason Beckford replace Pickering as manager just prior to the season and the club fought tooth and nail to win promotion to the UniBond League, going on a 21 match unbeaten run up to the new year. They were then hit by a 3 point deduction due to an administrative error and form took a nosedive as the team quickly crashed out of four cups and lost poll position in the League.

The drama continued to the end as Mossley where just pipped to the title by Clitheroe on the last day of the season.

Promoted in second place, 2004-05 season saw Mosslev consolidate back in the UniBond League, being unfortunate to miss out on a place in the promotion play off's after finishing in 7th place.

In the 2005/06 season Mossley excelled by becoming Champions of the UniBond League Division One on the last day of the season, finishing two points above Fleetwood Town. This despite losing their last two games earned promotion to the Premier Division where they had last competed in 1993.

Unfortunately, the joy was short-lived as the Lilywhites were relegated at the end of the season, returning to a newly reconstituted UniBond Division One they were placed in the North Division.

Beckford resigned followed quickly by the retirement of the clubs Directors and main sponsors, the Rigby family after a ten year period in control of club affairs.

A new Board of Directors made up of club supporters was appointed in the summer and former Emley, Altrincham and Ashton United boss Gerry Quinn was named as manager in what was a hugely transitional time for the club.

Summer 2008 saw Quinn replaced by former Mossley player Chris Willcock as manager and the team finished in a creditable 10th position, also reaching the final of the Manchester FA Premier Cup, unluckily losing 2-1 to Droylsden in the final at Oldham Athletic's Boundary Park.

In late December 2009 severe weather caused two of the 39 year old floodlights to collapse and the remaining six pylons were condemned meaning midweek home games were played at Ashton United's Hurst Cross for the remainder of the season. A new floodlight system was installed in the close season of 2010.

Chris Willcock resigned in January 2010 to be replaced by his former assistant John Flanagan and the team enjoyed a great run climbing to 7th position. Flanagan resigned at the end of the season and he was replaced by former Stalybridge Celtic reserve boss Shaun Higgins.

Despite a good FA Cup run to the final qualifying round Higgins reign only lasted until March 2011 when following a poor run of results and form he was replaced by former Woodley Sports boss Gareth McClelland, initially on a caretaker basis. McClelland impressed enough to be given the job for the 2011/12 season Mossley's 100th year at Seel Park.

McClelland resigned in January 2012 and former Accrington and Droylsden defender Steve Halford was appointed player manager and lifted the team to a comfortable mid-table finish. Mossley also reached the final of the Manchester FA Premier Cup but the final was never played as scheduled opponents Droylsden couldn't raise an eligible team and so the Lilywhites were awarded the trophy by

The 2012/13 season saw Mossley competing at the top end of the Evo-stik League Division One North throughout the campaign finally achieving a play off position on the final day of the season. However, the team were then desperately unlucky to lose to an injury time goal at Cammell Laird in the play off semi final. The Lilywhites did, however, retain the Manchester FA Premier Cup beating Salford City on penalties in the final at Stockport County's Edgeley Park ground following a

Manager Halford departed to Ashton United just prior to pre season and Mosslev appointed his former assistant Peter Band and ex Winsford United boss Lloyd Morrison as joint managers for the 2013/14 season and with a completely rebuilt team finished just below mid-table.

The 2014/15 season saw Mossley competing all season for a play off place only losing out in the last week of the campaign. That disappointment was waylaid by success in the Manchester FA Premier Cup as the Lilywhites beat Curzon Ashton on penalties in the final at Oldham Athletic's Boundary Park to win the trophy for the third time in four seasons.

2015/16 saw the Lilywhites on the fringes of the play offs throughout the season but injuries and suspensions took their toll on League form and the team had to settle for a mid table finish. However, Mossley retained the Manchester FA Premier Cup beating National League North neighbours Stalybridge Celtic 3-1 in the final at Hyde United's Ewen Fields Stadium to win the trophy for the fourth time in five years.



Grounds For Celebration



Some people love cars or bikes. Others get excited about pubs and restaurants. Me? I love football grounds! Now, I hate the term "ground hopper" because it's so geeky and, well, downright American – but, I guess I must admit, the anorak fits - a ground hopper is what I must be!

No two venues are the same and it's fascinating to me how there can be such an infinite number of variations in the configuration of what basically boils down to a piece of grass surrounded by something to watch from, somewhere to buy refreshments and a place to park your car outside. There are around a thousand grounds in the top ten levels of the pro' and semi-pro' game and every single one is unique.

One of the great consequences of gaining promotion is that it means you get to travel to a large number of new grounds! And this season we have visited a lot of interesting places. I think all grounds should be celebrated as the great theatres of entertainment and passion they are. So in true communitarian style, where everyone wins and no one leaves empty-handed in case it gives them a "complex", here are my awards for those I have visited with the Brewers this term...

HYDE – Most developed stadium and best-surfaced car park and best carpeted pitch! 3 awards in one for today's visitors. All four sides of Ewen Fields are properly developed and covered and there are numerous excellent vantage points. A spacious fully tarmac'd car park and approach road is a rarity at this level of football. The excellence of the other facilities helped me overlook the shortcomings of the artificial playing surface.

MOSSLEY – Highest ground above sea level! Well, OK, only the 4th highest altitude in the country overall, but the highest in this division. Nice Pennine aspect too!

OSSETT TOWN – Closest to a town centre or most mobile phone masts!

Many clubs now rely on income from mobile phone companies to make ends meet but

Ingfield boasts more than the rest. Just over the road from the bus station for PT users.

BAMBER BRIDGE – Best modern permanent stand or closest to a major road! Beside a slip road off the A6, Irongate has a brilliant, modern, raised side stand, offering unrestricted views of the action.

GOOLE – Best name and most time spent retrieving the ball or closest to a water tower! The Victoria Pleasure Grounds sound delightful but the 4-lane running track means that a lot of game time is lost. Perhaps, with more in-play time, Goole could have saved themselves from the drop?

RAMSBOTTOM – Darkest car park or latest switching on of floodlights! Having negotiated the way from the pitch-black car park into the ground, we were greeted with yet more blackness, with the floodlights being rationed before kick-off and then turned off before we'd even left the ground at the final whistle.

BURSCOUGH – Most in need of some TLC! The poor Linnets are going through the wringer on and off the pitch at the moment, sadly. Victoria Park exudes a sense of a glorious past but nowadays it more than a little tired.

OSSETT ALBION – Best redevelopment project! The Unicorns have very ambitious plans to create a new clubhouse, changing rooms and full-length stand along the South side. Works are already underway and I look forward to seeing big changes next season.

PRESCOT CABLES – Biggest stand or muddiest pitch! Cables' main stand is huge by NPL standards. It may have seen better days but it provides a great view of the pitch. The only problem is that the pitch is the most worn and muddy in this division – largely due to the ground-sharing arrangement with St Helens Town. And the great news is that next season we get to go twice – Skelmersdale United are moving in soon too!

CLITHEROE – Smallest car park and most vociferous fans! A car park the size of the average suburban driveway doesn't detract from a very boisterous home crowd. Perhaps the long walk to the ground warms them up!

RADCLIFFE BOROUGH – Most resilient club! Boro' were already raising funds to repair their stand, burned down by arsonists in the days prior to our December visit. A real "phoenix club"!

FARSLEY CELTIC – Most frustrating ground! Frustrating, not just because we somehow lost 5-1, but also because despite having developed both sides and one end of the ground, so much of it is unworkable – bad sight lines, seats out of action. And yet somehow, I really like the feel of it!

DROYLSDEN – Loudest tannoy or best covered end terrace! If you like loud "Madchester" music, The Butcher's Arms is the place for you! Great covered Kop too!

COLWYN BAY – Most income generated from Tad fans! Charging £10-a-head to our largest away following of the season, combined with refreshments necessary after such a long journey meant the Welsh club made a healthy profit on our cross-border visit!

TRAFFORD – Greenest surroundings and biggest car park! Situated in a leafy Cheshire suburb, with a golf club next door and surrounded by grass and trees, Shawe View is an ideal place to relax – unfortunately, our defence agreed! Huge car park too!

LANCASTER CITY – Closest to a railway station and best uncovered terrace! With the station next door and the Castle behind that, a full day out can be had in a radius of just a few hundred yards. Great permanent terrace behind one goal too!

BRIGHOUSE TOWN – Longest imaginary players' tunnel! Players must navigate a full 50 yards from dressing room to pitch. Pre-match warm ups are unnecessary!

GLOSSOP NORTH END – Best food or best sand pit! A severe drainage problem caused by nearby building work left a section of the pitch resembling Morecambe Bay, but a tasty pie and peas soon take your mind of it!

KENDAL TOWN – Best scoreboard! We could easily have "troubled" it 4 times in the first half alone, but had to make do with a share of the points in the end!

COLNE – Best views or most sloping pitch! Even by NPL standards, Colne play on the side of a mountain! The pitch may be almost vertical but the stunning views more than make up for that!

SCARBOROUGH (renting at Bridlington Town) – Best draining pitch or closest to a gas tower! Despite gale-force winds and torrential rain battering it for entire 90 minutes during the cup-tie, the Queensgate pitch played superbly – unlike the referee, unfortunately!

For all that I love visiting new towns and grounds, there really is no place like home! The i2i with its pristine grass pitch, on a sunny day, beside the River, watching Taddy in full flow, is my idea of paradise! Home results since Christmas have been much improved, today we will put another big stone block in the perimeter wall – Come on you Brewers!

On three occasions in the short space of ten minutes, Turnbull got up above his man on corners but failed to hit the target on all.

When Turnbull did guide a header on target twenty minutes into the second half it fell straight into the arms of Hallwood.

Billy Miller's men were putting in a tremendously spirited and gutsy showing against a Scarborough side that are gunning for a play-off spot, and this is despite Albion having nine first-team players out and three injured players on the bench.

The home (from home) side began to ramp up the pressure in the final ten minutes as Benny Igiehon threatened again.

Substitute Billy Logan teed up the burley striker who fired powerfully at goal only to be denied by a diving Chandler Hallwood.

With five minutes to go tensions boiled over in the corner with Josh

Grant involved in an altercation which lead to a brief scuffle amongst a number of players. Result.....two yellow cards.

With four minutes added on for stoppages, Tadcaster looked to have done enough surpassing the four minute mark.

However, with 95 minutes and 30 seconds on the watch Benny Igiehon turned inside the area and fired into the back of the net to spark mass celebrations for the Boro.

In the end it was massively disappointing for the Brewers who worked tirelessly all afternoon and defended impeccably.

Credit to Scarborough though, they kept plugging away and scored that crucial goal to take them into the play-off places with just the one game to go.
