

TAFC v **Barton Town Old Boys**

The club is believed to have been formed in 1892 as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until 1923 that the Tadcaster Albion name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In 1948 Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the 1950's & 60's.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets. oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until 1960, when the club moved 100 vards up river to its present home at the Park.

In 1973 the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in 1975 & 1977 to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in 1979 & 1980.

In 1982-83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001-2 & 2003-4.

At the start of 2004-5, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season. Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in 2006, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in November 2007, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of 2008-9, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In 2009-10, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title

In 2010. Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish and last season they finished 6th.

Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of this season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

Barton Town Old Boys FC HISTORY

Barton Town Old Boys Football Club was formed at the start of the **1995/96** season as a result of the amalgamation of the two longest established and most successful clubs in the North Lincolnshire town of Barton upon Humber, Barton Town FC and Barton Old Rows FC.

Barton Town had been in existence for well over 100 years, being formed in 1880, and playing out of their Marsh Lane ground, still the home of the new club, since 1927. *Town * was one of the founder members of the Lincolnshire League, winning it in 1960/61, before embarking on its * golden era * over the following two decades, initially in the Midlands League and then, particularly, in the Yorkshire League. The club returned to the Lincolnshire League in the early 1980s, winning the first division title in 1981/82. The * Swans * remained in the league for the next 10 years before dropping out for the usual off-field reasons, lack of help and finance. Barton Old Boys had been a member of the Scunthorpe and District League since 1959, eventually boasting two sides, in the first and second divisions. Over the ten-year period from the mid-1980s, * Old Boys * were arguably the most consistently successful team in the league, culminating in 1994/95 with the winning of all four maior Scunthorpe League competitions, a first at the time.

To progress the two clubs merged and started the **1995/96** season in the Lincolnshire League. After a disastrous start, the new Barton Town Old Boys finished a very creditable fourth and won the Lincs. County Senior "B" Cup for good measure. **1996/97** saw the team's fortunes peak, winning the League and Challenge Cup " double ", since when another County Cup triumph and two more Challenge Cup titles have been added to the list of honours. After five highly successful and enjoyable seasons in the Lincolnshire League, things were starting to turn stale, on and off the pitch, so the decision was made to move on, into the newly formed Humber Premier League for the start of the **2000/01** season. Despite being the only side from south of the River Humber, the team performed well. finishing third.

However, to gain a foothold on The Football Pyramid, the decision was made to move on again. Consequently, Barton Town Old Boys joined the Central Midlands League for the start of the 2001/02 season, bringing in Leigh Palin as first team coach to work alongside manager Peter Mitchell. The move paid off as the team finished runners up in the Premier Division, gaining automatic promotion to the Supreme Division for the start of the 2002/03 season

After a difficult start to the following season, Leigh Palin left the club in October 2002 and was succeeded in January 2003 by Alex Irvine who joined the club as joint manager, working alongside ex Hull City and Brigg Town stalwart, player Neil Buckley. After flirting with relegation, the team put together an excellent run of nine wins from the last 12 games to finish a difficult season in a relatively comfortable 13th position.

Alex Irvine left the club that summer, leaving Neil Buckley in sole charge and it has been a story of further progress since then. **2003/04** saw the team finish in 7th place, separated from the top six by goal difference only.

There was further improvement in 2004/05 as Buckley, alongside long-serving Old Boys player lan Durnian as assistant manager, saw the progress continue as the team claimed fourth spot, being denied a top three place only because of a draw in the final game of the property.

Summer 2005 marked the installation of state of the art floodlights at the Marsh Lane ground and that, along with the securing of a long term sponsorship deal with the local Euronics Centre, signalled the club's intent both on and off the pitch prior to season 2005/06.

On the pitch, that intent was certainly realised as the title of Supreme Division Champions 2005/06 was added to the club's list of honours.[1] Along with the reserve side's promotion to the top flight of the Humber Premier League, it was certainly a season to remember for all involved with the club.

Off the field, ground grading requirements prohibited promotion to the Northern Counties East League, the club's immediate ambition. As a result of that undoubted setback the club embarked on an extensive redevelopment programme, bringing in Paul Friskney as chief executive officer to oversee the project which involved, amongst other things, turning the playing area and floodlights through 90°, new access, car-parking, changing rooms, clubhouse and stands.

Supreme Division runners-up at the end of the **2006/07** season, the club was in the fortunate position of being considered once more for promotion to the Northern Counties East League and this time the facilities were not found wanting

As a consequence, 2007/08 saw the club begin a whole new era, a perfect end to all the hard work put in, on and off the field, over the last few years and a fitting tribute to Denis Cox, who has been involved with Barton Town F.C. for over half a century.

Ninth place in Division One was the outcome of the club's first foray in the NCEL, a comfortable finish, albeit a little disappointing bearing in mind the team had been promotion contenders until around about the turn of the year, before loss of form, injuries and suspensions took their toll. A great run in the League Cup, which saw a number of Premier Division sides beaten at Marsh Lane en route to the semi-final provided some consolation for missing out.

After five successful seasons at the helm, late July 2008 saw the shock resignation of Neil Buckley, due to increased work commitments. Despite that blow, the dub responded promptly, promoting coach Carl Stead to the hot-seat to work alongside existing assistant manager, Ian Durnian and newly appointed player/coach, Craig Burdick to send out the message that it was very much "business as usual".

The story of the **2008/09** season was another one of steady, if unspectacular, improvement. A fifth place finish was the outcome, but, in a worrying case of history repeating itself, not before another dreadful dip in form in the new year, which saw the team slump from genuine promotion contenders to also-rans, some eleven points adrift of a guaranteed gromotion slot.

The disappointment of missing out was compounded by the loss of a number of key senior players who had been instrumental, with others, in the club's success over the previous four seasons. The lure of football at a higher level, something that the club had signally failed to provide, proved to be too strong.

The **2009/10** season proved to be another season of two-halves. In contrast to the previous two seasons, it began poorly, one or two bright spots notwithstanding, and, plagued by a terrible run of injuries, showed little sign of improvement as the season wore on.

With the team marooned in mid-table in late November 2009 and finding it increasingly difficult to balance family and work commitments with football, Carl Stead resigned. Ian Durnian assumed the mantle of caretaker until a new management team of Dave Anderson and Mally Parker was appointed in early January 2010.

And so **2010** saw the start of a new chapter in the history of the club. The new faces had the desired effect. Players, both old and new, responded superbly to the promptings and demands of the new management duo, finishing the second half of the season in fine style. A sixth place finish, largely on the back of an unbeaten away run stretching back to January, bears testimony to the great strides forward made under the new regime.

In their first full season at the helm 2010/11, and in a huge testament to the management team and all the players involved. Dave Anderson and Mally Parker guided the side to promotion to the Premier Division, the highest level in the history of the club and achieved a full two seasons ahead of schedule. Not without a few nervous moments along the way, promotion was finally secured on the last day of a memorable season.


After a fraught start, the first season 2011/12 in the top flight saw the club finish a creditable 11th, helped in no small way by a seven match winning streak, part of a longer unbeaten run in all competitions dring November and December. The team also made it through to two cup finals, the County Senior Trophy and the President's Cup and although missing out, narrowly, in both, they too marked a significant step forward.

Caretaker manager Jon Miles hailed his players after under-dogs Glasshoughton Welfare severely damaged Tadcaster Albion's Toolstation NCEL Premier Division title hopes in a shock 1-0 win at Ings Lane.

Tom Carr's second half penalty left leaders Tadcaster's chances of winning promotion hanging by a thread as Brighouse Town, who have three games in hand, beat Worksop Parramore to go two points behind Paul Marshall's men.

Marshall conceded that his team "weren't good enough".

The hero for Glasshoughton was young goalkeeper Paul Hagreen. The stopper conceded six last week against Barton Town Old Boys, but nothing could get past him at Tadcaster.

His and his team-mates' magnificent performances earned Miles his second win since he replaced Rob Hunter and the interim Leeds Road chief said: "I'm very proud of them.

"They worked their socks off and from one to 14 they were all great. The game-plan worked. We went 4-5-1 with a centre-half at centre-forward who was there to close them down and defend from the front.

"We set up to defend and hoped to pinch one and as the game panned out and they had to throw everything at us, that's what happened.

"I think we deserved it. As much as we defended, we had as many goal-scoring opportunities as they did. People probably wrote us off after seeing the Barton result.

"We also saw an outstanding goalkeeping performance from Paul Hagreen. He spilled one cross which I think was a foul on him, other than that his handling was near as perfect.

"His shot-stopping was fantastic and you forget he is only 19. It was a top performance."

A fair but crunching tackle on Tadcaster captain Nick Thompson by Adam Walsh set Glasshoughton's stall out and sent the message out that they were there to cause a shock.

Even in the early stages, despite losing star man Del Pollock to a hamstring strain after just nine minutes, Glasshoughton caused the home side problems. Andy Seed lobbed goalkeeper Arran Reid and his effort went only just over the crossbar.

Tadcaster did move up a gear and Thompson was at the centre of two good chances. His first saw him lob Hagreen just inside the penalty area after finding space. That one went wide, while his other opportunity – a low strike – cannoned back off the post

Hagreen started to steal the show as half-time dawned when he somehow blocked Carl Stewart's header and then managed to divert the ball off-the-line as it roamed free.

The turning point was on the hour mark. Carr raced into the box and the ball was going out for a goal-kick, but goal-keeper Reid needlessly brought the midfielder down – giving the referee the easy decision of pointing to the spot.

Carr took the penalty and sent Reid the wrong way by placing the ball into the right-hand bottom corner – the first goal Tadcaster had conceded in 450 minutes.

Tadcaster's response was lacklustre and Glasshougton even had two opportunities to double their lead. Carr headed over before stand-in striker Reece Chappell saw another header cleared off the line.

From there on it was all Tadcaster. Glasshoughton defended really well and centre-halves Jimmy Williams and Adam Walsh were throwing themselves at everything.

Hagreen came to the rescue in the 74 minutes as Stewart's powerful attempt hit his head and went out for a corner. Substitute Danny Critchlow then wasted a good chance by heading wide inside the six-yard-box, despite being unmarked.

But for a team that needed to win there was to be no grand finale and dramatic equalising goals. Tadcaster did crank up the pressure deep into injury-time with Stewart's looping header needing Hagreen's hand to tip it over the crossbar. Even goalkeeper Reid was up for the resulting corner and when the ball briefly cleared, he was crossing it back into the box for Nicky Deverdics to head for goal. The ball was heading home until Hagreen initially pushed it clear before firmly claiming it.
