



TAFC v Athersley Recreation FC

Saturday 22nd February 2014







The club is believed to have been formed in 1892 as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until 1923 that the Tadcaster Albion name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In 1948 Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the 1950's & 60's.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East

Football continued on the Ings ground until 1960, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In 1973 the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in 1975 & 1977 to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in 1979 & 1980.

In 1982-83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001-2 & 2003-4.

At the start of 2004-5, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season. Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in 2006, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in November 2007, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of 2008-9. in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In 2009-10, with an influx of a few new key players. Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In 2010, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd. and the club became a company limited by

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish and last season they finished 6th.

Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of this season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

Jake said: "I've done a half marathon before at Redcar, and it went really well. I finished in 1 hour, 28 minutes, but this is obviously going to be much harder.


"I'm hoping I'll be able to get round in just over three hours. The furthest I've run so far is 17 miles, so I've still got another nine to add to it."

Athersley Recreation FC HISTORY

Athersley Recreation Football Club was formed in 1979, originally as Athersley North Juniors, and in the years that have followed have quickly become Barnsley's most successful ever amateur football team. The club is based at Sheerien Park on the Athersley North estate, two miles to the north-east of Barnsley. The ground lies adjacent to Athersley Memorial Park - dedicated to the memory of the 58 lives lost in South Yorkshire's worst mining disaster in modern times, Wharnclie Woodmoor, which devastated this close-knit community.

Now the only recognised sports facility in the area (following the closure of Atherslev Recreation Centre, from which the club took it's name), the club is a vital part of the community. The 60-year lease of the ground was bought by ex-Atherslev Rec player Geo Horsfield (who went on to represent Fulham. West Brom. Birmingham City and Sheeld United amongst others) and this has paved the way for extensive development of the club and the area he was raised in. Along with the tireless work of club founder/secretary/manager Pete Goodlad and his dedicated team of local volunteers, the foundations have now been laid for future generations to enjoy these excellent facilities, the like of which has never been available to people of all ages and abilities from this area of South Yorkshire.

On the pitch, the success the Rec has enjoyed is unrivalled in local football. Countless league titles and cup wins have become commonplace, none more so than winning the Sheeld Junior Cup an unprecedented three years in a row (winning it 5 years out of 7, the other two years being runners-up!). Last season saw a clean sweep of honours achieved with a quadruple as well as the reserves winning their league at County Senior level showing plenty of strength in depth.

To date, the record attendance has been over 500 to see the Rec play local rivals Wombwell Main - on a day when every other game in Barnsley was cancelled due to bad weather, this was testament to the hard work and skill of the groundsmen at Sheerien Park. With floodlighting now in place and Charter Standard status awarded, the future looks bright as the club enters into it's first season at NCEL level.

Plans are in the pipeline for further redevelopment, including a new clubhouse on site and new car parking facilities. The club prides itself on it's standing in the community and working together with local people, many of whom have given up a lot of their time and effort towards the bettering of the club - and with this bond so strong will endeavour to go on to bigger and better things in the future.

At the other end, the visitors missed a good close in chance that if converted would have set up a nervy end to the game. By this time, the rain was swirling around as conditions got harder for the players. There was a good shout then a penalty for The Brewers with a tackle in the box, but the referee waved play on.

The game was coming to its conclusion and after another Brewers header went over, it looked as if it would end at 3-1. Then with just 4 minutes to go, a fine accurate pass was played into the area to Carl Stewart who as the keeper came out to narrow the angle, neatly finished past him at the near post.
