


TAFC v Winterton Rangers FC

The club is believed to have been formed in 1892 as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until 1923 that the Tadcaster Albion name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In 1948 Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the 1950's & 60's.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East

Football continued on the Ings ground until 1960, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In 1973 the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in 1975 & 1977 to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in 1979 & 1980.

In 1982-83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001-2 & 2003-4.

At the start of 2004-5, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season. Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in 2006, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money fight. Then in November 2007, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of 2008-9, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In 2009-10, with an influx of a few new key players. Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In 2010, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd. and the club became a company limited by

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish and last season they finished 6th.

Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of this season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

When I came to the last home game against Albion Sports. I had that feeling in my over large stomach that the unbeaten record was under threat. It gave me no pleasure at all to be proved right. For today, game against Lincoln Moorlands Railway, I felt much more relaxed as they are having a tough season at the bottom end of the league. They are playing against us again next week and with another struggling team Winterton Rangers playing at Tadcaster the week after, it really means that we need a full 9 points out of 9 to get the championship challenge back on track. A nice winters day and hopefully we will be seeing a few goals today for The Albion. A nice number in the bar as I entered which is good reward for the new owners efforts in recent months. With meat raffle ticket 987 in my wallet, I drifted away with thoughts of a good fry up tonight to celebrate the hoped for comfortable home win. Good to see a lady referees assistant again for todav's game.

The game started with Taddy playing towards the town end. There was a lively start by Tadcaster with an early chance by Stuart Rice going wide of the far post. Lincoln Moorlands are proving hard to break down early on and the keeper makes a fine save in a one on one with Vincent Dhesi. Mid way through the first half and it was still 0-0 with Lincoln doing well in defence with the keeper especially busy. He looked like a man who has had plenty of practice this season.

Matt Sparkes then had a good chance as he drove into the area but he then shoots wide of the far post. The crossbar then takes a hit from an effort by Carl Stewart. In a rare trip to the far end of the ground, Lincoln Moorlands were given offside when they had a good chance at far post.

On 27 minutes, The Brewers took the lead as Danny Critchlow scored from around the penalty spot in a crowded area. This encouraged The Brewers and a good Stuart Rice effort was pushed over by the keeper. The home team has a good shout for a penalty as Josh Barrett drives into the area and goes down under a challenge.

It was not long before Vincent Dhesi has turned the ball in past the keeper for 2-0. It is soon 3 as a tackle from behind on Stuart Rice brings a clear spot kick that was calmly converted in conventional fashion into the keepers

top left corner by Carl Stewart.

The Brewers had became more dominant as the half progressed, and the 3 could have been double that. Halftime soon comes around with a nice 3-0 lead and everybody heading for the warmth of the bar area. The Pork Rolls look good, as they always do, but I distract myself with a quick check on Twitter to see what is what.

The second half starts with more Taddy pressure as they push on for a convincing win to make a statement to the rest of the championship challengers. An incident just outside of the away penalty area brings 2 bookings, one for each side as tempers rise for a few minutes. The home keeper is now not seeing much of the ball as it is mostly one way traffic.

There followed a good chance for Carl Stewart as he breaks into the area, but the ball flies over with Danny Critchlow shouting for a square pass. The Brewers leading scorer goes even closer as he hits a fierce free kick that the keeper turns onto the bar to make a good save that was sporting acknowledged by the striker. Goal 4 comes as substitute Mitch Hamilton taps in at the far post. Goal 5 is a second penalty kick put away in dink style by Carl Stewart after a handball , and number 6 is a cross into the top far corner by Dan Barrett over the keeper, David Seaman style for those older readers.

So it ends 6-0 after a defiant first 20 minutes, but in reality after that, it could have ended as any score. The team are applauded off the pitch and the crowd head to the bar to thaw out. It has been a good day which had the potential the be a record score but you have to give the Lincoln Moorlands keeper credit for a fine performance. A season high crowd of 247 is the icing on the cake, thanks partly to the group of York City fans who sponsored the game. For the record, the Brewers scorers were Danny Critchlow 27, Vincent Dhesi 40, Carl Stewart 44, 83 (pens), Mitchell Hamilton 80 and Dan Barrett 88. The teams around us at the top of the table have also won, so it was vital that there were no slip ups in our game.

So it is down the A1 to Lincoln next week for the return game where a good win would keep us on track for our best season in our history.

Winterton Rangers FC HISTORY

Winterton Rangers FC were founded in 1934. They were originally an intermediate side before becoming members of the Scunthorpe & District league following the Second World War. Rangers were quite successful in this league, winning trophies on many occasions.

Winterton have used just two grounds in their history. They were situated at Watery Lane until 1950 when a spot of land was purchased at West Street. In 1965 they joined the Lincolnshire county league but their stay was a relatively short one as they accepted an invitation to join the Yorkshire League in 1970.

The next decade saw Rangers become one of the league major forces and they took the league title on three occasions. They also reached the 4th qualifying round of the FA Cup twice in 1971-72 and 1976-77

Their best FA Vase performance was also in the **1976-77** season when they reached the Quarter Final stage.

In 1978 Rangers successfully won the Philips six-a-side floodlight cup, beating that years Vase winners Newcastle Blue Star in Birmingham. The prize? Six floodlights.

In 1982-83 they became founder members of the Northern Counties East League, when the Yorkshire League and Midland League amalgamated. It was a sad time just two seasons later when the club disbanded due to financial difficulties.

Rangers then re-entered the NCEL Division 2 in 1986 and after several poor seasons they won the Division 2 title in 1989-90 and were promoted directly to the Premier Division. After four average years in the top flight Rangers were finally relegated at the end of the 1993/94 season

In 2002 Dave Crowder joined the club as Chairman and brought with him a new committee to join the few people already at the club. After many seasons struggling with such a small amount of people the club were now looking forward to a bright future. In no time at all alterations were under way with a pool table been installed and a new kitchen put in place. After securing a grant from the Football Stadia Improvement Fund, the work in phase one would include new changing rooms, toilets, turnstiles and car parks. The hard working committee continued to improve facilities, two new clubhouse bars were built and new fire and security systems fitted. Phase two included a new terraced stand along with new walls and footpaths around the ground. Extensive work was done to improve the pitch and further clubhouse developments were completed.

During the summer of 2006 a brand new seated stand and dugouts were built along with further raised hard standing. Fencing was also erected down one side and behind one goal. The ground and facilities can now be considered one of the best in the whole league. After the excellent finish to last season, optimism was high. Manager Pete Daniels and his assistant, Dave Robinson, had built an excellent squad containing a balance of youth and experience. A

great season followed in 2006/07, gaining promotion to the Premier in second place behind Parkgate.

The team of young lads had done us proud. Pre season saw more money spent on the infrastructure. The floodlights were brought up to Conference standard in the major spend of the summer. And things started brightly pre-season when Rangers beat Hull City 3-2 at West Street against their full squad., which set up Rangers for a superb season. The side up to Christmas was untouchable, but with a couple of players leaving for Unibond it was a worry if the start would be sustained. New blood came in and the dream season continued culminating in the league title and League Cup double. It was decided not to apply for Unibond football.

2008/09 would be a tricky one following on from Rangers explosive return to the Premiership. Pete and Dave would battle through a terrible string of injuries to reach a County Cup Final and a fifth place finish. And in pre-season Pete decided to end his superb spell at West Street.

New beginnings on 2009/10. Interviews over and Richard Sennett and Mark Turner were installed in the managers hot seat. The new team had to be built from scratch, which meant for a difficult start to the season that saw Rangers hover around the mid-table area. But a few new faces and a run in that saw Winterton pushing for a top five finish until the last game. Cup glory came with a superb win against Arnold Town in the Presidents Cup, followed by a County Cup triumph against Louth Town in the last game of the season. A major achievement for a side that had but one existing player from the season before

In the summer of 2012 Richard, Mark and his backroom staff parted company with the club as they wanted a new challenge and Lee Danysz was given the task of carry on their good work. Lee brought in his own backroom team and had to assemble a completely new squad as the previous one followed Richard and Mark to Retford United. Because of circumstances the club knew it would be a hard season and after struggling in the lower reaches of the League Lee decided to step down due to family reasons at the beginning November. The club moved swiftly and appointed Ex Maltby Main manager Steve Adams in the hope he would turn round the clubs fortunes. After 2 months in charge Steve decided to step down and the club appointed senior players Leigh Herrick and Mark McDonagh as joint managers until the end of the season.

After a successful end to the 2012/13 season, Leigh Herrick was appointed sole manager of the First Team and he added Jonny Robinson to his backroom team. After a difficult start to the 2013/14 season Leigh decided to step down after 8 games due to personal reasons and the club moved quickly and appointed Paul Friskney as First Team Manager. Paul was previously Chief Executive at near neighbours Barton Town Old Boys and he brought with him to the club Pete Marshall as his assistant and also kept on Jonny Robinson in the same roll. Halfway through November Paul decided to step down as manager after finding the job difficult and the club appointed Darren Waring until the end of the season.
