

TAFC v Garforth Town FC

Saturday 8th February 2014







The club is believed to have been formed in 1892 as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until 1923 that the Tadcaster Albion name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In 1948 Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the 1950's & 60's.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until 1960, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In 1973 the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in 1975 & 1977 to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in 1979 & 1980.

In 1982-83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001-2 & 2003-4.

At the start of 2004-5, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in 2006, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in November 2007, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of 2008-9, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In 2009-10, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In 2010, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by quarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish and last season they finished 6th.

Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of this season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.



This was a game that I was really looking forward to after The Brewers had signed 4 players in the previous few days to help their challenge for the NCEL Premier title. Manager Paul Marshall had said in the press that the club needed 10 wins out of the remaining 14 games to be in the running, so this was definitely one game that had to be won. Winterton Rangers were in 21st position in the league table and having a pretty tough season. The pitch passes an early mid morning pitch inspection and the weather is good, although forecast to be a bit interesting later in the afternoon. A nice pre match meal and I am ready for action.


Tadcaster Albion played the first half kicking to town end. The game started pretty evenly with the pitch playing pretty well after the major downpour earlier at 2pm. As Tadcaster start to put the pressure on, they earned a few kicks just outside of the penalty area without converting them

The deadlock was broken after 17 minutes as Danny Critchlow scored from close range as he eventually squeezed the ball home after the keeper had blocked his first efforts. This lead to more pressure from the Brewers and there was another good chance for Danny Critchlow which was well saved. The keeper was then well clattered in a collision with a defender and their woes continued when a defender cleared the ball full force point blank range into a fellow defenders lower regions, to the enjoyment of everybody in the ground apart from him.

Just before half time, there were great chances from a corner for Tadcaster but Jamie Williamson headed over the bar, and a header by Terry Taylor didn't go in too, so half time arrived with a 1-0 scoreline.

The second half started with the home team playing at pace and early good work by Carl Stewart down the right was converted at the far post as Calum Ward slid the ball home. A few minutes later, Stewart Rice did the work down the right and as the ball went into the area, it bobbled around a little before Calum Ward drove it home from about 12 yards. This was the queue for "Tad All Over" to boom out over the tannov.

It was all Brewers now as they pushed on to boost the goal difference and the pressure lead to a free kick a few



Just 2 minutes later, it was 5-0 as Calum Ward broke through the middle and calmly converted past the keeper to complete a 19 minute hat trick. He was substituted shortly afterwards with his work done for the day. A further 2 substitutions followed and The Brewers looked for more goals, the highlight being a vicious shot by Stuart Rice from the edge of the area which rattled back off the bar with the keeper rooted to the spot by its speed. Good work again down the right by Josh Barrett lead to a cross being driven across the face of the goal which couldn't be converted by 2 forwards as they rushed in. Mitch Hamilton then had a shout for a penalty as he went down under a tackle on the 6 yard box , but the referee waved play on.

As the wind got stronger and the fans behind the goal tried not to get blown away, there was just time for Denny Ingram to hit a nice shot low past the keepers left and it was job done. Goal Times - Danny Critchlow 17, Calum Ward 48, 53, 67, Carl Stewart 65, Denny Ingram 90. The crowd was an excellent 202 when you look at the weather around the ground at 2pm.

Many games were postponed in the league but Worksop who played away at Pickering Town, probably wished they hadn't played as they lost 3-1. Third placed Basford United had a 7-0 home win against the hapless Lincoln Moorlands Railway. A number of the teams in the pack chasing Barton and Tadcaster Albion have midweek games, so it may get tighter at the top in a few days time, and that could be the pattern each midweek over the next few months as the league gets very tight at the top. We have to keep winning our games and keep the pressure on the others to match that, plus win their games in hand.

Overall it was a fine performance, especially considering the conditions and hopefully this form can be taken forward to next weeks very important game away at Brighouse Town.

Brighouse Town 8 - Tadcaster Albion 1

The weather was extreme and played a significant part in the Brighouse onslaught in the first half. We could barely get the ball out of our own half due to the very strong winds. Brighouse took total advantage of the conditions. Where as Tadcaster struggled to adjust from the kick off. 6-0 down at half time allowed Brighouse to sit deep in the second half and attack us on the break.

What does the Fox say?

Tadcaster Albion travelled to Brighouse Town knowing that they would have a tough game against their NCEL Premier championship rivals, especially as they had beaten the Brewers back in August 3-1 at Tadcaster. If the game needed any extra incentive, with the Barton Town Old Boys game being called off due to the weather, a Tadcaster win would have put them top of the table. Within the first half an hour, it became clear that it would be a long afternoon and eventually they went down by an 8-1 defeat to The Town in front of a crowd of 197. This was The Brewers heaviest league defeat since 1998.

The first two goals came by the 10th minute and that set the scene. By the 25th minute, it had all gone horribly wrong as they scored at regular intervals to make it 5-0. Just before half time, Tom Matthews made it 6-0 to complete his hat trick. In the second half, Danny Critchlow got a consolation goal back for the team in the 63rd minute as the scoring became a little more normal. It was an important one for him personally as that was the fourth consecutive league game that he had found the net. The hosts immediately hit back to make it 7-1, then adding a final goal of the day in to make it 8-1 in the 80th minute.

On twitter head coach Mike Morton commented, "The last time I ever conceded 8 goals was never! #embarrassing. Sorry to all the fans.". Elsewhere in the league, there were comfortable wins for Thackley, 4-1 away at Maltby Main and Basford United 3-1 away at WInterton Rangers. Whilst in the chasing pack, Albion Sports dropped 2 points away at Garforth Town.

Next up for the Brewers is a home game on Saturday 3pm against local rivals Garforth Town. Your support is now needed more than ever to see if they can bounce back and get their title challenge back on track. Remember it is just £5 for adults to pay on the gate.

Garforth Town FC HISTORY

Garforth Town Football Club were originally formed in 1964 as the MINERS ARMS, a local pub team taking their name from the hostelry where they were based.

Formative years were spent in the Elmet Sunday League and then the Leeds Sunday Combination League in **1972**. Having no ground of their own and none available in Garforth, matches had to be played on a council pitch in nearby Swillington.

Following several years of League & Cup success, the club decided to step up into Saturday Football and joined the West Yorkshire League, at the same time acquiring their own ground at BRIERLANDS LANE, by transforming a former council rubbish tip.

In 1977 Garforth made an application to join the Yorkshire League, however they were advised that pub teams were ineligible to compete so they changed the team's name to GARFORTH MINERS and were duly elected.

At the start of the **1981/82** season they became founder members of the Northern Counties East League, which was an amalgamation of the old Yorkshire and Midland League. In **1985** came the name change to the present one of GARFORTH TOWN.

The 1986/87 season saw Town produce their best ever Cup run when they reached the QUARTER FINAL stage of the FA VASE, eventually bowing out by 2 goals to 1 to the Essex based side Collier Row.

1991 saw the clubhouse erected at Brierlands Lane and in **1995** floodlights were installed following a campaign, which included the handing over, to local councillors of a petition in favour of lights going up which was signed by several hundred people.

The appointment of Dave Parker as manager in **1994** after the departure of the previous manager and nearly all the first team players started what is undoubtedly Town's best period in the NCEL.

The 1996/97 season brought a NCE Division One runners-up spot as well as a Cup Final win when Town lifted The Wilkinson Sword Trophy by defeating Eccleshill United over two legs. In 1997/98 Town won the NCE Division One Championship in style, 18 points clear of the second placed team - their first ever major League victory and also completed the DOUBLE by winning the West Riding County Cup, beating Premiership side Liversedge 2-0 in the final.

For the 1998/99 season Town moved into their brand new purpose built stadium - WHEATLEY PARK

That season saw Town reach the final of the NCEL President's Cup, eventually losing over two legs to North Ferriby United and in their first season in the Northern Counties East Premier Division - although topping the table to Christmas - finish a very creditable mid-table position.

In the 1999 /2000 season, despite a poor league finish, Town proved to be a cup winning side. They won the West Riding County Cup, beating Eccleshill United 2-0, as well as the Northern Counties East League Cup with a 3-1 victory over First Division side Glapwell in the final at Ossett Albion's ground.

Success that season was not confined to the First Team. Town's Under 18 side won the Leeds & District Championship at their first attempt and several of the side also made their debut for the First

Team. A sign that Town's youth policy is starting to bear fruit.

Dave Parker retired as manager following the League Cup final after six years at the helm. He was the best and most successful manager Town has ever had. His successor was Dave Harrison who had been Dave Parker's assistant manager for the previous 3 years.

His time in charge at Town saw him having to guide a young and inexperienced side through difficult times before being replaced towards the end of the 2001/2002 season as manager by Dave Holmes. Despite the hopes for better as the previous season's young squad had more experience and had also been augmented with experienced players, in the 2002/2003 season Town finished bottom of the NCEL Premier Division and relegated to Division 1.

Simon Clifford who runs the Brazilian Soccer Schools then took over as owner of the Club and after a shaky start to the 2004/05 season took over as manager guiding the club to promotion back to the NCEL Premier - the 1st step of his ambition to take Town all the way up the football pyramid. The season also saw the Miners take the National limelight with former Brazilian International Socrates making his Garforth Town debut, alongside former Manchester United player Lee Sharoe.

Clifford went onto achieve the clubs highest ever finish in the 2005/06 season of eleventh in the Northern Counties East League. In 2006/07 Garforth formed a major three-year sponsorship deal with GENIX, which also included the Stadium name changed to THE GENIX HEALTHCARE STADIUM. Clifford also led the Garforth to his second promotion in three years. For the first time in the clubs history Garforth reached Step four of the National League System and entered the newly formed UniBond Division One North.

Seasons 2008/09 & 2009/10 saw Town's league position stabilize, however they were more successful in cup competitions victorious in the West Riding County Senior Cup in both seasons.

Steve Nichol was appointed as 1st team manager leading Town to a creditable 13th finish in season 2010/11, the highlight being a famous victory in the last game of the season over 1st Division North Champions, Chester in front of their record highest crowd of 2,428.

2011/12 saw Town, under the management of Nichol, reach their highest ever Evo Stik First Division North league position of 5th placing them into a promotional playoff semi final game with Curzon Ashton, however despite a fine performance, they bowed out on negalities

Prior to the start of the 2012/13 season, off the field unrest saw the resignation of Steve Nichol and the disbanding of his playoff squad. Previous Assistant Manager Vernol Blair was put in charge of team affairs but he was unable to keep the club in the Evo Stik League and they were relegated to the Northern Counties East League.

2013 saw a bright new start for the club. Simon Clifford's ownership came to an end, and a new Management Committee was formed with a major sponsorship from RIASA assisting with the rebuilding process. Graham Nicholas, a UEFA 'A' qualified coach, was appointed as 1st Team Manager and a new playing squad was formed.
