

TAFC v Worksop Parramore FC

Saturday 8th March 2014







The club is believed to have been formed in At the start of 2004-5, Jim Collis became 1892 as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until 1923 that the Tadcaster Albion name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In 1948 Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York promotion was missed by one point. League during the 1950's & 60's.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East

Football continued on the Ings ground until 1960, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In 1973 the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in 1975 & 1977 to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in 1979 & 1980.

In 1982-83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001-2 & 2003-4.

manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season. Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in 2006, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in November 2007, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of 2008-9. in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In 2009-10, with an influx of a few new key players. Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In 2010, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd. and the club became a company limited by

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish and last season they finished 6th.

Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of this season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

Worksop Parramore FC HISTORY

Parramore Sports FC were established in 1936 just 12 years after F. Parramore & Sons, iron founders in Sheffield, were incorporated as a limited company. They played in the works league of the area from 1936 until 1972 and even continued to play football during the Second World War being as much of the workforce were in reserved occupations manufacturing steel for the war effort.

In 1972 they progressed to the Barnsley Junior League where they had immediate success winning the league and cup in their first season before going back to the Works League in 1975. The major change started in 1977 when they qualified for the Amateur League and following success as that level the team progressed to the highly rated County Senior League in the 1985/86 season. Success was soon to follow and they reached the Premier Division consolidating in the league for a number of years but, in the 1996/97 season, Parramore Sports FC were relegated to the 1st Division where they stayed for some time.

The start of the **2008/09** season heralded a new era with a move to the Central Midlands Football League, Premier Division, being headed by successful County Senior manager Pete Whitehead, assisted by Steve Smith and Geoff Evans. The same management team took the club forward into the Central Midlands Football League, Supreme Division after a successful campaign in the **2009/10** season which resulted in well deserved promotion. For the **2010/11** season the team gained promotion to the Northern Counties East League, Division One (Step 6) for the first time in the clubs history.

During the season break, Pete Whitehead's P&M Leisure company bought the Sandy Lane stadium, clubhouse and function suite in Worksop which was transformed after major works including the laying of a new premierclass pitch. The Windsor Foodservice Stadium,

Sandy Lane, is now the current home of the then renamed Worksop Parramore. Worksop Town were invited back to the ground by new owner Pete Whitehead as tenants and this offer was accepted.

During the **2011/12** season, Chairman and Manager, Pete Whitehead decided to concentrate on his Chairman duties and Darren Bland on 3rd September 2011. Daren began rebuilding the team towards the goal of promotion and a finish of 3rd in Division One was eventually enough to achieve it. The season wasn't without its difficulties but some superb player propelled 'The Parras' into the title frame for the last game of the season but the title was won by Handsworth FC.

Progress continued on the **2012/13** season in Darren Bland's first full season in charge and he strapped his style on the team, bringing in the players suit it. This resulted attractive football with some noticeable results along the way. Parramore managed 7th in their first season in the NCEL Premier (step 5) and a semi final in the League Cup. Although for much of the season the team were in with a shout at a top 3 finish, 7th is seen as something to build on.

Darren Bland decided to step down before the start of the **2013/14** season and Russ Eagle was appointed to continue the chairman's vision of one day playing at the highest level of non-league football. Russ has worked tirelessly in pre-season to assemble a squad he believes is capable of pushing for the top spot. Assisting him is Leon Wainman and a training role for Steve Smith.

More big news in **2013/14** is the partnership of Parramore FC and Handsworth FC with both clubs coming together and working on a merger for **2014/15** and beyond. Steve Holmes has been appointed as Club Development Manager to bridge the two clubs together seamlessly.


