The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCFL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.





Brighouse Town FC





The club was originally formed in 1963, as a representative side of the Blakeborough Valve Company of Brighouse and their home games were played on the Woodhouse Recreation Ground, with the side competing in the Huddersfield Works League.

The club gained various league honours over the years, the most successful coming in the 1968/69 season, when they won both the League Cup as well as the Halifax District Cup.

Following this success, the club took the huge step of obtaining its own ground at Hove Edge. Whilst at Green Lane, where they played for more than a decade, they achieved two more league titles before taking another major step, in applying for and achieving West Riding County Amateur League status in 1975.

The club thrived there, until their Green Lane ground was developed for housing, upon which they moved to their present ground, just round the corner, on St Giles Road. There followed a period of

stagnation, competing mainly in the lower divisions of the WRCAL until 1988 when the demise of the Blakeborough Company resulted in a new outlook, as well as a new name. This change proved to be the catalyst for the most successful period in the clubs history so far.

The newly named Brighouse Town AFC won promotion to the WRCA Premier Division

in their first season, as well as winning the WRCAL Division One Cup.

In 1991 the Premier Division
Championship was won for the first time
and in 1992 soon followed the West Riding
County Challenge Cup. In 1994 Town won
the Premier Division League Cup and were
runners up in the County Challenge Cup, and
they were Premier Division Champions again
in 1995.

Season 1995/96 was perhaps the most successful season in the clubs history so far. Brighouse Town once again won the WRCAL Premiership title and also completed the double by winning the WRCA League Cup. They also won the Bob Wedgeworth Memorial Trophy.

Season 2008-09, saw the club make the significant step into Semi-Professional football by entering and being accepted into the Northern Counties East League Division One.

After only two seasons in NCEL Division One, the Club won promotion to the NCEL Premier Division under the guidance of Mark Brier and Daz Attwood.

2011/12 Season saw the appointment of Paul Quinn as Manager and after 4th and 2nd place finishes in his first two seasons, the NCEL Premier Title was achieved with a record points total in 2013/14 – the Club's 50th anniversary season.

Promotion to the Evo-Stik Northern
Premier League Division One North brought
the highest level of football in the history of
the Club only six years after leaving the West
Riding County Amateur League, and a new
and exciting challenge lay ahead. A very
respectable 15th place finish was achieved in
the Club's inaugural season, and with
valuable experience gained, and Paul Quinn
still at the helm, valuable
foundations have been laid.

The Dark Night Ends Frosty.

On a night which never looked like getting going due to floodlight problems, ended in disappointment as Danny Frost stole all three points for Ossett Town.

Kick-off was scheduled for 7:45pm as normal for a midweek match but at around 7:00pm half of the floodlights went out.

The nippy winger cut inside Ashley Jackson but pulled his left-footed strike wide of the mark.

The visitors probably had the better of the opening five minutes with a couple of dangerous crosses but The Brewers took charge after ten minutes. Adam Baker terrifically brought down Mycoe's pass and tested Town stopper Leigh Overton with a crisp shot on target.

Chances may have been few and far between in Merseyside in Taddy's last outing but they were coming thick and fast late on Tuesday night.

Tom Corner's ferocious strike from 25 yards was kindly deflected beyond the defence and into the path of Rob Youhill who couldn't flick beyond Overton.

The visitors may have been wishing for more darkness to descend at this point as The Brewers continued to pepper Overton's goal.

Taddy should have been clear in front at this point and the chances only became more clear cut as the half went on. Ridley's curling cross was headed away by Andy Milne which ignited a promising counter-attack. Adam Baker's clever round-the-corner flick set Fatlum Ibrahimi away down the heart of the pitch.

The former Harrogate Railway midfielder drove at the Ossett defence before sliding Conor Sellars in behind who touched past the advancing goalkeeper Overton but saw his powerful strike hooked off the line by Ashley Jackson.

From the resulting corner the woodwork was struck as Andy Milne got the better of Tyrone Gay but could only guide his header into the ground and onto the top of the crossbar. The visitors were struggling to deal with Taddy's quick intricate forward play, especially Conor Sellars, but the only thing that was missing was the finishing touch.

Conor Sellars got in behind Ossett's back line when Rob Youhill curled a delightfully inviting ball over the top but when the former Boro man honed in on goal he skewed his shot wide of the target.

The closest Ossett came to taking a shock lead was in the 35th minute when Ridley's high cross was flicked inches wide.

Leigh Overton in the Ossett goal was in inspired form and was proving to be a real nuisance for the watching on home fans.


