1892



The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.

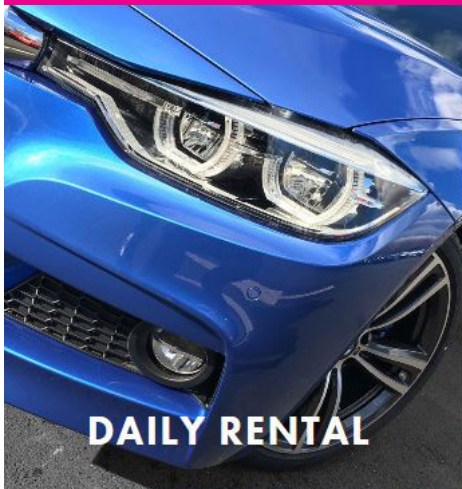

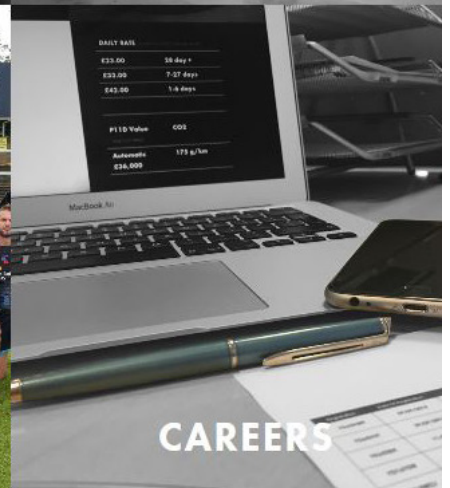

The club was formed in summer 1990, being the brainchild of David Brown, John Harrison, David Law, and Bill Whitten under the name North Trafford, sharing Shawe View with Trafford Borough Rugby League Club. After initially being denied entrance, a late withdrawal resulted in the club being invited to join Division 2 of the Mid-Cheshire League for 1990/91 season. The first game at competitive level versus Macclesfield College was won 3-1, leading to a finish in second place, and promotion to Division One. As a bonus the club obtained sole tenancy of Shawe View via a 30 year lease, and substantial ground improvements were undertaken.

1990/91 Manager David Law took North Trafford to 2nd place in the Mid-Cheshire League Division 2 & were promoted to the Division One.

1991/92 saw progress continue on the field as 4th place was achieved coupled with a successful application to join Division 2 of the North West Counties League.

1992/93 the club had another good season ending with in 7th place in the NWCL Division 2.

1993/94 a magnificent second half of the season in which 20 out of 22 games were won, resulted in 2nd place and promotion to Division One. Additionally the first trophy was won via a 3-1 victory versus Maghull in the Lamot Pils Cup. Promotion was dependent on further ground improvements resulting in the erection of floodlights and the South Stand, which was granted.

1994/95 was launched under the club's present name, ending in 4th place and defeats in the finals of the Manchester Senior and Carling Cups, progress being maintained the next season via 3rd place and reaching the last 16 of the F.A. Vase losing to the eventual winners, Brigg Town.

1995/96 Trafford had another successful league programme finishing in 3rd place.

1996/97 was undoubtedly our most successful, winning the N.W.C.L. and gaining promotion to Division 1 of the Unibond League but losing out in the finals of the Manchester Senior Cup and the League Cup. David Law who had managed the club since inception was named N.W.C.L. Manager of the Year, and the Reserves won the N.W.C.L. Reserve Division, the Reserve League Cup, and the Manchester Amateur Cup.

1997/98 saw an indifferent start but the club finishing 12th, and a further trophy was won, the Unibond First Division Cup, beating Lincoln United 3-1.

1998/99 started with the appointment of Mark Molyneaux as assistant manager to David Law, taking over the reins in the December, and guiding us to a final place of 14th.

1999/2000 Manager Mark Molyneaux along with his assistant Wayne Goodison guided Trafford to victory in the Unibond President's Cup Final beating Whitby Town in the 2nd leg on their ground.

2000/01 Trafford finished the season with thirteen games unbeaten run placing them in 5th place, their highest ever league position in the club's eleven year history.

2001/02 saw Mark Molyneaux resign to take over at fellow Unibond First Division side Chorley, with the club finishing in 15th place. Trafford then appointed Joey Dunn as the new manager.

2002/03 the results didn't come Trafford's way and at Christmas the club decided to release manager Joey Dunn & appoint the vastly experienced Mike McKenzie who has won so many honours as a manager in the Unibond League. Sadly results still didn't come & Trafford were relegated to the North West Counties League.

2003/04 By October Trafford decided to part-company with Mike McKenzie after finding themselves in 19th position in Division One. A month later Trafford appointed 28 year

old former Leigh R.M.I. Reserve Team Manager Danny Johnson as the new manager. Within a couple of weeks the results changed and Trafford began to improved their league position.

2004/05 By the end of season Danny Johnson's young entertaining side finished in 16th position with 50 points. Trafford didn't have much joy in any of the cup competitions but finished in an improved 12th position on 56 points. While the Reserve Team won their third County Cup in four seasons by winning the Manchester F.A. Trophy.

2005-06 was Trafford got off to a flying start in the League and had a good run in the FA Vase, but sadly couldn't maintain their league form throughout the season finishing in 14th position

2006-07 saw Trafford finish in 5th place in the NWCL Division One the club's best campaign since 2001 when they finished in 5th place in the Unibond Division One. The season included a good run in the FA Cup, two players in the top 20 goalscorers in the NWCL, with Glyn Barker in 6th place with 34 goals & Troy Hayder in 16th place with 20 goals, & a end of season run of 17 games unbeaten to round off a marvellous season. At the end of the season sadly manager Danny Johnson decided to move up to the Unibond League with Ashton United, with our player Ged Kielty becoming Trafford's 'new' Player Manager, assisted by Lee Southwood & coached by Tony Coyne.

2007/08 With the new look management Trafford had one of their most successful campaign's winning the Vodkat League Championship title by 11 points with a club record of 95 points to be promoted to the Unibond League for a second time after winning the title in 1997. From September 2007 Trafford went on a 29 league game unbeaten run including 18 straight wins which is a League record. Manager Ged Kielty was also voted Manager of the Year & the club won Programme of the Year. Centre forward Andy Lundy ended the season with 34 overall goals putting him in second place

in the League goalscoring chart, but was the League top scorer with his 28 goals in Division One. His 'sidekick' Scott Barlow came close behind in fourth overall place with 29 goals.

2008-09 saw Trafford return to the Unibond League after an absence of five seasons. Manager Ged Kielty led the team to the club's second Unibond League President's Cup win beating First Division South Quorn 2-0 on their ground in the final. Trafford previously won the President's Cup back in 1999-2000. Trafford's striker Scott Barlow finished runner-up as the First Division North Overall Leading Goalscoring charts with 40 goals. Trafford finished in 15th place in the Division.

2009-10 former Trafford stalwart Garry Vaughan in the 'hot-seat' as Ged Kielty decided to step down as manager. During seven seasons in the 90's Garry played a record 305 games for Trafford & is still the overall leading club goalscorer with 89 goals. In his first season as a manager at Unibond League level Garry along with his Assistant Manager Loz Greenhalgh guided the club to a creditable 12th place in the First Division North & were finalists in the Manchester County FA Premier Cup. During this season striker Scott Barlow scored 21 goals to become the joint overall club top goalscorer with a total of 89 goals in his three seasons at the club along with Manager Garry Vaughan.

2010-11 Trafford had a poor first half of the season, then Manager Garry Vaughan made a number of personnel changes including bringing back former Assistant Manager Wayne Goodison & the clubs fortunes changed finishing in a respectable 14th place.

2011-12 Trafford didn't have much luck in any of the cup competitions & had a rollers coaster season in the First Division North finishing in 12th place.

2012-13 In Garry Vaughan's fourth season as Manager along with his Assistant Wayne Goodison they led Trafford to promotion to the Evo-Stik League Premier Division, after winning the First Division North Play-Off final against Cammell Laird 4-2 on penalties aet on their ground.

2013-14 Trafford playing in their highest ever level of football in the Evo-Stik League Premier Division the club had a very successful season finishing in a very impressive 10th place & won the Manchester Premier Cup against Football Conference side Hyde at Bury FC's Gigg Lane.

2014-15 In January 2015 Manager Garry Vaughan & his Assistant Wayne Goodison resigned from the club & former Altrincham Manager Graham Heathcote took charge along with his Assistant Chris Adams. At the end of the season Trafford were relegated back to the Evo-Stik NPL First Division North & Graham Heathcote retired from Football management.

2015/16 In May 2015 Trafford appointed former FC Halifax & Chorley Captain Tom Baker as the club's new Manager. After in mixed first half to the season from mid-December Trafford's form turned for the better with only five defeats in twenty two league & cup games finishing the season in a creditable 8th place in the Managers first ever season as a Manager.

MANAGER **TOM BAKER**

Previously with Barnsley, Altrincham, Gainsborough Trinity, Scarborough, Bradford Park Avenue, FC Halifax Town and Droylsden he was a ball playing midfielder who was a dead ball specialist. Last season Tom was forced to retire after 17 months out in February 2015. Baker enjoyed an illustrious playing career having signed for Barnsley in 2001. He then signed a full time contract with Scarborough in 2005 but left the club following a succession of injuries. He then enjoyed a good deal of success at Bradford Park Avenue and Halifax Town before moving to Chorley under the management of Gary Flitcroft in 2012. Baker was a key component of Chorley's Evo Stik Premier Division Championship winning team but once again he was hampered by injury and after a fifteen month battle to regain full fitness, he was forced to retire from playing. Tom is confident of getting Trafford back to winning ways and everyone at the club wishes him all the very best! Now in his second at the club his aim is to better the 8th place from last season.

ASSISTANT MANAGER **CHRIS SHUKER**

33 year old Chris Shuker is the new Assistant Manager at Shawe View. Chris who is already signed on for Trafford started his playing career in the Academy at Everton & Man City. Chris then went on to make over 400 Football League appearances starting with five first team appearances for City in the Premier League under Manager Kevin Keegan before moving on to Barnsley, Tranmere Rovers, Morecambe & Port Vale. Tom Baker says "With Chris will be a great asset to the club"

GOALKEEPING COACH **DAVE ANDREW** Tom completed his Coaching Staff for last season by appointing Dave Andrew as the club's goalkeeper coach. Tom says: "Dave is someone who came highly recommended to me by several people and his CV speaks for itself. THE ELEPHANT IN THE STADIUM



There is something we should all be talking about. It's the most important thing in years. It's going to be big; life-changing even. And it's on its way in our direction at a rapid rate of knots. Yet almost nobody is even aware of it, let alone having any say in the planning for it... No. I'm not referring to Brexit, I'm sure you're all relieved to hear! We've all heard enough of that to last a lifetime, haven't we? No. It's something far more important than that! The big issue I'm on about is the forthcoming reorganisation of the Non-league Pyramid!

So, what DO we know about the impending changes? Well, very little actually. Only the very eagle-eyed will have picked up on the paper released by the FA earlier this year. Steve Whitney of www.nonleague.pitchero.com wrote in an article dated 18th January 2017:

"The continuing complaints that there is too much travelling involved for some clubs at Steps 3 and 4 could well be answered in time for the 2018/19 season. The cost of long journeys has been suggested as a reason why so few clubs in the north-east are prepared to take promotion from Step 5.

The long contemplated solution of a new league to cover the Midlands has now found voice in a paper produced by the FA, the latest draft of which bears the date of January 2nd this year. The new league would have a division at each of Steps 3 and 4. Along with this comes a reduction in size for some divisions:-

Step 1: (National League): will remain at 24 clubs

Step 2: (National Leagues North & South): will remain at 22 clubs per division

Step 3: the current three divisions of 24 clubs will now be four divisions of 22 clubs

Step 4: (OUR LEVEL): the current four divisions of 22 clubs and two divisions of 24 will become seven divisions of 20.

In total the current 276 clubs in Steps 1 to 4 will increase by 20 to 296. This will be achieved by relegating only the bottom clubs from the six step 4 divisions at the end of 2017/8 and promoting 26 clubs from Step 5."

The English Football Pyramid is a very upright one, in that it has 5 national divisions and it's not until the sixth tier when regionalisation kicks in, with National Leagues North and South. Below that we have the 3 Premier Divisions of the Northern and Southern Premier Leagues and the Isthmian League respectively. And then, at the level we currently occupy, there are 6 regional divisions. Beneath us, sit 14 regional (county) leagues at level 9 (step 5) and a further 17 at level 10 (step 6). A progression of 1-1-1-1-2-3-6-14-17.

Contrast this with Spain's much broader Pyramid. There, only the top 2 divisions (Primera & Segunda) are national ones and as early as the third tier (Segunda B, which is equivalent to League 1 in England) there are 4 regional groups. One level below (Tercera Division, equivalent to English League 2) has no fewer than 18 regional groups. Spanish Step 5 has over 50 provincial groups! A progression of 1-1-4-18-50+. Thus, The Brewers would effectively be sitting on the Step equivalent to League Two if we were a Spanish club – only three promotions away from the top flight!

Germany also has a Pyramid which more closely resembles the Spanish one than it does the English one. Such systems have the effect of dragging more clubs up to a better standard both on and off the field and it's surely no coincidence that the

international sides and now also the club sides of these two nations are the most successful in European football.

I'd like to see the English Pyramid given a complete once-and-for-all makeover to be perfectly pyramidal with 2-up and 4-down promotion/relegation throughout, as follows:

Level 1: Premier League
(20 clubs nationwide)

Level 2: 2 regional divisions of 20 clubs in each (comprising clubs currently in The Championship and League 1)

Level 3: 4 regional divisions of 20 clubs in each (comprising clubs currently in League 2 and National Leagues National, North & South)

Level 4 (OUR LEVEL): 8 regional divisions of 20 clubs in each (comprising clubs currently in the Northern Premier League, Southern Premier League and Isthmian League)

Level 5: 16 regional divisions of 20 clubs in each (comprising clubs currently in the Premier divisions of the various Counties' Leagues e.g. NCEL)

Level 6: 32 regional divisions of 20 clubs in each (comprising clubs currently in the First divisions of the various Counties' Leagues e.g. NCEL plus the various "Step 7" leagues).

As anyone who made the trip to Trafford ten days ago would testify, we certainly deserved at least a point from that game. We dominated possession and territory (especially in the second half) only to be undone by a combination of defensive hesitancy, missed chances and being caught out at the back whilst pressing hard for a late equaliser.

The story of much of our season encapsulated in one game. The next stage in our evolution as a team will be to start taking the points that our performances merit. Today will be a great game to make a start on that against an efficient, promotion-chasing side who boast an excellent away record – Come on you Brewers!

Taddy Left Frustrated After Missed Opportunity At Lancaster.

It was the same old story yet again for the Brewers after they misfired at promotion chasing Lancaster City.

Ryan Winder netted the only goal of the game in the first half after firing a free-kick past Chandler Hallwood. Tadcaster responded well though and dominated the second half with Josh Greening somehow heading over from four yards out.

Tadcaster boss Billy Miller made two changes to the defeat at Trafford with Liam Shepherd and Josh Greening both brought back into the starting eleven.

The Dolly Blues were looking to keep the pressure on league leaders Farsley Celtic and they were certainly doing just that as they took the lead after 14 minutes.

After plenty of successful practice in the warm-up, Ryan Winder stepped up and superbly curled a free-kick into the back of the net from 25 yards. Albion got out of the City storm shipping just the one goal, and they could have been level shortly after the half hour mark as they slowly worked their way back into the contest.

Dan Thirkell brilliantly reversed a through ball in behind to Josh Greening but he could only fire into the side-netting.

There's no doubting that the title chasers were the team on top in the first half and they really should have extended their lead less than a minute after Greening's missed opportunity.

City drove away from a Tad corner and substitute Hannu Tam sprung the offside trap leaving virtually a whole half between just him and goalkeeper Hallwood.

The pacey Tam drove in on goal but the former Walsall stopper narrowed the angle, stood tall and denied the striker's weak effort. Set-piece specialist Conor Sellars almost out did Winder's free-kick three minutes from the interval.

Right side of the penalty box, Sellars whipped the free-kick over the wall and unconventionally towards the far corner but saw his sweet strike crash off the crossbar with the keeper all but beaten.

Josh Greening may not be known for his heading ability, but even he will have been bitterly disappointed not to have rippled the back of the net four minutes into the second half.

Jordan Armstrong, who was outstanding all afternoon for the Brewers, put it on a plate for Greening who somehow headed over the mark from four yards out.

The Brewers, kicking towards the excellent terraced stand at Giant Axe, were putting the home side under severe pressure with a hat full of dangerous crosses and corners into the danger zone.

You got the feeling that the goal was coming for Miller's men but after the recent run of results, nothing is ever guaranteed.

Carl Stewart didn't have a lot to work with up top for Taddy but when he did get half a yard to set his sights, Mike Hale was on-hand to push clear.

Chances started to flow for both sides as the match ticked by and Chandler Hallwood had to make an impressive save to keep out Jacob Gregory.

Lancaster were camped deep in their own half as Taddy continued to probe for an equaliser. And with twelve minutes to go Josh Greening went close once again.

Carl Stewart rose highest and glanced down perfectly into the path of Greening but he couldn't generate enough contact to flick past the City goalkeeper. In the end it was a similar story to last week's defeat at Trafford. A dominant second half but nothing to show for their efforts.

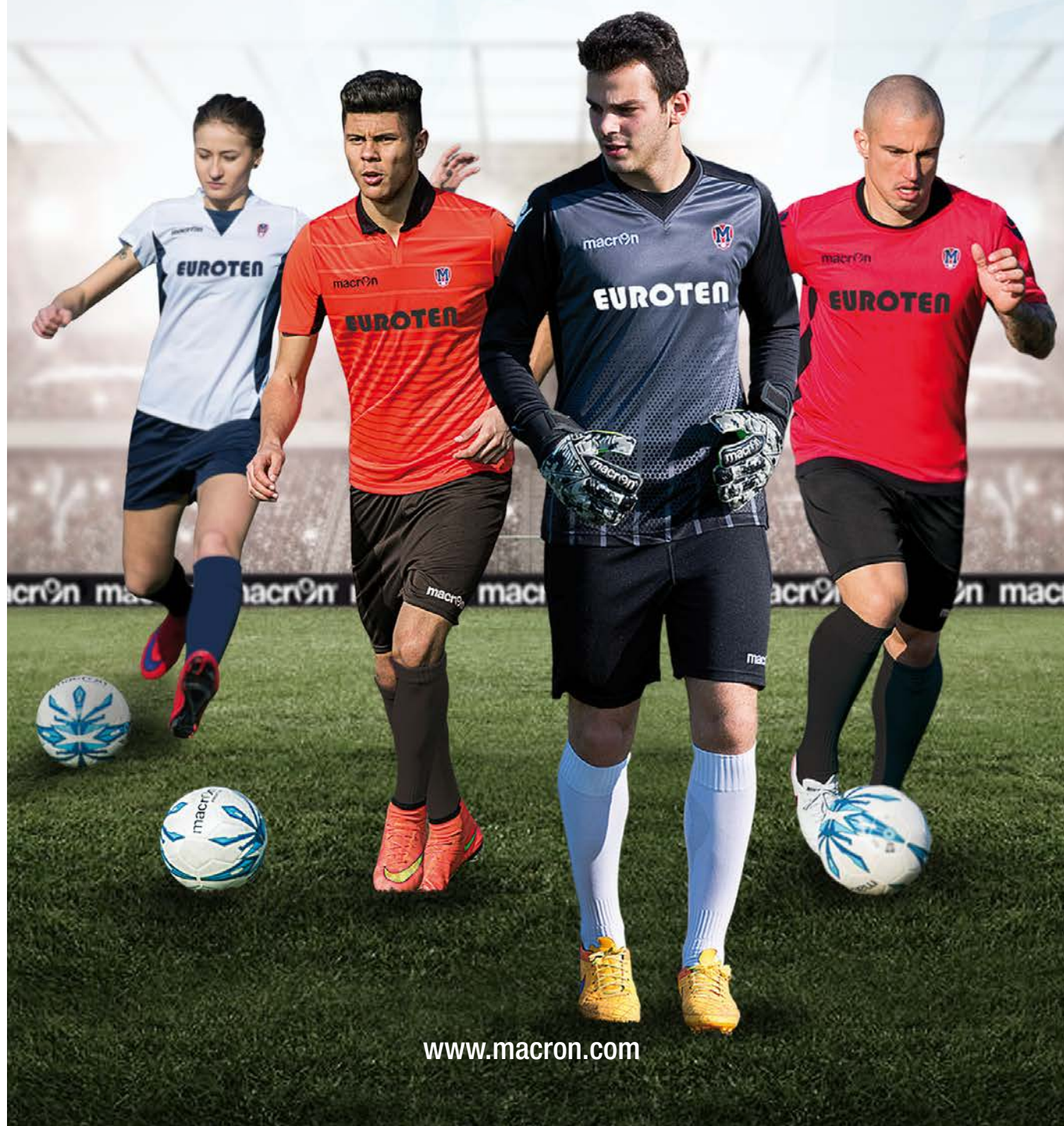

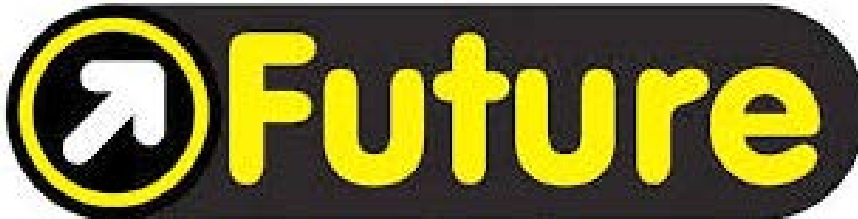

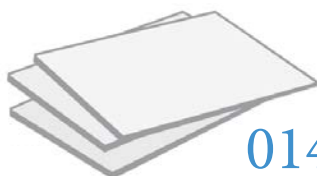

"It's good to be back at Tadcaster, it is massively different to when I was here before, although the club's fundamental family values haven't changed."

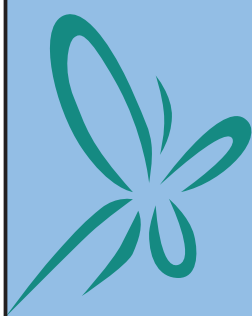
