# "the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.


### **TAFC** Directors Notes

Carl first joined Tadcaster Albion before going on to have spells with Pickering Town, Bridlington Town and Ossett Town. He returned in 2013 and was the club's top scorer in the 2013/14 season, scoring 32 goals (a club record).



#### Joe Thornton STRIKER

Former Barnsley, Ossett Albion and Shaw Lane Striker, Joe signed for the Brewers in the summer of 2015. Joe scored 22 goals last season - playing a key role in Shaw Lane winning the title and reaching the Quarter Final of the FA Vase.



#### Calum Ward STRIKER

Calum is a physical and determined striker who has previously played for Ossett Town. He is currently enjoying his second spell with Tadcaster Albion and wrote his place in Taddy history when he scored a hat-trick in the 4-1 FA Cup victory over Skelmersdale United in 2012.



#### Danny Gray Striker

Danny, who describes himself as a big number 9 striker, signed from Selby in December 2014 for what is now his second spell with the club. Danny gives the team another option up front because of his size and presence.



#### David Brown STRIKER

David spent 10 years with the Leeds United Academy before moving to Nottingham Forest in the 2007/08 season. He later moved to Bradford City where he scored on his debut beating Macclesfield Town 1-0. David, who has also played for Guiseley, FC Halifax Town, and Bradford Park Avenue, is a hard-working striker.

# **Visitors'** Team History



#### THE CLUB

The club was formed in **1914** as Harrogate AFC, but owing to First World War did not play a game until they joined the West Yorkshire League in **1919/20**.

The next season they also played in the newly formed Yorkshire League.

In **1921/22** they played in the Midland Counties League and after a disastrous season in the Northern League in **1931/32**, Harrogate F C folded.

In **1935** a new team called Harrogate Hotspurs was founded and in **1948** changed their name to Harrogate Town. They played in the West Yorkshire League until **1957** when they rejoined the Yorkshire League.After the introduction of the Non-League Pyramid in **1982** they joined the Northern Counties East, but after just five years they joined the newly formed NorthernPremier League First Division in **1987/88**. Town remained at this level until **2002** when they won the Championship and were promoted to the Premier division.

When Nationwide Conference North and South were created in **2004/5**, Town's 5th place finish in the Unibond Premier Division secured them a place in this new league. In their five seasons at this level Town finished sixth three times and reached the play off's once, where they lost to Stafford Rangers. Long standing manager Neil Aspin left at the end of season **2008/09** when Town finished ninth. His place was taken by Simon Weaver the ex-Lincoln, Scarborough and Nuneaton player.

Unfortunately, Town finished rock bottom in **2009/10** with 30 points, only to be saved from relegation to the Evo-Stik League by the expulsion of Northwich Victoria. Following their reprieve Town finished in a creditable 12th position in season **2010/11**.

An injury blighted **2011/12** season saw Town finish in 15th place after a tense

battle against relegation. Last season saw Town just miss out on a play off place when they finished sixth, but they reached the second round of the F A Cup with a victory over Torquay United, their first win over a League club, before losing to Hastings United on penalties.

In season **2012/13**, Town challenged for a play-off place but eventually finished ninth, whilst in the West Riding County Cup, they reached the final only to fall to a last minute penalty against Eccleshill United

In season **2014/15**, Town finished in 15th place in the Vanarama Conference North.

#### **HONOURS**

Harrogate's first League title came in **1926/27** when they won the Yorkshire League First Division Championship, but they had to wait for over fifty years before they won the Yorkshire League Second Division in **1982**.

Their only other League title was won in **2001/02** when they won the Unibond First Division.

Their only cup success in the Yorkshire League was a losing appearance in the **1961/62** League Cup.

They were Unibond First Division Cup winners in **1989/90** and Unibond Chairman's Cup finalists in **2000/01** losing on penalties to Barrow.

In **2002/03** they reached the first round of the FA Cup for the first time losing 5-1 at Farnborough. They repeated the feat in **2005** when they drew 1-1 at Torquay United before losing the replay 6-5 on penalties before a crowd of 3,317.

In **2012** Town reached the second round of the F A Cup for the first time losing to Hastings United. Town have also won the West Riding County Cup eight times and been runners up on four occasions.

#### THE GROUND

The club began playing behind the County Hotel (now Mujib restaurant) before moving to Starbeck Lane in **1919**.

A year later they moved to the present ground after raising £3000 with a share issue. After disbanding in **1931** the club sold the ground to the council who own it to this day.

Floodlights were installed in **1982** and a new cantilever stand built for the **1990/91** season. The bar has been extended twice, new changing rooms have been installed and the floodlights were improved to the level needed for Conference football in **2006**. In summer **2007** two new turnstiles were added, the clubhouse was revamped, and a new toilet block built.

The record attendance was set in the **1949/50** when 4,280 saw the Whitworth Cup final between Town and Harrogate Railway.

The close season **2012** saw feverish activity at Wetherby Road with the **1919** Club and the Sponsors/Directors Lounge completely revamped and a new office and shop built.

The famous Wetherby Road slope has been removed and a new sprinkler system installed and the pitch has been completely reseeded.

Further work took place on the pitch in summer **2013** and a new club shop incorporating the supporter's club shop has been opened. In the close season of **2014** a new stand, complete with two new toilet blocks and a refreshment bar, has been erected at the hospital end.

In the summer of **2015** a new covered terrace was erected on the Wetherby Road side of the ground.

Aged 37,Simon started with Sheffield Wednesday before joining Ilkeston.After spells at Grimsby and Nuneaton,he joined Lincoln City where he made 88 appearances before moving to Macclesfield Town in 2004.He then had spells at Kidderminster,Scarborough,York,Tamworth,.Boston,Kings Lynn and Redditch.

He moved back to Ilkeston and scored the winning goal in the Unibond play-off win over Nantwich Town,helping Ilkeston to gain promotion to Blue Square North.



#### John McDermott coach

Signed in June 2010 as assistant to Simon Weaver. John is a former Grimsby Town stalwart who made over 650 appearances for the Mariners. He has been coaching at the Grimsby Institute Academy for the past three years and will help with youth development at Town.



#### Peter Crook Goalkeeper

Peter signed dual registration forms with us and Harrogate Railway Athletic, in August 2013.

Originally a youth player with Scunthorpe United, Peter has also played for Ossett Albion, Barton Town and Ilkley Town.



#### Matt Bloomer Centre Half

# TAD'S History

by Ian Tyssen

### The NCEL Years 1994 - 1995 Season

For the second successive season, the membership of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) increased by one club. The Premier Division remained with 20 clubs and Division One again increased by one, to 16 teams.

Arnold Town and Hallam had been promoted to the Premier Division, with Eccleshill United and Winterton Rangers moving in the opposite direction. Tadcaster Albion were also joined in Division One by Blidworth Welfare, who returned to the NCEL after a ten year absence.

The season kicked off with a 0-2 home loss against relegated Winterton Rangers and this was to be the start of a four game run without a win. That sequence came to an end with a 3-1 home victory against Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare, who would finish the season in second place. One week later, another 3-1 win was picked up at Parkgate.

October brought another four game run without a victory, which included a 0-2 loss at champions Hatfield Main and a disappointing 1-1 draw at bottom club Brodsworth Welfare.

A pair of 2-1 home wins were achieved in mid November - against Blidworth Welfare and Rossington Main - but that would be the last time that the Brewers won two successive games in the season.

In the remaining 18 games of the 1994/95 season, Albion would only win two and draw five games. The victories came against Parkgate (3-1) in January and at Winterton Rangers (1-0) in April.

In the second half of the season, heavy defeats were

suffered against Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare (1-4), Immingham Town (2-5), Blidworth Welfare (0-3) and Yorkshire Amateur (0-4). Perhaps the most disappointing result came in the final game of the season, when the Brewers lost 0-1 at home against Brodsworth Welfare, who had not won a game since August.

As in the 1993/94 campaign, Tadcaster Albion finished in 12th place with 26 points. Although, it was from two more games in this season.

In the FA Vase preliminary round, Glapwell were beaten 3-1 at Ings Lane, before a 0-3 loss at Oldham Town in the first round.

Mid table NCEL Premier Division club Ossett Albion thrashed the Brewers 5-0 in the second round of the League Cup. Whilst Harrogate Town ended Albion's hopes in the West Riding County Cup with a 3-1 victory at Wetherby Road.

The Reserve Division reduced in size to 15 teams and the Brewers again finished bottom of the league. In their 28 games, they accumulated just eight points, with a -84 goal difference and 110 goals conceded.

The only two wins for the reserves were at Ossett Albion (5-2) in September and at home against Eccleshill United (2-0) in December.

The heaviest losses of the league season for the second XI were against Brodsworth Welfare (0-8), Hall Road Rangers (0-8), champions Emley (2-9) and Thackley (0-7). However, the worst defeat came in the Reserve Team Cup, when Ossett Town hit double figures, with a 10-2 victory.


