DECEMBER 31 HOGMANAY PARTY Leith headed down the A68 for the second time this season, however this time the result favoured the Edinburgh men as they returned with their first victory of the year. Earlston enjoyed much of the early possession but Leith were able to absorb the pressure well as the one out runners weren't troubling the more aggressive Leith defence with Neil Paterson and Paul Haggon leading the charge. Leith kicked into gear and motored up the other end of the park. After a good run by Andrew Paterson, Leith had a number of phases before Earlston infringed but like the home kicker, Dannfald drifted his kick wide of the post.

Leith were still camped in the home teams half and after kicking a penalty to the corner the away side sniffed its first chance of points. A good catch and drive from the forwards set the platform for the backs and powerful winger Ross Marwick to latch onto the pass from Ben Wilkinson, burst through the defence and touchdown from 15m out. Dannfald duly converted and Leith were first on the board.

It didn't take long for Leith to grab their second as from the kick off Paul Haggon burst through the Earlston defence and made good yards into their hair. Whilst the ball was knocked on, from Earlston's resulting clearing kick, winger Paterson gathered and with pace, footwork and power beat 3 or 4 defenders on a 60m dash to the line. This time the conversion was missed leaving the score 12-0 to Leith. Paterson almost scored the third try of the afternoon as once again he shrugged off a couple of defenders and made 50m deep into the 22. However the full back eventually brought Paterson down and Leith were unable to convert more goal line pressure into points.

Earlston finished the half where they started it by piling the pressure on the Leith line after a few penalties gave them field position. Flanker Paul Haggon was sent to the bin after one too many penalties in the red zone from the team but the defence stood firm and showed no way through for the home side. Eventually Marcos Teixera who was at the heart of a great defensive effort secured the turn over for Leith to clear. Earlston came again but after being constantly repelled back, opted instead to take the points and draw an end to the half.

The message was clear for Leith at the half, keep the discipline and keep the same level of performance as they had in the middle 25 of the first half. The weather was now closing in and making handling conditions difficult for both teams which did not suit the rugby Leith were trying to play. A few errors and penalties once again gave the home team some field position and they took the chance to double their points tally to 6. Ranging runs by Marwick, Kilgour and Paterson once again got Leith into the Earlston half. Paterson did manage to breach the defence again but was hauled to the ground just short on the 5m line and his attempted offload could not be gathered by the onrushing McNamara. Leith piled on the pressure but were being let down by their handling in the tough conditions. However it was from this pressure and bad handling that gave that man Paterson the chance to run against a broken defence and step his way to his secodnd score of the day. Converted to give Leith a 19-6 lead.



Andrew Paterson Man of Match Ill-discipline then handed Earlston chances to get themselves back into the game. Leith were able to soak up the majority of the pressure, the front row union of Wilson, Winton, Connelly and then O'Neil worked hard at the set piece and in the loose to thwart Earlston back. Kirkwood and McLeish were also important in their carrying and defence as Leith looked to close the game out, and off the line out Forsyth was stealing and disrupting the home team at any chance. However from a 5m line, Earlston did get a shove on and scored a try with big question marks over the grounding. The conversion was made from out wide which gave us a six point ball game heading into the last minutes. Earlston came at Leith again and after being thwarted by some tackles out wide, some quick pick and goes allowed them to crash over with time in the red. Leith chased down the kick with everything they had and the home kicker sent it wide to give Leith their first victory of the year.

Overall Leith were delighted with the result but disappointed with different aspects of the performance. Solid showings all over the pitch, the forward pack fronted up their defensive effort massively, a new centre pairing of Muirden and McNamara were solid and allowed the outside backs to flourish. But unanimously man of the match was Paterson, two good scores, many metres gains and a solid defensive effort helped Leith to the victory.



Leith Youth Rugby Development (LRYD) was set up as a charity earlier this year to deliver rugby to children within the local Leith primary schools.

Starting in August we look forward to delivering rugby to Primary 4 pupils in the Leith primary cluster. We will be delivering sessions at Lorne Primary, Leith Primary, Craigintinny Primary, St Ninians and Hermitage Park Primary.

We are also starting to deliver curriculum rugby to the S1 pupils at Leith Academy. We have just begun a 6 week block of rugby for the boys and after the October school holidays we will be coaching the girls for 6 weeks. At the end of the delivery we will be running a rugby interhouse competition which has not been done before at Leith Academy.

Our afterschool clubs start up again Friday 1st September for the Secondary school boys while the Primary school cluster club starts back up again on Friday 15th September. In addition to this, we have now set up another afterschool club also on Fridays at St Ninians Primary school. This will start on Friday 15th September.

We're looking forward to hosting a rugby festival at Leith Rugby after the 6 weeks of delivery at the primary schools. The next rugby festival will be on the 12th October and will be for the Primary 4 children. We are still looking into the idea of having Minis rugby on Sundays in the coming months. We will be looking to create an opportunity for children to come along to Leith Rugby to participate in rugby and develop their skills.

### This is a really exciting time for Leith Rugby club youth section.

During the summer Leith Rugby in partnership with Active schools ran a summer camp for the first time. We had a mixture of boys and girls from P4-P7. The summer camp covered some of the fundamental skills of rugby and also looked at playing through the game by playing fun games and developing the children's game understanding and skills. We plan to run an easter camp and another summer camp next year.

Going forward we are starting to look at putting volunteers through rugby qualification courses so they can help out with game coaching at our rugby festival and assist the rugby development going on in the Leith area. In addition to this the LRYD were given money to spend on rugby equipment and with this we purchased rugby balls and branded Leith Hawks bibs which have been given to the schools.

LRYD is dependent entirely on contributions from charitable funds and trusts, private donations and our own fundraising.

Would you be standing reminiscing about a tour to somewhere 20 or 30 years ago with someone you would never have met if it hadn't been for playing rugby?


