# KEY ACTION PLAN

1)	Rolled & amended from previous; Finalise move to College Meadows for the whole Club (including 3G Pitch, Stand, Clubhouse development and 150 additional parking spaces)  – key part being to agree to a long-term lease (25 years) & sustainable rent.  Move due to be completed by Dec 2018, by which the Club will then have 3 full size pitches on site.
2)	Pathway from Academy to Senior Rugby – Set up a clear pathway from Youth Rugby into Senior Rugby, which is shared with players and parents & has measured outcomes. For youth transition to 3rds & below senior rugby we have targeted 10 players a season, allowing for universities & general drop out  In addition, there will be an Academy section for 19 to 22 year olds aimed as a pathway to the 1st XV
