Our Head Coach is a full time professional coach, having played Test and One Day International cricket for Zimbabwe. In the 2019 season he delivered over **400 probono hours** of coaching sessions (paid by Club Management) to more than **250 children** over a **6 week** period as part of our excellent Community Outreach programme.

The Club remains committed to investing in to Glebelands School cricketing facilities including delivery of management and coaching time. This programme will continue in 2020 with a view to encouraging players from the school to continue to play cricket post school term. The Club has seen a marked increase in interest in cricket by children from local Cranleigh schools.


