## HOLMER GREEN FOOTBALL CLUB



## SSML DIVISION ONE

Holmer Green was founded in 1908, spending their first few seasons as a club in the Chesham & District League. They then moved across to the Wycombe Combination League in 1934, where they had a 19 year wait for their first major trophy; in the form of the 1953 Berks and Bucks Junior Cup. The Greens won the Wycombe League title in 1972 and 1974, under the management of Norman King.

In 1984, Holmer Green became founding members of the Chiltonian League, where they proceeded to win consecutive League titles in 1984-85 and 1985-86.

The end of the 1994-95 season saw some legal action taken by the Greens, as they tried to leave the Chiltonian League to join the South Midlands League. They were denied permission by the Chiltonian League and after multiple trials and tribunals they were granted permission to move to the new league, which they won on the first time of asking.

After a relegation in 2009, the club bounced straight back and gained promotion as champions from the South Spartan Midlands League Division One, where they remained for 8 years until the 2017-18 season, The following year, however, the club was relegated back to the first division, but in the 2009-10 bounced back as champions of the Spartan South Midlands League Division One and until 2017-18 season were still in the Premier Division. However, at the close of the season and as part of a reorganisation managed by the FA, they were moved sideways into the UHL Hellenic League. Manager Chris Allen retired from the club after ten years in May 2019 and was replaced by Dave Lynch for the start of the 2019/20 season after Holmer Green were moved into The Hellenic Premier Division. Dave Lynch was replaced by Matt Stowell in September 2019. These last two seasons were curtailed by the Covid pandemic and for the start of the 2021/22 season the club were moved back to The Spartan South Midlands League. Matt Stowell was replaced in December 2021 by Tom Bryant. Holmer Green ended the 2021/22 season bottom of the SSML Premier Division and will compete in SSML Division One for the 2022/23 season.
