The Parents Survey and the Opening of the Beehive

Firstly, thank you to all parents and visitors for taking the time to complete our survey on The Beehive. Participants were asked to answer questions on the range, quality and pricing of hot food and beverages as well as the range of cold drinks and snacks on offer.

For the final four weeks of the 'challenging' 2020/21 season the new Beehive was opened for Sunday training from 08:30 to 13:30/14:00. The purpose of this was to gain an understanding of customer reaction to the Beehive initiative, gauge demand, assess range of products to offer and the staff.

Overview of outcomes

Summary of outcomes

- Between 58.6% and 78.6% of respondents rated the range, quality and pricing of hot food and beverages as excellent or very good with the range and pricing of hot food receiving 70% or above.
- The category respondents were least happy with was the range of cold drinks and snacks on offer, followed by the quality of hot food where the good or fair outcomes were 50% and 41.4% respectively.
- Not one category received a single 'poor' rating with six of the seven categories receiving between 1 and 6 'fair' responses with pricing of hot drinks again receiving none.

What you said about the Beehive

"Love the Beehive, added a special dimension of the Club. Food great, coffee perfect. People pretty amazing too".

"Friendly, good selection and good prices. it's a great club initiative. These types of things go a long way to making clubs stand out to people".

"The Beehive has been a great addition to the club. Service provided has been very good. Friendly staff...".

"Think your pricing for food is spot on, maybe a bit more choice ie cakes and pastries to complement the great coffee".

"Great addition. Have used it regularly. Bread rolls are a bit dodgy".

"Coffee was lovely, son liked the food".

"Lovely coffee & hot choc. Always cheery staff.

Your suggestions

"Please can you offer pastries, not everyone likes burgers etc, these would go down well with a coffee. It is difficult to see what soft drinks, snacks are on offer when ordering from the window. I didn't see if there was a sign outside with what's on offer. Soft drinks for the little ones would also be great".

"I haven't visited yet but will there be veggie options available please"?

"Need to think about the flow in and out. Think it will be better served from a hatch when it is really busy otherwise you can't make an obvious queue in and out".

"When it's cold and muddy, to save the floor it may be best to serve from the window"?

"Better quality food produce and put the prices up. As money goes back to the club, I don't think people will mind".

"I would prefer baguettes or crusty rolls".

"Coffee options should include "normal" coffee like Americano or filter for those that want milk but not latte or flat white".

"The kids love burgers abs stuff like that, I'm only going to buy less greasy food, pastries, loaf cakes, stuff like that. Also, would prefer more vegetarian options".

"I'm thrilled it's here. It feels a little haphazard so far, everyone was falling over each other, which might just be getting everything bedded in but there is much to be said for getting organised so you can serve more people, and there's less chance of anyone getting injured or something getting spilt". "Better quality of bacon/sausage - increased number of soft drinks available - Addition of soft drinks fridge".

"Definitely serve alcohol! Can we get a Guinness keg in? Or get guest ales from Billericay Brewery"? "Maybe a bigger seating area"?

Actions

Over the summer the Club Committee will, amongst other areas, review:

- The range of cold drinks and snacks on offer.
- The quality of the food and particularly that of the bread products
- The presentation of the cold beverages and snacks
- Provision of vegetarian options
- The signage

Note, after the first week of the survey being open and in response to some initial comments, we did improve the quality of the burgers on offer.

Nearly another visit for BRFC to visit the home of Rugby - Kids First Champions Award

You may recall way back in November 2019 the club were recognised as being a Kids First Champion club. Only 7 clubs across England received such recognition. This award was based on the Club's efforts to promote and deliver the Kids First philosophy across our age groups.

This philosophy puts the individual child's needs as the highest priority, then development of each child is driven from that need, finally competitions are there to support that development. It turns the outdated model of competition first, all about the win, on its head and we firmly believe as a club and a group of coaches that this is what we stand for.

The award would have seen a small group of players enjoy a training day at Twickenham and a run out on the pitch but sadly Covid put a stop to that. Equally selecting a few players would have been a very difficult process so in some way its taken a problem away.

As an alternative to the day at Twickenham the club has received a number of brand new Tackle Wedges and 20 balls - probably £400 of free training kit - a much better prize that benefits all the players.

The kit is obviously a good result but this shows how far the club has come sine the senior visits over 20 years ago. A fantastic involvement by all involved and a huge thank you.

Well done to all involved we raised £691 for the NHS and the cakes (in particular made by Shirley Fisher) were amazing! Thanks for your support




The 2021 Presidents Award




The New Structure


