



Pitch Perfect!

Hopefully you've all noticed the improvements in the pitches this season.

The club provided, at a great cost, the tractor, mower and sport play (aerator, rake, roller & brush on one frame) and GreenTek slitter over the last 18 months and this winter we're seeing starting to see the benefits (It's also been much dryer than last year so far!).

The pitches were cut 2-3 times a week over the summer and moving in to the season were cut once or twice and deep slit once a week and the pitches all marked each week.

At this time of the season the sport play is used once/twice a week to do all four jobs in one pass. This takes about 6 to 8 hours a week to complete.

Club funds will also go towards fertilizing, top dressing with sand and over seeding once the season ends.
