Peterborough Lions 20 – Bedford Athletic 19



Peterborough Lions started the new season with a hard fought last minute victory over Bedford Athletic. After 80 minutes of intense physical rugby, it came down to the Lion's scrum half, Jaco Steenberg, to kick the winning penalty.

The first 20 minutes was error strewn with maybe first match nerves playing their part. Peterborough Lion's indiscipline gifted Bedford Athletic two penalty chances, which were both missed, but were punished in the 21st minute, when a penalty to touch resulted in Bedford driving Sheldon Reynecke over. Bedford converted to take a 7-0 lead. Lion's fought straight back from kick off and newly returned centre Jacques Vorster was unlucky to have a try disallowed. From the resulting 5m scrum, No.8 Ian Underwood crashed over from short range, with Steenberg converting. The half wasn't over and with 2 minutes left on the clock Chris Humphrey paid the price for team indiscipline and was yellow carded.

Despite their numerical disadvantage, Lions started the second half strongly, and good counter attacking from the backs lead to new captain Saad Sait scoring, but the try went unconverted. Lack of discipline prevented Lions from keeping control, and some sloppy play saw Luke Levitt turn the ball over and allow James Mortimer to walk under the posts for a converted try for Bedford Ath, to take the lead 14-12. The see saw nature of this contest continued as Lions scrum and forward superiority began to tell as they continued to create chances. Silly penalties and poor execution of final passes prevented them for scoring sooner, but eventually the pressure told and Saad Sait got a second score, to leave the game delicately poised at 17-14 to Peterborough Lions. Bedford Athletic refused to give up and with Lions refusing to learn from earlier, when not dealing with a rolling maul, allowed Ben Middleton a try in the corner. Again the conversion was missed and with 10 minutes remaining, Bedford lead 19-17. Lions, keen to maintain their home record which has not seen them lose in over a year, dominated possession for the final 10 minutes. Bedford refused to give any try scoring opportunities, but repeated infringements allowed Steenberg to kick a penalty to take the score to 20-19. With just 30 seconds remaining, debutant Dan Page claimed the kick off under severe pressure, set the ball up for it to be kicked out of play and the final whistle to be blown.

After the match, captain Saad Sait said 'We are really pleased to get the first win, everyone stood up to the increase in quality. The front row of Tom Laws, Manny van Niekerk and Joe Roberts laid a great platform for the rest of the team. We've seen the increase in physicality and that we will be punished for mistakes and indiscipline unlike last year. Everyone is learning and we build to next week against Matlock'

Inter and Intra Muscular Haematoma's (Dead-Leg)

You may wonder why I and Victoria treat you with caution when you take a blow and get a 'dead-leg' during a game. This article will explain the risks of these two very different and yet similar injuries and the importance of getting the treatment spot on.

These injuries are commonly caused by a collision and require quick treatment. It is important you understand the different definitions of the condition,

Intermuscular haematoma's involve bleeding between the muscles/fascia.

However **inter**muscular haematomas cause greater loss of function than the intramuscular and are generally more persistent, taking longer to develop; pain reduces normally within the first 24hrs. It isn't unusual for the bruising to travel distally towards gravity. This injury can be treated after the initial stages using massage but NEVER straight away.

<u>Intramuscular haematomas</u> are when the blood is unable to escape, clotting within the muscle sheath. <u>Intramuscular</u>, can also be caused by muscle strains, tears, or bruising. The swelling is instant and often causes pain as it may press against adjacent nerves. The function of the muscle is impaired, and contractility and extensibility are greatly reduced. Therefore performance and power output will be significantly reduced.

This injury causes greater risk factors and in the very worst case if an **intra**muscular haematoma goes untreated and unrecognised, a limb can be lost due to tissue damage and death within surrounding areas.

It is vital to get these injuries treated as soon as they occur and treat them with caution. So please **get it looked at!**



Matlock 27 – Peterborough Lions 44

Peterborough Lions looked as though had no ill-effects from the long journey as they made the perfect start to their clash against Matlock. Strong carrying from the forwards lead to the home team infringing and scrum half Jaco Steenberg, pinning Matlock back deep in their 22. From the resulting lineout, a strong catch and drive saw Oli Story score on debut. The conversion was missed and Lions lead 5-0. With Lions dominating possession, Matlock again conceded the penalty for Lions, for Steenberg to convert.

Minutes later, Steenberg had the chance to push the lead out to 11-0 but the kick

was missed. Then a lack of concentration from Peterborough let Matlock regain the 22 drop out, and good supporting play saw them move swiftly up the pitch, to allow the centre to score under the posts. Matlock had no answer to Lions physicality and ability to move the ball. Another penalty allowed Lions a 11-7 lead, then clean lineout ball lead to Mark Rossouw dummying through the defensive line and off loading to Chris Humphrey, to run in under the posts, Steenberg with the conversion again. After controlling all the ball and perfect discipline until this point, Peterborough had a mad 10 minutes before half time. Firstly Steenberg was yellow carded for retaliation after a late tackle, the Matlock fly half kicked to move the score on to 18-10. Minutes later and in a case of mistaken identity repeated infringements saw Marius Andrijauskas also yellow carded to reduce Lions to 13 men temporarily. Another Matlock penalty saw Lions going into half time with an 18-13 lead. The message from coach Lee Adamson of retaining the possession, cut out the errors and indiscipline seemed to have had an effect, as after several drives from the forwards, Mark Rossouw stepped up and drove over from short range and converted from in front, Lions were beginning to play with the confidence of last year and after breaking up a Matlock attack on their own 22, the ball was spread wide for centre Gedis Marcisauskas to break the line, who fed open side flanker Chris Humphrey, who in turn fed winger Mantautas Vilimavicius, to outpace the defence from 50m out. Steenberg, back on the pitch, converted to take the lead to 32-15 and the

Lions made the mistake of losing concentration, thinking they had the match won, and after conceding a couple of penalties, a well worked front peel of a Matlock lineout saw them score from close range. In typical Peterborough Lions style though, they hit back straight away. A quick throw in from Marcisauskas and an exchange of passes with full back Max Guseinov, with good support play from flanker Humphrey, saw him run in for his 2nd try of the day.

attacking bonus point.

A silly trip from Marius on the Matlock scrum half ,who stepped inside him, saw him get a second yellow card and left for a frantic final 13 minutes. Matlock who now began to run a lot more ball, broke through to score again and with 10 minutes remaining, the score was 37-27. Lions though showed a lot of character and resolve in hot conditions, from a strong driving maul, the ball was played out to Marcisauskas who topped off a fine performance by breaking a tackle and out pacing the cover defence to score. Again, Steenberg converting to make the final score 44-27.

Man of the match went to Chris Humphrey, for his endless work rate and support play. Peterborough Lions are finding out though, that any mistakes and indiscipline are quickly punished at this new higher level. They now look forward to their first appearance in the East Midlands cup, in a league double header against Old Northamptonians.
