# Peterborough Lions 65 – 30 Old Northamptonians

Peterborough Lions gave a scintillating display of attacking rugby in their 65-30 demolition of Old Northamptonians and sent out a statement of intent to the rest of the league, that



there is more to come. The game was just two minutes old, when prop Manny Van Nierkerk barged over for a try from short range, after powerful carrying from the forwards. Steenberg converted and it was 7-0 to the home team. Just minutes later, centre Jacques Vorster; who is a welcome return after a season out, picked up a bobbling ball, carved through the middle to offload to Gedis Marcisaukas, who crossed for his first of

five tries. ONs had no answer to the pace, power and handling skills of the Peterborough Lions forwards or backs. It was not long before Marcisaukas was crossing again. Good work by the forwards lead to the ball being spread wide to JC Sagoe, who is growing every game, combining with Saad Sait (in his less favoured position of prop), to allow the centre to run in for his second try. ON's though, were gaining more possession, hit back with a penalty. Dan Page, in just his 3rd game for the club, was next to cross from a powerful rolling maul, to go into a 26-3 lead with just 30 minutes on the clock. ON's then



got a foothold in the game when Mark Rossouw was yellow carded, after deliberate foul play. After a while the pressure eventually told and the ON's winger crossed in the corner, and 2 penalties were converted. This seemed to inspire Lions to score arguably, the try of the game. Max Guseinov attacking from deep in his own 22, beat 2 men, chipped the defensive



line to re-gather. He then sent another kick over for debutant Robb Shingles to cross. ON's had the last say in the first half though, crossing again to reduce the deficit to 38-20.

The second half was a slightly scrappier affair, with both sides crossing at regular intervals. The pick of them was substitute Laurent Ross breaking from his own half, past 3 defenders, before being tackled. Quick hands saw Vorster slice through and score under the posts. Gedis Marcisaukas was named man of the match after his 5 tries.

Captain Saad Sait said 'The guys looked so dangerous in attack today, you'd be hard pushed to find anyone who didn't play well. We all know there are still things to work on but we are really enjoying this and there's a great buzz around at the minute. Next week they will look to gain revenge for defeats in previous seasons from Towcestrians in another home clash

and everyone is excited to see what they can do next.



# PLEASE WARM UP CHAPS

Before starting any exercise sessions, it is essential to warm up. There are two main reasons for this:

<u>first</u>, warming-up can make sports injuries less likely in certain circumstances; <u>second</u> the body works more efficiently when warm and sports performance may actually improve.

A good warm up will have physiological, mechanical and psychological effects.

A warm up will allow the body tissues to work more efficiently. Normally, while relaxed, the muscles receive only about 15 per cent of the total blood flow. The rest goes to the body organs such as the brain liver and intestines. During vigorous exercise, because the muscles need far more fuel to provide energy, their requirement for blood increases and they need 80 per cent of the total blood flow. It takes time to re-route this blood by opening some blood vessels and closing others, and if the muscles are required to perform maximally before the blood flow has changed, they will work inefficiently.

Incidentally, this process of alteration in regional blood flow is the reason why you should not exercise within an hour of eating a heavy meal. After eating, we need the blood to stay in the region of the stomach and intestines to effectively absorb the digestion foodstuffs. If we start to exercise during this period, much of the blood will move away from the digestive organs and into the working muscles. The result can be digestive upsets and stomach cramps.
