Champions Hyde beaten again

HYDE, who won the ECB Premier League title last season after losing only once, were beaten for the second time in five games when their batting collapsed chasing a relatively modest Bowdon tally at South Downs road.

Skipper Simon Marshall's 54 and an unbeaten 47 from Pat Ashling helped Bowdon post 181, Danny Woods producing superb figures of 6-95. However, only Lancashire starlet Harry Dearden, 31, cut the mustard after tea when paceman Chris Ashling, 5-56 and Aussie off spinner Richard Carter, 4-41, bowled the champions out for 146.

At the top, Toft made it four wins in five when they beat Bramhall by five wickets at Booth's Park. Bramhall posted 209-8, Atur ur Rehman, 62, before Toft's hard-hitting batsmen pulled it off again after tea at 210-5, Rob Jones' 78 not out.

Nantwich kept up their improved form with a seven wickets stroll at Marple, who drop to the foot of the table after being bowled out for 78 when opting to bat first. Jimmy Warrington took 5-30 and Ollie Griffiths 4-15.

There were runs galore at Filkins Lane where Chester Boughton Hall outbatted improving Neston. CBH declared after 49 overs on 283-4, in-form Ollie Law, 100 not out and Ross Dixon, 78 adding 156 in an unbroken fifth wicket stand after Rick Moore's earlier 64. Neston fought doggedly with Brad Donelan's 44 aided by a rearguard action which featured an unbeaten 37 from number 11 Paul Stimson before closing on 226. Match-winners were Parkgate old boy Ash Davis, 5-89 and Harry Killoran, 5-66. Grappenhall eased off the bottom with a five wickets home win against Cheadle whom they dismissed for 173, Saqib Mahmood 4-39. James McCoy later hit 65 and Warwick Ibrahim 53. This was a timely victory following the death during the week of Club President Harry Bramhall (see page 4).

The only drawn game saw Alderley Edge enjoy a 15-4 return at home to Macclesfield. Calum Rowe, 126 and Richard Wilkinson, 87 put on 193 for the second wicket to help Alderley reach 262-4. Macc responded with a dogged 172-9, Jack Ward 34, Aussie spinner Simon Sturrock, who looks like getting through a lot of overs come September, returning 4-49.

Division 1 shocks

SURPRISE result in Division One was the first defeat (since August 2) of promoted Weaverham at home to relegated Oxton for whom loyal Sri Lankan Gayan Fernando produced the all-round performance of the day.

Oxton totalled 214-8 on the back of Fernando's 60 and a quality 47 from James O'Neill. Weaverham's batting fell below it usual depth and only Wilden Cornwall, 65, stood firm against the pace of Fernando whose 6-88 bowlewd out the home side for 163. Another upset saw Timperley beaten by seven wickets at home to Christleton, whose Kiwi Mitch Renwick hammered an unbeaten 136 and Talha Tufail 58 (138 for second wicket) in a reply of 245-3 to Timperley's 244, Asif Iqbal 50.

Sale stay top but had to be content with a 13-7 points draw at home to Cheadle Hulme after posting 248-6, Tyrone Lawrence 74, Ryan Reckelton 68. 'Hulme got to 200-6, Richard Battye 59.

Oulton Park seem certain to be among the front runners after the way they polished off Tattenhall. Iro De Silva claimed 6-33 to rout Tatters for 132 and Park were home in 22 overs at 133-2, Pat Roberts 67 not out.

Teenager Brad Yates, scored a maiden century, 114 not out and Calum Turner 64 out of 282-5 for Urmston in a winning draw at home to Middlewich. The visitors reaching 181-6, James Cornford 72 not out.

Didsbury beat Davenham by 22 runs in a close game at Wilmslow Road highlighted by an 8-65 return by the losers' Dean Jackson, while Simon Normanton scored 59 and took 6-78 for the victors.

Bolly's five in row

BOLLINGTON made it five wins in a row at the top of Division Two with a home win over Stockport after posting 235-9, Rick Hough 67. Kiwi Roscoe Price-Moor hit 107 as Stockport replied with 218.

Warrington kept up their winning ways with a seven wickets win against Irby, for whom Greg Shilliinglaw scored 100. Mal Agar was out for 99 in Warrington's reply.

Brooklands won by four wickets at Bredbury, while Congleton took full points at Mobberley, led by Max O'Sullivan 57 not out. Northwich won their first game by one wicket at home to Upton, new Sri Lankan all-rounder Chamindu Ishanka 6-37, before James Plant hit a watch-winning 56.

Alvanley took the draw points 13 – 7 at Widnes, led by Mike Rowlands 64 and Stephen Charles 4-39.

Death of Harry Bramhalla true Legend

THE death of Grappenhall President Harry Bramhall, one of the League's best-known characters, occurred after a lengthy illness on Wednesday last week.

Club secretary Paul Tyerman offers the following tribute:

"The mood here is very sombre. People throughout the League will have known Harry who had a real personality and was a top bloke. The word 'Legend' is not too far-fetched.

Harry has been an integral part of GCC as long as any of us can remember, from running the junior teams and bringing his sons Andy and Steve through, Steve going on to become the best wicker-keeper the County League has seen .

'H' as we has affectionately known, was chairman of our selectors - and of League Representative XIs - for many years and supported and guided many a captain through good times and bad, always offering wise advice. He made those selection meetings productive and entertaining at the same time.

Retaining the Presidency throughout his illness, Harry remained a welcome visitor to grounds throughout the league as long as he felt fit enough, travelling all over Cheshire with his devoted wife Dorothy and closest pal Les Fairbrother. They were all cricket

It was at Broad Lane that H's presence was felt most and he remained a huge supporter to all the senior teams and often used to watch and encourage the juniors. He played a big part for many of the young players who have come through and no one will ever forget his presence in 'Critics Corner' wearing his beloved white cap, offering advice to any fielders who came near. .

He will be truly missed by all who knew him, especially by his family Dorothy, Andy and Steve and his grandchildren.

Grappenhall marked his passing with two minutes' silence before all week-end games, black arm bands for the players were worn and a moving address was given by former club captain Nick Sharp before the Cheadle match. In a nice touch, the players took time to go over to Critics Corner for a drink in H's memory after the game.

No details have yet been released about his funeral, and discussions are ongoing about a permanent memorial."
