

Crawley Hockey Club Code of Conduct Summaries

Crawley Hockey Club have adopted EH Policies regarding Code of Ethics and Behaviour (Respect).The following is not meant to replace them but simply to act as an aide-memoire in summary form. When in doubt refer to the full policies.

Code of Conduct for Players

Arrive for training, coaching and matches on time to prepare thoroughly.

Inform the Captain/Coach as soon as you know you cannot attend, or are going to be late to a training/coaching session or match.

Wear the right kit for matches and coaching/training. This includes a well-fitting mouth guard and shin pads. The Club provides facemasks for use at penalty corners and advises players to wear them.

Warm up and cool down properly.

Inform the Captain/Coach of any injury as soon as possible.

Do not leave the match or coaching/training session without first asking the Captain/Coach.

Learn and play by the rules of the game.

Respect the decisions of the Umpire, Captain and Coach/Manager.

Be a good sport –win with modesty, lose with dignity.

Respect your team mates, your captain, coach/manager, umpires and opposition.

Recognise and applaud good play.

Do not criticise other players, instead think about improving your own performance.

Pay all subscriptions and fees due to the Club on time.

Members are not allowed to consume drugs of any kind on Club premises or whilst representing the Club.

Do not post comments or photographs on websites, email, phone SMS, social or other media, relating to other club members or opponents that could offend, upset or bring CHC into disrepute.

Code of Conduct for Parents and Carers

Set a good example by recognizing fair play and applauding the good performance of all.

Encourage your child to learn the rules and play within them.

Discourage unfair play and arguing with officials, lead by example.

Help your child to recognize good performance/progress, not just results.

Never force your child to take part in sport.

Never sanction or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.

Publicly accept officials' judgements.

Support your child's involvement and help them to enjoy their sport.

Use correct, acceptable and proper language at all times.

Code of Conduct for Coaches, Club officials and volunteers

Consider the well-being and safety of participants before the development of performance.

Develop an appropriate working relationship with performers, based on mutual trust and respect.

Make sure all activities are appropriate to the age, ability and experience of those taking part.

Display consistently high standards of behaviour and appearance.

Following all guidelines laid down by the EH and the Club, covering Safeguarding, safety, equity, ethics and conduct.

Hold the appropriate, valid qualifications and insurance cover.

Never exert undue influence over performers to obtain personal benefit or reward.

Promote the positive aspects of the sport including fair play, sportsmanship and enjoyment.

Never condone rule violations, rough play or the use of prohibited substances.
