

# Roles and Responsibilities of the DBS Liaison

### Who will I be responsible to?

The Club Committee

This role is shared between the Welfare Officer and the Junior Coordinator

### What will I be responsible for?

Junior Coordinator: DBS for Club members /volunteers involved at Junior Level

Welfare Officer: DBS for Club and team captains, club officers

### What is my role?

1. To be the main contact with England Hockey regarding DBS checks

- 2. To ensure the club is registered with EH's DBS checking service
- 3. To support the Welfare Officer to ensure all relevant club members and new officers are DBS checked and existing DBS volunteers every 3 years
- 4. To sign off volunteer evidence for DBS checks as appropriate

# What else can you tell me about the role?

- You will need an understanding of EH's SafeD Safeguarding Young People Policy, Procedure and Guidance
- 2. Knowledge of DBS processes
- 3. Be DBS checked through England Hockey
- 4. You will need access to a protected computer and appropriate IT skills

### **Training needed**

Completion of EH online Safeguarding and Protecting Young People in Hockey Course. It is advisable for you to attend a Sports Coach UK Safeguarding and Protecting Children.

# How much time will I need to give to the role?

Approximately 3-4 hours a month each, which tends to be front loaded in early season

## What tasks are involved?

Task will include:

- 1. Registration with EH's DBS checking service
- 2. Be the lead contact with EH for DBS checking and updates
- 3. Update the Welfare Officer/Club with updates from EH
- 4. Update DBS records
- 5. Ensure checks are carried out on new volunteers and existing volunteers every 3 years
- 6. Sign off volunteer evidence for DBS checks
- 7. Providing appropriate advice/support for Club members undertaking online DBS checking or EH's Safeguarding and Protecting Young People in Hockey Course
