#### **Worcester Hockey Centre**





Worcester Hockey Club and the Royal Grammar School (RGSW) are working towards a joint venture to create a state of-the-art Hockey Centre in Perdiswell, Worcester as both suffer from the lack of Hockey Pitches in Worcester. WHC have no permanent club base and RGSW students currently travel out of the City to play Hockey.

The need for a Worcester Hockey Centre is supported by Sport England, England Hockey, Hockey GB, The County Sports Partnership, the University of Worcester, Worcester City Council and the current South Worcestershire Playing Pitch Strategy. The evident demand from Worcester Hockey Club and RGS Worcester further reinforces the need for a community facility which will give Worcester Hockey a home, pinnacle of our hopes and ambitions as a club.

The site, which has historically been a sports ground with pavilions, sits in Perdiswell, south of Droitwich Rd (A38) and adjacent to Ravenmeadow Golf Club. Extensive searches in conjunction with Worcester City Council over the past 5 years have not found another site which is as suitable for the proposed development. There are direct pedestrian, vehicular and public transport routes between the site and the City Centre, of which several pass by the RGS Worcester.

RGS sites will be used for off site parking, and rendezvous points for players on Saturdays to minimise parking demands on the site during this peak period. This is to mitigate any possibility of overspill parking onto the A38, which was the main concern of local residents in respect of the proposals, which otherwise were received very positively, in a recent public consultation event.

The existing public right of way route which cuts across the middle of the site will be diverted along the west boundary and this new route was seen to be welcomed by the residents addressed during the public consultation event. The site is also party to nearby on and off-road cycle routes and several bus stops along the main road. This allows player drop off and easy to access, as well as the ability to use public/sustainable transport links.

A multitude of different groups, of all ages and abilities, will benefit from the facility, which is designed in line with FIH and Sport England standards, to meet the demands of the Club's competitive league matches, weekly training sessions, use by RGS Worcester and visits from other surrounding schools and the University.

The facility will include two international-standard water-based pitches (EH Category 1 pitches for national & international competition, each measuring 55mx91.4m with 4m run off).

The Pavilion, proposed to be approx. 550m<sup>2</sup> over a single level, will have 8 changing rooms, officials changing, first aid room, club room with kitchen, reception lobby with office and WCs. The arrangement of these different functions has been carefully considered for efficiency and functionality of the space, whilst creating a focal destination point of the building through the club room.

The proposals have been designed to enable accessibility for all: In accordance to Sport England guidance, accessible changing rooms have been provided within the club house with an adjacent

accessible W/C. Level access is provided to the building at all entry points. An additional set of access doors into the rear changing room section of the club house also allows flexibility from pitch to changing rooms.

Lighting will be in line with FIH standards to a level of 500 Lux. There will be six flood light masts per pitch to prevent glare and avoid disturbing shadows for the GK. Masts will be majorly concealed on 3 sides by the dense tree boundary and far enough from the road side that they should not be visually disruptive to the landscape - the placement of the pitches, and in turn, flood lights, have been carefully considered in plan to avoid disruption regarding light pollution to neighbours.

There is no light spill outside of the immediate site. This is helped by retaining all existing landscape features such as trees and boundary screening. The landscape proposals have been carefully coordinated with consultants to formulate a strategy which cleverly extends and plugs in the 'gaps' of existing planting screening along the site boundary to enhance both bio-diversity and the general aesthetics of the site. This has also been fundamental in preserving the nature of the site's location



and helping to provide an improved and sustainable landscape. The low profile timber clad design of the Pavilion enables it to nestle effectively within the landscape and topography of the Greenbelt site.

Our vision for the Worcester Hockey Centre supports the aim in the City Plan for Worcester to 'become an inspirational sporting city, hosting regular national and international competitions and boosting grassroots participation for people of all abilities'. This philosophy goes hand in hand with that presented by the core objectives of England Hockey; to be a 'A Nation Where Hockey Matters': 'A nation where hockey is talked about at dinner tables, playgrounds and public houses up and down the country'.

The key to achieving this vision statement is to provide the best possible environment and experience for players, to allow our sport to become more visible, available and relevant to new audiences: Increased community involvement in Hockey is at the heart of the ethos and design of our proposals. It is also true to say that the standard of Hockey played within Worcester is at a level far exceeding the average county standard. The vision is to represent and further develop this standard through high qualities facilities which open the doors for Hockey Players in Worcester, whether representing Worcester Hockey Club, Worcester Royal Grammar School, the University of Worcester (or any other Worcester based team or school) to win more national and international recognition. All in all, the high-quality proposals will enable us to showcase our skills through facilities to match – this is England Hockey's 'virtuous circle' underpinning the sport.

We are aiming for Planning determination at Planning Committee on 23 January 2020. To show widespread Community backing for the proposals, Hockey Club Members are invited to submit expressions of support for the scheme via the Worcester City Council Planning Portal at www.worcester.gov.uk/commenting-on-applications.

If we are granted planning permission at this meeting, it will enable us to start work on site in March 2020, with the view to having pitches ready to play on from September 2020; in time for the new season. In the meantime, we are working hard with professional consultants to finalise detailed design standards and precise specifications, and identify suppliers and contractors, ready for the delivery phase. These are exciting times for Hockey in Worcester and our new home will provide a firm foundation for our future success.

The section thrived in 2018-2019 with a growth in membership in the 4-10 years age range and improved retention of the older juniors as they progressed into the 2 senior sections. As ever we welcome new members and to this end made contact with all the primary schools in the local area to ensure that the opportunities for juniors provided by WHC are

made known to them. This is especially relevant now there is a very real prospect of creating a new Hockey Centre in Worcester in conjunction with RGSW. At the AGM held in May 2019 Mary Travers stepped down as our Co-ordinator having held this office for 14 years. We owe her a very special 'thank you' for her dedication and sheer hard work for all these years. In recognition of this and other responsibilities she has undertaken on behalf of the Club over the past 22 years she has been elected as a Vice-President. Dickie Head who has been involved as a parent helper and coach for the past 3 years will now take over the role.

#### **Training & Coaching**

Steve Williams has continued to lead the coaching on Sunday mornings at Nunnery Wood Sports Centre. He is supported by a group of parent helpers / coaches from across the club. Steve together with other coaches from PerFx hockey have continued to run the popular hockey camps during the school holidays and more are planned for the coming season.

Last season was a tough year for the men's section with all but 1 team finishing close to the relegation spots. This was in part due to the new open league structure which shuffled teams in to leagues with a view to making all games competitive but the initial restructure seemed to have our teams in tough leagues. Added to being in tough leagues was an unprecedented number of injuries through the men's section which left teams very short on numbers and often no subs for the league games. The new Open league structure will take about 4 more seasons to fully sort it's self out and get the right teams in the right league to offer competitive games to all teams each week. With the league fixtures already in place and the season looming I wish all players the best of luck and this year lets have a male winning the top scorers competition.

#### **Club Coaching**

WHC coaching structure remains in a good position. This year has seen a couple of changes with Head Coach Paul Simons stepping down from the role. Paul should be commended for his 3 years as head coach having put a plan in place to have more higher qualified coaches from within the club. His plan was to get as many Level 2 coaches in place and all of which coaching the same style following the England hockey Golden Thread ideology. #### Women's Section

To all of these players, WHC thank you - we wish you well and hope you have enjoyed your time at the club.

However, this left us in a dilemma, as our teams for the next season looked quite depleted and it raised the question of the benefits of being promoted. We focus on player development throughout the season, and we are not only excited by the opportunity to see

existing players move up through the ranks, but we will also be joined by a number of our successful u14 iuniors. The section, therefore presents a skilful but a largely youthful group of players. As a result, we are restructuring the 1s & 2s. In doing so, we declined promotion. This was not an easy decision, but it was felt it was the best decision for the longer term development. The re-selection of players to the 1s and 2s would ensure that 2s players who wanted promotion (and are of a suitable ability and able to commit to training), would be able to play in the feeder league. Both teams would have a balanced distribution of experienced players, students and upcoming younger players. With a similar approach throughout our other teams, we are aiming to build stability and progression through the section, so all our teams can push for promotion, and we can attract even more players to the club. I am very positive about where the women's section is currently heading. As we develop the mobility between teams, I believe it will become stronger and more competitive. Finally, I would like to thank all the section captains, managers and coaches this year. Those who are passionate about hockey and work tirelessly to bring the game to the pitch and players week in and out. To Barnsey, Chick, Becca, Lucy, Liz, Abi, Amy, FFi your good humour and patience is always appreciated. To Tom and Phil, and all that helped to coach the teams. I think the players have done you proud - couldn't have done it without you. And to Robin and to George and your words of wisdom – many, many thanks!



# Safeguarding and Protection - Children and Young People

1. England Hockey has published two important documents in recent years:

Safe D - Safeguarding the Hockey family. This publication covers in five chapters:
Safeguarding Policy; Recognising Poor Practice and Abuse; Reporting Procedures;
Useful contacts and a list of Good practice Guidance resources and templates available on line www.englandhockey.co.uk/safe

Worcester Hockey Club is committed to and has signed up to this guidance – see over page.

**RESPECT - Codes of Ethics and behaviour**. This code exists to protect everyone within the game and outlines the behaviour expected from all people within the Hockey family. In all there is a Generic Code of Behaviour and 7 specific Codes of Behaviour covering Players; Young Players; Clubs, Associations, Leagues and Staff; Coaches, Managers, Teachers, Leaders, and Adult Helpers; Spectators and Parents; Umpires and Officials and finally Medical Practitioners and Allied Health Professionals. We cannot reproduce all 21 pages of this code in this Members handbook but the Codes set out on pages 33 and 34 are still valid as are our expectations of those to whom they are aimed. All the EHB codes are available to download at **englandhockey.co.uk/respect.** 

All the Club officers, coaches and captains have been made aware of both of these publications and copies can be made available from either of the Club Welfare officers. Furthermore everyone with an involvement with Worcester Hockey Club is encouraged, indeed expected, to familiarise themselves with the content of both documents.

2. The Club Welfare officers will continue to ensure that everyone involved in coaching for the Club plus team captains will have a valid CRB/DBS clearance certificate and will have attended a Safeguarding and Protection of Children course once every three years. Qualified coaches are also required to have some First Aid training and we shall ensure that this is in place throughout 2019-2020.

#### **Code of Equity and Behaviour**

Worcester Hockey Club has formally adopted this code formulated by England Hockey. Thus all members are expected to respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person and to treat everyone equally within the context of their sport regardless of age, ability, gender, religious belief, sexuality or social/economic status. Members are encouraged to read the full version of this on the England Hockey website.





# Hockey Club/Association Safeguarding and Protecting Young People Commitment







WORCESTER HOCKEY CLUB adopts England Hockey's Safeguarding and Protecting Young People in Hockey Policy, Procedures and Guidance to ensure all those in the hockey family have a safe and positive experience.

#### **DEFINITIONS:**

**HOCKEY FAMILY** - The hockey family includes all individuals, clubs, associations and other organisations involved in any capacity in the game of hockey, whether members of England Hockey or not. For the avoidance of doubt, this includes all players and anyone working within hockey (in a paid or voluntary capacity, and whether as an employee or on a self-employed or other work basis) including all coaches, umpires, referees and other officials.

YOUNG PEOPLE - Anyone under the age of 18.

CLUB - includes both hockey club and association.

#### WE WILL DO THIS BY:

- Recognising all young people participating in hockey (regardless of age, gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, ability or disability) have the right to play in an environment free from poor practice, abuse and harm.
- Ensuring all people who work in hockey at, or for, our club (including staff, officials, volunteers, team managers, coaches) have a responsibility for safeguarding young people and understand how the safeguarding policy and guidance applies to them
- Ensuring all individuals working at, or for, the club are recruited in accordance with England Hockey's recruitment guidance.
- Ensuring all individuals working within hockey at, or for, the club are provided with support, through education and training, so they are aware of and adhere to England Hockey's Code of Ethics and Behaviour.
- Always approaching safeguarding with a young person perspective, ensuring the individual's wellbeing is the prime focus.
- Ensuring that the responsibility of determining whether or not abuse has taken place, lies with child protection experts, however it is everyone in hockey's responsibility to report concerns.

#### **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

Worcester Hockey Club will ensure the name and contact details of the Welfare Officer are available:

- As the first point of contact for parents, young people and volunteers/staff within the club.
- As the main point of contact within the club for the England Hockey Safeguarding team as well as relevant external agencies in connection with safeguarding young people.
- As a local source of procedural advice for the club, its committee and members.

#### **Code of Conduct for all Junior and Senior Players**

As a playing member of Worcester Hockey Club, the Club expects that you will:

- learn the rules of hockey and play within them;
- remember that the safety and welfare of all players, officials and supporters is of paramount importance;
- support the Club's efforts to develop an open, caring and safe environment in which all adults and young people can enjoy hockey and make friends;
- abide by the Club Rules, Equity Statement and other policies/codes of practice as required;
- discourage unfair play and arguing with officials;
- set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding the good performances of all, including the opposition;
- publicly accept officials' judgements;
- keep to agreed timings for training and matches and inform the team manager / captain / coach as appropriate if you are unable to attend on time;
- pay the appropriate membership and match fees on time;
- wear suitable kit for training and match sessions as agreed with the team manager / captain / coach and ensure that gum shields (juniors) shin guards and suitable footwear are worn at all training and match sessions;
- · use correct and proper language at all times;
- · set a good example in post-match hospitality;
- help to ensure that Junior members do not consume alcohol or drugs of any kind or smoke cigarettes whilst on club premises or representing the club at competitions;
- never punish or belittle other players for losing or for making mistakes, and
- never force anyone to take part in sport.

All members of the club are expected to be familiar with the Code of Conduct for all Junior and Senior Players.



#### **Code of Conduct for Parents/Carers and Spectators**

As a parent or carer of a Junior Member of WHC, the Club requests that you:

- encourage your child to learn the rules of hockey and play within them;
- support your child's involvement and help him/her to enjoy the game;
- support the Club's efforts to develop an open, caring and safe environment in which all children can enjoy hockey and make friends;
- discourage unfair play and arguing with officials;
- help your child to recognise good performance, not just results;
- set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding the good performances of all, including the opposition;
- publicly accept officials' judgements;
- use correct and proper language at all times;
- never punish or belittle a child for losing or for making mistakes, and
- never force your child to take part in sport.

The Club requests that all spectators at junior coaching sessions or matches / tournaments should abide by the above Code of Conduct.

#### **Policy on Anti-Bullying**

Worcester Hockey Club adopts England Hockey's Anti-Bullying Policy and is committed to creating and maintaining an environment in which all young people involved in hockey are free from bullying. Bullying is anything that is done with the intention of hurting or intimidating, frightening or upsetting another person. Bullying can take many forms:-

**Emotional** persistently being unfriendly, excluding, tormenting, threatening gestures.

**Physical** pushing, kicking, hitting, punching or any use of violence.

**Racist** racial taunts or language, graffiti, gestures.

**Sexual** unwanted physical contact or sexually abusive comments.

**Homophobic** because of, or focusing on the issue of sexuality. **Verbal** name-calling, sarcasm, spreading rumours, teasing.

**Cyber** All areas of the internet (including social networking sites), email and text

messaging, misuse of technology i.e. manipulation of digital images

It should be noted that bullying may not only occur through face to face contact. Some bullying may be illegal and necessitate a report to police/children's social care.

The Club wishes to promote a TELLING culture and anyone who knows, or suspects that bullying is happening must take the matter seriously and report his/her concerns to an officer of the Club.
