WHITSTABLE TOWN FC SPECTATORS/VISITORS CONDITIONS

ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE BELMONT GROUND ON MATCH DAYS ARE ONLY ADMITTED SUBJECT TO THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Whitstable Town FC aims to create and maintain an environment where employees, volunteers, and spectators/visitors (both home or away) can enjoy the game of football, safe in the knowledge that they are free from all forms of harassment, abuse, unacceptable or disorderly conduct.

Whitstable Town FC will not tolerate **Unacceptable Conduct** both physical or verbal from spectators/visitors (both home or away) at Whitstable Town FC.

Unacceptable Conduct is where there is:-

- Actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person or persons.
- Intentional damage to property.
- Using threatening, abusive, offensive or insulting words or conduct both verbal and non-verbal.
- Displaying writing or any other item which is threatening, abusive or insulting.
- Disorderly conduct involves any activity which stirs up or sustains, or is likely, or is designed to incite or sustain hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of :
 - Gender
 - Age
 - Colour, race, nationality, (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.
 - Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.
 - Sexual orientation
 - Transgender identity
 - Disability

Any spectator/visitor (home or away) behaving in this way will face eviction from the ground and their actions will/may be reported to the Police. Ticket holders who conduct themselves in this manner face having their ticket immediately revoked and all spectators/visitors face the prospect of a life ban from Whitstable Town FC, All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge WHITSTABLE TOWN FC's right to search any person and their belongings whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search. Threatening, abusive or violent behaviour, and/or foul, offensive or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground, irrespective if entry payment has been made. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the ground as a result.

Causing damage to, or interfering or tampering with any equipment, furniture or fixture within the Ground will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment is strictly forbidden and will result arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.

Responsibility for minors (any child under 16 years) remains at all times with a parent or guardian. Should any 'minor' be required to leave the Ground for any of the above reasons they shall be accompanied by their parent or guardian. Should a parent or guardian not be present then the minor will be placed into the care of the Police or social services.

At all times whilst present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward or officer of WHITSTABLE TOWN FC and/or by any Police officer. Failure to comply with any instructions may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.

Ramsgate History

Ramsgate has had senior football teams within the town since the late-1800s, but despite the paucity of reports in the local press there are match reports for Ramsgate Athletic from 1895. At this time matches were being played on a number of grounds around the town, including the Rams' current home - Southwood. Football in east Kent closed down during the Great War, and in 1919 the Southwood ground was provided for Ramsgate Town, by then known simply as Ramsgate. In their first season they finished 3rd in the Kent League and reached the Kent Senior Cup final, but lost 1-0 to Northfleet at Maidstone before a crowd of 10,000. In 1924 Ramsgate Town folded and Ramsgate Grenville moved to Southwood and, apart from the appearance and demise a few years later of Ramsgate Press Wanderers in 1932, became the senior Ramsgate side until the 2nd World War again brought an end to all football in east Kent.

Football resumed after the war and Southwood was taken over by the current club in 1945, then called Ramsgate Athletic, with the pitch being turned through 90 degrees and covers to the terraces and a stand erected from the anti-invasion steelwork from nearby Pegwell Bay. The Club played in the Kent League until it was disbanded in 1959, and were runners-up in the Kent Senior Shield in 1946/47, finalists in the Kent Senior Cup in 1947/48, Kent League Cup winners in 1948/49, followed by winning the League and runners-up in the Kent Senior Shield in 1949/50. In the next golden period, from 1954 to 1957, the Club won back-to-back League Championships (1955/56 & 1956/57), with a new attendance record being set in 1955/56 when 5,200 spectators watched the local derby against Margate. They also made Club history when they reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time in November 1955, eventually losing 5-3 at Watford, a record that stood for the next 50 years.

In 1958/59 the Club also started playing in the Thames & Medway Combination League, winning the Eastern Division that season but finishing runners-up to Sittingbourne in the Champions' Cup Final. With the demise of the KCFA Kent League in 1959, the Club joined the Southern League, as well as continuing in the Thames & Medway Combination. A new main stand was erected along the southern side of the pitch at Southwood, which is still in use today, and in November 1959 the Rams were visited by Everton to mark the official illumination of the newly installed floodlights – the 'Toffees' winning 7-1. In 1967/68 the Club again won the Kent Senior Shield and were runners-up in the Southern League Cup. In 1971/72 they finished runners-up in the League and were promoted to the Premier Division. In 1972 the Club changed its name to Ramsgate but after a decline in fortunes off the pitch the Club were relegated to Division 1 and later resigned from League in 1976, the 1st team taking the Reserves' place in the new Kent League and in 1988/89 won the Kent Senior Trophy for the 2nd consecutive year and finished runners-up in the Kent League Cup, whilst in 1998/99 the Club was eligible for promotion to the Southern League after winning the Kent Premier League championship, but decided the time was not right, and also won the Kent Senior Trophy and reached the semi finals of the Kent League Cup. The 2004/2005 season saw the Club capitalise on the promise of its successful youth and a tough pre-season programme had the Rams playing (and defeating) 4 sides from higher leagues, including old adversaries Margate. In competitive football the Rams made good progress in the FA Cup, despatching Kingstonian (2 leagues above) before falling in the 2nd half to Dulwich Hamlet (1 league higher), whilst in the FA Vase they again reached the 3rd Round Proper. The best form was saved for the domestic season, where the Rams again did the double, the Kent League Premier Division Cup as well as the Kent League Championship by a clear margin, gaining promotion to the Isthmian League Division 1 South.

Summer 2005 saw the Rams start the new era with two further pieces of silverware, beating Herne Bay in the Kent League Challenge Shield and Margate in the Kent Messenger Challenge Cup. The season continued with the Club reaching the 1st Round Proper of the FA Cup, the only Step 4 club in the country to do so that year and equalling the Club record set 50 years earlier. The Club also won the League at the first attempt, securing back-to-back promotions to the Isthmian Premier for 2006/2007. For most of their 1st season in the Premier Division the Rams were settled in the 'play-off spots' and spent several weeks in 2nd place, but the toll on the squad was noticeable and injuries saw their form dip in the last weeks and they eventually slipped to 9th. This also meant a new record, as the Club had only managed to stay in the Southern League Premier for a single season. 2007/08 saw the Rams set more club records, winning the Isthmian League Cup and also reaching the play-offs for Conference South. For 2008/09 the Club erected new covers to the terraces behind each goal, to replace those erected after the war but removed in the 1970s, however having lost key players an average performance on the pitch dipped in the last months with relegation to Division 1 South. This saw several players leave to remain playing at the higher level, and a much younger Ramsgate team in 2009/10 avoided a further drop as some had predicted. After returning to Division 1 the Rams usually finished near the play-offs until 2013/14 when, after five managers in 14 months, the Rams ended up in 21st place. This saw the return of Jim and Danny Ward for their 3rd spell in charge, almost 20 years since they first joined the Club, and though they were in 2nd place at Christmas the form dropped and the Rams ended up mid-table. A good start in 2016/17 didn't last and after slipping into the bottom quarter, with 1 point from 3 games over Christmas head coach Lloyd Blackman replaced the Wards. A 10-match unbeaten run saw a mid-table finish reprieve, with Blackman confirmed as gaffer for 2017/18. A season of mixed fortunes saw a lean patch after Christmas with some significant injuries saw the Rams sliding in the table, but another strong finish lifted Ramsgate back towards mid-table. In 2018/19 the Rams dispatched Gosport Boro before Hemel Hempstead stopped them in the 3rd Qualifying Round on the FA Cup in Herts, while AFC Hornchurch stopped their FA Trophy run in Essex. Following this, and an unbeaten 8 game run in the League, the Rams lost two in a row and Blackman decided to step down, being replaced by former Sittingbourne manager Nick Davis (who played at centre half and at times captained the Rams in their Ryman Premier days) in December 2018. Nick saw out the rest of the season but after a poor start to the 2019/20 campaign, Nick was replaced by a joint management team of Jason Lillis, Terry Sedge and Joe Radford.

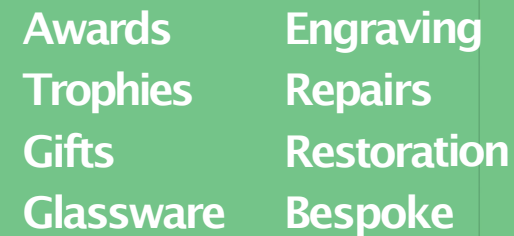
He hailed from County Durham and had begun his career at Old Trafford but turning out only a few times for Man.Utd. From Middlesbrough he went to Anfield for a season to be understudy to David James but never played a game, so moved to Hartlepool United for whom he played 15 times.

The year he left Middlesbrough was the time the club moved to its present Riverside Stadium from its long-time home ground of Ayresome Park. He was playing a very well supported testimonial match. It was the last game played at the ground and towards the end he was invited forward to take a penalty, which he duly converted. It turned out to be the last goal to be scored at the ground. Since hanging up his boots, he has been goalkeeper coach at Middlesbrough, Hartlepool and Gateshead.

The name Pears has no connection with the fruit. It is actually a version of Peter, with the s short for 'son', so means 'son of Peter'. This quite a religious name with its allusion to Simon Peter, disciple of Jesus Christ.

Two great free kicks earn Whitstable the points in a hard fought game

Whitstable made it nine points from their last three games with a good win against Burgess Hill at a breezy Belmont. It was the visitors that had the majority of the possession in the first half and they would have been disappointed to find themselves trailing at half time, although it was an excellent free kick by Harry Stannard that gave Whitstable the advantage. The second half was a different story though, as the home team created most of the chances. Dan Eason had made a good save in the first half from Aaron Smith-Joseph and he did well to deny him again midway through the second, only to see his clearance strike James Brown and rebound into the net to level the scores. Another great free kick, this time by Aaron Millbank, soon restored the lead. The young Burgess Hill goalkeeper kept his side in the game with some good saves, but their best chance of salvaging a point disappeared when Pat Harding lifted a good opportunity over the bar.

Whitstable had lost 3-2 to a very different Burgess Hill team back in September, with just four of their starting eleven and two of their substitutes from that day featuring in this rematch. They have since appointed a new manager, Jay Lovett, as they look to climb the table. They started this game in 16th place, but had won at both Herne Bay and Ramsgate in their two January away fixtures. Whitstable manager Lloyd Blackman, recovering from a hip operation sat in the stand, alongside Connor Sanders, who dislocated his shoulder at Three Bridges. Whitstable were also without the unwell Luke Girt and Liam Gillies, who left the club during the week, having decided the "grass" will be greener at Sevenoaks. Ollie Rowe, Charles Etumnu and Harry Stannard started and new signing Jay Hards was on the bench, from where Mark Lane and Steve Nolan were overseeing affairs in the absence of the manager.

Following a couple of early Burgess Hill corners, a good low cross by John Ufuah was met by Stannard at the near post, but the ball was deflected just wide. The visitors continued to press forward however and a teasing cross by Louie Downey was headed wide at the back post by Smith-Joseph. Harding and Drew Matthews both tried shots that were easily caught by Eason in the Whitstable goal. At the other end, Etumnu had an effort from outside the box that was gathered by Fynn Talley on the bounce. Burgess Hill came close to opening the scoring on 17 minutes when Harding pulled the ball back from the left to Smith-Joseph, but Eason got down to deflect his low shot over the bar. After dealing with the two corners that followed, Whitstable managed to break down the right and Etumnu won the ball before driving forwards until he was brought down a few yards outside the penalty area. Stannard took the free kick, which beat the loose wall and the dive of Talley and the ball flew into the bottom left corner to give Whitstable the lead in the 23rd minute, somewhat against the run of play.

Burgess Hill were still looking threatening, but a looping Downey header and a wild shot over the top by Tom Cadman failed to trouble Eason. After Jordi Ndozid was booked for a foul, Jake Mackenzie created another half chance for Etumnu, following a promising run into the box, but his shot was well blocked. A long ball forward then dropped nicely for Smith-Joseph, who went down in the area when challenged as his shot went wide, but despite appeals for a penalty the referee awarded a goal kick. A free kick presented the visitors with their last chance of the half, but Matthews shot over the bar and Whitstable held on to their 1-0 lead at the break.

The majority of the 293 crowd would have been relieved to see Whitstable ahead at the break, but aware that they would most probably need to improve in the second half if they were to stay in front. They were not disappointed as it proved to be a different game with Whitstable looking stronger in midfield and seemingly coping better with the conditions on a windy afternoon. There were a couple of early goalmouth scrambles in the visitors' box and in the 52nd minute, another goal seemed inevitable, but Etumnu had an effort saved and then Millbank could not get enough power on his header to beat Talley. Whitstable introduced Leo Mazzone in place of Etumnu on the hour mark and his performance complemented the energy of T.J. Jadama to give his team more control in the middle of the pitch. A great cross by Stannard picked out Ufuah at the near post, but his left footed shot went inches wide of the post. Burgess Hill managed a brief spell of pressure that led to the equaliser in the 68th minute. A long throw into the box reached Smith-Joseph, who tried an overhead kick that Eason just managed to push out, but the ball hit defender Brown on the head and rolled back into the net.

It took just three minutes for Whitstable to regain the lead when Jadama was fouled on the edge of the penalty area just to the left of the “D” in a similar position to that from which Millbank had curled in a free kick in the previous game. He again struck it beautifully into the far corner giving the goalkeeper no chance. Millbank almost added another after winning the ball, but this time he was denied by a good save from Talley, who also did well to save the follow up effort from Ufuah. Burgess Hill had a golden opportunity to draw level again in the 77th minute, following another run on the left by the dangerous Smith-Joseph who pulled the ball back for Harding, but he failed to keep his shot down. Ufuah and Stannard then combined to set up Millbank, who was again thwarted by Talley and Marshall Wratten had his shot from the rebound blocked by a defender. The young goalkeeper, who has represented England at under 16 level, had a good first game since joining from Brighton. In the time remaining, there were a couple of half chances at each end and the 17 year old Hards was introduced in the 88th minute for his debut, but no further drama and Whitstable saw out the game for a 2-1 win.

The match sponsor Dan Fogarty chose Tom Bryant as the man of the match. Whitstable next face a trip to in-form Cray Valley on Tuesday, then Ramsgate visit the Belmont at the weekend.

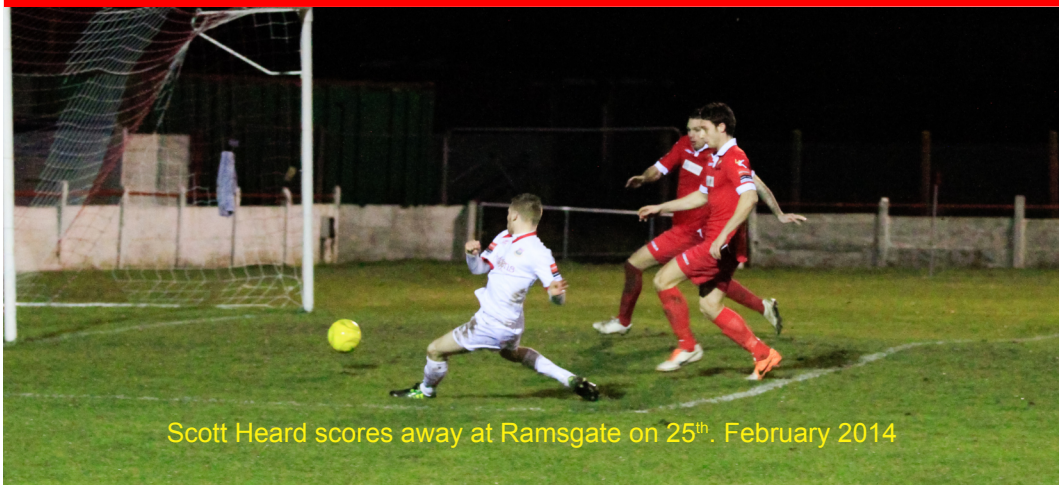

Dan Eason could only push his low strike into the path of Gavin Tomlin, who brought the scores level again and then the former Herne Bay player cut inside and fired an unstoppable shot into the roof of the net to give his team the win.

The teams were meeting for the third time this season, with the league encounter at the Belmont finishing 1-1 thanks to a 95th minute Whitstable equaliser in a closely fought game. Whitstable came out on top in the Kent Senior Cup, surviving some late pressure to win 2-1 in south east London. The Millers started this game in 4th place, following three impressive results, beating Ashford 3-1, VCD 5-0 and Whyteleafe 4-0. They made one change to the team that beat Whyteleafe, as Ashley Sains returned at the back in place of Emiliano Hysi. Whitstable were also in good form, winning their last three games and remaining unbeaten since New Year's Day. Luke Girt returned from illness, with Charles Etumnu dropping to the bench.

The game started relatively quietly, with neither goalkeeper being called upon to make a serious save until Whitstable scored in the 15th minute and it was a cleverly worked goal, with the ball being played forward to Harry Stannard, who controlled it and immediately flicked it on for Ufuah to race through, hold off the last defender and find the bottom right corner, past the diving Walker, as the offside appeals were ignored. Tomlin and Francis Babalola both shot wide as the Millers tried to respond and they did find an equaliser in the 22nd minute. A throw in on the left reached Tomlin in the box and he slipped the ball to Warren, who shot past Eason into the far corner from a tight angle. Just a minute later, Marshall Wratten swung the ball right across the field to Ufuah on the left and his good, low cross was met by Jadama, who shot past Walker to make it 2-1.

The rest of the half was fairly even. Cem Tumkaya headed a corner over the bar and Babalola and Ryan Flack both tried their luck from distance. In the 38th minute, Whitstable almost got a third goal when Wratten battled for the ball on the edge of the box and it eventually found its way across to Ufuah on the right, but his shot was well saved by Walker. The Whitstable bench were frustrated that the half continued long enough after the announced two added minutes for Cray to win a corner and the mood was certainly not improved when Warren was allowed to run and thump a free header past Eason to send the teams in level at the break.

As the game restarted, a Ufuah cross was laid back for Jadama to shoot, but his sweetly struck effort was blocked. At the other end, Babalola made a threatening run before seeing his shot closed down by the Whitstable defence. Denzel Gayle had a shot deflected into the hands of Eason, who then got down to push a long range Flack shot past the post. Gayle's last action was to try a shot that curled out for a throw in on the other side of the pitch. He and Danny Smith were then both substituted after a lengthy injury delay, to be replaced by King-Elliott and Kweku Ansah. Flack and Tomlin both skied attempts and Warren shot wide when trying for his hat trick. A Walker goal kick was met by Ollie Rowe just inside his own half and he headed the ball forward into a perfect area for Millbank to burst through into the right of the penalty area and send a powerful shot past Walker to restore Whitstable's lead in the 72nd minute.

Both teams made substitutions and there were yellow cards for Girt and King-Elliott. Ufuah sent the ball just wide of the far post for in a rare Whitstable opportunity, but despite having plenty of possession, Cray were struggling to find a way through. Then, on 87 minutes, the ball was worked across to King-Elliott on the left and he cut inside and shot low through the crowd towards the far post, where Eason could only push the ball to Tomlin, who tucked away the rebound. Things were to get worse for the visitors when King-Elliott received the ball in a similar position in the 90th minute and this time stepped into the box before powering a right footed shot into the roof of the net. There were six additional minutes played, but no more chances of note and Cray Valley held on for a 4-3 win.

The game was a good advert for Isthmian League football and kept the rather small crowd of 95, including a good number from Whitstable, entertained throughout. It was a disappointing end to the evening for Lloyd Blackman's improving team, but they can take a lot of confidence from the way they played against useful opposition and look forward to the matches ahead, starting with a home game against Ramsgate on Saturday.

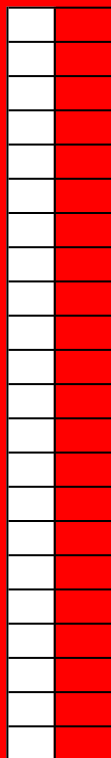

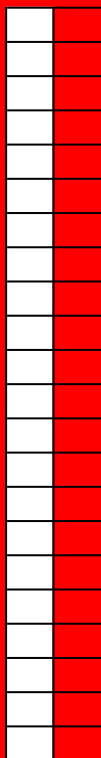
