

#### WHITSTABLE TOWN FC SPECTATORS/VISITORS CONDITIONS

### ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE BELMONT GROUND ON MATCH DAYS ARE ONLY ADMITTED SUBJECT TO THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Whitstable Town FC aims to create and maintain an environment where employees, volunteers, and spectators/visitors (both home or away) can enjoy the game of football, safe in the knowledge that they are free from all forms of harassment, abuse, unacceptable or disorderly conduct.

Whitstable Town FC will not tolerate **Unacceptable Conduct** both physical or verbal from spectators/visitors (both home or away) at Whitstable Town FC.

#### Unacceptable Conduct is where there is:-

Actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person or persons. Intentional damage to property.

Using threatening, abusive, offensive or insulting words or conduct both verbal and non-verbal.

Displaying writing or any other item which is threatening, abusive or insulting. Disorderly conduct involves any activity which stirs up or sustains, or is likely, or is designed to incite or sustain hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of :

Gender

Age

Colour, race, nationality, (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.

Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.

Sexual orientation

Transgender identity

Disability

Any spectator/visitor (home or away) behaving in this way will face eviction from the ground and their actions will/may be reported to the Police. Ticket holders who conduct themselves in this manner face having their ticket immediately revoked and all spectators/visitors face the prospect of a life ban from Whitstable Town FC,

All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge WHITSTABLE TOWN FC's right to search any person and their belongings whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search. Threatening, abusive or violent behaviour, and/or foul, offensive or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground, irrespective if entry payment has been made. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the ground as a result.

Causing damage to, or interfering or tampering with any equipment, furniture or fixture within the Ground will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment is strictly forbidden and will result arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.

Responsibility for minors (any child under 16 years) remains at all times with a parent or guardian. Should any 'minor' be required to leave the Ground for any of the above reasons they shall be accompanied by their parent or guardian. Should a parent or guardian not be present then the minor will be placed into the care of the Police or social services. At all times whilst present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward or officer of WHITSTABLE TOWN FC and/or by any Police officer. Failure to comply with any instructions may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.







### **Geoffrey's Memories**

Queen's Park Rangers had 2 Hazell's on their books. Tony and Bob, both defenders, Tony from 1964-74, Bob from 1979-83. Tony later played for Millwall, Crystal Place and Charlton Athletic. I think his favoured position was left-back. Bob had begun at Wolverhampton and later turned out for Leicester City, Reading and Port Vale. He was a strong, muscular, determined and uncompromising tackler at centre-back, whose career ended earlier than it might have done because of injury problems.

They were no relation. Tony was born in High Wycombe whilst Bob hailed from Jamaica, but, nonetheless, was capped by England at Under 21 level. After retirement Tony worked for BT and Bob has as a Sports Prevention Manager been working to help the rehabilitation young offenders through sport. Bob's nephew Reuben played for an array of clubs, making most of his appearances with Oldham Athletic 2007-11.

The name Hazell dates back many centuries and does connect with hazel nut. A Hazell would have been someone who lived close by hazel trees.

### Burgess Hill Football Club was founded in 1882 and was a founder member of the Sussex County Football Association.

The club attained the unique achievement of winning the SussexSenior Cup three years running thus retaining it permanently in the process. The cup is on display in the trophy cabinet in the club boardroom. The current trophy was presented to the S.C.F.A. by Burgess Hill Town Football Club.

In the club's formative years they were also founder members of the Mid-SussexFootball League, and won the League Championship in its inaugural season.

Following several successful seasons the club joined the Sussex County League for the 1958–59 season, and stayed until attaining promotion to the Southern Football League in 2003. In 1969 the club amalgamated with Worlds End F.C. and with the help of Burgess Hill Town Council were able to move to Leylands Park, the club'scurrent home. In 1971, the club gained promotion to Division One, only to be relegated two seasons later. 1974 saw the 'Hillians' reach another landmark achievement by becoming the only club ever to have won both the League Challenge Cup and the Division Two Cup in the same season. In 1976 a hat trick of achievements were completed by winning the Division One Championship by six points, having secured the Division Two title the previous season.

During the ensuing twenty years in the top flight of the County League success was modest. In 1980 the League Challenge Cupwas secured and in 1992 the RUR Cupwas added. However, all this changed in season 96–97 under the guidance of club manager, Alan Pook. The club became Division One champions by twelve points, won the Floodlight Cup, and were runners up in the League Challenge Cup. The 2nd XI finished runners up in the Reserve Premier and won the Mid–Sussex Charity Cup, while the Youth XI won their overall championship. In 1997–98, the club 1st XI attained even more success by again winning the League Championship and the League Challenge Cup, also reaching the last sixteen in the F.A. Vase. Additionally they reached the SussexSenior Cup Final and were top of the county's merit table. The Youth XI also finished as 'Double Champions' in the sector.

1998-99 season saw the Hillians achieve a unique treble in winning the Championshipfor a post war record third time and again securing a league and cup double, back to back. The 2nd XI won their cup and were runners upin the league, missing out by a single point. Not to be out done, the Youth XI won their league and only missed out on a double by goal difference. All in all an historic season.

The club then welcomed new manager, Gary Croydon for season 1999–2000. He ledthe Hillians to take runners' up spot in the league and to a record fourth qualifying round FA Cup tie against Hereford United. Again, a last 16 place was achieved in the FA Vase as well as winning the RUR Cup and the Floodlit Cup.

The new millennium seasonsaw Hillians take the league championship with the team remaining unbeaten in the league until April; the Club also had its best ever run in the FA Vase only being beaten after extra time by eventual finalists Tiptree United in the last eight, before athen club record attendance of 1598. With plans being laid for Southern League football, club directors, Gary Croydon and Eddie Benson appointed Danny Bloor as manager for season 2002–2003. The club was rewarded with yet another championshipcrown, the fifth in seven seasons.

Gary Croydon took over the Hillians again as the club entered the Southern League for the first ever time. After just missing out on the play offs, Burgess Hill Town moved over to the Isthmian League due to the restructuring of the non-league pyramid.

For the next few years the Club established itself as a Ryman League club with a few mid table finishes and twice just avoiding relegation. In 2011/12 with the Hill struggling and with seven gamesto go Manager Simon Rowland was sacked and GK Coach John Rattle was put in charge. The club survived relegation with victories in the last two games of the season against Whitstable Town and Dulwich Hamlet FC, both 1-0.

The following season, 2012/2013, the Hillians returned to their original greenand black colours. Former Brighton & Hove Albion player and coach Ian Chapmanwas appointed as Manager and he guided the Hillians to eighth place in the table.

2013/14 saw the Hillians achieve their highest ever finish in the Football pyramid, finishing sixth in the table and just missing out on the play offs by one point. The newly formed Under 21 side finished third in the Ryman U21 League whilst the Youth Team had their most successful season ever. They won the Ryman Youth League and the Ryman Youth Champion of Championswhilst also lifting the Sussex County Youth Cup. Two Ladies teams were also introduced as part of Burgess Hill Town FC and they enjoyed mid table finishes in their first season.

2014/15 saw the Club enjoy the greatest season in the Club's History. Ian Chapman's side were unbeaten in the league until mid-March and went on to win Ryman League Division One South title by 11 points and gain promotion to the

Ryman Premier League for the first ever time. They also equalled their best-ever FA Cuprun, eventually losing away to Dartford in the 4th qualifying round but having gaining a memorable 3–1victory at Sutton United in the previous round. In the FA Trophy, the club reached the 2nd round, finally losing at hometo Dartford FC. In the previous round the team had beaten Aldershot Town of the National League 1–0away.

A confident start to the Hillians first season in the RPL before Christmas saw the team 8th in the league, but a disappointing second half saw them finish in 20th position. Theclub avoided relegation due to Farnborough FC being relegated for financial irregularities. The following two seasonssaw the Hillians avoid relegation on the last day of the season to keep its Isthmian Premier status. The Hillians did enjoy excellent cupruns in the FA Cup both seasons narrowly missing out on the FA Cup 1stround proper.

After four seasons in the Isthmian Premier League, the club were relegated in the 2018/19 season. The seasonwas full of mixed emotions, with the long standing managementteam of lan Chapmanand Stuart Tuck leaving the club after six very successful years. Ian was replaced by Ex-Lewes manager, Simon Wormull. Under Wormull, the team rallied over the Christmas period and towards the end of season with some spirited performances. The team also reached the Parafix Sussex Senior Cup for the first time in some thirty years but lost 2–1 to Bognor Regis Town in extra time at the Amex Stadium. The U18's also reached their own Sussex Cup Final, losing 1–0, to Lewes.

### WHITSTABLE FIGHT BACK TO WIN

Strong second half performance leaves East Grinstead still looking for first win

Whitstable completed the double over their winless opponents, but had to come from behind after Shawnikki Clement-Peter had given a much changed East Grinstead team the lead on the half hour mark. The visitors caused a few problems on the break in the first half, but failed to make the most of a couple of promising situations and Tijan Jadama fired in the equaliser just before half time to give Whitstable a timely boost. East Grinstead offered very little in the second half, when home goalkeeper Dan Eason was virtually untroubled. Aaron Millbank tucked away a penalty after Harry Stannard was fouled soon after the restart to put Whitstable ahead. Millbank later had one header ruled out for offside and another hit the bar in the closing moments, but the points were secure once Marshall Wratten had curled in a great third midway through the half.

A lot of rain has fallen on the Belmont pitch in recent weeks and a pitch inspection was arranged for the morning. The referee was happy for the game to go ahead, although the surface was tricky in some areas. Whitstable came into this match in reasonable form, having drawn their last two league fixtures against Sevenoaks and a good Chichester team, whilst in between, earning a notable win at Welling in the Kent Senior Cup. Marshall Wratten, who had scored both goals at Welling before getting injured, returned to the team in place of Charles Etumnu. East Grinstead arrived at the seaside having failed to win any of their 18 league games, as well as conceding 12 goals in a Velocity Trophy game at Hastings. Whitstable had won the reverse fixture 3-0 back in October, but of today's team only Gil Carvalho and Robin Deen featured in that game, although their captain Drew Cooney may have done, had he not received red cards in each of the last two games. Former Whitstable striker Stephen Smith was on the bench. Now under new management, they had shown some signs of improvement in their previous 3 games, narrowly losing to Sittingbourne and Hythe after conceding late goals and drawing with Whitehawk.

There were a few opportunities for Whitstable to get the ball into the East Grinstead box in the opening minutes, but no real chances created, whilst at the other end Michael Uwezu was quickly closed down when he tried to test Eason on a couple of occasions. Carvalho tried a long shot that forced Eason to push the ball behind for a corner in the 10th minute, but when it was cleared John Ufuah made a great run down the right from deep inside his own half into the penalty area at the other end, only to shoot wide of the far post. Then, on 15 minutes, it was the turn of the visitors to break quickly from a Whitstable corner when Carvalho sent Uwezu clear with Raheem Sterling-Parker for support and only one home defender, but the pass was played at the wrong time and drew an offside flag. East Grinstead won two corners, with Luke Girt doing well to bring the ball out from the second, before being pulled back by Uwezu, who collected the first caution of the game. Some more good play by Ufuah on the right got him into a shooting position, but Benjamin Dudzinski managed to deflect the ball behind for a corner. East Grinstead were quick to seize on the next home corner and again raced forward, but this time Jake Mackenzie was able to make a crucial clearance. The goal that had been threatened on several occasions arrived in the 30th minute, when a cross from the left was not properly cleared and Zak Henry collected the ball before finding Clement-Peter on the edge of the box and he turned past a couple of challenges before shooting low past Eason's right hand to give his team the lead.

Uwezu had to be replaced due to injury and Whitstable pushed forward seeking an equaliser. Ufuah and Stannard had shots kept out, then Stannard clipped the top of the bar from a free kick. Carvalho got into a promising position, but was unable to find the finish and then found himself in the book for delaying a free kick in the 44th minute. When the free kick was swung into the box, Tom Bryant appeared to be caught in the head with an arm and play was stopped while he received treatment. When play restarted, in added time, Millbank was fouled by Simba Kudyiwa just outside the box and Stannard's delivery was only cleared as far as Jadama, who brought the ball down before slamming it past Dudzinski to make it 1-1. Henry eventually talked his way to a yellow card and the teams went into the break level.

Whitstable did not have long to wait for their second goal, which came from a 50th minute penalty. Henry lost possession in midfield and the ball was played to Stannard who was brought down by Kudyiwa as he was about to shoot. Millbank shot low to the left under the diving goalkeeper to make it 2-1. Jadama and Luke Girt were winning all the challenges in midfield as their opponents seemed to tire and Kudyiwa was spoken to after unceremoniously halting a dangerous run by Jadama. Bryant created an opening for Ufuah whose initial shot was blocked before he sent the rebound across to the far side, where Wratten crossed and Millbank headed home, but he was denied by an offside flag. Henry was replaced by Deen and then Sterling-Parker was the next to collect a dissent booking, before he too was substituted as East Grinstead tried to find a route back into the game. It was all but settled in the 69th minute however when Stannard released Wratten on the right and he cut inside on his left foot and curled an unstoppable shot into the top left corner to give Whitstable a two goal cushion.

Carvalho bent a free kick straight into the hands of Eason, which turned out to be his team's only attempt of the half. Play soon returned to the other end as Ufuah had a shot comfortably saved and Girt lobbed an effort over the top. Whitstable brought on Marcus Elliott, Liam Gillies and Leo Mazzone towards the end as they continued to dominate. Stannard swung over the 8th of Whitstable's 10 corners and it was just missed by everyone in the box, then a Connor Sanders throw was cleared to Girt just outside the box and his well struck shot was pushed away by Dudzinski. In the last of the four added minutes another Sanders throw was met by the run of Millbank, but his glancing header hit the bar. Whitstable had done enough to collect a deserved three points and leave the groundsman with some repair work to do on the pitch ahead of the next home game.

Whitstable move up to 10th in the table and next face a trip to Three Bridges on Saturday.

### THREE POINTS AT THREE BRIDGES

Early Ufuah strike and Millbank double earn good away win despite Sanders injury blow

#### THREE BRIDGES 1 WHITSTABLE TOWN 3

Whitstable made it back to back 3-1 wins with a good away performance against a physical Three Bridges team. An unstoppable strike by John Ufuah gave them an early lead and there were no more goals in the first half despite some promising moments at both ends. Whitstable suffered an injury blow just before the interval, which unfortunately led to a hospital visit for Connor Sanders. After Dan Eason had saved a Tom Tolfrey shot early in the second half, Whitstable took control of the game with two Aaron Millbank goals. He curled in a perfect free kick and shortly afterwards scored again after being set up by Liam Gillies. Ufuah, Millbank and Marshall Wratten all went close for Whitstable, but it was the home team that found the net from a well taken free kick by Curtis Gayler. Tolfrey then put a decent chance wide for Three Bridges, but Whitstable held on with relative comfort to claim the points.

After beating bottom team East Grinstead in their previous game, Whitstable travelled to face a Three Bridges team that were sitting third from bottom. They had been on a poor run since beating Hythe in November, but came into this game with renewed optimism after ending their winless run with a good 3-0 victory at Phoenix Sports. When the two teams had met at the Belmont in October, Three Bridges had two players and their manager sent off as Whitstable won 2-0. Liam Gillies returned to the Whitstable starting eleven and new signing Ollie Rowe was among the substitutes, whilst for John Ufuah, it was a return to the club where he played in a spell during the 2018-19 season.

It was Three Bridges that looked the more threatening in the opening minutes, with the majority of the danger coming down the left through Andrew Sesay and Eason did well to cut out an early low cross. Tolfrey then got into the box before laying the ball back for Gayler who shot over the bar from 18 yards. It was Whitstable that took the lead in the 8th minute however, as Gillies played the ball out to Ufuah on the right and he cut inside before curling a left footed shot from the edge of the penalty area that sailed over everyone and flew into the top left corner. It was a great finish and gave goalkeeper Kieron Thorp no chance. It looked like Ufuah might add a second in the 13th minute when an attempted header back by Troy Williams lacked power and Ufuah raced on to the ball, but appeared to be impeded as he was about to shoot and only managed to prod the ball forwards as he tried to stay on his feet, so it was easily cleared off the line and the officials ignored the Whitstable appeals. It was the turn of the home team to feel aggrieved a few minutes later when Sesay ran on to a header and went down just outside the box as Jake Mackenzie slid across to challenge, but again the referee saw nothing wrong.

Sesay was enjoying a lot of possession and another good run ended with a cross/shot that went just past the far post. Three Bridges had to make a change midway through the half when Billy Irving was replaced by Tadley Bromage, who went on to have a good game at the back. Another low cross by Sesay was pushed out by Eason, before Whitstable carved out a couple of chances following long throws by Sanders. Gillies shot over and then Sanders clipped the ball into the path of Millbank, but he was thwarted by Thorp who got down well to save. A few minutes before half time, Whitstable gave the ball away in the centre circle and Vincent Muwanga drove forward into the box, where Sanders just got across to block, but he was caught by the Three Bridges player and fell awkwardly. He had to leave the field and following a hospital visit was diagnosed with a dislocated shoulder. Rowe was introduced for his Whitstable debut just before the teams went off for half time with Whitstable leading by the single goal.

The home team started the second half brightly and James Brown had to be alert to clear as Muwanga looked to shoot and the Three Bridges player was the first into the book for catching Brown as he followed through. Brannon O'Neill swung a free kick into the box that was headed away by Tom Bryant as far as Tolfrey, whose low shot through the crowd was well saved by Eason. Luke Girt was then cautioned for a foul, but Whitstable were beginning to regain some control and a good run by Ufuah ended when he was brought down just outside the penalty area on the left. Millbank took the free kick and it curled over the defence and the ball beat Thorp before going in off the far post to make it 2-0 in the 59th minute. Three minutes later, Gillies was first to a loose ball on the left and slipped it across to Millbank, who looked to be just onside on the 18 yard line, and the Whitstable striker took a few strides towards the centre of the area before beating Thorp with a low shot inside the left post.

Whitstable looked as though they might add further goals and after Sesay had collected a yellow card for a foul, Gillies volleyed over from 25 yards, then Ufuah curled a low left footed shot just wide as Thorp dived across to attempt the save. Wratten chipped the ball into the box for Millbank who went down as he was challenged, but play was waved on. Rowe was next to be cautioned for upending Sesay as he ran towards the box and Three Bridges pulled a goal back from the resulting free kick as Gayler bent the ball around the wall, out of the reach of Eason and into the far corner. The home team might have got themselves right back into the game a couple of minutes later when substitute Stephen Adegboye hooked the ball forward to Tolfrey, but he dragged his shot wide. Home captain Lee Hall picked up the game's final booking for another foul on Tijan Jadama in midfield, then after a good build up on the right, a ball into the box by Ufuah was just missed by Wratten as he looked sure to score his fifth goal for Whitstable. In the 80th minute, Whitstable broke quickly from a Three Bridges corner and Ufuah crossed for Millbank, but he was denied his hat-trick by Thorp who made a good left handed save just inside the post and Bryant headed the corner wide. Whitstable introduced Charles Etumnu and Harry Stannard and won two late corners, but neither goalkeeper was called into action again and Whitstable finished 3-1 winners.

There was good travelling support for Whitstable, which must have accounted for around half of the low attendance of 74. Everyone wishes Connor Sanders a speedy recovery from his unfortunate injury. Whitstable next face a home game against Burgess Hill Town and will be hoping to keep their recent good run going, having suffered a 3-2 defeat when the teams met in Sussex in September.


