#### WHITSTABLE TOWN FC SPECTATORS/VISITORS CONDITIONS

## ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE BELMONT GROUND ON MATCH DAYS ARE ONLY ADMITTED SUBJECT TO THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Whitstable Town FC aims to create and maintain an environment where employees, volunteers, and spectators/visitors (both home or away) can enjoy the game of football, safe in the knowledge that they are free from all forms of harassment, abuse, unacceptable or disorderly conduct.

Whitstable Town FC will not tolerate **Unacceptable Conduct** both physical or verbal from spectators/visitors (both home or away) at Whitstable Town FC.

#### Unacceptable Conduct is where there is:-

Actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person or persons. Intentional damage to property.

Using threatening, abusive, offensive or insulting words or conduct both verbal and non-verbal.

Displaying writing or any other item which is threatening, abusive or insulting. Disorderly conduct involves any activity which stirs up or sustains, or is likely, or is designed to incite or sustain hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of:

Gender

Age

Colour, race, nationality, (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin. Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.

Sexual orientation

Transgender identity

Disability

Any spectator/visitor (home or away) behaving in this way will face eviction from the ground and their actions will/may be reported to the Police. Ticket holders who conduct themselves in this manner face having their ticket immediately revoked and all spectators/visitors face the prospect of a life ban from Whitstable Town FC,

All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge WHITSTABLE TOWN FC's right to search any person and their belongings whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search. Threatening, abusive or violent behaviour, and/or foul, offensive or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground, irrespective if entry payment has been made. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the ground as a result.

Causing damage to, or interfering or tampering with any equipment, furniture or fixture within the Ground will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment is strictly forbidden and will result arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.

Responsibility for minors (any child under 16 years) remains at all times with a parent or guardian. Should any 'minor' be required to leave the Ground for any of the above reasons they shall be accompanied by their parent or guardian. Should a parent or guardian not be present then the minor will be placed into the care of the Police or social services.

At all times whilst present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward or officer of WHITSTABLE TOWN FC and/or by any Police officer. Failure to comply with any instructions may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.



# Geoffrey's Memories

One of The Stones' regular and strongest opponents in the early 1960s were Wimbledon, in the days before they, prior to their going full-time, turned semi-pro. Amongst the stars of the Dons was Geoff Hamm. I query the comment on the Internet which describes him as 'inside right'. That position as I recall was for a player named Martin. I remember Hamm in the no 10 or inside-left shirt. He was a player with composure, comfortable on the ball and a good passer of it.

There was another player named Ham at roundabout the same time. He played for a number of clubs, namely Bradford Park Avenue, Gainsborough Trinity, Bradford City, Grimsby Town (2 games only but 1 goal scored), Preston North End and Rotherham United. His record/CV shows to have been a good goal scorer for his various clubs. When he retired, he went into Management with Gainsborough, Matlock Town and Guiseley. He was also involved with Speedway, being with his brother Alan, sponsor of the Bradford Dukes.

Hamm or Ham has nothing to do with pig meat! Most likely it is what we might call 'a pace name' and is an old English name with German connections and refers to pastureland that is close or surrounded by a stream or streams of water.

# BLUE ROOTS

The first match to be played by a team representing Haywards Heath was in March 1888, which provided the impetus for the formation of 'Haywards Heath Juniors'.

After a brief change of name to 'Excelsior' in 1894, the club adopted the name 'Haywards Heath FC' in 1895.

Without home a ground, the club led a somewhat itinerant existence in its early days, playing most of its games away until

1895 when it was offered the use of the field in South Road which was later to become Victoria Park and the club's home venue until 1952.

Haywards Heath FC lifted its first silverware in 1900 when it won the Sussex Junior Cup and played in the Mid-Sussex League of which it was one of the founding members. 1901-1906 saw the club finish as runners up in the senior division in four of its first five seasons, then division 2 winners in 1911-12 after relegation in 1908. In 1919-20 Haywards Heath were Mid-Sussex League champions without losing a game. They won the title again in 1922-23 and went on to retain it for the next two seasons, losing only one match in each season.

In 1926 the club transferred to the Brighton, Hove & District League and, after winning the league title at the very first attempt, joined the Sussex County League the

> following year. first five seasons in 1932-33 season.

the County League (1926-1932) saw the club finish in the top four but they were sadly to finish bottom of the league in the

In 1941-42, the club were winners of the

Sussex Senior Cup and, after the war, were the league's Eastern Division winners of 1945-46. A single division league was reintroduced the following year which the club won in both 1949-50 and again in 1950-51.

1952 saw the club finally move from Victoria Park to the newly finished Hanbury Stadium which enabled it to join the Metropolitan League which included the reserve sides of professional clubs such as West Ham. Tottenham, Chelsea and Arsenal, After a promising first season finishing in fifth place, the club struggled against the professional opposition and, finishing bottom in 1960-61, elected to re-join the Sussex County League.

### A Potted History of Haywards Heath Town Football Club

The Division 1 title was won in 1969-70 and the League Cup in 1972-73. The club was also runners-up in 1974-75 but were relegated at the end of the 1979-80 season. The Division 2 Cup was won in 1983-84 and, as runners-up in 1985-86, the club again gained promotion back into the senior division.

In 1988 the present name of Haywards Heath Town Football Club was adopted in it's centennial year to reflect the 'town' status of Haywards Heath itself.

Two successive relegations in 1992 and 1993 saw the club drop into the third division where they won the Division 3 Cup in 2000-01. The following year as Division 3 runners-up, HHTFC were promoted back to Division 2 but were again relegated after only one season. The Division 3 Cup was won in 2008-09 however and in 2012-13 (again as runners-up), the club gained promotion back into Division 2.

On the rebranding of the Sussex County League to the Southern Combination in 2015, the division was renamed Division 1 and the title was won in that first season, earning for Haywards Heath Town FC promotion to the Premier Division. The club finished top of the division the following season and were due to be promoted to the

Isthmian League. Unfortunately, promotion was denied following a nine-point deduction awarded the championship elsewhere due to an inadvertent off-field administrative error. The club however responded by winning the Premier Division again in the 2017-18 season and enjoyed a successful 2018-19 debut in the Isthmian League, finishing in a very respectable fifth position which qualified them for the play-offs at the first attempt.

As well as achieving the club's highest ever finishing position in the non-league football pyramid, Shaun Saunders' squad also reached the final of the Sussex RUR Cup and the semi-finals of the Sussex County Senior Cup, and this year will be looking to continue that success with promotion to the Premier Division.

#### A POINT FROM FIRST TROPHY GAME

Whitstable fight back to draw, but lose penalty shootout in new Velocity Trophy format

#### HYTHE TOWN 2 WHITSTABLE TOWN 2 (after 90 minutes – no extra time) Hythe Town won 6-5 on penalties

Velocity Trophy Group Seven Tuesday 10 September 2019 19.45

Whitstable opened their campaign in the new style Velocity Trophy in an entertaining game at Hythe Town that ended in a draw. The new rules meant that the two teams were each awarded one point and a penalty shootout then determined the destination of an additional point. The home side were deservedly ahead at half time, thanks to a Tom Carlton penalty and a Rhys Bartlett shot that beat Dan Eason at his near post. Whitstable, without several regulars, also lost Aaron Millbank and Liam Dickson to head injuries, but fought back with two late goals from Marcus Elliott. Hythe went on to win 6-5 on penalties, with Ryan Nicholls making two good saves.

Whitstable had already visited Hythe in a league match that resulted in a 2-0 home win, which remained the only game that Hythe had not lost so far this season – a poor run that ended in the departure of manager Sam Denly. Their newly appointed replacement is Steve Watt, who was in the dugout for the first time. He played for a number of clubs, notably Chelsea, where he made one Premier League appearance against Newcastle. He also had spells at other clubs including Ross County, Grimsby Town, Dover Athletic, Maidstone United and Hastings United, before becoming the manager of Margate. He has now added Nathan Elder and Paul Booth to his management team. Ten Hythe players that appeared in the earlier league match were also involved in this Velocity Trophy game. Whitstable were without the injured Tom Bryant, TJ Jadama and John Walker, with Marcus Evans and Marcus Elliott starting on the bench. This competition allows the use of five substitutes, although Whitstable only named three.

Hythe started brightly when in the 2nd minute Tom Walmsley chased a long ball down the right before crossing for Stephen Okoh, whose low shot went just wide of the far post. Alex Anderson then did well to win a corner following a strong run down the left and Josh Spencer, making his first start, caused a few problems in the box, before the ball was eventually cleared for another corner that was wasted. In the 10th minute, a throw in led to Aaron Millbank breaking through on goal, but despite chipping the advancing goalkeeper, the ball landed on top of the net. A few minutes later, a dangerous Ryan Cooper cross was well cut out by Jake Mackenzie, then as Hythe started to increase the pressure, an attempted clearance by Dan Eason was deflected into the path of Carlton, whose shot was blocked. The opening goal arrived in the 23rd minute after Spencer had brought down Carlton in the box and the Hythe midfielder got up to find the bottom left corner as Eason went the other way.

Osman Proni sent a free kick into the box, where Spencer had an effort blocked at the back post and from the resulting corner, Spencer was again first to the ball, only for Nicholls to make a good stop on the line. Thomas Bramble, Carlton again and Bartlett all tried to increase the lead, whilst a Millbank effort was easily saved at the other end. In the 32nd minute, Bramble found Bartlett, who had begun to look a threat on the left and his firm shot from a narrow angle somehow beat Eason at his near post and the ball was deflected into the net with a number of people in the ground slow to realise that it had actually gone in. A Whitstable free kick in the 40th minute led to an opportunity

for Proni when the ball came back to him just outside the box, but his left footed shot went narrowly wide. There was some controversy in added time when Millbank sustained a nasty head injury and came off with a blood covered face, but as Whitstable were bringing on their substitute Elliott, the referee went into the dugout to show Millbank a yellow card for leaving the pitch, which led to an exchange of words and some delay before the final moments of the half could be completed. Whitstable had created several good chances, but Hythe were worth their lead and went in 2-0 ahead.

The first chance after the break fell to the home team in the 54th minute when Okoh set up Carlton whose shot went wide. Dickson then also had to come off, to be replaced by Evans, but a good stop by Nicholls kept Whitstable out when James Brown found Anderson in space on the left and his cross was met by Elliott whose close range attempt was well saved. Whitstable were gradually improving and having more of the possession, but were still prone to the odd lapse, giving the ball away in their own half at times and in the 67th minute Walmsley was gifted a chance to break clear, but Eason saved his shot from the edge of the box. A couple of minutes later, Whitstable again had Eason to thank when he made a great double save, as firstly Carlton was allowed to run through unchallenged before Eason parried his shot and then Okoh saw the goalkeeper recover in time to push his powerful follow up shot behind for a corner.

Elliott had the ball in the net in the 73rd minute, but it was ruled out for offside. Both teams made further changes, but Whitstable were now asking more questions and Nicholls made another good block as the ball was headed towards goal following a free kick. A Proni corner eventually led to Whitstable's first goal in the 86th minute, when Evans had a header blocked at the far post and Elliott forced home the rebound. The equaliser soon followed when a long Connor Sanders throw was not properly cleared and Elliott stabbed in his second. There was still time for a couple more chances at both ends as Frannie Collin shot wide from distance and Elliott had a shot blocked on the edge of the area as he tried for his hat-trick. Spencer got on the end of another long throw but his effort looped up for Nicholls to catch safely. Hythe had a great chance in the final added minute when they broke three on one from the halfway line, but failed to make the most of the opportunity and allowed a couple of defenders to get back to clear and the game finished 2-2.

Penalties followed to see which team would receive a "bonus" point and after Collin had scored the opener, Evans saw his shot well saved. Eason saved the third Hythe effort by Charlie Webster to level things up and nobody else missed until Mackenzie stepped up to take the seventh Whitstable penalty, which was well saved by Nicholls to his right to secure a 6-5 win for his team.

The Whitstable manager will have been encouraged by the way his depleted team finished the game, but will know there is still work to be done as they now prepare to face a good Haywards Heath team in a league match at the Belmont on Saturday.

#### FOLKESTONE EASE THROUGH IN FA CUP BY RON MARTIN Big crowd watches Whitstable make FA Cup exit

Emirates FA Cup First Round Qualifying Saturday 7 September 2019 15.00

There was to be no cup upset at the Belmont, as an in-form Folkestone ran out comfortable winners, although only one goal separated the teams at half time. Ira Jackson, once again scored against his former club, hitting a great shot in off the post midway through the opening half. Whitstable suffered a blow, when their captain Tom Bryant limped off early in the second half and within a few minutes, the reorganised team conceded two further goals, when Jackson scored again following a mistake at the back and then substitute Johan Ter Horst put the result beyond doubt soon afterwards. Sam Hasler thumped a great fourth past Dan Eason in the closing stages, as Whitstable kept trying, but rarely looked like scoring and Folkestone deservedly booked their place in Monday's draw for the next round.

Having beaten Newhaven in the previous round, the reward for Whitstable was a tough home draw against the BetVictor Isthmian Premier League leaders, Folkestone Invicta, which brought back memories of the same round last season, when another high flying Premier Division team, Bognor Regis Town, won 5-0 at the Belmont. The Folkestone squad contained a few familiar faces, including Scott Heard, who made 253 appearances in a Whitstable shirt. Micheal Everitt, Ira Jackson and Ronnie Dolan have also played for Whitstable and the substitute goalkeeper, Henry Newcombe, signed for Folkestone shortly after featuring for Whitstable in the pre-season game between the two clubs at the end of July. Folkestone were without Finn O'Mara and Josh Vincent through injury, so Alfie Paxman switched to play at right back. New signing James Brown started in midfield for Whitstable instead of Liam Gillies, in the only change to the team that lost at Sevenoaks.

For the second consecutive home fixture, over 500 people were in attendance at a sunny Belmont Ground. An early Folkestone corner taken by Heard was headed on to the far side of the pitch by Callum Davies, where the ball was crossed back in by Jackson and Jerson Dos Santos flicked it just wide. A minute later, Paxman cut in from the right and curled a left footed shot just past the far post. In the 6th minute, a home free kick led to a quick Folkestone break that ended with Hasler hitting a long, dipping shot over the bar. Jackson then tried a low shot following a good run, but it was easily held by Eason. Dos Santos went over when challenged on the 18 yard line, but the referee penalised him for a dive and awarded a free kick to Whitstable. The home team finally started to apply a little pressure at the other end, winning a couple of free kicks and corners, but TJ Jadama was unfortunately injured when fouled on the edge of the box and had to be replaced by Gillies a few minutes later. In the 18th minute, a good ball in by Jake Mackenzie was headed behind for a corner that was missed by goalkeeper Tim Roberts and met by the head of Bryant, but the ball went just the wrong side of the post.

The game then went through a quiet spell before Folkestone took the lead in the 25th minute, when a long cross field ball by Hasler found Jackson on the right and he cut in past three defenders before firing a left footed shot in off the far post giving Eason no chance. Whitstable won their third corner a few minutes later, but it was taken short and possession lost. Nat Blanks curled an effort over the bar, then Jackson was brought down just outside the box and got up to take the free kick, but hit it straight at Eason. In the 37th minute, Kieron McCann saw his shot well tipped over the bar by the home goalkeeper. As the interval approached Connor Sanders tried a couple of long throws into the Folkestone box and from the second, Matt Newman appeared to handle the ball, but the loud penalty appeals were dismissed by the referee. Dos Santos was replaced by Ter Horst in the 45th minute and there was a late, dangerous cross that went right through the Whitstable box, before Ter Horst had a shot closed down. Whitstable went into the break trailing by the single goal, leaving the home supporters still hopeful of a second half comeback.

Both teams started the second half brightly and Jackson sent a low cross right across goal, but Whitstable lost their captain and central defender, Bryant, with an ankle injury in the 50th minute. Alex Anderson was sent on to play on the left wing and the team reverted to a back four, which seemed to disrupt things completely and the game was effectively over a few minutes later. Liam Dickson failed to clear a Folkestone free kick and Newman slipped the ball forward to Jackson who buried his shot into the net to double the lead and then in the 54th minute it was 3-0 when Heard played a neat pass through to Ter Horst, who ran on to the ball and shot first time past Eason.

Whitstable introduced Tarik Ibrahim, who showed some promising touches, but was unable to find an end product. In the 64th minute, a Folkestone corner was met by Newman whose shot grazed the top of the bar, then Gillies was caught in possession and Jackson fired over after a quick break. Dolan came on for Heard, who received some generous applause as he departed in the 68th minute. Ter Horst then saw his shot blocked on the line by the impressive Marcus Evans, who put in a calm display at the back for the home side, before McCann curled a follow up attempt over the top. Dolan had the ball in the net, only to see the flag raised for offside. Folkestone did add a fourth in the 81st minute with another great strike, this time by Hasler, who collected a pass from the left wing and smashed a left footed shot into the top left hand corner from outside the box. Folkestone then gave their substitute goalkeeper a few minutes on the pitch. Gillies had a late shot blocked as Whitstable looked in vain for a consolation goal and the final action saw Newman shoot wide when the ball dropped to him in the box.

So Folkestone collect £4,500 and progress to the second qualifying round, whilst Whitstable pick up a further £1,500 to add to their earlier prize money. There were a few good performances on the pitch for Whitstable, but overall the management team will probably be disappointed that they went out rather tamely, albeit to a very good team. After two consecutive 4-0 defeats, they will be looking for some improvement when they start their Velocity Trophy campaign at Hythe on Tuesday evening.


