

WHITSTABLE TOWN FC SPECTATORS/VISITORS CONDITIONS

ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE BELMONT GROUND ON MATCH DAYS ARE ONLY ADMITTED SUBJECT TO THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Whitstable Town FC aims to create and maintain an environment where employees, volunteers, and spectators/visitors (both home or away) can enjoy the game of football, safe in the knowledge that they are free from all forms of harassment, abuse, unacceptable or disorderly conduct.

Whitstable Town FC will not tolerate **Unacceptable Conduct** both physical or verbal from spectators/visitors (both home or away) at Whitstable Town FC.

Unacceptable Conduct is where there is:-

Actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person or persons. Intentional damage to property.

Using threatening, abusive, offensive or insulting words or conduct both verbal and non-verbal.

Displaying writing or any other item which is threatening, abusive or insulting. Disorderly conduct involves any activity which stirs up or sustains, or is likely, or is designed to incite or sustain hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of :

Gender

Age

Colour, race, nationality, (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.

Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.

Sexual orientation

Transgender identity

Disability

Any spectator/visitor (home or away) behaving in this way will face eviction from the ground and their actions will/may be reported to the Police. Ticket holders who conduct themselves in this manner face having their ticket immediately revoked and all spectators/visitors face the prospect of a life ban from Whitstable Town FC,

All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge WHITSTABLE TOWN FC's right to search any person and their belongings whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search. Threatening, abusive or violent behaviour, and/or foul, offensive or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground, irrespective if entry payment has been made. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the ground as a result.

Causing damage to, or interfering or tampering with any equipment, furniture or fixture within the Ground will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment is strictly forbidden and will result arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.

Responsibility for minors (any child under 16 years) remains at all times with a parent or guardian. Should any 'minor' be required to leave the Ground for any of the above reasons they shall be accompanied by their parent or guardian. Should a parent or guardian not be present then the minor will be placed into the care of the Police or social services. At all times whilst present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward or officer of WHITSTABLE TOWN FC and/or by any Police officer. Failure to comply with any instructions may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.





Geoffrey's Memories

Steve Gammon was 80 in September. I recall him as a Cardiff City player in the late 50s and early 60s but whose career that promised so much (he made his first-class debut at the age of 18) was cut short because of a serious leg fracture in February 1961. The injury was the result of a collision with Manchester City's Denis Law. He recovered but broke the same leg again twice, so retired in 1965 from being full-time to becoming part-time and Player Manager with Kettering Town, this role until 1971.

He made just over 300 appearances for the Poppies and was succeeded as Manager at Rockingham Road by Ron Atkinson.

There seems to be differences of opinion as to what the name Gammon means. Some reckon it connects with an Anglo-Norman word for 'ham', which in turn connects with an ancient French word for 'leg'. If so, it could refer to someone involved in the meat trade or be a nickname for someone who had pig-like legs or thighs. Others say that the name was a nickname given to people who were good at games. If I were a Gammon, I think I would prefer this second explanation!

Sevenoaks Town A Brief Club History

Sevenoaks Town FC. was formed originally in 1883 and was one of the founding members of the Kent League

In 1951, Sevenoaks Town combined with St Johns United and became members of the Kent Amateur league of the western region. In 1965-1966 they won the division one league cup and in 1968/69 they won the premier division and won it again in 1975/76. In 1984/85 Sevenoaks Town won the Premier Kent County Football league and again in 1995/96 and 2002/03.

Among these trophies, Sevenoaks Town has won the intermediate challenge shield on two occasions, the inter-regional cup twice and the Sevenoaks Charity cup 12 times.

On the 26th of April 1883, Sevenoaks Town played against Royal Arsenal. In the South of England, they were the only professional team. Other 1000 spectators watched this game at Knole Paddock. In the 1900/1901 season, Sevenoaks Town won the Sevenoaks Charity cup and since then won it 11 more times.

Other more recent successes include: 2002/03 Kent County Primary League Champions 2016/17 SCEFL League Cup Champions 2017/18 SCEFL League Champions 2016/17 FA Cup 2nd round qualifier

2017/18 FA Vase 2nd round

2018/19 FA Trophy 1st round qualifier

In recent years the ground has also seen some significant improvements with a new state of the art 3G pitch which was installed in June 2017. There are now plans to build a brand-new stadium in the next 2 years.

GREAT STANNARD STRIKE NOT ENOUGH

Ashford edge hard fought Boxing Day game at a wet Belmont

Whitstable were narrowly beaten by Ashford United on a wet and miserable afternoon in a game watched by 330 at the Belmont Ground. This was the only Boxing Day fixture in the division to take place, with the other scheduled games at Faversham and Burgess Hill beaten by the wet weather. Both teams gave everything and provided some entertainment for those that braved the elements, although the conditions certainly made things difficult, particularly in the second half. Josh Wisson fired Ashford ahead in the first half after Whitstable failed to clear a free kick. Whitstable almost equalised just before the break, but had to wait until Harry Stannard found the net with a great strike from distance early in the second half. Lee Prescott did well to restore his team's advantage a few minutes later and although Whitstable went close on several occasions, Ashford managed to see out the game and collect the points to move them up to third in the table.

These two Kent rivals had met in the Velocity Trophy at the Belmont back in October, when Whitstable ran out 3-1 winners. Whitstable had also won the corresponding league fixture last season 1-0, thanks to a late Tom Walmsley goal, although the two goalkeepers and Wisson were the only three players from that game back in September 2018 that lined up again for this one. Whitstable were without Josh Spencer after his red card at Ramsgate, but Tom Bryant returned to captain the side.

Whitstable might have taken the lead in the 4th minute when a good cross by John Ufuah was missed by Mohammed Kamara and fell to Stannard on the six yard line, but he was unable to get a firm enough connection and Sam Mott was able to make the save. In the 16th minute, Luke Girt was fouled by Kamara just outside the box as he tried to shoot and Stannard curled the free kick inches wide of the far post. Ashford won their first corner a few minutes later when a Jay May shot was deflected behind and Wisson headed the corner wide. There were not too many obvious chances, but Ashford scored the opening goal on 31 minutes after Whitstable were unable to properly clear a free kick that had been curled in from the left by Aaron Condon and the ball fell to Wisson who shot low past the diving Dan Eason into the left corner of the net.

A good run down the right by Theo Osinfolarin nearly led to a second Ashford goal on 41 minutes, as he played the ball to May who then helped it on to Condon and his shot was almost deflected over Eason, but the goalkeeper did well to make an acrobatic save and push the ball away. Whitstable then had a great chance to pull themselves level when the ball was played into the penalty area, but Ashford defended well to deny them twice before Stannard's blocked shot reached Ufuah at the far post, but his shot was deflected behind for a corner. There was a yellow card for a foul by Prescott just before the break as the rain began to fall more heavily and the teams retreated to the shelter of the dressing rooms with Ashford leading 1-0.

Whitstable won their third corner just after the restart, before Prescott curled an effort over the bar at the other end. The scores were level in the 52nd minute with a goal of the season contender by Stannard who found the top corner with a left footed shot from way out on the right after some good build up play on the wing with Jake Mackenzie making a significant contribution. Whitstable continued on the front foot with another corner, but then put themselves back under pressure with some sloppy defending that eventually led to Bryant collecting a booking for a foul. Shortly afterwards, Whitstable lost the ball in midfield and Prescott took it past several defenders before shooting past Eason to put Ashford back in front in the 57th minute. There were few opportunities for Whitstable to find another equaliser, as Ashford were quite happy to hold on to their lead in the deteriorating conditions.

Whitstable brought on Marcus Elliott for Ufuah, but the best of any chances were coming from set pieces. An Ashford corner was sent across goal by Condon and the ball struck May before rebounding wide. Whitstable had six second half corners and from one in the 76th minute, the ball found its way back to the taker, Marshall Wratten, who curled an effort just past the far post. Then a long throw by Connor Sanders was met by the head of Bryant, who nodded the ball back across goal, but just the wrong side of the post. Leo Mazzone replaced Girt for the last few minutes and a Wratten free kick was sliced behind by an Ashford player for a corner. Wratten delivered an in-swinger that Mott, under pressure, just managed to push out from under the bar. The referee awarded a free kick for a foul on Mott as Whitstable appealed optimistically that the ball had crossed the line. There was one more chance for the home team when Mackenzie was fouled on the 18 yard line and Stannard struck the free kick fractionally wide of the near post with Mott beaten. Ashford successfully wound down the clock in added time to hang on for a 2-1 win and a valuable three points to aid their promotion hopes.

Whitstable felt afterwards that they had deserved something from the game for their performance, but will now have to prepare for a visit to Herne Bay on New Year's Day to see if they can complete a league double over their local rivals.

New Year Starts With Loss Herne Bay reverse result from August clash at the Belmont

Herne Bay were the winners of this New Year's Day local derby in front of a bumper crowd of 831, gaining revenge for the August Bank Holiday fixture at the Belmont that Whitstable won by the same score. An early goal by Tushaun-Tyreese Walters gave the home team the perfect start and despite some good possession, Whitstable were unable to make the most of their opportunities and fell further behind in the first half when Zak Ansah scored from the penalty spot. A great finish by Walters was the only addition to the score in the second half, as Herne Bay defended well to make sure of the three points that moved them up to sixth in the table.

Herne Bay had not played since December 14th when they drew 0-0 with Haywards Heath, whilst Whitstable had been beaten 2-1 by Ashford United on a wet Boxing Day at the Belmont. Apart from the previous league meeting, the teams had also met in a Velocity Trophy game at Whitstable that Herne Bay had won 4-1, although neither team was able to progress to the knock out stages of that competition. Whitstable made two changes to the team that started against Ashford, with Marcus Elliott coming in for Marshall Wratten and Liam Gilles started in midfield instead of the unavailable Luke Girt. Top scorer Zak Ansah started the game on 18 goals for Herne Bay, 6 of which were successful penalties.

Whitstable had an early chance when Tom Bryant headed a long throw by Connor Sanders just wide. Herne Bay scored just afterwards however, on 3 minutes, when Whitstable failed to deal with a long clearance by George Kamurasi and Walters combined with Keiron Campbell before shooting past Dan Eason from a narrow angle on the left into the far corner. Whitstable had plenty of the ball in midfield, but were unable to take their chances. They went close in the 22nd minute, when a Harry Stannard corner was missed by the tall Herne Bay goalkeeper, but Bryant's header went just over the bar. Whitstable were threatening an equaliser, but then in the 26th minute they found themselves 2-0 down after a Walters shot was saved by Eason, only for Campbell to pick up the rebound and win a penalty when Bryant was adjudged to have brought him down just inside the area. Ansah made no mistake from the spot, finding the bottom right corner, out of the reach of the diving Eason.

Sanders had a number of opportunities to send long throws into the Herne Bay box and from one of these in the 36th minute, Bryant forced a good save from Kamurasi who pushed the ball past his left hand post, although somewhat surprisingly a goal kick was the result. Eason had to make a save when a Herne Bay break saw the dangerous Campbell work a position to fire in a shot and Bryant was able to complete the clearance. Whitstable had a couple more good chances before the break, when firstly John Ufuah was found by Elliott, but shot wide from just inside the box and then Gillies and Elliott created a great opportunity for Aaron Millbank, but his shot was well blocked by the head of the diving Ryan Cooper. The half time whistle blew with Herne Bay 2-0 ahead and Whitstable were left to wonder how, given the amount of possession and chances they had created.

Eason made a comfortable save from Tom Carlton early in the second half and at the other end, Kamurasi caught a Stannard effort. Herne Bay all but wrapped up the points in the 61st minute, when former Chelsea youngster Walters scored his second goal of the afternoon. Bola Dawodu, who made 12 appearances for Whitstable in the 2016-17 season, played the ball out to the right and Walters took it around James Brown before curling a great shot from distance into the far top corner, giving Eason no chance.

Chances were still coming for Whitstable, but Millbank shot over, then Ufuah had an effort parried by Kamurasi and Stannard was unable to direct the rebound on target. The result was never in doubt during the latter stages of the game and both teams made substitutions, with Wratten and Leo Mazzone coming on for Whitstable. Ansah and substitute Ryan King-Elliott both shot wide for Herne Bay, before Carlton had a shot saved by Eason after a run from midfield. A late effort from Campbell went wide, although there were few clear chances in the closing minutes and Herne Bay finished 3-0 winners.

Whitstable have picked up no points from their two holiday fixtures, although performed quite well and certainly had their chances in both games. They next face Sevenoaks Town on Saturday at the Belmont and will be hoping they can get back to winning ways, but will need to be more clinical in front of goal.
