### WHITSTABLE TOWN FC SPECTATORS/VISITORS CONDITIONS

#### **ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE BELMONT GROUND ON MATCH DAYS ARE ONLY ADMITTED SUBJECT TO THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

Whitstable Town FC aims to create and maintain an environment where employees, volunteers, and spectators/visitors (both home or away) can enjoy the game of football, safe in the knowledge that they are free from all forms of harassment, abuse, unacceptable or disorderly conduct.

Whitstable Town FC will not tolerate **Unacceptable Conduct** both physical or verbal from spectators/visitors (both home or away) at Whitstable Town FC.

**Unacceptable Conduct** is where there is:-

- Actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person or persons.
- Intentional damage to property.
- Using threatening, abusive, offensive or insulting words or conduct both verbal and non-verbal.
- Displaying writing or any other item which is threatening, abusive or insulting.
- Disorderly conduct involves any activity which stirs up or sustains, or is likely, or is designed to incite or sustain hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of :
  - Gender
  - Age
  - Colour, race, nationality, (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.
  - Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.
  - Sexual orientation
  - Transgender identity
  - Disability

Any spectator/visitor (home or away) behaving in this way will face eviction from the ground and their actions will/may be reported to the Police. Ticket holders who conduct themselves in this manner face having their ticket immediately revoked and all spectators/visitors face the prospect of a life ban from Whitstable Town FC,

All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge WHITSTABLE TOWN FC's right to search any person and their belongings whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search. Threatening, abusive or violent behaviour, and/or foul, offensive or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground, irrespective if entry payment has been made. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the ground as a result.

Causing damage to, or interfering or tampering with any equipment, furniture or fixture within the Ground will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment is strictly forbidden and will result arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.

Responsibility for minors (any child under 16 years) remains at all times with a parent or guardian. Should any 'minor' be required to leave the Ground for any of the above reasons they shall be accompanied by their parent or guardian. Should a parent or guardian not be present then the minor will be placed into the care of the Police or social services.

At all times whilst present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward or officer of WHITSTABLE TOWN FC and/or by any Police officer. Failure to comply with any instructions may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.

# SGT. PEPPER'S ONLY FOOTBALLER

(Researched and compiled by Bernie Thompson)

With the recent publicity regarding The Beatles iconic Abbey Road album and cover showing the 'Fab Four' using a zebra crossing fifty years ago, it got me checking through my own Beatles record collection. I personally find the Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band album cover more interesting, depicting seventy-odd well known celebrities and personalities, which set me wondering how many people know who the only footballer is included on the album cover picture. Answers on a postcard with a prize for.....no, I won't do that, as in this day of iPads and smart phones the answer can be found in an instant. I understand that pub quizzies have lost their popularity due to correct answer seekers using mobile phones.



The only footballer included on the album cover alongside Mae West, Fred Astaire, Bob Dylan, Tony Curtis, Marilyn Monroe, Laurel and Hardy, Oscar Wilde, Diane Dors and many others, is Albert Stubbins. Yes, the former Liverpool marksman is the only footballer to have his face included on the album cover. The Beatles were not big football fans although Paul McCartney was an Everton fan and attended the 1966 FA Cup final at Wembley but later claiming to support both Everton and Liverpool.

So why was Albert Stubbins chosen to appear in the collage when there are more well-known Merseyside players such as Dixie Dean. Well, Stubbins although a prolific goal scorer on Merseyside during The Beatles early years, he was not actually selected for the cover for football goal scoring feats but simply because of his name. The Beatles, especially John Lennon, liked the phonetic qualities of the name 'Stubbins'.

So who was Albert Stubbins many will ask because he isn't the most well-known of footballers outside Merseyside. Born in July 1919 at Wallsend, North Tyneside, he spent a large part of his early life living in the United States after his parents moved to America in 1921 when Albert was just two years old. When the Great Depression hit the U.S. he returned to Wallsend and he joined Sunderland, his first club. In 1937 he moved to Newcastle United but became one of those unfortunate group of talented players who lost most of their careers to war after having only played just twenty seven games for the Magpies.



**ALBERT STUBBINS**

At the end of the war, Stubbins was 26 and had developed into a powerful centre forward scoring many goals in wartime football games. In 1945 Stubbins was selected for England in a Friendly match with Wales but as the game was classed as a war time international he never won an official cap and must be regarded as one of the finest uncapped players in the history of football.

In 1946 he moved from Newcastle United to Liverpool and became a prolific goal scorer for the Reds and his goal scoring ability helped Liverpool to the first post war Football League Championship. After the success of the 1946-47 season Liverpool struggled in the league for a few seasons despite Stubbins goals and his desire to move on. In 1948-49 although Liverpool could only finish eighth in the league they had more success in the FA Cup reaching the final v. Arsenal but the Gunners proved too strong for Liverpool, defeating them 1-0.

Stubbins left Liverpool in 1953 with one League title, one FA Cup runners-up medal but never an England cap. He spent a season in non-league football with Ashington FC before hanging up his boots and becoming a sports journalist. Albert Stubbins died in December 2002 aged 83.

I write this because in the 1960s a pretty strong Maidstone United came up against a very strong Barnet outfit, whose number 9 was Roger Figg, a strong leader of the forward line and with a prowess for finding the back of the net, and so highly acclaimed by followers of the Underhill side.

I recall a game at our County Town club's old London Road site, when The Stones' keeper was a teenager, Swinard – I think his father had kept goal for Ashford Town. Barnet won – 4-1 I think but the young goalie did well. I can see it now: early on in the contest left-winger Reggie Finch pulled the ball back from the bye-line and offered Figg a great chance but the young Swinard bravely grabbed the ball from his boots.

When I was Minister of Chorleywood Free Church in Hertfordshire, one of the ladies in the Church was a cousin of Roger Figg. Her maiden name had been Figg.

## **Faversham Town F.C.**

The club was formed in 1884, and experienced many ups & downs during the early years, the storey below takes you from the 1970's to one of its most successful periods which arguably has been the last 5/6 years.

After a brief flirtation with the Athenian League in the mid seventies, the club returned to the Kent League, winning the Kent Senior Trophy in 1977. The following season they repeated this success and were also crowned Kent League champions, completing a famous "double". The Lilywhites won the Kent League again in 1990, but league form dipped in the 92/93 season and was to stay that way for several seasons. The club managed to reach the final of the Kent League Challenge Cup in 2000, but things were in rapid decline. Matters reached crisis point in 2003, when the KCFA suspended the club for nonpayment of fines, with the club's operators blaming just about everyone for the mess except themselves.

In the following months, the once proud Salters Lane ground was systematically wrecked by vandals. Meanwhile, club trustees led by businessman Ray Leader fought a desperate battle to heal a widening rift with the previous regime over the ownership of the club and ground. In a separate development, the Faversham Town Independent Supporters Club had been formed, and quickly gained a membership of over 300 paid up members in the market town. This was despite the fact the club had no team, no manager, and a ground that had been totally wrecked by vandals and now resembled a bomb site. Perhaps the real turning point came when trustees and Independent Supporters Club committee members got together and declared an alliance to get the club back on its feet. An interim club committee was formed, and the long road to recovery was started. The revival was slow, but things finally started to happen. The ownership dispute was settled and access to the ground obtained. Volunteer workers were confronted with completely smashed and vandalized buildings, and shoulder-height grass on what had been the pitch. A massive clear up operation began but it was back breaking work. Meanwhile, paperwork was put in order with a new club constitution written and agreed.

Kent County FA allowed the club to retain their coveted senior status subject to several conditions. Local authority grants were applied for and secured, sponsorship deals obtained, and the club embarked on a range of fund raising initiatives. Slowly but surely, Salters Lane was returned to its former glory, before the future became even brighter with the erection of brand new floodlights. The revival of club and ground from the jaws of death was nothing short of a miracle - a story that would surely rival the efforts to revive both "The Valley" at Charlton, and Accrington Stanley F.C.

The revived club played their first season back in 05/06, competing in the Kent County League and finishing as runners-up. Having passed ground inspections and fulfilled minimum criteria, promotion to the Kent League was confirmed, and Faversham Town had at last "come home".

Season 2007/08 saw the arrival of Justin Luchford and Jimmy Strouts taking over the management with Town second bottom of the league. The team sunk to bottom before the pair gradually steered them up to mid table. Strouts soon left for personal reasons and Luchford, along with Clive Walker, took the Lilywhites to the Kent Senior Trophy final in season 2009/10, beating Greenwich 2-1 to lift the trophy. A week later, they were crowned Kent League Premier Division champions.

Towards the end of his first season in the Ryman League, and with Town within touching distance of the play-offs, Luchford resigned. His place was taken by his assistant Ray Turner. Turner took charge of the last seven league games securing eighth spot - the highest position of any Kent team competing at that level.

Another significant milestone was reached in 2010 when the revamped stadium was renamed Shepherd Neame Stadium after a sponsorship deal with the town's famous brewery. Having consolidated their position as a mid-table Ryman South side during the first two years of Turner's reign, Faversham embarked on one of the best seasons in the club's history during the 2012/13 season.

The Lilywhites lost just three away league games all campaign on their way to finish third and reach the Ryman South play-off final against all odds. However, at Maidstone United's newly-built Gallagher Stadium in front of a 2,226 strong-crowd, Town were unable to pull off one final upset against a side with huge investment and backing. Maidstone cruising to a 3-0 victory to deny Faversham their first taste of Ryman Premier League football.

Town spent the majority of the 2013/14 campaign just outside the play-offs, and ultimately had to settle for tenth position in their fourth season in the Ryman South. Off the pitch, Town continued to grow with another significant advance. They came together with nearby Faversham Town Youth & Juniors to form a new youth section, meaning boys were now playing in the famous white and black kit from the age of five. The move also created a route through from youth development into the senior side and enabled the newly-expanded club achieved FA Charter Standard Community Club rank, marking their rise in status.

The Lilywhites took another step forward in February 2014 with the announcement of an ambitious project to redevelop Shepherd Neame Stadium. The plans - broken down into five phases - include rebuilding the changing rooms, adding hospitality and function rooms, extra seating in the stands and a new stadium entrance. A coffee shop and retail store will then be added, with meeting rooms and offices also being built to bring in additional revenue. A new 120-seater stand, fitness centre and sports hall will also be built. Fundraising for the project then began.

Faversham had a productive 2014/15 season, scoring 111 league goals - more than any other Ryman League side that campaign - and amassing a record 97 points to finish in third place in the Ryman South for the second time in three seasons. But the club suffered more play-off heartache, as they lost 5-4 on penalties at home to Merstham in their Ryman South Play-off Semi-Final following a goalless draw away.

Faversham came fifth at the end of the 2015-16 season, again reaching the play-offs, but after beating Dorking Wanderers 2-1 in the semi-final they lost 3-0 to Worthing in the final, leaving them knocking once more on the door of the Ryman Premier Division.

The 2016/17 season was one of transition for the Lilywhites on the pitch, and success off it as they forged ahead with Phase One their ambitious rebuilding programme.

A tenth place finish was achieved with a young squad as manager Ray Turner dealt with a number of unexpected player departures, which led to a mid-season wobble. However, in May 2017 MP Helen Whately opened the new changing rooms as the first stage of the stadium redevelopment was finally completed. Another significant advance came when, for the first time, the club were able to field Kent Youth League standard squads at every age group from Under 13s upwards in the 2017/18 campaign, a mark of their growing stature in the region and of their commitment to a successful youth policy. In a further development, the Under 21s also switched to become an Under 23 Development team with the aim of helping young players bridge the gap from the Under 18s to the first team. The progress marked the fruition of a vision set out five years earlier by Ray Turner and Head of Youth Chris Greenfield, who was promoted to Under 23s Manager.

Long serving manager Ray Turner resigned in October of this season and his assistant Clive Walker held the fort for us until 27<sup>th</sup>. November when Danny Chapman & Phil Miles became joint managers, Clive Walker was then asked to join the Board as Director of Football, a post that he accepted. ## LEAFE COAST TO AWAY WIN BY RON MARTIN

Poor run continues with fourth consecutive loss

At the end of October Whitstable were on a good run of form, having lost only two of their past twelve games and one of those was to a 120th minute goal in an FA Trophy replay at Ware. They have since lost all of their completed games in a disjointed November, which saw two league matches postponed and two lost, together with a couple of defeats in the Velocity Trophy. Rather like the previous game at Whitehawk, this one was effectively lost in a poor first half performance. Antonio Walker-Barth and former Herne Bay striker Ronald Sobowale scored the goals and Whitstable rarely looked like recovering. The better chances for the remainder of the afternoon fell to the visitors, but neither goalkeeper was over extended. The late dismissal of new signing Charles Etumnu simply added to the frustration for the home team.

Whitstable were without captain Tom Bryant, who was serving a one game ban for his red card against Herne Bay and new signing from Cray Wanderers, Charles Etumnu was given his first start in midfield. Freddie Parker's one month loan was not renewed and by a strange coincidence, he was on the bench for Whyteleafe for this match. Another former Oysterman Peter Wedgeworth was in the starting eleven for Whyteleafe, who started the season well, but had failed to win any of their last five matches.

An early shot by Sobowale was blocked by the stand-in Whitstable captain Liam Dickson at the expense of a corner. Etumnu sent over a good cross from the right that Aaron Millbank headed over under pressure from the Whyteleafe defenders. The home defence was caught out in the 13th minute when the ball was played through for Walker-Barth, who was able to take it wide of Dan Eason and slot it into the net. The closest that Whitstable came to scoring all afternoon was from a corner several minutes later. Liam Gillies swung the ball in from the left and it hit the outside of the post and rebounded all the way back to him and he delivered another cross to the back post where it was headed wide by Josh Spencer. Whyteleafe then sent a long ball forward that was missed by Spencer, giving Sobowale a chance to break clear, but he was stopped by a timely challenge from Dickson.

The second goal arrived in the 21st minute when an overhit cross from the right was collected by Wedgeworth on the far side and he sent the ball in low to the near post where it was neatly flicked past Eason by Sobowale. Corey Holder was perhaps a little fortunate to get away with a yellow card following a high challenge on Jake Mackenzie that eventually led to the Whitstable right back limping out of the game before half time. Sobowale once again ran through the home defence far too easily, but his shot was blocked. There were a couple of late corners for Whyteleafe that were cleared, between which Luke Girt replaced the injured Mackenzie and Whitstable trailed 0-2 at the break.

There was very little excitement for the crowd of 215, the highest in the division on the day, during the second half and the strong Whyteleafe defence dealt relatively comfortably with any threat on an increasingly heavy pitch. The pitch seemed to cause problems for both teams soon after the restart, when firstly a slip by Spencer gave Walker-Barth the chance to run across the box, but just as he took the ball past Eason and was about to shoot, he appeared to lose his

footing and Eason was able to grab the ball. Whitstable brought on Harry Stannard and John Ufuah in an attempt to change things, whilst Freddie Parker was one of the three Whyteleafe substitutes used.

Parker had a great chance to score in the 71st minute, when he ran through on his own as Whitstable appealed for offside, but he lost control of the ball and allowed it to roll into the grateful hands of Eason. Stannard struck a free kick into the hands of Tyler McCarthy after Nathan Campbell had been booked for a foul just outside the box. Eason saved a low shot by Helge Orome, who was then involved in an incident with Etumnu, which saw the Whitstable player retaliate following a couple of fouls in quick succession. After consulting his assistant, the referee decided to show red card to Etumnu and a yellow to Orome. A late Wedgeworth shot was saved by Eason and the game ended tamely, with little further action of note.

It was a game to forget for Whitstable, who now face a much-changed Faversham team at the Belmont in the last Velocity Trophy group match on Tuesday, followed by a league game away to the same opponents on Saturday.

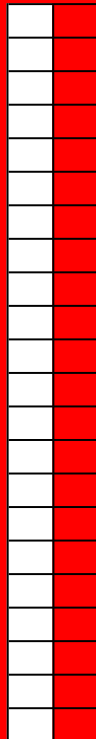
