WHITSTABLE TOWN FC SPECTATORS/VISITORS CONDITIONS

ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE BELMONT GROUND ON MATCH DAYS ARE ONLY ADMITTED SUBJECT TO THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Whitstable Town FC aims to create and maintain an environment where employees, volunteers, and spectators/visitors (both home or away) can enjoy the game of football, safe in the knowledge that they are free from all forms of harassment, abuse, unacceptable or disorderly conduct.

Whitstable Town FC will not tolerate **Unacceptable Conduct** both physical or verbal from spectators/visitors (both home or away) at Whitstable Town FC.

Unacceptable Conduct is where there is:-

- Actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person or persons.
- Intentional damage to property.

- Using threatening, abusive, offensive or insulting words or conduct both verbal and non-verbal.

- Displaying writing or any other item which is threatening, abusive or insulting.

- Disorderly conduct involves any activity which stirs up or sustains, or is likely, or is designed to incite or sustain hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of :

 - Gender

 - Age

 - Colour, race, nationality, (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.

 - Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.

 - Sexual orientation

 - Transgender identity

 - Disability

Any spectator/visitor (home or away) behaving in this way will face eviction from the ground and their actions will/may be reported to the Police. Ticket holders who conduct themselves in this manner face having their ticket immediately revoked and all spectators/visitors face the prospect of a life ban from Whitstable Town FC,

All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge WHITSTABLE TOWN FC's right to search any person and their belongings whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search.

Threatening, abusive or violent behaviour, and/or foul, offensive or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground, irrespective if entry payment has been made. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the ground as a result.

Causing damage to, or interfering or tampering with any equipment, furniture or fixture within the Ground will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment is strictly forbidden and will result arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.

Responsibility for minors (any child under 16 years) remains at all times with a parent or guardian. Should any 'minor' be required to leave the Ground for any of the above reasons they shall be accompanied by their parent or guardian. Should a parent or guardian not be present then the minor will be placed into the care of the Police or social services.

At all times whilst present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward or officer of WHITSTABLE TOWN FC and/or by any Police officer. Failure to comply with any instructions may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.

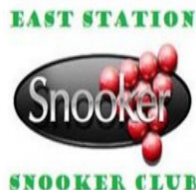

Herne Bay a very brief history

1953 saw the move to Winch's Field. Over 1,000 spectators saw their first match at their new home; a 2 - 2 draw against Tunbridge Wells Reserves in Kent League Division 2. Within two years they lifted the Division 2 title, winning promotion to Division 1. In the 1957/58 season the club won The Kent Amateur Cup beating Bromley 2 - 0 in the final. The following season saw the Kent League fold and a move to the Aetolian League followed. The 1964/65 season saw another move to Division 2 of the Athenian League, where they enjoyed several successful seasons followed by promotion to Division 1 on winning Division 2 in 1970/71. A good run in the FA Cup saw the Bay reach the 4th qualifying round, where they lost to the then 'mighty' Margate in front of a record home attendance of 2,303.

However, the 2001/02 season proved to be one of great disappointment. Exiting all cup competitions at the first-round stage and finishing a poor 7th position in the league, despite being one of the few teams to defeat league and cup double winners, Maidstone. A major grant was awarded to provide new perimeter fencing and refurbishment of the changing facilities and these works were complete prior to the start of the 2003/04 season when the club celebrated 50 years at Winch's Field. Former Gillingham and Maidstone player, Jason Lillis took over the reins for the 2004/05 season which proved to be very successful as Bay finished runners up in both the League and League Cup, losing out to Ramsgate in both competitions.

Both the 2005/06 and 2006/07 seasons proved to be very disappointing and with several senior players, and Jason, leaving the Club during the 2007/08 season, the Club built on the success of Herne Bay Youth with the introduction of a number of very good young players into the first team squad. This proved very beneficial and these players formed the basis of the first team squad for this 2008/09 season. Along with some very influential experienced players introduced by new manager, Barry Morgan, the Club had high hopes for a successful 2008/09 campaign. Unfortunately, a run of five defeats in six matches in October severely dented any promotion prospects. Despite a twelve-match winning sequence Bay fell just short at the end of the campaign and a defeat in the final match saw them finish in 6th position in the League. The majority of the young squad were retained for the 2009/10 season and with new sponsors there was a renewed optimism within the Club.

With the appointment of Simon Halsey as Manager, Herne Bay FC pushed on to finish runners up in the Kent League Premier Division two seasons running, the second of those going down to the last few minutes of the last match where a goal at Tunbridge Wells gave Hythe Town the title. But, in season 2011/12 Herne Bay swept all before them, narrowly missing out on a Wembley appearance in the FA Vase and capturing the Kent League Premier Division title and promotion to the Ryman League.

The 2013/14 season saw another new start for the Bay with Sam Denly (son of former manager Nick Denly) taking up the managerial reins following a disappointing first season in the Ryman League where immediate relegation back to Step 5 was narrowly avoided. Achieved highest ever finish and points total in the 2014/15 campaign in Herne Bay 's third season at this level. The 2015/16 season Bay faired even better, sitting in the play-off position for most of the season and with a number of poor results in March Bay finally finished 8th, surpassing their highest finish in the Isthmian league achieved in the previous season. Retaining all the players for the 2016/17 season Bay expected to achieve a better position, but a number of poor results in the early part of season set the tone for the rest of the campaign. Bay hovered around relegation zone until late January. The player's budget was cut and immediately there was an improvement in results. A ten-match unbeaten run saw Bay climb away from the relegation zone with an eventual finish in 17th place. Sam Denly resigned at the end of the season and all of the players left the club. New managers, professional players, John Embery and Jermaine Darlington, were appointed and they have built a totally new side comprising, a large number of very talent young players, along with some experienced older players.

This is the second time in the last 17 years that a totally new side has been formed and to blood these youngsters into what always proves to be a very competitive level of football. the club were delighted with a mid-table finish in 12th place.

For the 208/19, a couple of players moved on but with new signings Matt Fry, James White, Nick Reeves and Connor Pring Embery is looking for a higher finish this season, maybe with a shot at reaching the play-offs. Unfortunately, things didn't go according to plan, with the club fighting against relegation for most of the season. Only a very good run in the latter part saw the club move out of the relegation zone; eventually finishing 15th. Embery and Darlington quit on 30th March. Anthony Deer and Alan Birchard took over with six fixtures still to play, Rumours were rife about the clubs' future with social media claiming the club were going to fold. Despite these issues a consortium led by the now chairman, Stuart Fitchie, took over the running of the club, bringing in Ben Smith and his back-room staff to manager the team. Ben and his team took Canterbury City to the semifinal of the FA Vase in the previous season, but he was dismissed from his position as soon as the season was over.

A number of former Herne Bay favourites have now returned to the Bay and along with some new exciting additions, the club are looking forward to a more successful 2019/20 season.

Kick-Off - Law 8

Changes

- The team that wins the toss can now choose to take the kick-off or which goal to attack (previously they only had the choice of which goal to attack)

Explanation

- Recent Law changes have made the kick-off more dynamic (e.g. a goal can be scored directly from the kick-off) so captains winning the toss often ask to take the kick-off.

Medical Breaks - Law 7

Changes

- Difference between 'cooling' breaks (90 secs – 3 mins) and 'drinks' breaks (max 1 min)

Explanation

- In the interests of player safety, competition rules may allow, in certain weather conditions (e.g. high humidity and temperatures), 'cooling' breaks (from ninety seconds to three minutes) to allow the body's temperature to fall; they are different from 'drinks' breaks (maximum one minute) which are for rehydration.

Penalty Kick - Law 14

Changes

- The team's penalty taker can have (quick) treatment/assessment and then take the kick
- The goalkeeper must not be touching the goalposts/crossbar/nets; they must not be moving
- The goalkeeper must have at least part of one foot on/in line with the goal line when the kick is taken; cannot stand behind the line

Explanation

- It is unfair if the kicker needs assessment/treatment and then has to leave the field and cannot take the penalty kick.
- The referee must not signal for the penalty kick to be taken if the goalkeeper is touching the goalposts, crossbar or net, or if they are moving e.g. the goalkeeper has kicked/shaken them
- Goalkeepers are not permitted to stand in front of or behind the line. Allowing the goalkeeper to have only one foot touching the goal line (or, if jumping, in line with the goal line) when the penalty kick is taken is a more practical approach as it is easier to identify if both feet are not on the line. As the kicker can 'stutter' in the run, it is reasonable that the goalkeeper can take one step in anticipation of the kick.

Players' Equipment - Law 4

Changes

- Multi-coloured/patterned undershirts are allowed if they are the same as the sleeve of the main shirt

Explanation

- Manufacturers now make patterned undershirts whose sleeves are the same as the main shirt sleeve; these should be allowed as they help match officials' decision-making.

Quick free kick and YC/RC - Law 12

Changes

- If the referee is about to issue a YC/RC but the non-offending team takes the free kick quickly and creates a goal-scoring opportunity, the referee can delay the YC/RC until the next stoppage if the offending team was not distracted by the referee

Explanation

- Occasionally, an attack is stopped by a cautionable (YC) or sending-off (RC) offence and the attacking team takes a quick free kick which restores the 'lost' attack; it is clearly 'unfair' if this 'new' attack is stopped to issue the YC/RC. However, if the referee has distracted the offending team by starting the YC/RC procedure, the

Substitutes - Law 3

Changes

- A player who is being substituted must leave the field by the nearest point on the touchline/goal line (unless the referee indicates the player can leave quickly/immediately at the halfway line or a different point because of safety, injury etc.)

Explanation

- To stop a player who is being substituted 'wasting' time by leaving slowly at the halfway line (which is not a Law requirement) the player must leave at the nearest point (as with an injury) unless the referee indicates otherwise, e.g. if the player can leave quickly at the halfway line, there is a safety/security issue or the player leaves on a stretcher. The player must go immediately to the technical area or dressing room to avoid problems with substitutes, spectators, or the match officials. A player who infringes the spirit of this Law should be sanctioned for unsporting behaviour i.e. delaying the restart of play.

Team Officials - Laws 5 & 12

Changes

- A team official guilty of misconduct will be shown a YC (caution) or RC (sending-off)*; if the offender cannot be identified, the senior coach who is in the technical area at the time will receive the YC/RC * Law 12 will have a list of YC/RC offences

Explanation

- The experiment with YC/RC for misconduct by team officials has been successful and has revealed many benefits at all levels, including for young referees dealing with 'difficult' adult coaches. If the offender cannot be identified, the senior team official (usually the main coach) in the technical area will receive the YC/RC (as the person responsible for the other team officials).

Tom Carlton the difference in a poor game

Whitstable travelled to Hythe for their first away game of the new season and suffered a 2-0 defeat in a game that, with the exception of a few moments of quality, was fairly low on entertainment. Tom Carlton scored the first goal with a wonderful strike from distance and the home team were well worth their half time lead, as Dan Eason had to make a good save from a Frannie Collin header to prevent them doubling their lead before the break. Whitstable improved in the second half and frustrated the home fans by having a lot of possession, but there was very little threat of an equaliser. Carlton forced Eason into another diving stop, but the Hythe midfielder was instrumental in their decisive second goal when Eason could only parry another powerful low drive and the ball fell kindly for substitute Rhys Bartlett who applied the finishing touch.

Whitstable tried to respond quickly and a low cross from the right flashed across the goal just out of reach of the arriving Liam Gillies. Hythe almost scored again in the 15th minute when a good cross from the left was met by Collin, but his header was brilliantly tipped over the bar by Eason.

The game then became quite scrappy with a few fouls, although Collin had another headed chance that went wide. Just after the half hour mark, a foul by Jake Mackenzie on the touchline led to a minor scuffle that resulted in yellow cards for Mackenzie and Luke Girt. Aaron Millbank got his head to a good John Walker cross, but his effort was comfortably saved. A good Whitstable attack involving Osman Proni, TJ Jadama and Liam Gillies almost created an equaliser, but goalkeeper Ryan Nicholls was quickly out to claim the ball. There was a bit more late pressure on the home goal just before the break, when a saved Millbank shot led to successive corners, but Hythe survived to preserve their 1-0 lead at half time.

Whitstable started the second half brightly, with Jadama shooting wide after a good spell of possession. Hythe broke well a few minutes later though and Luke Blewden crossed from the right, but Collin scooped his shot over the bar. Back at the other end, Millbank headed a Proni free kick wide under pressure from several defenders. Whitstable, not for the first time, gave the ball away in midfield, leaving Carlton to break clear, but his low shot

lacked the power to beat Eason. Marcus Evans, who had a good game alongside Tom Bryant at the back, chipped the ball forward for Millbank whose shot was deflected behind for a corner. Whitstable introduced the lively Tarik Ibrahim for Marcus Elliott in the 63rd minute, just before Chris Kinnear went into the book for a late challenge on Jadama. Ibrahim started to cause a few problems down the right and won a corner that was headed just over by Bryant.

The home crowd were growing a little concerned, as their team were unable to put the game to bed and Hythe were understandably lacking a bit of confidence after their big opening day defeat. There was always the feeling though that they were more likely to score the next goal and Carlton once again drew a great save from Eason, when his curling shot was just kept out. The game was settled in the 80th minute when another low Carlton shot was pushed out by the diving Eason, but only as far as Bartlett, who followed in to score. Whitstable might have grabbed a consolation when an Ibrahim cross was cleverly guided towards goal by Proni, but the ball went just wide of the far post. There was little further action apart from two late yellow cards for the home team, who saw the game out for a deserved, if a little nervy, three points.

Both teams now move on to the Emirates FA Cup Preliminary Round, with Hythe facing a tricky tie at Cray Wanderers. Whitstable have a home game against Southern Combination League Newhaven and will hope that they can find more of a cutting edge to their play, if they are to progress further in the competition.

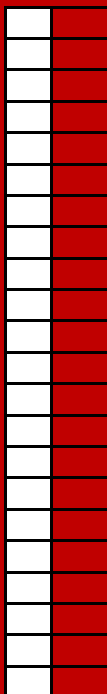

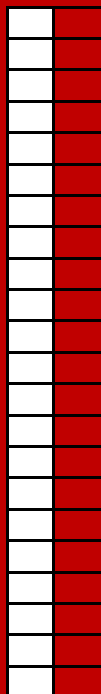
