

ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE BELMONT GROUND ON MATCH DAYS ARE ONLY ADMITTED SUBJECT TO THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Whitstable Town FC aims to create and maintain an environment where employees, volunteers, and spectators/visitors (both home or away) can enjoy the game of football, safe in the knowledge that they are free from all forms of harassment, abuse, unacceptable or disorderly conduct.

Whitstable Town FC will not tolerate **Unacceptable Conduct** both physical or verbal from spectators/visitors (both home or away) at Whitstable Town FC.

Unacceptable Conduct is where there is:-

Actual, attempted or threatened physical violence against any person or persons. Intentional damage to property.

Using threatening, abusive, offensive or insulting words or conduct both verbal and non-verbal.

Displaying writing or any other item which is threatening, abusive or insulting. Disorderly conduct involves any activity which stirs up or sustains, or is likely, or is designed to incite or sustain hatred or ill will against or towards individuals or groups of people because of :

Gender

Age

Colour, race, nationality, (including citizenship) or ethnic or national origin.

Membership or presumed membership of a religious group or of a social or cultural group with perceived religious affiliation.

Sexual orientation

Transgender identity

Disability

Any spectator/visitor (home or away) behaving in this way will face eviction from the ground and their actions will/may be reported to the Police. Ticket holders who conduct themselves in this manner face having their ticket immediately revoked and all spectators/visitors face the prospect of a life ban from Whitstable Town FC,

All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge WHITSTABLE TOWN FC's right to search any person and their belongings whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search. Threatening, abusive or violent behaviour, and/or foul, offensive or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground, irrespective if entry payment has been made. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the ground as a result.

Causing damage to, or interfering or tampering with any equipment, furniture or fixture within the Ground will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment is strictly forbidden and will result arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. WHITSTABLE TOWN FC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.

Responsibility for minors (any child under 16 years) remains at all times with a parent or guardian. Should any 'minor' be required to leave the Ground for any of the above reasons they shall be accompanied by their parent or guardian. Should a parent or guardian not be present then the minor will be placed into the care of the Police or social services. At all times whilst present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward or officer of WHITSTABLE TOWN FC and/or by any Police officer. Failure to comply with any instructions may lead to immediate election from the Ground.


Ramsgate History

Ramsgate has had senior football teams within the town since the late-1800s, but despite the paucity of reports in the local press there are match reports for Ramsgate Athletic from 1895. At this time matches were being played on a number of grounds around the town, including the Rams' current home - Southwood. Football in east Kent closed down during the Great War, and in 1919 the Southwood ground was provided for Ramsgate Town, by then known simply as Ramsgate. In their first season they finished 3rd in the Kent League and reached the Kent Senior Cup final, but lost 1-0 to Northfleet at Maidstone before a crowd of 10,000. In 1924 Ramsgate Town folded and Ramsgate Grenville moved to Southwood and, apart from the appearance and demise a few years later of Ramsgate Press Wanderers in 1932, became the senior Ramsgate side until the 2nd World War again brought an end to all football in east Kent.

Football resumed after the war and Southwood was taken over by the current club in 1945, then called Ramsgate Athletic. with the pitch being turned through 90 degrees and covers to the terraces and a stand erected from the anti-invasion steelwork from nearby Pegwell Bay. The Club played in the Kent League until it was disbanded in 1959, and were runnersup in the Kent Senior Shield in 1946/47, finalists in the Kent Senior Cup in 1947/48. Kent League Cup winners in 1948/49. followed by winning the League and runners-up in the Kent Senior Shield in 1949/50. In the next golden period, from 1954 to 1957, the Club won back-to-back League Championships (1955/56 & 1956/57), with a new attendance record being set in 1955/56 when 5,200 spectators watched the local derby against Margate. They also made Club history when they reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup for the first time in November 1955, eventually losing 5-3 at Watford, a record that stood for the next 50 years.

In 1958/59 the Club also started playing in the Thames & Medway Combination League, winning the Eastern Division that season but finishing runners-up to Sittingbourne in the Champions' Cup Final. With the demise of the KCFA Kent League in 1959, the Club joined the Southern League, as well as continuing in the Thames & Medway Combination. A new main stand was erected along the southern side of the pitch at Southwood, which is still in use today, and in November 1959 the Rams were visited by Everton to mark the official illumination of the newly installed floodlights - the 'Toffees' winning 7-1. In 1967/68 the Club again won the Kent Senior Shield and were runners-up in the Southern League Cup. In 1971/72 they finished runners-up in the League and were promoted to the Premier Division. In 1972 the Club changed its name to Ramsgate but after a decline in fortunes off the pitch the Club were relegated to Division 1 and later resigned from League in 1976, the 1st team taking the Reserves' place in the new Kent League and in 1988/89 won the Kent Senior Trophy for the 2nd consecutive year and finished runners-up in the Kent League Cup, whilst in 1998/99 the Club was eliqible for promotion to the Southern League after winning the Kent Premier League championship, but decided the time was not right, and also won the Kent Senior Trophy and reached the semi finals of the Kent League Cup. The 2004/2005 season saw the Club capitalise on the promise of its successful youth and a tough pre-season programme had the Rams playing (and defeating) 4 sides from higher leagues, including old adversaries Margate. In competitive football the Rams made good progress in the FA Cup, despatching Kingstonian (2 leagues above) before falling in the 2nd half to Dulwich Hamlet (1 league higher). whilst in the FA Vase they again reached the 3rd Round Proper. The best form was saved for the domestic season, where the Rams again did the double, the Kent League Premier Division Cup as well as the Kent League Championship by a clear margin, gaining promotion to the Isthmian League Division 1 South.

Summer 2005 saw the Rams start the new era with two further pieces of silverware, beating Herne Bay in the Kent League Challenge Shield and Margate in the Kent Messenger Challenge Cup. The season continued with the Club reaching the 1st Round Proper of the FA Cup, the only Step 4 club in the country to do so that year and equalling the Club record set 50 years earlier. The Club also won the League at the first attempt, securing back-to-back promotions to the Isthmian Premier for 2006/2007. For most of their 1st season in the Premier Division the Rams were settled in the 'play-off spots' and spent several weeks in 2nd place, but the toll on the squad was noticeable and injuries saw their form dip in the last weeks and they eventually slipped to 9th. This also meant a new record, as the Club had only managed to stay in the Southern League Premier for a single season. 2007/08 saw the Rams set more club records, winning the Isthmian League Cup and also reaching the play-offs for Conference South. For 2008/09 the Club erected new covers to the terraces behind each goal, to replace those erected after the war but removed in the 1970s, however having lost key players an average performance on the pitch dipped in the last months with relegation to Division 1 South. This saw several players leave to remain playing at the higher level, and a much younger Ramsgate team in 2009/10 avoided a further drop as some had predicted. After returning to Division 1 the Rams usually finished near the play-offs until 2013/14 when, after five managers in 14 months, the Rams ended up in 21st place. This saw the return of Jim and Danny Ward for their 3rd spell in charge, almost 20 years since they first joined the Club, and though they were in 2nd place at Christmas the form dropped and the Rams ended up mid-table. A good start in 2016/17 didn't last and after slipping into the bottom guarter, with 1 point from 3 games over Christmas head coach Lloyd Blackman replaced the Wards. A 10-match unbeaten run saw a mid-table finish reprieve, with Blackman confirmed as gaffer for 2017/18. A season of mixed fortunes saw a lean patch after Christmas with some significant injuries saw the Rams sliding in the table, but another strong finish lifted Ramsgate back towards mid-table. In 2018/19 the Rams dispatched Gosport Boro before Hemel Hempstead stopped them in the 3rd Qualifying Round on the FA Cup in Herts, while AFC Hornchurch stopped their FA Trophy run in Essex. Following this, and an unbeaten 8 game run in the League, the Rams lost two in a row and Blackman decided to step down, being replaced by former Sittingbourne manager Nick Davis (who played at centre half and at times captained the Rams in their Ryman Premier days) in December 2018. Nick saw out the rest of the season but after a poor start to the 2019/20 campaign, Nick was replaced by a joint management team of Jason Lillis, Terry Sedge and Joe Radford.





From 1985 to 1995 Middlesbrough's 'keeper was Stephen Pears, and a real favourite with the supporters. He made 327 appearances and in the 87-88 season when the club won promotion to the top Division, he achieved the record of keeping 7 consecutive clean sheets.

He hailed from County Durham and had begun his career at Old Trafford but turning out only a few times for Man.Utd. From Middlesbrough he went to Anfield for a season to be understudy to David James but never played a game, so moved to Hartlepool United for whom he played 15 times.

The year he left Middlesbrough was the time the club moved to its present Riverside Stadium from its long-time home ground of Ayresome Park. He was playing a very well supported testimonial match. It was the last game played at the ground and towards the end he was invited forward to take a penalty, which he duly converted. It turned out to be the last goal to be scored at the ground. Since hanging up his boots, he has been goalkeeper coach at Middlesbrough, Hartlepool and Gateshead.

The name Pears has no connection with the fruit. It is actually a version of Peter, with the s short for 'son', so means 'son of Peter'. This quite a religious name with its allusion to Simon Peter, disciple of Jesus Christ.

James Duffy first played for the first team on 18th February 2006 against Erith Town at the Belmont in a 3-0 victory in the Kent Premier League match.

Bertie Braidwood was first selected for the Boxing Day Ryman South encounter with Sittingbourne at the Belmont, a game won by 'The Brickies' 2-0. Goalkeeper, Dylan McVickar's first team baptism was in the 2-1 away victory over Corinthian Casuals in a Ryman South match on 30th September 2008. Ben Smith made his debut v. Met Police (A) on 7th November 2009 when Whitstable suffered a 5-0 defeat. Ben is now manager of local rivals Herne Bay after previously fulfilling a similar role for Canterbury City.

Rams hold on for a draw at the Belmont

A slow start by the home side saw Tom Chapman give Ramsgate an early lead, but on a difficult pitch, Whitstable gradually improved and went on to have the better of the second half. Their only reward was a perfect, long distance free kick by Harry Stannard that found the top corner. Charlie Burns, in the Ramsgate goal, saved well from John Ufuah and Leo Mazzone, whilst Dan Eason was relatively untroubled and the teams had to settle for a point each.

This was the third meeting between the teams so far this season, with the first two matches at Southwood resulting in a 2-0 win for the Rams in the Velocity Trophy and a 1-1 draw in a league game, during which Dan Eason saved two penalties in three minutes. Ramsgate however have struggled for most of the season after making a lot of changes in the summer and arrived at the Belmont with only 14 points from 24 games and only winless East Grinstead below them in the table. Their line up for this game included former Oystermen James Morrish, playing in a new role at the heart of the defence, Kane Rowland and Ashley Miller, with Nick Treadwell among the substitutes. There are now also a number of ex-Ramsgate players at Whitstable, together with their former manager Lloyd Blackman, to add some further interest to the occasion.

Heavy overnight showers left the pitch very soft in places, but on a fine afternoon 502 turned out to watch. It was the visitors that pushed forward in the opening minutes, although Whitstable had several chances to send the ball into the box from free kicks and a corner and one cross by Ufuah was gently headed into the hands of Burns by a stretching Marshall Wratten. In the 16th minute, Chapman scored to give his team hope of a much needed win. New signing Henry Arnold played the ball in from the right to Chapman, whose touch was a bit heavy, so Eason came out to intercept, but slipped on the surface, allowing the Ramsgate forward the simple chance to take the ball past him and roll it into the net. Encouraged, they looked to extend their lead and had a near post attempt blocked following a corner, then Chapman pulled the ball back for Rowland who lifted a good opportunity over the bar.

Whitstable began to see a lot more of the ball and on 23 minutes Luke Girt won possession for Tijan Jadama to hit a great shot from 25 yards that beat Burns, but came back off the crossbar. A few minutes later, a low left wing cross by Wratten was flicked just over the bar by Aaron Millbank at the near post. Ramsgate looked to have carved out a good chance from a right wing cross, but the ball was stabbed just wide, although the offside flag had already been raised. A Wratten free kick was not held by Burns and the ball dropped to Stannard at the back post, but he shot over from close range. On 40 minutes, Jude Arthurs was booked for pulling back Jadama and from the free kick the ball eventually reached Ufuah whose cross was headed over the bar by Ollie Rowe. Aaron Simpson tested Eason with a low shot that was comfortably held and Ramsgate still led by the one goal at the break.

The home supporters did not have to wait long for a second half equaliser when Phil Starkey pushed Millbank just over 30 yards from goal in the 49th minute and Stannard hit a great free kick into the top left corner, out of the reach of Burns. Rowland almost got an opportunity at the other end, but Eason was quickly out to collect. Mazzone replaced Wratten in the 64th minute and was soon in the action when sliding into a challenge in the penalty area as Arthurs threatened. Ramsgate appealed for a spot kick, but the referee felt that he had played the ball off the Ramsgate player and awarded a goal kick.

Ufuah and Simpson were having a good battle down the Whitstable right and Ufuah got past him in the 71st minute, before having his low shot saved by Burns. Ufuah was as it again a few minutes later as he cut inside and tried a left footed shot that was pushed around the post by the goalkeeper. Stannard had a shot blocked from the short corner routine that followed. Ramsgate created their only goal attempt of the second half when Rowland fed Chapman whose low shot from the edge of the box was easily saved by Eason. In the 80th minute, a quick sequence of passing by Whitstable eventually saw Jake Mackenzie knocked over off the ball, but the penalty appeals were waved away. Both managers made changes, with Jay Hards coming on for his second Whitstable appearance and Mazzone was then involved at both ends of the pitch, making a good interception at the back, before being set up by Mackenzie, only to be denied by Burns. The resulting corner was hooked over the bar by Rowe. There was a late booking for Girt, but no more chances and the game ended 1-1.

Ramsgate remain second from bottom, now six points above East Grinstead who collected their first win at Three Bridges. Whitstable are tenth and next face away trips to Phoenix Sports and VCD.

EARLY GOAL SINKS TOWN

Whitstable beaten in a poor game at a windy Oakwood

An early goal was enough for VCD to take the three points on a very windy afternoon in Crayford. Whitstable started the game, looking like a team that had not played for a couple of weeks and paid the price when Alex Gaggin shot past Dan Eason. Whitstable struggled to create much at all and the home team looked the more likely to find the net again, although two efforts from a narrow angle by Gaggin that were pushed out by the Whitstable goalkeeper were the nearest they came. Whitstable only managed two shots on target in a game that will not live long in the memory of the meagre crowd.

VCD started this fixture in 10th place, with one more point than Whitstable, having played an extra game. The teams drew 1-1 back in October at the Belmont. The last outing for VCD resulted in a 1-0 win at Herne Bay, but Whitstable had not played for two weeks, since their draw with Ramsgate. Whitstable manager Lloyd Blackman named an unchanged team.

The pitch contained several sanded areas, although the game was not really in any doubt despite the recent rain. A bigger factor was the strong wind that blew throughout the afternoon to make conditions challenging for both teams and the 79 in attendance, almost half of which had travelled to support Whitstable. VCD twice got into threatening positions in the opening stages, before the Whitstable defence blocked balls in the box, but they did not have long to wait to take the lead. A long punt upfield by Jack Steventon saw Charlie Macdonald get past Tom Bryant and play the ball across to Gaggin, who worked himself an opening before hitting a left footed shot past a couple of defenders and Eason into the net in the 8th minute. A brief spell of Whitstable pressure led to Harry Stannard flicking the ball through to Aaron Millbank, but his shot was comfortably held by former Cray Wanderers goalkeeper Nick Blue.

Whitstable suffered an injury blow when their captain, Bryant, hurt his knee when challenged by Macdonald and had to be helped off before being replaced by Leo Mazzone, with Luke Girt dropping back into the defence. Bode Anidugbe struck a weak free kick straight at Eason and then in the 29th minute, Gaggin sent in a low cross from the right that Eason had to push behind at his near post. From the resulting corner, Gaggin was played in again by Anidugbe before trying his luck again from a very tight angle and once again Eason kept the ball out. Stannard swung a free kick dangerously into the box, but the home defence cleared the ball away and there was nothing else of significance to report in the first half, so VCD still led by the single goal at the break.

In the 53rd minute, Mazzone, probably the most effective Whitstable player on the day, fed John Ufuah who got the better of Bradley Simms and hit a good shot from just inside the box, but Blue was able to make the save. There were two chances at the other end, early in

the second half, for Henry Ikeije, but he blazed both well over the top. Jay Hards replaced Marshall Wratten on 71 minutes, as Whitstable tried in vain to find an equaliser against a physical home defence. Ali Fuseini attempted a low shot that was safely held by Eason, before the referee got his yellow card out three times in the space of a few minutes. The two big VCD central defenders both went into the book for heavy challenges, then Tijan Jadama joined them soon afterwards. Fuseini and substitute Ainsley Everett tried to extend the lead without success and Whitstable won their only corner in the 91st minute that was headed over by Mazzone. In truth though, neither team really looked much like scoring and the home team were happy to see out the game and take maximum points from a game played in difficult conditions.

Whitstable are now scheduled to play Ramsgate at the Belmont Ground in a Kent Senior Cup quarter final on Tuesday, before Guernsey visit on Saturday, assuming the weather does not have other ideas.
