Suzie Best presented a verbal update. Overall the accounts for 2019/2020 are up by £700. Action: SB to finalise accounts, and MH to attach to minutes for record.

### 4. Chairman's Report – Chairman

### Chairman's Report 2019/2020

We find ourselves in a very strange and challenging situation. Our 2019/2020 season has been curtailed and our annual summer league, run successfully since 2007, has had to be cancelled. Our annual Dinner Dance has been pushed to October and it is far from clear at the moment what we will be able to do with regards competitive hockey next season. As we navigate the time between now and the start of next season, our overriding concern will be for the safety of our club members and supporters. This will certainly impact what we can do with regards pre-season training and fitness, and will likely impact what we can do with regards post-match socialising, even if we are able to play competitive games. Our goal, however, will remain making hockey available to as many people as possible.

There are a couple of things to highlight from last season. First, we threw our hat in with Tennis and Squash and used their clubhouse and bar on Saturday afternoons for our postmatch socialising and I think this has worked very well with the feedback from club members being very positive overall. We will look to refine our agreement with them for next season but at this stage there seems to be little reason to go back to the old pavilion and our previous mode of operating. Second, and related to this, I think we have seen more people socialising after matches on a Saturday because we have a nicer environment to be in and to bring our opponents back to.

Third, although we still have some work to do here, we have had a few more people step up to umpire matches. Assuming a similar volume of games next season we will have an equally great need for people to assist with this and we will incentivise people to do so by crediting a match fee for every game umpired. Fourth, again related to umpiring, we have seen an unacceptable increase in the level of abuse shown towards our umpires and in some instances have been accused of abusing umpires ourselves. Those of you who have known me long enough will enjoy the irony of me calling this out but we will not tolerate any form of abuse or aggression towards umpires and we will be asking all members to be mindful of this as we move forward.

Lastly, we made some progress in investigating the development of a pitch in conjunction with The Grange School and managed to get agreement from them to put together a new set of plans with associated costs. Our progress on this has been more or less halted as a result of CV-19 but will remain on our agenda as a critical focus area as we move forward. Looking forward to next season we have some important areas to focus on:

 Retaining as many of our current playing members as possible. We fully understand that people may find themselves in a position where there is uncertainty around jobs or where incomes have fallen as a result of the CV-19 outbreak. As a club we would rather have people continue to play than not and will happily take a view on subs and match fees,
Continuing our drive to recruit juniors by stepping up our engagement with the local schools, work started last season by Will Ebsworth that we will continue to fund heading into next season, and

• New focus on player recruitment by setting up a team of people to work on this. Next season will be challenging as we navigate the CV-19 landscape, but with the support of our members and the work of our volunteers I am confident that we will get through it. In closing and as always, I'd like to thank all of the members of the Exec Committee for their work and support over the past season, everyone who umpired a game, everyone who coached our juniors or managed a team on match days, all of our team captains, everyone involved in arranging a club social and the dinner dance, and our members for their loyalty and for making Aylesbury Hockey Club what it is.

1. Minutes from Ladies End of Season Meeting held on 24 April 2019 were approved.

2. Report from Team Captains and Coaches were read and attached as appendix 1.

3. Training

Given the current circumstances with regards to COVID19 we agreed that we should plan for returning to training and preparing for season ahead. We would update members on final arrangements subject to government guidelines.

Fitness Training – proposed to start on 23 July, club to fund fitness instruction, these will be outdoor sessions. Location and times tbc.

Action: Maz to ask committee for funding to run free fitness sessions for all club members.

Stick & Ball Pre-season Training – proposed to start Tuesday 6 August 7.15-8.45 pm at AVA. Charge of £3 per session to cover pitch hire.

Trials – Proposed dates Tuesday 25th Aug 7.15 - 8.45 & Sat 29th Aug 9.30 - 11.30 at AVA. Ideally would like all players to attend at least one trial session.

Training – proposal to move to 7.15 pm start on both Tuesday and Wednesday. Woody to continue to coach both sessions.

4. Ladies 4s

Sarah recognised for her sterling efforts in managing the 4th team. Unfortunately, Sarah is stepping down from captaincy and we may only have two goalkeepers. A discussion was had about how to replace captaincy and considerations for 4th team going forward. The outcome is to continue with a 4th team and see how season develops.

Appendix 1 – Captain and Coach Reports

Ladies 1st Team Captain's Report - Hannah Pigott

This season played 19 games. Won 7, drew 5, lost 7. Scored 30. Finishing on 26 points in 6th position. Voirrey is 3rd top scorer in the league with 8 goals. 22 different players have played for the 1st team this season. Availability overall has been good with every week getting a minimum of 13 players out. 10 different goal scorers from the team. Training attendance good at the beginning of the season however numbers dropped towards the end due to work commitments, school commitments etc. Socials organised and attended by the 1s players consistent like previous seasons.

Ladies 2nd Team Captain's Report - Lucy Drane

The Ladies 2s have had a very successful season and although the season finished abruptly with three games still left to play, we positioned 4th in Division 3. Of the 17 games played, we won 10, drew 2 and lost 5. Of the 3 games that were left to play we had beaten them all in the first half of the season, so potentially could have won 13 of the 20 games!! Our goals scored was 44, by 10 different players and 22 goals against.

Every player in the team should be proud of these results.

Our availability each week and attendance at training has been good. I believe this has enabled the team to work better together and put into action the skills and tactics learnt at training. The confidence of all players from defence through midfield and to the forwards has grown over the season which has led to some fantastic individual and team linking play which has been wonderful to watch.

My hopes for next season are that we can continue to build on where we left off and to aim for placing in the top two and getting promotion. I feel that as a team we are ready for this and more than capable of achieving it.

Ladies 3rd Team Captains Report - Sandra Satterly

Firstly, I would like to say a big thank you to every one of the 28 players who played a part on pitch for us this season. Also, thank you to everyone who supported us both on the side-lines and throughout the Club, Woody for coaching us this season and all our umpires because without any of you, we wouldn't be where we are.

We played in Division Five this season and managed to play all but two of our games before everyone's season was unexpectedly cut short due to Covid-19. We were a bit rusty when we started back in September/October when we lost two of our games but we quickly bonded as a team and although our hockey wasn't always perfect, the motivation was evident for all to see as we fought for every point we earnt. Throughout the season, with a few up's and down's, we learnt to communicate with each other, support each other and put together lovely passing moves up and down the pitch, really showing us as one team.

We played 18 games, won 13, Drew 2 and lost 3, scoring 60 goals along the way (by nine different players), having 19 goals scored against us finishing in second place on 41 points. I was Division Five's top goal scorer and second top scorer in the Trysports League with 32 goals.

At the time of writing, the league has decided with regards to how the league positions will be settled and this is to take the number of points earnt and divide

this by the number of games played. We are still waiting for confirmation from the league but using this calculation, we remain in second place and on course for promotion to Division Four.

Attendance at training was a definite improvement upon last year with a core 14 players attending regularly. Punctuality needs to be improved with regards to match days in that a meeting time is just that, not to rock up sometimes 20 minutes later with no apology.

Finally, I just need to say a big thank you to my vice-captain, Nicola, for all your hard work and help throughout the season. Your input and efforts have been invaluable. I'm sure I speak on behalf of everyone in wishing you all the best in your move, we're going to miss you and hope you keep up with your hockey.

Ladies 4th Team Captains Report - Sarah Jackson

The 4's started the season in division 6 as we had done last year and now all 4 ladies teams play in the Try Sports League. I think we all thought this would be easier when trying to bench players, but it turned out whenever we were at home everyone else was away and vice versa.

The 4's squad was almost entirely different from the previous season bar 4 players and availability from the outset has been difficult. Some weeks Teamers were going out to over 20 people and we were still struggling to find a side. The lack of a goalkeeper has also had a big impact.

We started poorly with 3 losses (one of them down to my shocking attempt in goal) in a row before our first win of 6-0 against Abingdon. A draw and then another win felt like we were starting to pick up but then against Sonning we could only find 6 players, so we had to concede that one and take the 5 goal and 5-point hit.

It didn't really get better after that despite numerous attempts to engage the squad in training, commitment and social activity.

Our last game on 14th March meant we had played 15 games resulting in:

Coach Report - Woody

What a weird way to finish season but looking at where we ended up with 4 teams, at the beginning of the season I was apprehensive looking at team sheets, people leaving and slightly worried as basically we'd lost a full team and this clearly had an effect on the 4s. We lost three first team players from last year however juniors stepped up.

Attendance during training was excellent, particularly from 2s this season. As a Club our focus I'd say just after xmas looking at where people/teams stood we decided early on to support 3s and for 2s to sacrifice a little with that, big thank you to 2s to help facilitate that. I'd like to push for 2s to get promoted next year. There was solid turnout by 3s at training, had some tough games, few ups and downs, one week fantastic the next wobbly, playing teams nearer the top of the division was putting certain pressures onplayers. The 3s showed a lot of character and looking to support them going up a league. 4s players did well at training and thanks to Karen, Boogey and Lucy for doubling up on GK. Overall we achieved what we wanted for the 1S to stay in Prem 1, 2s close to promotion, 3s to get promotion, and 4s as expected to stay in division 6. Training was really productive and players trying to get used to new system of playing. To address the dwindling junior membership numbers we have now setup a formal Schools liaison programme led by Will Ebsworth

Proving very positive so far, supported by Matt, Tristan & Woody delivered first school very well, now moving on to evening club with them (circa 22) which we will then try leverage into new members. Next 2 primary schools lined up, and wider comms to another 45 schools on a priority backlog

## Key Points

 $\cdot$  The season was truncated because of COVID-19 but most teams only had 1 or 2 games left to play and the leagues were frozen as they stood

 $\cdot$  1s had a tough season having lost a few experienced players and with injuries struggled in first half of the season. The new coach appointed at the beginning of the season was let go at Xmas and Matt Kiely took over – big thanks to Matt. The second half of the season saw some much better performances without necessarily getting the results deserved. Big thanks to Tim Atcheson for taking over the

captaincy of the 1s, helped by Ollie Paterson and Will Ebsworth. A few of the younger players will be off to university – at least that was the plan – so recruiting for the 1s is a priority.

 $\cdot$  Dan Inkley took over the 2s captaincy (thanks Dan). The first half of the season was better than the second and with the squad they had should have finished a bit higher.

 $\cdot$  Remarkably Stuart still captained the 3s, who had been relegated the previous season. Some good performances interspersed with poor ones led to a bottom half finish.

• The Kites – joint team with Tring – started better than the previous season but fell away in the second half to finish at the bottom, despite winning more games and getting more points than the previous season when they finished higher. Availability on the Tring side was poor in the second half of the season. Thanks to Tom Brockett for managing the joint team

 $\cdot$  We added an additional Development side for the season, again jointly with Tring, run by Matt Kiely – thanks again Matt – together with 3 other experienced players and many juniors just starting adult hockey. This was a great success and the results did not always bear out the way the team played, although they finished comfortably clear of relegation. Tring provided a number of juniors but few adults.

 $\cdot$  There will be more juniors feeding into the Development team next season and the juniors there moving up at some stage. Need to recruit at all levels, especially the higher teams
